MONDAY, JULY 19, 2021 OAKLAND, CA GAME #93 (46-46) ROAD GAME #44 (19-24)

LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the first of six games on a road trip to Oakland (July 19-20) and Minnesota (July 22-25)...Angels went 1-2 on last homestand vs. Seattle to begin the second half of the regular season.

THE MAN ON THE MOUND: Today's game marks the seventh time this season **Shohei Ohtani** will make a pitching start with at least a share of the Major League home run lead...<u>He is the first pitcher to make multiple pitching starts in a season while also leading MLB in home runs since Boston's **Babe Ruth** in 1919 (ELIAS)...He has batted for himself in 10 of his 13 pitching starts this season; first pitcher ever to hit for himself 3+ times in games where a DH is available.</u>

HIT STREAK SNAPPED: Yesterday vs. Seattle, David Fletcher went 0-for-5, snapping his 26 game hit streak (second longest in Angels history)...During the streak he batted .454 (49/108) with 13 doubles, two HR and 21 RBI and raised his batting average from .255 to .318...His 26 game streak is a career best (previous was 16 games in 2020) and is the longest in the Majors since Wilson Ramos (NYM) had a 26 game streak in 2019.

MARSH MADNESS: Yesterday, OF Brandon Marsh made his

Major League debut and went O-for-4 vs. Seattle after being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake before the game...Marsh was the Angels second round draft pick in 2016 and entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the #2 prospect in the organization...In his last eight games with Salt Lake, his .382 (13/34) with two doubles, two triples two HR, six RBI and a 1.152 OPS.

ROCKY HITTER/PITCHER SHO: During All-Star festivities this week in Denver, Shohei Ohtani became the first Japanese-born player to participate in the Home Run Derby...He totaled 28 homers on Monday before falling in a double tiebreaker to Washington's Juan Soto in the first round...On Tuesday, Ohtani became the first player ever to start at pitcher, start in the leadoff spot and earn the win all in the same game (regular season, All-Star or postseason) (STATS)...He worked a perfect 1st inning on the mound and went 0-for-2 at the plate...He was the first player ever selected to an All-Star team as both a pitcher and a position player.

JARED WALSH: ALL STAR: In his first career All-Star Game, Jared Walsh went 0-for-2, but made a bases loaded sliding catch in left field to end the 8th inning and preserve the lead for the American League...It marked his first time playing left field at the Major League level.

<u>.500 AGAIN:</u> Angels are back at the .500 mark (46-46) for the 15th time this season (1-1, 9-9, 10-10, 11-11, 12-12, 13-13, 32-32, 33-33, 35-35, 36-36, 41-41, 42-42, 44-44 and 45-45).

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Angels are 3-7 this season vs. Oakland and are 2-5 at the Coliseum...A's have won head-to-head season series each of last three seasons (2018-20).

TROUT ON THE IL: On May 18, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth in the Majors (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624)...He was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 28.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: OF Justin Upton is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with Triple-A Salt Lake tonight at Tacoma...He has missed the Angels last 19 games with a right low back strain.

<u>PETERS TO THE PIRATES:</u> Today the Angels traded LHP <u>Dillon Peters</u> to Pittsburgh for cash considerations...He was designated for assignment by the Angels on Wednesday.

LEAGUE LEADERS:

Today's starting pitcher, **Shohei Ohtani** leads the Major Leagues in home runs (34), extra-base hits (57) and slugging (.688), ranks second in RBI (74), OPS (1.051), is tied for fifth in triples (4) and is tied for sixth in runs scored (66)... He also has 12 stolen bases (T-8th in A.L.) and has made 13 pitching starts (4-1, 3.49 ERA, 87 SO, .195 BAA).

Jared Walsh ranks fifth in the American League in RBI (66), is tied for sixth in extra-base hits (45) and home runs (22), seventh in slugging (.543), tied for seventh in total bases (184) and tied for eighth in doubles (22).

SIGNED SPANKY: On Wednesday, the Angels signed OF Adam Eaton to a Major League contract after he was granted his unconditional release by the White Sox on Monday...He appeared in 58 games for Chicago this season...Eaton joins the Angels active roster...In corresponding moves, LHP Dillon Peters was designated for assignment and INF Jose Rojas was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake.

AGAINST SOUTHPAW STARTERS: Angels have won 14 of last 21 games vs. left-handed starters after losing seven of first nine games against lefty starters.

RAISEL-MANIA: Angels closer Raisel Iglesias has compiled 19 saves this season, which ranks tied for second in the American League...He is the first Angels closer with 19+ saves before the All-Star Break since Huston Street (24) in 2015...He leads the Majors with six saves of 4+ outs this season...Also leads MLB with 35 saves of 4+ outs since 2017...Additionally, he has stranded 25 of his last 27 inherited runners.

FOUR SCORE: Angels are 44-16 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 2-30 when scoring three-or-fewer.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: David Fletcher was named A.L. Player of the Week for July 5-11 after batting .593 (16/27) with two doubles, two HR and seven RBI...Marks his first time receiving the honors...Angels have now had four of the past five A.L. Player of the Week winners: Max Stassi won it for the week of June 13, and Shohei Ohtani won it for the weeks of June 20 and July 4.

<u>IT'S SHO-TIME</u>: Last week, MLB unveiled a new **Shohei Ohtani** :30 spot to celebrate his historic first half of the season...The clip can be viewed HERE.

MAKE IT MAJOR: Shohei Ohtani is one of six Major League players featured in large photos outside of Major League Baseball's new headquarters in New York City...The building is located directly across the street from Radio City Music Hall.

TWINS ON DECK: Following the current series in Oakland and an off day on Wednesday, the Angels will face the Twins in a four game series at Target Field...Halos lead the 2021 season series 2-1 after winning the first meeting between the clubs on April 16 and splitting a doubleheader on May 20 at Angel Stadium...Angels are 17-18 (.486) all-time at Target Field since the ballpark opened in 2010.

Earned win for A.L. in All-Star Game on Tuesday with one perfect inning pitched

- <u>SHO TIME:</u> Making MLB career high 14th start of the season as a pitcher and sixth on the road...Second start of 2021 vs. Athletics...Limited to two starts as a pitcher in 2020...Did not pitch during 2019 season, while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
- <u>WINNING IN 'RADO</u>: Earned winning decision in the All-Star Game after working a perfect 1st inning (retired Fernando Tatis Jr., Max Muncy and Nolan Arenado)...Was the first player ever selected to the MLB All-Star Game as both a pitcher and position player...Voted by fans as starting designated hitter and was also selected as a pitcher on the Player Ballot.
- <u>DON'T NEED A DH</u>: Has batted for himself in 10 of 13 pitching starts this season...Became first Angels starting pitcher to bat for himself in an A.L. game since the designated hitter rule was implemented in 1973...Was first Angels starting pitcher to hit a home run since Clyde Wright (Sept. 8, 1972 - Game 2 @ CWS).
- <u>RECENT HONORS</u>: Named American League Player of the Month for June, marking his first time receiving the monthly honors...Was also named A.L. Player of the Week for June 14-20 and for June 28 July 4.
- ANGELS STRIKEOUT RECORDS: Has recorded 153 career strikeouts, which is a Club record through 25 career games as a pitcher...His total is already a record through 26 games as well (previous: Jered Weaver - 141).
- <u>LAST TIME ON THE MOUND (regular season):</u> Earned the win in last regular season start on July 6 vs. Boston after tossing 7.0 innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with no walks and four strikeouts.
- OFF THE BOARD: Prior to yielding seven runs on June 30 at NYY, had allowed total 12 earned runs in his previous 49.2 innings pitched (2.17 ERA).
- PLAYING THE FIELD: Has moved to the outfield three times following pitching starts this season...On May 11 at Houston, finished the game in right field after tossing season-high 7.0 innings and allowing one earned run with a season-high 10 strikeouts...Became third player since 1900 to strike out 10+ batters and play another position in the same game. (ELIAS).
- <u>GETTING SETTLED</u>: Has a 9.95 ERA (12.2 IP 14 ER) in the first inning this year, compared with a 1.99 ERA (54.1 IP 12 ER) after the first frame.
- SWING AND A MISS: Has a 32.6% swing and miss rate this season, which ranks fifth in A.L. (min. 65 IP)...Has recorded 74 of 87 strikeouts (85%) on swinging strike 3's this season...Led Major League starters (min. 10 GS) with a 35.1% swing and miss rate in 2018.
- PATIENT OPPONENTS: Opponents have taken 54.8% of pitches (580/1059), which is 10th-highest rate in A.L. (min. 65
- THE SPLITTER: This season, batters are 7-for-76 (.092) against his splitter with 49 SO...Has held opponents to an .074 (10/135) batting average against the splitter since 2018...Recorded 86 of 153 strikeouts with the pitch
- BRINGING THE HEAT: Has reached 100 MPH with nine pitches this year...Fastest pitch was clocked at 101.1 MPH
- VS. OAKLAND: In four career games vs. A's, is 2-2 with a 5.21 ERA (19 IP 11 ER)...Took loss in first start vs. A's this year on May 28 (6 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 5 SO)...Went 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13 IP 3 ER) with 18 strikeouts against the A's in his two starts in 2018, but allowed five runs without recording an out in vs. Oakland on July 26, 2020...Finest pitching performance of big league career came vs. Oakland on Apr. 8, 2018 at Angel Stadium (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 12 SO) and carried a perfect game into the 7th inning.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In three games at the Coliseum, is 1-2 with a 8.25 ERA (12 IP 11 ER)...Made first big league start on April 1, 2018 (W; 6 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO) in Oakland...All three runs allowed in that contest came on three-run HR by Matt Chapman in second inning...Did not record an out (6 BF) in start on July 26, 2020.
- TWO-WAY, YEAR 3: Is the first player to make multiple starts as a pitcher and non-pitcher in three MLB seasons since Johnny Cooney did so in six seasons for the Boston Braves (1923-26, '28-29). (ELIAS).
- JAPANESE HALOS: Is one of five Japanese-born players to play for Angels, along with Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi and Junichi Tazawa.
- PITCHING CAREER IN JAPAN: In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts.
- MLB CAREER NOTES: Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017...Made Major League debut as a DH on March 29, 2018 at Oakland and had first start as a pitcher on April 1, 2018 at Oakland...Named the 2018 American League Rookie of the Year...Named A.L. Player of the Month for June 2021 and has won A.L. Player of
