TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 7 -game homestand with the first of 4 games vs. Oakland (7/22 $7 / 25$ ), followed by 3 games vs. Houston ( $7 / 26-7 / 28$ )...tonight is the Mariners first game at T-Mobile Park since the All-Star Break...coming off a winning road trip (3-2) against Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Colorado (1-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS, as well as broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 6-3 in their last 9 games, 17-9 over their last 26, 20-10 over their last 30 and 30-19 over their last 49...are 20-13 in day games and 31-32 at night...are 29-20 at T-Mobile Park and 22-25 on the road...are 42-14 when scoring at least 4 runs and 9-31 when scoring 3 or fewer runs.. are 37-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- On a Roll - Seattle is 20-10 (.667) since June 13, tied for the best winning percentage in the Majors during that span with Houston (22-11).
- 1st Game - The Mariners are 19-12 (.613) in the first games of series this season....have won 3 consecutive series openers and are 8-2 in their last 10 openers.
- Yesterday - Seattle selected RHP Darren McCaughan and optioned OF Dillon Thomas to Triple-A Tacoma...INF Wyatt Mathisen also cleared waivers and was outrighted to Tacoma.
- In All Series-ness - Seattle has won or split 9 of its last 10 series dating back to June 14-16 vs. MIN... overall, Seattle is 15-11-5 in series this season.
- Happy Thursday - The Mariners are 38-21 (.644) between Thursday and Sunday this season, compared to 13-24 (.351) between Monday and Wednesday.
MITCH PERFECT...Mitch Haniger has reached base safely in 20 consecutive games dating back to June 25, batting .333 ( $26 \times 78$ ) with 21 runs scored, 2 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI, 8 walks, 4 hit-by-pitches, a .418 on-base percentage and a . 628 slugging percentage (1.046 OPS) during that span...among American League players with at least 60 percent of their games played in the outfield, Mitch ranks 1st in runs scored (66), 2nd in extra-base hits (41), 2nd in total bases (183), 2nd in home runs (23), 3rd in RBI (59), 3rd in hits (95) and T7th in doubles (17).
- Hitting Streak - Holds an active 11-game hitting streak dating back to July 6...during the streak, is batting $.366(15 \times 41)$ with 13 runs scored, 1 double, 5 home runs, 12 RBI, 5 walks and 2 hit-by-pitches.
- Player of the Week - Named American League Player of the Week for the week ending on July 18...hit 455 ( $5 \times 11$ ) with 7 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 walks, 1 hit-by-pitch, a .533 on-base percentage and a 1.091 slugging percentage (1.624 OPS) in 3 games.
LONG DIVISION...the Mariners play their first of 10 consecutive games against the American League West Division, their 3rd-longest intra-divisional streak this season...Seattle is 21-15 (.583) in 36 games against the AL West this season and 30-30 in 60 games outside the division...Seattle went 9-5 during a seasonhigh 14-game stretch against divisional opponents from May 24-June 6...the Mariners play their final 13 games of the regular season within the division.
LEFT ON LEFT...the Mariners lead the Majors in hits (111) by left-handed batters against left-handed pitchers this season...they rank ahead of Houston (99) and Tampa Bay (88)...they also lead the Majors total bases (174) in lefty-lefty matchups...they rank T2nd in doubles (22), 3rd in home runs (13), 2nd in RBI (53) and T1st in walks (43) with Los Angeles-NL and Tampa Bay...J.P. Crawford has 42 hits vs. lefties, which leads MLB among left-handed batters...he ranks ahead of Matt Olson-OAK (39) and Cedric Mullins-BAL (38)...Kyle Seager's 7 homers vs. left-handed pitchers are tied for 5th-most among lefties in the Majors. WINNING WITH A TY...Ty France is batting .429 ( $9 \times 21$ ) with 4 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 2 hit-by-pitches in his last 5 games...in 49 games since returning from the Injured List on May 24, the Mariners are 30-19 (.612) and Ty is batting .304 ( $56 \times 184$ ) with 22 runs, 12 doubles, 6 home runs, $29 \mathrm{RBI}, 10$ walks and 10 hit-by-pitches...he's gotten on-base at a .367 clip, slugging .467 with an .835 OPS in that span. TORREN' IT UP...Since returning from Triple-A Tacoma on June 15, Luis Torrens is batting . 280 (21x75) with 1 double, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 17 RBl and 12 walks...he's gotten on-base at a 379 clip, slugging .680 with a 1.059 OPS...Torrens' 680 slugging percentage is 4 th-highest in the Majors since June $15 . .$. Luis has compiled 1.0 WAR (FanGraphs) in that stretch, tied for most among MLB catchers with Elias Diaz-COL and Will Smith-LAD.
DON'T STOP RELIEVIN'...the Mariners bullpen tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball yesterday, led by Darren McCaughan ( 5.0 IP, 0 H, 1 ER, 3 BB ) in his MLB debut...Seattle's bullpen is $24-14$ with 26 saves and a 4.10 ERA ( 168 ER, 368.2 IP) with 327 hits allowed, 129 walks and 374 strikeouts...FanGraphs pegs Mariners relievers as the 2nd-most valuable by Wins Above Replacement (4.6) this season, trailing only Tampa Bay (4.7)...the bullpen's 3.53 Fielding Independent Pitching also ranks 2nd in the Majors to Tampa Bay (3.46). SLUGGING POSITION...the Mariners have the 2nd-highest slugging percentage (.478) in the Majors with runners in scoring position this season, trailing only Toronto (.485)...Seattle is batting . 266 (185x696) with RISP as a team, 8th-best in MLB...the Mariners are 1 of 2 AL clubs (other: Chicago) with 4 players batting .300 or better with RISP (min. 50 PA each): J.P. Crawford is batting .368 ( $21 \times 57$ ) with RISP, Ty France is batting .346 (27x78), Mitch Haniger is batting . 343 (23x67) and Kyle Seager is batting .304 (24x79).
AGAINST OAKLAND...Seattle is $3-3$ in 6 games against Oakland this season...the 13 remaining games against the Athletics are the most of any opponent for the Mariners (2nd-most: 12 remaining games against Houston)...Tom Murphy has a . 994 OPS in 5 games against the A's this season, batting .273 (3×11) with 2 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 2 walks.
THREE HOME RUNS...the Mariners homered 3 times in a game yesterday for the 12th time this season, matching their season-high...Kyle Seager, Luis Torrens and Mitch Haniger each hit solo blasts...it was the second time this season that Seattle scored 3 runs in a game all via the solo home run (also: 3-2 win on June 26 at Chicago-AL)...Taylor Trammell homered twice in that game and Ty France supplied the third home run at Guaranteed Rate Field.
54 PLAYERS... 54 players have appeared in a game for Seattle this season, most in the American League and tied for most in the Majors with the New York Mets... 31 have pitched for Seattle, tied for most in the American League with Toronto and tied for 3rd in the Majors, trailing Arizona (33) and New York-NL (32).

AS YOU KNOW...Chris Flexen is 6-2 with a 1.76 ERA (12 ER, 61.1 IP) with 10 walks and 43 strikeouts in 10 starts at T-Mobile Park this season...the 1.76 ERA is 2nd-best in franchise history through a Mariners pitcher's first 10 career starts at home, trailing only Joel Piñeiro's 1.40 ERA in his first 10 starts between 2001-02, but...DID YOU KNOW? ...that Flexen's 1.76 home ERA is 2 nd-best in the American League this season?...among AL pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched in their home ballpark in 2021, Flexen trails only Lance Lynn-CWS (1.50 ERA, 11 ER/66.0 IP)...the right-hander narrowly leads Kyle Gibson-TEX (1.77 ERA, 11 ER, 56.0 IP ).

- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-yea contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School.. made his Major League debut with New YorkNL on July 27, 2017 at San Diego
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012...played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the football team for 2 years.....was committed to Arizona State University before signing with the Mets.
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA (236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games (105 starts)...in 2013, was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
