LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the second (0-1) of six games on a road trip to Oakland (0-1; July 19-20) and Minnesota (July 22-25)...Angels went 1-2 on last homestand vs. Seattle to begin the second half of the regular season.

FLETCH HITS: David Fletcher leads the American League with 111 hits this season and ranks fourth in the league with a .316 batting average...He has multiple hits in eight of his last 10 games and is batting . $533(24 / 45)$ in that span.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: OF Justin Upton is on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Salt Lake...Last night in Tacoma, he hit a leadoff home run and finished the night 1-for-3 with one walk and one strikeout, while playing seven innings in left field...He has missed the Angels last 19 games with a right low back strain.

RAISEL-MANIA: Angels closer Raisel Iglesias has compiled 19 saves this season, which ranks tied for second in the American League...He is the first Angels closer with 19+ saves before the All-Star Break since Huston Street (24) in 2015...He leads the Majors with six saves of $4+$ outs this season...Also leads MLB with 35 saves of $4+$ outs since 2017...Additionally, he has stranded 25 of his last 27 inherited runners.

HIT STREAK SNAPPED: Sunday vs. Seattle, David Fletcher went 0 -for-5, snapping his 26 game hit streak (second longest in Angels history)...During the streak he batted . 454 (49/108) with 13 doubles, two HR and 21 RBI and raised his batting average from .255 to .318 ... His 26 game streak is a career best (previous was 16 games in 2020) and is the longest in the Majors since Wilson Ramos (NYM) had a 26 game streak in 2019.

MARSH MADNESS: Sunday, OF Brandon Marsh made his Major League debut and went 0 -for-4 vs. Seattle...Yesterday, he collected his first three career hits as well as his first career RBI...Marsh was the Angels second round draft pick in 2016 and entered the season ranked by Baseball America as the \#2 prospect in the organization...In his last eight games with Salt Lake, his $382(13 / 34)$ with two doubles, two triples two HR, six RBI and a 1.152 OPS.

GETTING BACK TO .500: Angels are one game under the . 500 mark (46-47)...With a win today, Angels would be at exactly .500 for a 16 th time this season (1-1, 9-9, 10-10, 11-11, 12-$12,13-13,32-32,33-33,35-35,36-36,41-41,42-42,44-44$, 45-45 and 46-46).

VS. OAKLAND: Angels are 3-8 this season vs. Oakland and are 2-6 at the Coliseum...A's have won head-to-head season series each of last three seasons (2018-20).

TROUT ON THE IL: On May 18, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth in the Majors (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624)... He was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 28.

PETERS TO THE PIRATES: Yesterday, the Angels traded LHP Dillon Peters to Pittsburgh for cash considerations... He was designated for assignment by the Angels on Wednesday.

## LEAGUE LEADERS:

Shohei Ohtani leads the Major Leagues in home runs (34), extra-base hits (58) and slugging (.686), ranks second in RBI (74), OPS (1.047) and total bases (218), is tied for fifth in triples (4) and is tied for sixth in runs scored (66)... He also has 12 stolen bases (T-8th in A.L.) and has made 14 pitching starts (4-1, 3.21 ERA, 95 SO, . 191 BAA).

Jared Walsh ranks fifth in the American League in RBI (66), is seventh in extra-base hits (45), tied for seventh in home runs (22), is ninth in slugging (.536), eighth in total bases (184) and tied for eighth in doubles (22).

SIGNED SPANKY: On Wednesday, the Angels signed OF Adam Eaton to a Major League contract after he was granted his unconditional release by the White Sox on Monday... He appeared in 58 games for Chicago this season...Eaton joins the Angels active roster...In corresponding moves, LHP Dillon Peters was designated for assignment and INF Jose Rojas was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake.

AGAINST SOUTHPAW STARTERS: Angels have won 14 of last 22 games vs. left-handed starters after losing seven of first nine games against lefty starters.

FOUR SCORE: Angels are 44-16 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 2-31 when scoring three-or-fewer.

ROCKY HITTER/PITCHER SHO: During All-Star festivities this week in Denver, Shohei Ohtani became the first Japaneseborn player to participate in the Home Run Derby...He totaled 28 homers on Monday before falling in a double tiebreaker to Washington's Juan Soto in the first round...On Tuesday, Ohtani became the first player ever to start at pitcher, start in the leadoff spot and earn the win all in the same game (regular season, All-Star or postseason) (STATS)...He worked a perfect 1 st inning on the mound and went 0 -for- 2 at the plate... He was the first player ever selected to an All-Star team as both a pitcher and a position player.

JARED WALSH: ALL STAR: In his first career All-Star Game, Jared Walsh went 0-for-2, but made a bases loaded sliding catch in left field to end the 8th inning and preserve the lead for the American League...It marked his first time playing left field at the Major League level.

IT'S SHO-TIME: Prior to the All-Star Game, MLB unveiled a new Shohei Ohtani :30 spot to celebrate his historic first half of the season...The clip can be viewed HERE.

MAKE IT MAJOR: Shohei Ohtani is one of six Major League players featured in large photos outside of Major League Baseball's new headquarters in New York City...The building is located directly across the street from Radio City Music Hall.

TWINS ON DECK: Following the current series in Oakland and an off day on Wednesday, the Angels will face the Twins in a four game series at Target Field...Halos lead the 2021 season series 2-1 after winning the first meeting between the clubs on April 16 and splitting a doubleheader on May 20 at Angel Stadium...Angels are 17-18 (.486) all-time at Target Field since the ballpark opened in 2010.

- TODAY'S GAME: Making 12th appearance (third start) of the season and eighth road appearance (second start) of 2021...Second appearance of season vs. Seattle...Is in third Major League season with Angels.
- RETURN TO THE SHOW: Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on May 28 for third big league stint of the season.
- BACK IN THE ROTATION: Joined Angels rotation on July 5 for first Major League start since Aug. 25, 2020 in Game 1 of doubleheader at Houston...In his nine relief appearances this year, went 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA ( 27.1 IP - 6 ER) and 26 strikeouts.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on July 11 at Seattle after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing one earned run on three hits with two walks and four strikeouts.
- CAMBIO: This season, has held opponents to a $.111(5 / 45)$ average against his changeup...For his career, opponents bat $219(41 / 187)$ against the pitch and has recorded 57 of his 107 strikeouts with the change.
