THE LATEST:

- The Blue Jays scored a tie-breaking run in the 8th to edge the Orioles, 5-4, Wednesday night...Improved to 22-21 in series finales and 7-8 in rubber games...Are now 12-15 in one-run contests, having won each of the last three...Evened their record in division games at 28-28.
 - Toronto has won four of its last five games and is now 7-5 over its last 12...Has taken 20 of its last 34 contests and 26 of the last 46...Is also 37-27 over the last 64 games.

MAR-CRUSH SEMIEN:

- Marcus Semien tied a career high with his 33rd home run of the season on Wednesday, equaling the mark he set in 2019...His 33 bombs lead all second basemen and rank 5th among all MLB hitters...His .527 slugging percentage is currently the highest ever by a Blue Jays middle infielder (2nd: Aaron Hill - 499 in 2009)
- The all-star now boasts a 5.5 fWAR, the 2nd-best mark among MLB hitters (1st: Vladimir Guerrero Jr. - 5.6), while ranking 2nd in XBH (69), T-2nd in total bases (278), 4th in runs (93), T-4th in doubles (34) and T-12th in hits (141).

GOING STREAKING:

- Vladimir Guerrero Jr. extended his hitting streak to 10 games with an infield single on Wednesday...Is batting .350 (14-for-40) with a double, three homers and seven RBI over that stretch (.995 OPS)...Has now reached base safely 229 times, tied with Juan Soto for the most among all MLB hitters...His 292 total bases are also the most in the Majors.
- The All-Star Game MVP is currently leading the AL in OBP (.405) and OPS (1.004) ... Among all MLB batters, ranks T-1st in runs (98), 2nd in OPS (1.004), 2nd in home runs (39), T-2nd in hits (152), 3rd in RBI (96), 3rd in OBP (.405), 3rd in SLG (.600), 6th in AVG (.312), T-6th in walks (72) and T-9th in XBH (61)...His 5.6 WAR (FanGraphs) is currently the best among all MLB hitters (2nd: Marcus Semien - 5.5).

TURNING 40...AT 22:

With his next home run, Vladimir Guerrero Jr. will be the youngest player in team history to record a 40-HR season, ahead of Jesse Barfield, Tony Batista and Shawn Green - who were all 26...Will become the 10th player in MLB history with a 40-HR campaign in his age 22 or younger season (last: Ronald Acuña Jr. - 41 in 2019 at age 21)...Will become the 10th player (15th time) in franchise history to reach the 40-HR mark (last: Edwin Encarnacion - 42 in 2016).

RUN IT BACK:

Bo Bichette singled, stole a base and scored twice on Wednesday...His 98 runs are now tied with Guerrero Jr. for the most in MLB...Has hits in each of his last seven games while going 10-for-29 (.345) with two doubles, a home run and four RBI...His 148 hits this season are currently 5th most in the AL (6th in MLB) while his 21 stolen bases also rank 5th.

CASE CLOSED:

Jordan Romano picked up his 15th save Wednesday night...Has not allowed a run over his last 11 games, combining for 11.2 IP, 7H, 2BB, and 19K (.171 AVG, 0.77 WHIP) while converting all six save opportunities.

HOME SWEET DOME:

- The Blue Jays are through three games (2-1) of their 3rd Rogers Centre homestand ... Went 10-11 at TD Ballpark in Dunedin, FL, and 12-11 at Sahlen Field in Buffalo, NY, and are now 36-29 overall at home ... Are a season-high-tying seven games over .500 at home... After this weekend set with the A's, will head out on a seven-game road trip to take on the Yankees (77-56) and the Orioles (41-91).
- *Toronto batters are leading the AL in home SLG (.472) while 2nd in home AVG (.268), 2nd in home OPS (.806) and 2nd in runs/game at home (5.37)... The pitching staff has posted a 3.86 ERA during home contests (8th in the AL) to go with a .241 opponents' AVG (7th) and a 1.27 WHIP (9th).

RAY-TING THE BEST:

Robbie Ray has claimed AL Pitcher of the Month for August...Marks his 1st career Monthly nod and Toronto's first since Ricky Romero in August 2011... Kept a 1.76 ERA (8 ER/41.0 IP) over six starts, allowing 27 hits and eight walks while recording 52 strikeouts for a 0.85 WHIP and a .188 AVG ... The 52 K's were 3rd most ever in August by a Blue Jays pitcher, trailing Roger Clemen's 68 in 1998 and 54 in 1997.

LET'S GET IT STARTED:

- Blue Jays starters have combined to fashion a 3.29 ERA since the All-Star Break, the best mark among AL clubs (2nd: NYY - 3.33) and 3rd-best in MLB.
- Over that span, Toronto's rotation also leads the Majors in K/BB (3.70) while tops in the AL in FIP (3.28) and innings pitched (243.2)...Also sit 2nd in the AL in opponent OPS (.661), 2nd in wins (17) and 4th in WHIP (1.18).

HOMER HAPPY:

- The Blue Jays have now hit an AL-high 197 home runs this season, trailing only San Francisco (201) for the most in the Majors...The 197 homers are 4th most through 132 games in team history.
- The Jays lead MLB in team SLG (.450) and OPS (.776) while ranked 2nd in AVG (.262), 3rd in hits (1,166), T-5th in XBH (429), 6th in OBP (.326) and 7th in runs (656).

FINALLY HOME:

The Blue Jays returned home on July 30 for their first action at Rogers Centre in nearly two years...The Blue Jays are the first team to play home games in three different cities in the same season (Dunedin, Buffalo, Toronto) since 1903, when both the Cleveland Naps and the Detroit Tigers did so ... Toronto is the 1st team (since 1901) to play home games in three different states/provinces in the same campaign.

- Marcus Semien went 7-for-17 with two doubles, a homer and two RBI in the four games vs. his former team in May ... Has batted .300 (9-for-30) with four extra-base hits and three RBI over his eight career games against them.
- George Springer leads all current Blue Jays with 101 career contests against Oakland...Has hit .262 (103for-393) with 18 doubles, two triples, 19 home runs and 53 RBI in those meetings for an .808 OPS.
- Jarrod Dyson has played 40 career games vs. OAK, batting .293 (34-for-116) with three doubles, a triple, a homer and eight RBI.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Making his 15th career MLB start and his 4th at Rogers Centre...Took a no-decision his last time out, on 8/28 at DET, giving up 2 runs and 4 hits over 6.1 innings with no walks and 8 strikeouts...Didn't walk a batter for the 1st time in his career.
- His 86 strikeouts are the most in franchise history by a player in his first 14 career games (2nd: Ricky Romero - 77)
- Has kept RHH's to a .156 AVG, the 5th-best mark in MLB (min. 135 BF).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Took a no-decision on 8/23 vs. CWS, tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball with 5 hits, 3 walks, and 5 strikeouts...Has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 13 career starts.
- Picked up his 5th win on 8/11 at LAA, giving up 2 runs and 5 hits over 6.2 innings with a career-high 11 strikeouts and 114 pitches (78 strikes)...**The 11 K's tied a franchise record for the most in a game by a rookie** (5th time).
- Won his 4th game on 8/6 vs. BOS, giving up 2 runs and 4 hits over 5.0 innings (3BB, 4K)...Became the 4th pitcher all-time to allow 4 or fewer hits and strike out 4+ batters in 10 straight games, joining Jacob deGrom (11G in 2021), Mike Clevenger (10G in 2018), and Johan Santana (10G in 2004).
- Allowed 4 hits or fewer in his first 10 career starts, the longest such streak to start a career in MLB history.
- Picked up his 3rd win on 7/31 vs. KC, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings while giving up just 2 hits (1BB, 4K)...Became the 1st Blue Jay and 16th player all-time with no earned runs in 4 of his first 9 career starts.
- Took his 1st career loss on 7/9 at TB, giving 3R/2ER on 3 hits over 3.2 innings with a trio of walks and 9 strikeouts.
- Earned his 2nd career win on 7/2 vs. TB, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings, giving up 3 hits with a walk and 10 strikeouts on 109 pitches (71 strikes)... Kept a no-hitter through 5.1 innings, the longest no-hit bid by a Toronto rookie since Thomas Pannone on 8/22/18 vs. BAL (6.0)...Set a franchise record by striking out 7 consecutive batters from the 1st to the 3rd inning (5 other Toronto pitchers had 6 straight K's)...Became the 5th pitcher since 1974 (as far as tracking goes back) to strike out 7 straight batters in a game within his first 7 career starts (last: Stephen Strasburg in 2010)...Became the 1st pitcher in club history to go 7+ IP with no runs and 10+ strikeouts within his first 7 career contests...Tied a club record by beginning his career with 7 straight starts without a loss (Jerry Garvin - 1977).
- Had a no-decision on 6/25 vs. BAL, surrendering 4 hits and 1R/0ER over 6.0 innings (2BB, 6K)...Has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 4 of his 6 starts, and has given up exactly 4 hits in each of his last 5 outings.
- Took a no-decision on 6/19 at BAL, allowing 4 hits (all solo home runs) and 5 runs with a walk and 6 strikeouts over 3.1 innings...Ejected by Jerry 5 runs with a walk and 6 strikeouts over 3.1 Meals after hitting Maikel Franco with a pitch.
