TODAY'S TILT ... the Mariners continue a 3-city, 10-game road trip (5-1) with the last of 4 games against the Oakland Athletics (3-0)...are coming off a series win at Kansas City (2-1)...will begin a 3-game series at Los Angeles-AL starting tomorrow night...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW**, as well as broadcast on **710 ESPN** and the **Mariners Radio Network**. ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Athletics by a 4-1 score last night...the Mariners have won

4 consecutive games and 5 of their last 6...are 13-7 over their last 20 games, 20-13 over their last 33, 24-14 over their last 38, 25-15 over their last 40, 27-20 over their last 47, 32-23 over their last 55, 38-27 over their last 65, 49-33 over their last 82, 52-34 over their last 86 and 62-43 over their last 105...are 32-22 in day games and 51-47 at night...are 42-33 at T-Mobile Park and 41-36 on the road...are 67-25 when scoring at least 4 runs and 16-44 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 55-9 when out-hitting their opponent.

- High Water Mark The Mariners (83-69) are a <u>season-high 14 games above .500</u> for the first time this season...they are 14+ games above .500 for the first time since they closed the 2018 season at 89-73.

- High 5 Seattle looks to match a season-high 5-game winning streak (done 3x) with a victory today.
 Finishing Strong Seattle has won 8 of its last 10 series finales.
 Joy Division Seattle is 40-26 (.606) against the AL West Division this season.
 Series Record The Mariners own a 17-9-2 series record since June 14, winning or splitting 19 of their
- last 28...the Mariners own a 25-19-5 overall series record this season. **Road House** Seattle has won 5 of its last 7 road series since Aug. 17

1-Run Games - The Mariners are 31-18 (.633) in 1-run games, leading MLB with 31 one-run victories. SEAGER REACHES 35 HR, 100 RBI...Kyle Seager went 3-for-5 with a double and home run last night... his 4th inning homer was his 35th home run and 100th RBI of the season, setting a career-high (previous high 99 RBI in 2016)....Seager is the 9th Mariners player to hit 35+ home runs in a season and the first since Nelson Cruz hit 37 in 2018...Seager is the <u>17th Mariners player to reach 100+ RBI</u> in a season and the first since Cruz had 119 RBI in 2017...Seager is 1 of 9 Mariners with at least 35 home runs and 100 RBI in the same season, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (5x), Alex Rodriguez (4x), Jay Buhner (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Nelson Cruz (2x), Edgar Martinez, Richie Sexson and Robinson Cano.

THAT WOULD BE SWEEP ... the Mariners go for their 6th series sweep of the season ... they earned series sweeps vs. Texas (4 G, 5/27-5/30), vs. Tampa Bay (4 G, 6/17-6/20), at Texas (3 G, 8/17-8/19), at Oakland (2 G, 8/23-8/24) and at Arizona (3 G, 9/3-9/5)...with a win today, Seattle would join Houston (4) and Tampa Bay (3) as the only American League teams with at least 3 four-game series sweeps this season.

BRING YOUR A-GAME...Seattle has won 8 consecutive games against Oakland and 5 consecutive games at the Oakland Coliseum...the Mariners are 7-1 at the Coliseum this season, 1 win away from matching their most wins (8) at the Coliseum in a season, done twice (2007, 2016)...the Mariners have won 8 consecutive games against the A's, matching a franchise record for most consecutive victories against them...they also won 8 consecutive games against Oakland from May 17-Sept. 26, 2017.

ROAD IS WHERE THE HEART IS...the Mariners are 16-5 in their last 21 road games...their .762 road winning percentage is best in the American League since Aug. 8 and 3rd-best in the Majors to San Francisco (.824/14-3) and St. Louis (.773/17-5)...it is the Mariners best 21-game road stretch since they went 16-5 in 21 road games from Sept. 14, 2018-April 20, 2019.

IT STARTS WITH STARTING PITCHING...the Mariners starting rotation has recorded 4 consecutive quality starts for the first time this season...Logan Gilbert, Tyler Anderson, Marco Gonzales and Chris Flexen have combined to go 4-0 with a 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP) with 5 walks and 23 strikeouts over the Mariners last 4 games...the 1.67 starter's ERA is lowest in the Majors over that span.

ZONE DOMINATION ... since August 1, the Mariners pitching staff has the fewest walks (115) and lowest walks-per-9 innings (2.41) in the Majors...in 47 games since August 1, the pitching staff has the 2ndhighest strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.28) in the American League, trailing only Toronto (3.42).

JUST FRANCE...**Ty France** reached base 3 times last night, going 2-for-4 with 2 runs scored, his 17th home run of the season, an RBI and his 25th hit-by-pitch...he's hit safely in 8 of his last 9 games...this season, France is batting .293 (157x536) with 77 runs, 29 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 65 RBI, 40 walks and 25 hit-by-pitches, getting on-base at a .366 clip, slugging .446 with an .812 OPS...he's batting .331 (80x242) since the All-Star Break.

SADLER'S STREAK...**Casey Sadler** has not allowed a run over his last 23 appearances since July 27...the streak has spanned 20.2 innings, with Sadler walking 4 and striking out 16 during the streak... opponents are batting just .136 (9x66) against him in that stretch...his 23-game scoreless streak is 2ndlongest in franchise history, trailing only Shigetoshi Hasegawa's franchise record 25-game scoreless streak...Hasegawa did not allow a run in 25 consecutive appearances from June 3-Aug. 17, 2003.

J.K....Jarred Kelenic drew 2 walks last night...in 19 September games, the rookie is batting .257 (18x70) with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 15 RBI, 8 walks and 2 stolen bases...he's gotten on-base at a .333 clip, slugging .600 with a .933 OPS...his 6 home runs, 13 runs scored and 42 total bases lead American League rookies during the month, while his 15 RBI are tied for the lead with Bobby Dalbec-BOS. TOM MURPH-A...Tom Murphy went 2-for-4 with a run batted in last night...in 11 games against Oakland this season, Murphy is batting .400 (12x30) with 4 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 7 RBI and 6 walks, slugging .633 in 37 plate appearances against the A's.

WINNING MONTHS...the Mariners are 12-7 in September...they finished August 15-13 (.536), their 3rd straight winning month...the Mariners went 14-12 (.538) in June and 14-10 (.583) in July...Seattle last recorded 3 consecutive winning months from March/April-June 2017...this season, the Mariners have put together a winning record in 4 of 5 months...they went 15-12 (.556) in April and 13-15 (.464) in May...the Mariners have put together a winning record in 5 of their last 6 months, going 12-11 (.522) in Sept. 2020. WINNING SEASON ... the Mariners won their 82nd game of the season on Wednesday night, securing the 15th winning season in franchise history...Seattle has finished above .500 in 1991, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2007, 2009, 2014, 2016, 2018 and now 2021.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners have won 4 consecutive games, outscoring their opponents by a 20-6 advantage during that stretch, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the 6 runs allowed over the 4-game stretch matches a season-low by Seattle pitching?...the Mariners allowed 6 runs over a 4-game span earlier this season from May 27-30 when they swept the Texas Rangers in a 4-game series at T-Mobile Park...the fewest runs the Mariners have allowed over a 5-game span this season is 9 runs, from Aug. 8-13 at New Vorth (A) (9/0)... York-AL (8/8), vs. Texas (8/10-8/12) and vs. Toronto (8/13), with the Mariners going 4-1 in those games.

ABOUT KIKUCHI...

- year-old left-hander is making his 29th start of the season, his 70th Major League start and his 9th career start against Oakland, 3rd this season
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School. Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu
- Lions of Japan's Pacific League. In 7 seasons with Seibu, was 69-45 with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.

LAST OUTING ... L #9 in last start on 9/18 at KC ... allowed 3 runs on 8 hits over 3.0 innings, striking out 3...tossed 86 pitches, 54 for strikes.

- STRIKE THREE...had a career-high 12 strikeouts in 6.0 IP July 23 vs. OAK...was his 3rd double-digit strikeout game of the year and now his 4 10+ K games in his career...is averaging a career-high 9.40 K/9.0 IP this year.
- CONSISTENT QUALITY...has 14 quality starts this season, tied for 7th-most among AL starters, trailing Robbie Ray-TOR (22), Frank-ie Montas-OAK (18), Gerrit Cole-NYY (17), Chris Bassitt-OAK (16), Zack Greinke-HOU (15), Jose Berrios-MIN/TOR (15) and tied with Lucas Giolito-CWS, and Chris Flexen-SEA.
- ALL-STAR...named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time July 4... was on AL club but did not pitch...is 14th Japanese-born player to be selected to participate in Major League Baseball All-Star Game ... of the 14 Japanese-born players to make an All-Star roster. 5 have been in a Seattle uniform: Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x), Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hisashi Iwakuma and Yusei Kikuchi... of 30 total Japanese-born selections, exactly one-half (15) have been Mariners
- STREAK...ran off a career-best 5-game winning streak May 24-July 1...over the 7-start run, was 5-0, 1.87 (9 ER, 43.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts...included a 4-start stretch June 12-July 1 in which he posted a 1.01 ERA and 24 strikeouts in 26.2 innings...the last Mariners pitcher with that low of an ERA and that many strikeouts over a 4-start span was Félix Hernán-dez in Sept. 2014 (0.96 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 28.0 innings (via Elias Sport Bureau).
- WHAT A MONTH ... Kikuchi went 2-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 ER, 23.2 IP) in 4 starts in June, while limiting opponents to a .181 (15x83) average, walking 10 and striking out 26...among American League starters his 1.90 June ERA was 3rd-lowest, trailing only Sean Manaea-OAK (1.13) and Kyle Gibson-TEX (1.52).
- THAT'S QUALITY...recorded a quality start in 6 consecutive outings April 29-May 30, the longest quality start streak of career...left game in T5 June 5 at LAA after getting hit by a line drive comebacker, ending the streak; had tossed 4.0 innings while striking out 8 with 64 pitches (48 strikes) in that game.
- OH, YOU AGAIN...Kikuchi made 3 of 4 starts against Houston from 8/20-9/6 going 0-2 against the Astros during that span...tossed 7.0 shutout innings against Houston in lone start in Seattle, while allowing 13 runs (11 earned) in 4.1 innings in 2 starts in Houston.
- W#1...had one of best starts of career, tossing 7.0 shutout innings and allowing just hit at HOU April 29 in 1-0 SEA win...had no-hitter thru 6.1 innings & notched 1st W of season...allowed only Correa opposite field double.
- SEASON OPENER ... ND in 2021 debut on 4/2 vs. SF...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 3 ER on 6 hits 1 walk with a career-high tying 10 strikeouts...left the game with the score tied 3-3 after the 6th inning in 3-6 Mariners loss.

START ME UP...Yusei has made 69 career starts with Seattle in his 3-year Major League career...moved past Mac Suzuki for sole possesion of 12th all-time for start by a Japanese-born pitcher. Hideo Nomo holds the record for a Japanese-born pitcher with 318 career MLB starts...Kikuchi's 69 starts trail Hisashi Iwakuma's 136 starts (2012-17) for most by a Japanese-born starter in Mariners club history.

- 2020 RECAP...went 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (27 ER, 47.0 IP) with 20 walks and 47 strikeouts in 9 starts during his second Major League season...tossed at least 6.0 innings in 4 starts, including 3 of his last 4 starts to end the season.
- DEBUT ... with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokvo Dome.
- COMPLETELY KIKUCHI... recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18, 2019 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elías, and Gil Meche).

WELCOME TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025...is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).

EARLY YEARS...the native of Morioka, Japan, pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School...helped lead his high school to a runner-up finish at the national high school invitational in April and to the semifinals in the national championship in August before being the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft...made his professional debut for Seibu's minor league team in 2011 and also pitched with Melbourne in the Australian Winter League that year.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP LOGAN GILBERT (5-5, 4.97)

24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 23rd career start tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL and 3rd against the Angels this season...Seattle is 14-8 in his first 22 starts, including winning 11 consecutive from 5/25-7/30...W#6 in last start on 9/19 at KC (7.0,3,1,1,1,5)...ND in Mariners 5-4 win against Boston on 9/13 matching career high in strikeouts (6.0,5,2,2,1,9, 1 HR)...went 4-0 with 2.66 ERA (14 ER, 47.1 IP) in 9 starts, 5/25-7/18...1st Major League win June 6 at LAA, tossing 5.0 innings and al-lowing only 1 run on 4 walks & 7 strikeouts...first quality start on May 31 vs. OAK (6.0,5,2,2,1,5,HB); left game with a 4-1 lead...ND in Mariners 4-3 win at OAK on May 25 (4.0,4,2,2,0,4,HB)...lost his **MLB debut** May 13 vs. CLE, allowing 4 ER, incl. 3 ER on pair of HR; K'd side in his final inning...**CAREER**: selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau...has appeared in parts of 2 Minor League seasons in the Mariners organi-ration (2019 & 2021), oping 11-5 with a 2.12 ERA (33 ER 140 LP) with 33 walks and 170 strikeouts in 27 strance view in a 2.44 ERA (2.55 EA (2.55 zation (2019 & 2021), going 11-5 with a 2.12 ERA (33 ER, 140 IP) with 33 walks and 170 strikeouts in 27 career starts...vs. LAA 2-0 with a 2.61 ERA (3 ER, 10.1 IP) in his 2 career starts against the Angels...set career high in strikeouts when he fanned 9 Angels batters on 7/18...earned first career MLB win against the Angels on 6/6.
