TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7-game homestand with the 3rd of 4 games vs. Oakland (1-1), followed by 3 games vs. Houston (7/26-7/28)...coming off a winning road trip (3-2) against Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Colorado (1-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS**, as well as broadcast on **710** ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners evened the series last night with a 4-3 win...are 7-4 in their last 11 games, 18-10 over their last 28, 21-11 over their last 32 and 31-20 over their last 51...are 20-13 in day games and 32-33 at night...are 30-21 at T-Mobile Park and 22-25 on the road...are 43-14 when scoring at least 4 runs and 9-32 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 37-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Great Scott! Mariners manager Scott Servais won his 400th game as Seattle skipper...he becomes the 2nd manager in franchise history to reach the 400-win mark, joining Lou Piniella (840 wins).
- I'm Gonna Be Your #1 The Mariners are 21-8 (.724) in 1-run games this season, leading the Majors by a wide margin...Boston and Cincinnati are tied for 2nd-best winning percentage in 1-run games (.643)...Seattle also owns the most 1-run wins (21), leading the New York Mets (19).
- Yesterday RHP Casey Sadler was reinstated from the 60-day IL...RHP Rafael Montero was designated for assignment.
- Connect Four Kyle Seager has hit safely in his last 4 games (7/20-c), which ties a season-high.
 Saturday in the Park The Mariners are 39-22 (.639) between Thursday and Sunday this season, compared to 13-24 (.351) between Monday and Wednesday.
 SERIES OF FORTUNATE EVENTS...the Mariners have won or split 9 of their last 10 series since June

14...are 7-1-2 over their last 10...during this stretch their winning percentage in series is the highest in the Major Leagues ranking ahead of Detroit (7-2-1), Los Angeles Dodgers (7-3-0), New York Yankees (7-3-0) and San Francisco (7-3-0).

SO CAL IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST...Cal Raleigh hit his first career Major League home run last night, a 2-run homer in the 2nd inning that was estimated at 444 feet (Statcast)...only Jake Burger of the Chicago White Sox has hit a first career Major League home run further (456' on July 17) this season.

TORREN' IT UP...Luis Torrens hit his 12th home run of the season last night, equaling his career-high 5-game hitting streak in the process...since June 15, Torrens is batting .277 (23x83) with 16 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks...he's gotten on-base at a .368 clip, slugging .675 with a 1.043 OPS in that span...since June 15, his .675 slugging percentage ranks 3rd in the AL and 4th in the Majors behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (.815), Adam Duvall-MIA (.678) and Joey Gallo-TEX (.677) among players with at least 80 plate appearances...he is also 1 of 10 MLB players with at least 10 home runs since June 15.

BACK "2" BACK...Raleigh and Torrens hit back-to-back home runs in the 2nd inning last night...became the 2nd pair of Mariners to hit back-to-back home runs this season...**Tom Murphy** and Jacob Nottingham hit back-to-back homers on May 27 vs. Texas in the 3rd inning...all 4 of the players involved in Seattle's 2 pairs of back-to-back home runs this season are catchers by trade...in both instances, the catcher (Murphy on 5/27, Raleigh yesterday) homered first, followed by a home run from that day's first baseman (Nottingham on 5/27, Torrens yesterday).

WOOLY BULLY-PEN...the Mariners bullpen tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in last night's 4-3 win...Seattle's bullpen is 25-14 with 27 saves and a 4.08 ERA (170 ER, 375.1 IP) with 333 hits allowed, 135 walks and 383 strikeouts...FanGraphs pegs Mariners relievers as the 2nd-most valuable by Wins Above Replacement (4.7) this season, trailing only Tampa Bay (5.0)...the bullpen's 3.54 Fielding Independent Pitching also ranks 2nd in the Majors to Tampa Bay (3.44).

WHIFF OR WHIFFOUT YOU...the Mariners pitching staff tallied a season-high 18 strikeouts last night...
Yusei Kikuchi led the charge with a career-high 12 strikeouts in his start, the most for a Mariners starter since James Paxton struck out 16 on May 2, 2018 vs. Oakland...relievers Erik Swanson (1 K), Paul Sewald (3 K) and Kendall Graveman (2 K) also contributed...the 18 strikeouts were the most for Seattle since Sept. 1, 2018 when they struck out 18 as a staff at Oakland...3 of Seattle's last 4 games registering at least 16 strikeouts in a game have come against the Athletics.

LONG DIVISION...the Mariners play the 3rd of 10 consecutive games against the American League West Division, their 3rd-longest intra-divisional streak this season...Seattle is 22-16 (.579) in 38 games against the AL West this season and 30-30 in 60 games outside the division...Seattle went 9-5 during a seasonhigh 14-game stretch against divisional opponents from May 24-June 6...the Mariners play their final 13 games of the regular season within the division.

TY GOES TO THE HITTER...Ty France reached base 3 times last night, going 2-for-3 with a double and walk...is batting .429 (12x28) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 2 hit-by-pitches in his last 7 games...in 51 games since returning from the Injured List on May 24, the Mariners are 31-20 (.608) and Ty is batting .309 (59x191) with 23 runs, 13 doubles, 6 home runs, 29 RBI, 11 walks and 10 hit-by-pitches... he's gotten on-base at a .372 clip, slugging .471 with an .843 OPS in that span.

BACK ON TRACK...Mitch Haniger went 1-for-4 last night...he has reached base safely in 21 of his last 22 games since June 25...in that span, Mitch is batting .314 (27x86) with 21 runs, 2 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI, 8 walks and 4 hit-by-pitches...he's also hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games since July 6.

SIDE OF GRAVY...Kendall Graveman recorded his 10th save of the season last night, tossing a scoreless 9th...the right-hander is 2-0 with 10 saves and a 0.87 ERA (3 ER, 31.0 IP) with 15 hits allowed, 7 walks and 31 strikeouts this season...his 0.71 WHIP leads the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 IP... Graveman's .144 (15x104) opponent batting average also leads the American League.

BE MIZ...since June 11, **Anthony Misiewicz** has held opponents scoreless in 11 of his 14 appearances, going 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER, 13.0 IP)...during this stretch he has limited opponents to a .174 (8x46) batting average, while walking 2 and striking out 15.

SLUGGING POSITION...the Mariners have the 3rd-highest slugging percentage (.473) in MLB with runners in scoring position this season, trailing Toronto (.485) and Houston (.474)...Seattle is batting .263 (185x704) with RISP as a team, 9th-best in MLB...the Mariners are 1 of 2 AL clubs (other: Chicago) with 4 players batting .300 or better with RISP (min. 50 PA each): **J.P. Crawford** is batting .362 (21x58) with RISP, **Mitch** Haniger is batting .343 (23x67), Ty France is batting .338 (27x80) and Kyle Seager is batting .304 (24x79).

AS YOU KNOW...Logan Gilbert takes the mound for Seattle tonight...the Mariners are 9-2 as a team in Gilbert's first 11 career starts...they have rattled off 9 consecutive victories in Gilbert starts since May 25 at Oakland, after dropping each of his first 2 starts...**BUT, DID YOU KNOW?**...that the 9 consecutive team wins in his starts rank T5th in Mariners history?...Gilbert is currently tied with Jim Beattie (9 straight team wins, 5/25-7/5/1982) and Jamie Moyer (9, 8/11-9/19/1997)...he trails 4 streaks: Moyer (13, 7/18-9/24/2001), Aaron Sele (13, 4/4-6/12/2001) and Randy Johnson twice within the same season (10, 4/27-14/2001). 6/10/1995 and 8/11-10/02/1995)...statistic via Stats Perform.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT ...

- 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make the 12th start of his Major League career, and 3rd start against the Oakland Athletics
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau
- Named to the Mariners 60-man roster prior to the start of the 2020 season...spent season pitching at Mariners Alternate site in Tacoma
- In 2019, split season between A West Virginia (4/4-5/1), High-A Modesto (5/2-7/14), and Double-A Arkansas (July 15-end), going 10-5 with a 2.13 ERA (32 ER, 135.0 IP) in 26 combined starts in first professional season.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Among all MiL pitchers in 2019, ranked 3rd in ERA (2.13), 5th in average (.198), T7th in strikeouts (165), while his 10 wins were 2nd-most among all Mariners farmhands.

D ED DD SO UD

LAST OUTING... W#4 in Mariners 7-4 over the Angels on July 18 at Angel Stadium...allowed 2 runs on 4 hits while walking 2 and striking out a career-high 9 batters in 5.1 innings...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings before allowing 2 runs in the bottom of the 6th inning...the Mariners are 9-2 in his 11 starts, including winning each of his last 9 starts.

WHAT A STRETCH...dating back to May 31, Gilbert is 4-0 with a 2.49 ERA (12 ER, 43.1 IP) in his last 8 starts...during this stretch he has limited opponents to a .185 (28x151) average, while walking 10 and striking out 51...his 2.49 ERA during this stretch is the 2nd-lowest in the American League, trailing only Sean Manaea-OAK (2.41).

SHUT OUT...W#3 in 4-0 win over the Yankees on July 8 at T-Mobile Park... struck out 8 over 7.0 scoreless innings allowing just 1 hit and 1 hit by pitch... became the 2nd-youngest pitcher in franchise history to toss 7.0 or more shutout innings while allowing 1 hit or less.

<u>HALF CENTURY</u>...became the 6th pitcher in franchise history to tally at least 50 strikeouts through his first 10 career games on July 8 vs. New York-AL.

QUALITY...first career quality start on May 31 vs. OAK...received a no-decision despite leaving with 4-2 lead after tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 2 earned runs on 5 hits...matched career-high with 5 strikeouts.

MLB DEBUT...made his MLB debut on May 13 vs. CLE...threw 4.0 innings and allowed 4 earned runs on 5 hits and no walks with 5 strikeouts and 2 home runs in 4-2 loss...was tagged with the loss...tossed 71 pitches (52 strikes) and two wild pitches...notched his first career strikeout in the 3rd inning (Céasar Hernández)...became the 42nd Mariners pitcher to start in MLB debut, the first since Justin Dunn, Sept. 12, 2019 vs. CIN.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER...Logan Gilbert (#28) and Jarred Kelenic (#4) made their Major League debuts on May 13 vs. Cleveland, becoming the highest ranking duo to debut in the same game since MLB.com began prospect rankings in 2020...there have only been 2 other instances where multi-

pect rankings in 2020...there have only been 2 other instances where multiple top-100 prospects debuted for the same team in the same game...on July 23, 2013, outfielders Jake Marisnick (#70) and Christian Yelich (#13)

both debuted for Miami...on Sept. 21, 2016, outfielders Manuel Margot (#45) and Hunter Renfroe (#92) both debuted for San Diego.

LAST MILB OUTING...earned his 1st AAA win of the MiL season on May 7 vs. El Paso Chihuahuas...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed 1 run on 4 hits

and no walks with 5 strikeouts in 8-2 Rainier win...left game with 3-1 lead after the 5th inning having thrown 77 pitches (47 strikes).

PROSPECT PEDIGREE...was rated as the No. 28 overall prospect on MLB Pipeline's 2021 Top-100 Prospects List as the time of his call up...is the highest rated pitching prospect to appear for the Mariners since Taijuan Walker (No. 4) made his debut in 2013 season.

TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...during the 2019 season, was named Pitcher of the Week twice en route to being named an All-Star for both the California (Single-A) League and Texas (Double-A) League, as well as an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star...rated as the #4 Prospect in the Texas League and the #7 Prospect in the California League by Baseball America following the season.

<u>ALMOST A DOZEN</u>...tallied a career-high 11 strikeouts on May 19, 2019 with Modesto at the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed only 2 hits without issuing a walk...has struck out at least 5 batters in 22 of 27 career minor league starts.

<u>PITCHER OF THE YEAR</u>...received the Jamie Moyer Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award following the 2019 season...was honored in a pregame ceremony at T-Mobile Park along with other minor league award winners in the Mariners farm system on Sept. 27, 2019.

2019 RECAP...made his professional debut, splitting the season between A West Virginia (4/4-5/1), High-A Modesto (5/2-7/13), and Double-A Arkansas (July 15-end), going 10-5 with a 2.13 ERA (32 Er, 135.0 IP) in 26 combined starts in first professional season...limited opponents to a .198 (95x481) average, while walking 33 and striking out 165...among all minor league pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 3rd in ERA (2.13), 5th in average (.198), T7th in strikeouts (165), while his 10 wins were 2nd-most among all Mariners farmhands

AMONG STETSON ROYALTY...Gilbert is 1 of 4 active Stetson University players in the Major Leagues, joining Jacob deGrom, Corey Kluber, and Patrick Mazeika, which places Gilbert alongside 2 Cy Young Award winners...was the first pitcher from Stetson to be taken in the 1st round, and 1st Hatters 1st-rounder since 2003 (Brian Snyder)...drafted as highest pick in Stetson history at #14...during his 3 seasons with Stetson, Gilbert was 23-3 with a 2.48 ERA... started in 33 of his 52 appearances, and pitched a total of 250.2 innings for the Hatters...ranks 1st in Stetson history for lowest opponent batting average (.201), 2nd in most strikeouts per 9 innings (11.24), 4th in most strikeouts (313), and 1st in most strikeouts looking (84)...in final season with the Hatters, he ranked 1st in the nation in fewest hits allowed per 9 innings (5.4), 2nd in total strikeouts (163), 4th in ERA (2.72), and 4th in WHIP (0.80).

CAREER....selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau...has appeared in parts of 2 Minor League seasons in the Mariners organization (2019 & 2021), going 11-5 with a 2.12 ERA (33 ER, 140 IP) with 33 walks and 170 strikeouts in 27 career starts.
