Darren McCaughan made his Major League debut yesterday...became the 7th pitcher in MLB history (since 1901) to throw 5.0+ innings without allowing a hit in his debut and just the third reliever to do it.

Seattle relievers have registered 229 individual scoreless outings this season, leading the American League...they lead Boston (226) and Cleveland (225)

On a Roll - Seattle is 20-10 (.667) since June 13, tied for the best winning percentage in the Majors during that span with Houston (22-11).

 Happy Thursday - The Mariners are 38-21 (.644) between Thursday and Sunday this season, compared to 13-24 (.351) between Monday and Wednesday.
 MITCH PERFECT...Mitch Haniger has reached base safely in 20 consecutive games dating back to June 25, batting .333 (26x78) with 21 runs scored, 2 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI, 8 walks, 4 hit-by-pitches, a .418 on-base percentage and a .628 slugging percentage (1.046 OPS) during that span...among American League players with at least 60 percent of their games played in the outfield, Mitch ranks 1st in runs scored (66), 2nd in extra-base hits (41), 2nd in total bases (183), 2nd in home runs (23), 3rd in RBI (59), 3rd in hits (95) and T7th in doubles (17).

- Hitting Streak Holds an active 11-game hitting streak dating back to July 6...during the streak, is batting .366 (15x41) with 13 runs scored, 1 double, 5 home runs, 12 RBI, 5 walks and 2 hit-by-pitches.
- Player of the Week Named American League Player of the Week for the week ending on July 18...hit .455 (5x11) with 7 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 walks, 1 hit-by-pitch, a .533 on-base ercentage and a 1.091 slugging percentage (1.624 OPS) in 3 games.

LONG DIVISION... the Mariners play their first of 10 consecutive games against the American League West Division, their 3rd-longest intra-divisional streak this season...Seattle is 21-15 (.583) in 36 games against the AL West this season and 30-30 in 60 games outside the division...Seattle went 9-5 during a seasonhigh 14-game stretch against divisional opponents from May 24-June 6...the Mariners play their final 13 games of the regular season within the division.

<u>LEFT ON LEFT</u>...the Mariners lead the Majors in hits (111) by left-handed batters against left-handed pitchers this season...they rank ahead of Houston (99) and Tampa Bay (88)...they also lead the Majors total bases (174) in lefty-lefty matchups...they rank T2nd in doubles (22), 3rd in home runs (13), 2nd in RBI (53) and T1st in walks (43) with Los Angeles-NL and Tampa Bay...**J.P. Crawford** has 42 hits vs. lefties, which leads MLB among left-handed batters...he ranks ahead of Matt Olson-OAK (39) and Cedric Mullins-BAL (38)...**Kyle Seager**'s 7 homers vs. left-handed pitchers are tied for 5th-most among lefties in the Majors.

WINNING WITH A TY...Ty France is batting .429 (9x21) with 4 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 2 hit-by-pitches in his last 5 games...in 49 games since returning from the Injured List on May 24, the Mariners are 30-19 (.612) and Ty is batting .304 (56x184) with 22 runs, 12 doubles, 6 home runs, 29 RBI, 10 walks and 10 hit-by-pitches...he's gotten on-base at a .367 clip, slugging .467 with an .835 OPS in that span.

TORREN' IT UP...Since returning from Triple-A Tacoma on June 15, **Luis Torrens** is batting .280 (21x75) with 1 double, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 17 RBI and 12 walks...he's gotten on-base at a .379 clip, slugging .680 with a 1.059 OPS...Torrens' .680 slugging percentage is 4th-highest in the Majors since June 15...Luis has compiled 1.0 WAR (*FanGraphs*) in that stretch, tied for most among MLB catchers with Elias Diaz-COL and Will Smith-LAD.

DON'T STOP RELIEVIN'...the Mariners bullpen tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball yesterday, led by **Darren McCaughan** (5.0 IP, 0 H, 1 ER, 3 BB) in his MLB debut...Seattle's bullpen is 24-14 with 26 saves and a 4.10 ERA (168 ER, 368.2 IP) with 327 hits allowed, 129 walks and 374 strikeouts...FanGraphs pegs Mariners relievers as the 2nd-most valuable by Wins Above Replacement (4.6) this season, trailing only Tampa Bay (4.7)...the bullpen's 3.53 Fielding Independent Pitching also ranks 2nd in the Majors to Tampa Bay (3.46).

SLUGGING POSITION...the Mariners have the 2nd-highest slugging percentage (.478) in the Majors with runners in scoring position this season, trailing only Toronto (.485)...Seattle is batting .266 (185x696) with RISP as a team, 8th-best in MLB...the Mariners are 1 of 2 AL clubs (other: Chicago) with 4 players batting .300 or better with RISP (min. 50 PA each): J.P. Crawford is batting .368 (21x57) with RISP, Ty France is batting .346 (27x78), Mitch Haniger is batting .343 (23x67) and Kyle Seager is batting .304 (24x79).

AGAINST OAKLAND...Seattle is 3-3 in 6 games against Oakland this season...the 13 remaining games against the Athletics are the most of any opponent for the Mariners (2nd-most: 12 remaining games against Houston)...**Tom Murphy** has a .994 OPS in 5 games against the A's this season, batting .273 (3x11) with 2 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 2 walks.

THREE HOME RUNS...the Mariners homered 3 times in a game yesterday for the 12th time this season, matching their season-high...Kyle Seager, Luis Torrens and Mitch Haniger each hit solo blasts...it was the second time this season that Seattle scored 3 runs in a game all via the solo home run (also: 3-2 win on June 26 at Chicago-AL)...**Taylor Trammell** homered twice in that game and **Ty France** supplied the third home run at Guaranteed Rate Field.

54 PLAYERS....54 players have appeared in a game for Seattle this season, most in the American League and tied for most in the Majors with the New York Mets...31 have pitched for Seattle, tied for most in the American League with Toronto and tied for 3rd in the Majors, trailing Arizona (33) and New York-NL (32).

AS YOU KNOW...Chris Flexen is 6-2 with a 1.76 ERA (12 ER, 61.1 IP) with 10 walks and 43 strikeouts in 10 starts at T-Mobile Park this season...the 1.76 ERA is 2nd-best in franchise history through a Mariners pitcher's first 10 career starts at home, trailing only Joel Piñeiro's 1.40 ERA in his first 10 starts between 2001-02, but... DID YOU KNOW?...that Flexen's 1.76 home ERA is 2nd-best in the American League this season?...among AL pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched in their home ballpark in 2021, Flexen trails only Lance Lynn-CWS (1.50 ERA, 11 ER/66.0 IP)...the right-hander narrowly leads Kyle Gibson-TEX (1.77 ERA, 11 ER, 56.0 IP).

ABOUT FLEXEN...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 29th career start (45th appearance), his 18th start of 2021 and 2nd vs. Oakland
- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-year contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020.
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB $\,$ First-Year Player Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School. made his Major League debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at San Diego.
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012...played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the football team for 2 years.....was committed to Arizona State University before signing with the
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA (236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games (105 starts)...in 2013, was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
- Toronto was the 22nd team Flexen faced in his career...has not faced: Baltimore, Chicago-AL, Kansas City, New York-AL, New York-NL, Pittsburgh, Seattle, Toronto and Washington.
- In his Mariners debut on April 3, 2021, became the 900th Seattle Mariners player in franchise history.
- Seattle is 13-4 in his 17 starts this season...his 3.51 ERA in the first half of the season was the 12th-lowest in the American League...his 1.85 walk per 9.0 inning ratio was the 6th-lowest in the AL.

AST OUTING...W#9 in 6-5 Mariners win July 16 at LAA...defeated Angels in back-to-back starts allowing 1 ER in 14.0 IP...tossed 7.0 innings allowing with only damage coming on a solo HR in the 2nd...the Mariners are now 13-4 in Flexen's 17 starts this season.

STREAKER...is riding a career-best 4-game winning streak...since June 15, Flex is 4-0, 1.36 (39.2 IP, 6 ER) in 6 starts...has struck out 29 while walking just 8 and has limited opposing hitters to a .200 BAA...during this stretch has lowered his ERA from 4.68 to 3.35...since June 15, Flexen's 1.36 ERA is the best in the Major Leagues...his previous career-best winning streak was 3 games (4/24-5/14/21).

EARNED ... entering play today, his 3.35 ERA ranked 10th in the AL.

TRYING FOR 4th of JULY ... is 3-0, 0.90 (20.0 IP, 2 ER) in 3 GS in month of July this year...has struck out 13 while allowing just 3 walks.

<u>CAREER DAY</u>...earned win #6 this season against Minnesota after setting career highs in innings pitched, strikeouts and pitches thrown... went 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing 4 hits, striking out 8 without walking a batter...26 BF in 8.0 IP...threw 107 pitches, 77 for strikes. **HOME COOKIN**¹...has posted a 1.76 ERA (12 ER, 61.1 IP) with 10 walks and 43 strikeouts in 10 starts at T-Mobile Park this season, compared to a 5.92 ERA (26 ER, 38.0 IP) with 10 walks and 22 strikeouts in 7 games on the road...his 4.16 differential between road and home ERA is the largest in the Majors this season...Flexen's

1.76 ERA at home this season is 3rd-best in the Majors this season, trailing only Jacob deGrom-NYM (1.20) and Lance Lynn-CWS (1.50). **SAFE AT HOME**...Flexen is 6-2 with a 1.76 ERA (12 ER, 61.1 IP) in his first 10 home starts with the Mariners... his 1.76 ERA is the lowest in club history through a player's first 10 home starts of a season, ranking ahead of

Erik Hanson (1.93 in 1993) and Randy Johnson (2.07 in 1997).

BEHIND THE PLATE...Flexen has made 6 starts with Luis Torrens behind the dish, 9 starts with Tom Murphy behind the plate, 1 start with Jose Godoy as the catcher and 1 start with Cal Raleigh calling signs...in his 6 starts with Torrens as his battery mate, Flexen is 4-1 with a 1.87 ERA (7 ER, 33.2 IP) while walking 5 and striking out 21...he is 4-2 with a 4.44 ERA (26 ER, 52.2 IP) in 9 starts with Murphy, 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 iP) with Godoy and 1-0, 1.29 (1 ER, 7.0 IP) with Raleigh.

#100..recorded his 100th career strikeout when he struck out Cavan Biggio on 6/29 against Toronto.

FIRST WIN...earned his first win as a Mariner in his first Mariners start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts on April 3 vs. San Francisco...became first Mariners pitcher to throw 5.0+ scoreless innings in his debut with the team since LH Wade LeBlanc threw 6.0 scoreless IP on June 24, 2016 in his Mariners debut in a 4-3 win vs. St. Louis...marked Flexen's first win in the Majors in 1,319 days (Oct. 1, 2017 w/New York-NL at Philadelphia).

DOMINATING THE KBO...spent the 2020 season with the Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization and went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA (39 ER 116.2 IP) with 30 walks and 132 strikeouts over 21 starts...struck out 28% of batters faced, the 4th-highest rate in the KBO.

PLAYOFF MVP...posted a 1.91 ERA (6 ER, 28.1 IP) in the KBO playoffs, while pitching in both starting and relieving rolls.. named series MVP of the semi-finals after tossing 10.1 innings and allowing 2 earned runs with 13 strikeouts in one start and one relief appearance... started Game 1 for Doosan and tossed 7.1 IP of 2-run ball...came out of the bullpen in Game 4 on 3 days rest and tossed 3.0 scoreless IP.

RACKKKK 'EM UP...tallied 10+ strikeouts in 4 starts while pitching for Doosan in the Korean Baseball Organization during the 2020 season...ended the season with back-to-back games of 10+ Ks (10/20 at Lotte: 12 K & 10/27 vs. Hanwha: 10 K)...tallied a season-high 13 strikeouts on 9/22 at Hanwha.

W#1...earned his first career Major League win with the Mets on Aug. 8, 2017 vs. Texas.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP YUSEI KIKUCHI (6-5, 3.92)

30-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, his 58th Major League start and his 8th career start vs. A's...named to 2021 ASG, but did not pitch...has 11 quality starts and a .204 BAA...L#5, his 2nd straight, in last start, July 17 at LAA (5.0,9,7,7,1,7,HR-2)...has struck out at least 10 batters twice this season: 4/2 vs. SF (6.0,6,3,3,1,10,2HR) and 5/11 at LAD (6.1,6,3,3,1,11,HR)...Historic Debut...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome...while with the Seibu Lions, started against the Yomiuri Giants on June 8, 2018 at the Tokyo Dome; earned the win, going 7.0 scoreless innings and scattering 2 hits and 3 walks while striking out 3...in 2011, made a 1.0-inning relief appearance against the Giants in a preseason game...vs. OAK...is 1-2 despite a 2.54 ERA in 7 career GS vs. A's...is making 2nd start vs. OAK this season; won 4-2 May 24 at OAK (6.0,4,1,1,2,3,HR).
