TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7 -game homestand with the second of 4 games vs. Oakland (0-1), followed by 3 games vs. Houston (7/26-7/28)...coming off a winning road trip (3-2) against Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Colorado (1-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS, as well as broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 6-4 in their last 10 games, 17-10 over their last 27, 20-11 over their last 31 and 30-20 over their last 50...are 20-13 in day games and 31-33 at night...are 29-21 at T-Mobile Park and 22-25 on the road...are 42-14 when scoring at least 4 runs and 9-32 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 37-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- In All Series-ness - Seattle has won or split 9 of its last 10 series dating back to June 14-16 vs. MIN... overall, Seattle is 15-11-5 in series this season.
- Happy Friday - The Mariners are 38-22 (.633) between Thursday and Sunday this season, compared to 13-24 (.351) between Monday and Wednesday.
- Scoreless - RH Erik Swanson (9.2 IP), RH Drew Steckenrider (7.0 IP) and RH JT Chargois (5.2) each have active scoreless innings streaks of at least 5 innings...Swanson's 9.2 scoreless innings streak is T11th-longest active in the Major Leagues, T4th-longest in the American League.
- Walk This Way - Kyle Seager (507) is 10 walks away from tying Ichiro Suzuki (517) for 5th-most walks in Mariners franchise history.
- Double Double - Mitch Haniger is 5 doubles away from 100 doubles in his career.
- 7000 - The Mariners played their 7,000th game last night...Seattle is $3,297-3,701$ in their first 7,000 games in franchise history.
LONG DIVISION...the Mariners play their second of 10 consecutive games against the American League West Division, their 3rd-longest intra-divisional streak this season...Seattle is 21-16 (.568) in 37 games against the AL West this season and $30-30$ in 60 games outside the division...Seattle went $9-5$ during a season-high 14-game stretch against divisional opponents from May 24-June 6...the Mariners play their final 13 games of the regular season within the division.
OAKTOWN BULLY...Yusei Kikuchi is $1-2$ with a 2.54 ERA ( $11 \mathrm{ER}, 39.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 7 career start vs. the A's... he has limited opponents to a . 239 ( $34 \times 142$ ) average while walking 11 and striking out $31 \ldots$ over the last 2 seasons, Kikuchi has limited the Athletics to only 1 run over 18.0 innings in 3 starts ( $8 / 1 / 20-\mathrm{c}$ )...during this 3 -game stretch he is $1-0$ with a $.183(11 \times 60)$ average while walking 6 and striking out $17 \ldots$...his 0.50 ERA vs. the A's since 2020 is the 4th-lowest ERA vs. a single opponent (min 15.0 IP) in the Major Leagues, trailing Anthony DeSclafani-CIN/SF vs. Washington ( $0.00 / 15.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and vs. Colorado ( $0.00 / 15.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and Austin Gomber-COL vs. San Diego (0.47/19.1 IP).
GETTING SERIOUS...since June 14, the Mariners are 7-1-2 (.800) in their last 10 series...during this stretch their winning percentage in series is the highest in the Major Leagues ranking ahead of Detroit (7-21/.750), Los Angeles Dodgers (7-3-0/.700), New York Yankees (7-3-0/.700) and San Francisco (7-3-0/.700). START ME UP...dating back to May 24, the Mariners starters are 22-3 with a 2.16 ERA (38 ER, 158.0 IP) in 25 starts when the pitcher tosses at least 5.1 innings, compared to $8-17$ in games in which the starter tosses 5.0 innings or fewer...last night's loss by Chris Flexen snapped a string of 15 consecutive wins by a Mariners starter recording at least 1 out in the 6th inning (June 13-July 18)...it was the longest such streak in club history.
OLYMPICS...the Tokyo 2020 Olympics kicked off Friday with the Opening Ceremony - almost a year to the day from their intended start date in July 2020...the Mariners have 4 players currently on National League rosters for the Olympics in Japan...INF/OF Eric Filia-AAA Tacoma (Team USA), OF Julio Rodriguez-AA Arkansas (Team Dominican Republic), RHP Zack Weiss-AAA Tacoma and RHP Alon Leichman-AA Arkansas Pitching Coach (Team Israel)...The Olympic Games baseball tournament opens Wednesday, July 28. The United States, Dominican Republic, Israel, Japan, Korea, and Mexico all qualified for the 6-team field.
WINNING WITH A TY...Ty France is batting . 400 ( $10 \times 22$ ) with 4 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 2 hit-by-pitches in his last 6 games...in 50 games since returning from the Injured List on May 24 , the Mariners are $30-20$ (.600) and Ty is batting .303 ( $57 \times 188$ ) with 22 runs, 12 doubles, 6 home runs, 29 RBI, 10 walks and 10 hit-by-pitches...he's gotten on-base at a 365 clip, slugging .463 with an .828 OPS in that span. HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...since May 27, INF Ty France has reached base safely in 23 of his last 26 home games, including 20 games with at least 1 hit...during this stretch, he is batting .326 (30x92) with 12 runs scored, 7 doubles, 3 home runs, 17 RBI, 2 HBP and 7 walks...his .329 home batting average during this stretch is the 7th-highest in the American League, trailing David Fletcher-LAA (.400/34x85), Cedric Mullins-BAL (.360/27x75), Jonathan Schoop-DET (.344/33x96), Tim Anderson-CWS (.343/35x102), Whit Merrifield-KC (.333/29x87) and Randy Arozarena-TB (.329/24x73).
TORREN' IT UP...since returning from Triple-A Tacoma on June 15, Luis Torrens is batting . 278 (22x79) with 15 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 17 RBI and 12 walks...he's gotten on-base at a .374 clip, slugging .658 with a 1.032 OPS...Torrens' .658 slugging percentage is 4 th-highest in the Majors since June 15 (min. 90 PA), trailing Shohei Ohtani-LAA (.815), Joey Gallo-TEX (.699) and Trea Turner-WAS (.675).
DOMINATE THE ZONE...since June 11, Anthony Misiewicz has held opponents scoreless in 11 of his 14 appearances, going 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER, 13.0 IP)...during this stretch he has limited opponents to a $.174(8 \times 46)$ average, while walking 2 and striking out 15 .
SLUGGING POSITION...the Mariners have the 2nd-highest slugging percentage (.476) in the Majors with runners in scoring position this season, trailing only Toronto (.485)...Seattle is batting 264 (184x697) with RISP as a team, 8th-best in MLB...the Mariners are 1 of 2 AL clubs (other: Chicago) with 4 players batting .300 or better with RISP (min. 50 PA each): J.P. Crawford is batting . 368 ( $21 \times 57$ ) with RISP, Mitch Haniger is batting .343 ( $23 \times 67$ ), Ty France is batting .342 ( $27 \times 79$ ) and Kyle Seager is batting .304 ( $24 \times 79$ ).
54 PLAYERS... 54 players have appeared in a game for Seattle this season, most in the American League and tied for most in the Majors with the New York Mets... 31 have pitched for Seattle, tied for most in the American League with Toronto and tied for 3rd in the Majors, trailing Arizona (33) and New York-NL (32).

AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Seager has hit 18 home runs this season, 2nd-most on the Mariners trailing only Mitch Haniger's 23 home runs...he is 2 home runs away from recording his 9th season with at least 20 home runs... AND AS YOU MAY KNOW....since 2012, Seager is 1 of 3 active Major League players with 8 seasons with at least 20 home runs, joining Mike Trout ( 8 HR in 2021) and Nelson Cruz (19 HR in 2021)...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?...with 2 more home runs, Seager would tie Ken Griffey Jr. (9) for the most seasons in club history with at least 20 home runs?...Edgar Martinez and Jay Buhner each had 8 seasons with at least 20 home runs.

- 30-year-old left-hander is making his 18th start of the season, his 59th Major League start and his 8th career start vs. the Oakland Athletics (second this year).
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan... pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School.
- Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu Lions of Japan's Pacific League.
- In 7 seasons with Seibu, was $69-45$ with a 2.69 ERA ( 286 ER, 956.1 IP ) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games ( 144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.
LAST OUTING...allowed a career-high tying 7 runs on July 17 at Los Angeles-AL, surrendering 9 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...has lost back-to-back decisions for the first time this season after posting a career-high 5 -game winning streak from May 24 - July 1.
STREAK...ran off a career-best 5-game winning streak May 24-July 1...over the 7-start run, was 5-0, 1.87 (9 ER, 43.1 IP ) with 40 strikeouts...included a 4-start stretch June 12-July 1 in which he posted a 1.01 ERA and 24 strikeouts in 26.2 innings...the last Mariners pitcher with that low of an ERA and that many strikeouts over a 4-start span was Félix Hernández in Sept. 2014 (0.96 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 28.0 innings (via Elias Sport Bureau).
ALL-STAR...named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career on July 4...was on AL club but did not pitch...is the 14th Japanese-born player to be selected to participate in a Major League Baseball All-Star Game... of the 14 Japanese-born players to make a Major League All-Star roster, 5 have been in a Seattle uniform: Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x), Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hisashi Iwakuma and Yusei Kikuchi...of the 30 total Japanese-born selections, exactly one-half (15) have been Mariners.
CONSISTENT QUALITY...has 11 quality starts this season, T5th-most among AL starters: 14-Gerrit Cole; 13-Robbie Ray and Chris Bassitt; 12-Kyle Gibson; 11-Yusei Kikuchi, Sean Manaea \& Shane Bieber.
WHAT A MONTH...Kikuchi went 2-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 ER, 23.2 IP) in 4 starts in June, while limiting opponents to a . 181 (15x83) average, walking 10 and striking out 26...among American League starters his 1.90 June ERA was 3rd-lowest, trailing only Sean Manaea-OAK (1.13) and Kyle Gibson-TEX (1.52).
THAT'S QUALITY...recorded a quality start in 6 consecutive outings from April 29 May 30, marking the longest quality start streak of his career...left the game in the top of the 5 th inning on June 5 at Los Angeles-AL, after getting hit by a line drive comebacker, ending the streak having tossed 4.0 innings while striking out 8 with 64 pitches (48 strikes).
