## Oakland Athletics (50-40) at Texas Rangers (35-53)

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers edged the Athletics last night, 3-2, and club has a 2-2 record to begin this 7-day, 6 -game homestand against DET (1-2) and OAK (1-0) leading into the All-Star break...club has won 2 of 3 and has a 4-4 record thru 8 G in July...team is $8-5$ in last 13 G (beg. 6/25) and 10-7 in last 17 G (beg. 6/21)...TEX has the T2nd-best record in the A.L. since $6 / 25$ (BOS- $.786,11-3$; TEX/CWS/LAA/SEA.615, 8-5)...team had a season-best 4-G winning streak from 6/25-29...prior to this span, the Rangers went just 7-28 from 5/10-6/20 and 3-19 from 5/25-6/20.

- At 35-53 (.398), Texas has the 4th-lowest win pct. in MLB (ARI-.289, 26-64; BAL-.322, 28-59; PIT-.368, 32-55)...current record marks fewest wins through 88 G since 1985 (3256)...team reached 17 games under . 500 after win last Sat. at SEA, which matched team's best since 6/13 (25-41)...Texas has been season-high 21 G under . 5003 x (last at 27-48 on $6 / 24)$...reached season-best at $.500(18-18)$ on $5 / 9$.

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 43 days...since $5 / 25$, club has gone from 6.0 GB to 18.5 GB behind 1 st place HOU, the 2nd-largest deficit in A.L. (26.0 GB--BAL) and 4th-largest in MLB (30.5 GB-ARI, 19.5 GB--PIT)...Texas reached season-high 20.0 GB on $6 / 24$, largest deficit since end of 2019 (29.0 GB)...have been in 4 th or 5 th place on all but one day since $4 / 9$ (T3rd on $5 / 23$ ).
SERIES STUFF: Texas is 9-17-2 in 28 overall series in 2021, including 2-2-1 in last 5 series after going 0-7-2 in previous 9 series...team is $5-7-2$ at home and $4-10-0$ on the road...TEX has gone 2-4-2 in last 8 series at home... win today would clinch this series and improve the Rangers to 3-1-1 in home series against divisional opponents in 2021.

AT HOME: The Rangers are 22-23 (.489) at Globe Life Field in 2021, 6th in A.L. in home win pct...club has won 2 of 3, 5 of 7, and 7 of last 11 G in Arlington...have a 20-17 record at this facility since a $2-6$ start...last night's win pushed the club's all-time record at GLF back above .500 at 38 -37...TEX is playing 21 of team's final 32 G before AS break at Globe Life Field (9-10 in span).

- Since a $13-6$ home loss on $6 / 22$ vs. OAK, the Texas pitching staff has limited opponents (OAK/KC/DET) to 32 runs over the last 9 G at Globe Life Field (3.6 R/G).
- On offense, the Rangers are batting just $.238 \mathrm{w} / 4.1$ R/G at home in 2021 but have been improved of late, batting .273/.350/.468/.818 with $5.5 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ in last 11 G here.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 5-3 against the A's this season, the team's most wins against any opponent...club is 1-0-1 thru 2 series and seeking a 2nd consecutive series win, as TEX recently won 2 of 3 at the Coliseum (6/29-7/1) for the club's 1st series win in Oakland since 2016 (2-1, 9/2325/16)...teams have nearly identical run differential in 2021 (TEX leads 37 -to-36)...TEX has won 6 of 8 dating to last season, but are still just $15-32$ vs. OAK since $7 / 23 / 18$...the A's hold a slight edge (388-381) in the all-time series, though the Rangers have a 203-184 advantage in Arlington...TEX is in a span of playing 10 of final 19 G vs. OAK heading into the All-Star break.

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE: The Rangers are 9-5 in home games against opponents from the A.L. West this season, outscoring their divisional rivals 77-to-66 (+11)...the club has gone 8-2 in last 10 G against the A.L. West at Globe Life Field following a $1-3$ start...TEX is 2-1-1 in home series against divisional opponents, going 2-0-1 in last 3 .

A RARE VICTORY: The Rangers won 3-2 last night despite totaling just 5 hits, none for extra bases...prior to last night, the team had not won when recording 5 -or-fewer hits and no extra-base hits since a $2-1$ victory on $8 / 28 / 16$ vs. CLE ( 5 singles)...between those 2 wins, Texas was $0-20$ in such games...team's 3 -run 6th last night was the 4th time in the 1st 4 G of this homestand for Texas to have a $3+$ run inning

ALL-STAR ADOLIS: Adolis García once again delivered in the clutch last night, hitting a go-ahead 2 -run single in the 6 th inning of the Rangers' 3-2 victory...García's 21 HR and 61 RBI are most ever by a Texas rookie prior to the All-Star break, as he surpassed David Murphy's club rookie record for RBI ( 60 in 2008)...García is the 9th rookie in MLB history with $20+$ HR and $60+$ RBI prior to the Midsummer Classic, which began in 1933 (see chart)...each of the last 6 rookies to accomplish this feat went on to win Rookie of the Year.

FEW FREEBIES: Mike Foltynewicz enters today's start averaging a career-best 2.01 walks per 9 innings, the 6th-lowest rate among 30 A.L. qualifiers (see chart)...the right-hander has issued 2-or-fewer free passes in 9 straight starts, the 2nd-longest such streak of his career (11, 4/23-6/18/17) and longest by a Ranger since Lance Lynn (12, 6/1-8/2/19).

NICE: Joey Gallo leads MLB with 69 walks, 9 more than the next closest player (CWS' Yasmani Grandal has 60)...Gallo's 69 BB are 2nd-most ever by a Ranger prior to the All-Star break behind Toby Harrah (82 BB in 1985)...Harrah would finish the 1985 season with a club-record 113 free passes... since 2012, the only players to match or exceed Gallo's totals of $23 \mathrm{HR} / 51 \mathrm{RB} / / 69 \mathrm{BB}$ prior to the All-Star Game are Mike Trout for 2019 Angels ( 28 HR/67 RBI/76 BB) and Bryce Harper for 2018 Nationals ( $23 \mathrm{HR} / 54 \mathrm{RB} / 78 \mathrm{BB}$ ).

NOT SO FAST: Joey Gallo's outfield assist in the 1st inning last night was the 14th assist by a TEX outfielder this season, 3rd-most among A.L. clubs: $28-\mathrm{BOS}, 15-\mathrm{TB}, 14-\mathrm{TEX}$ MIN/TOR...individually, Gallo and Adolis García (5 each) rank T3rd in assists among A.L. outfielders: 11-BOS' Hunter Renfroe, 8-TOR's Lourdes Gurriel Jr., 5-Gallo/García/4 others.

FEELS LIKE HOME: After a slow start that saw him bat just 139 (5-36) with no HR and one RBI over his 1st 10 G at Globe Life Field this season, Adolis García has responded by compiling a $.324 / .373 / .694 / 1.067$ (35-108) slash line with 11 HR and 33 RBI over his last 29 G at this facility...over that span (beg. 5/7), García's 33 home RBI lead the A.L. and rank 2nd in MLB behind ATL's Ozzie Albies ( 35 home RBI). - Since his season debut on $4 / 13$, only 2 players in MLB have more overall RBI than Garcia's 61 , and both will be his teammate at next week's All-Star Game: TOR's Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (65) and BOS' Rafael Devers (62).

SHORTS: In addition to the usual BSSW broadcast, today's game will be carried nationally on FS1 with Alex Faust and former Ranger Hunter Pence on the call...today marks the club's last 3:05 p.m. Saturday start at home this season, as the Saturday home games will shift back to 6:05 p.m. starts after the AS break...today is the 3rd matchup between Mike Foltynewicz and James Kaprielian this season, with TEX winning on 6/23 in Arlington (5-3) and 6/29 in Oakland (5-4).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER \#20 Mike Foltynewicz, RHP <br> \author{ (2-8, 5.17) 

}TODAY: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 18 th start of the season in the middle game of this series against Oakland... has pitched to a 3.60 ERA (8 ER/20.0 IP) and limited opponents to a . 192 BA (14-73) over his last 3 starts to lower season figure from 5.59 to 5.17 , still 4th-highest among A.L. qualifiers...will be working on extra 5 days' rest after taking the loss in the club's Independence Day road trip finale on Sun. at SEA (7.0 IP, 4 R-ER), a 4-1 Texas defeat...team-high 8 losses are T4th-most in A.L, ranks 6th in A.L. with a ca-reer-best 2.01 walks per 9 innings rate, and has the league's lowest run support average ( 3.06 RS/9 IP)...has 7 quality starts, T2nd-most on club behind Kyle Gibson (12)...was signed as a free agent to a one-year contract on 2/10/21...made just one start for ATL in 2020 while spending the remainder of the season at the Braves Alternate Training Site...made 20+ starts for the Braves in 4 consecutive seasons from 2016-19...set career bests with 13 wins, 202 strikeouts, and a 2.85 ERA while being selected as an N.L. All-Star in 2018...was acquired by Braves in January 2015 after making his Major League debut with HOU in 2014...was the 19th overall player selected in the 1st round of the 2010 MLB Draft by the Astros out of Minooka (IL) High School...Texas is 6-11 in his 17 starts.

FEW FREEBIES: Foltynewicz ranks 6 th in the A.L. with a career-best 2.01 walks per 9 innings rate (see front page)...current figure is well below his career average (3.0 BB/9)...has issued 2-or-fewer BB in 9 straight starts, the 2nd-longest such streak of his career (11, 4/23-6/18/17) and longest by a Ranger since Lance Lynn (12, 6/1-8/2/19).

LAST START: Took the loss in the club's Independence Day road trip finale on Sun. at SEA (7.0 IP, $4 \mathrm{H}, 4 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}, 1 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{SO}, 2 \mathrm{HR}, 94$ pitches/ 59 strikes), a 4-1 Texas defeat...completed 7.0 innings for a 2 nd consecutive start...in a common theme for Foltynewicz, all damage came in the form of HRs by Luis Torrens (3-R in 4th) and Shed Long Jr. (solo in 5th).

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 2-0, 2.11 ( $5 \mathrm{ER} / 21.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) over $4 \mathrm{G} / 3 \mathrm{GS}$ in career vs. OAK... will be facing the Swingin' A's for the 3rd time in 4 starts, as he went $1-0$, 2.77 (4 ER/13.0 IP) over outings on 6/23 in Arlington (ND, 6.0 IP, 2 R-ER) and $6 / 29$ at the Coliseum (W, 7.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...the Rangers won both games, as Foltynewicz has been on the mound for 2 of the team's 5 wins vs. OAK in 2021... victory on $6 / 29$ at OAK snapped a career-high 10 -start winless span.

- Has gone 2-2, 3.32 (21 ER/57.0 IP) in 9 starts against the A.L. West this season, facing each divisional opponent twice.

AT HOME: Has fared better at Globe Life Field this season, going 1-4, 4.53 (28 ER/55.2 IP) in 10 home starts compared to 1-4, $6.10(26 \mathrm{ER} / 38.1 \mathrm{IP})$ in 7 road starts...lone win on $4 / 27 \mathrm{vs}$. LAA ( $5.1 \mathrm{IP}, 1$ R-ER)...opponents are batting .263/.316/.479/.795 at home compared to $.288 / .327 / .564 / .891$ on the road...has the most home starts of any Ranger in 2021.

2021: Has allowed the T2nd-most extra-base hits (25) and T4th-most HR (10) in the A.L... 30 of 55 runs allowed have come via HR...has the lowest run support average ( $3.06 \mathrm{RS} / 9 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in the A.L...issued 2-or-fewer BB in 9 straight and 14 of 17 starts...opponents are batting . 253 (22-87) with runners in scoring position... opp. BA by time thru batting order: 1st (.257), 2nd (.338), 3rd (.195)...ERA by catcher: Jonah Heim ( 3.62 ERA in 8 G), Jose Trevino ( 6.90 ERA in 9 G)...started the Rangers' home opener on $4 / 5 \mathrm{vs}$. TOR (L, $4.0 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}$ )...took the loss on $4 / 11$ vs. SD (7.0 IP, $2 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}$ ), the 1st Texas pitcher to ever lose in Arlington when posting $7.0+$ IP, 2 -or-fewer H and just one run...earned 1 st win as a Ranger on $4 / 27$ vs. LAA ( 5.1 IP, 1 R-ER), his 1 st win in 585 days (last $9 / 20 / 19 \mathrm{vs}$. SF w/ ATL- 8.0 IP, 0 R)....permitted a career high-tying 8 runs on $6 / 11$ at LAD ( 2.2 IP , 8 R-7 ER), most by any Texas pitcher in 2021...snapped a career-high 10-start winless span with win on $6 / 29$ at OAK, longest single-season winless span by a Ranger since Martin Perez (11 G, 4/29-9/28/18).

2020: Opened the season with the Braves and sustained a 14-5 loss in lone start on $7 / 27$ at TB (3.1 IP, $4 \mathrm{H}, 6 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{SO}, 3 \mathrm{HR}$ )... was designated for assignment the following day and assigned outright to ATL's Alternate Training Site in Gwinnett on $7 / 30 \ldots$ spent the final 2 months of the season there and became a free agent on 11/2/20.

2018 ALL-STAR: Was selected to N.L. All-Star Game after going 7-5, 2.66 in 18 games to open the season...tossed a scoreless 4th inning in ASG on 7/17 at WSH....was the 1st pitcher in Braves franchise history (since 1876) to reach 200 strikeouts and have an opponents' average under .200...was 1st ATL hurler with 200+ strikeouts since Javier Vázquez in 2009 (238).
