#### THE LATEST:

- ◆The Blue Jays scored six runs in the 8th inning and three more in the 9th as part of an 11-10 come-frombehind win over the Athletics...Are now 13-15 in one-run contests, having won each of the last four.
- ◆Toronto has won five of its last six games and is now 8-5 over its last 13...Has taken 21 of its last 35 contests and 27 of the last 47...Is also 38-27 over the last 65 games

#### **TEO TOWERS TO LEFT:**

₱Teoscar Hernández tied last night's game, 2-2, in the 4th inning with his 23rd home run of the campaign... Marked his 7th homer to tie the game or give the Jays the lead...Was his first longball since Aug. 18 at WAS, ending a season-long 13-game drought...His 89 RBI for the season are now tied 7th most in the AL (T-9th in MIB) His 41 RBI since the All-Star break are tied with Salvador Perez for the most among AL batters (T-3rd in MLB).

#### **GURRIEL IS GRAND...AGAIN:**

Lourdes Gurriel Jr. crushed his 3rd career grand slam on the 1st pitch he saw in the 8th inning last night... Became the 4th player in franchise history with three slams in a single season, joining Carlos Delgado (1997), Darrin Fletcher (2000) and Edwin Encarnacion (2015)...Is the 3rd Blue Jay ever to hit a game-tying grand slam in the 8th inning or later, joining Rick Bosetti (8th inn. on May 7, 1978 at SEA) and George Bell (9th inn. on June 20, 1986 vs. NYY)...Over his last 20 games, has gone 22-for-63 (.349) with three doubles, three homers and 16 RBI (.945 OPS).

### **SEMIEN SAVES THE DAY:**

- Marcus Semien won last night's game with a three-run blast in the 9th...Was his 2nd career walk-off homer, also doing so last month on Aug. 7 vs. BOS (1)...Has homered in back-to-back games for the 3rd time this season and the 15th time in his career... His 34 bombs are a new career high (33 in 2019), lead all second basemen, and rank 5th among all MLB hitters.
- ◆The all-star now boasts a 5.5 fWAR, the 2nd-best mark among MLB hitters (1st: Vladimir Guerrero Jr. - 5.7), while ranking 2nd in XBH (70), 2nd in total bases (282), 4th in runs (94), T-4th in doubles (34) and T-12th in hits (142)...His .529 slugging percentage is currently the highest ever by a Blue Jays middle infielder (2nd: Aaron Hill - .499 in 2009).

### **STILL STREAKING:**

- Vladimir Guerrero Jr. singled three times last night for his 14th 3+ hit game this year (T-4th in MLB)...Extended his hitting streak to 11 games, the 2nd longest of his career (12G from Aug. 19-30, 2020)...Is batting .350 (14-for-40) with a double, three homers and eight RBI over that stretch (1.039 OPS)...Also drove in a run and scored twice...Became the 1st player in the Majors to reach 100 runs this season...Has now reached base safely an MLB-high 232 times (2nd: Juan Soto 230)...His 295 total bases are also the most in the Majors (2nd: Marcus Semien - 282).
- The All-Star Game MVP is currently leading the Majors in OPS (1.008) and leads the AL in OBP (.407)...Among all MLB batters, also ranks 2nd in home runs (39), 2nd in hits (155), T-2nd in RBI (97), 3rd in OBP (.407), 3rd in SLG (.601), 5th in AVG (.316), T-6th in walks (72) and 10th in XBH (61)...His 5.7 WAR (FanGraphs) is currently the best among all MLB hitters (2nd: Marcus Semien - 5.5).

### **GETTING AFTER IT:**

Gurriel Jr.'s homer came on the 1st pitch of his plate appearance...The Blue Javs now have an MLB-high 50 1st-pitch home runs (2nd: ATL - 38) which is also 2nd most in team history (55 in 2000).

#### **HOME SWEET DOME:**

- The Blue Jays are through four games (3-1) of their 3rd Rogers Centre homestand...Went 10-11 at TD Ballpark in Dunedin, FL, and 12-11 at Sahlen Field in Buffalo, NY, and are now 37-29 overall at home...Are now a season-high eight games over .500 at home... After this weekend set with the A's, will head out on a seven-game road trip to take on the Yankees (78-56) and the Orioles (41-92).
- ◆Toronto batters are leading the AL in home SLG (.475) while 2nd in home AVG (.269), 2nd in home OPS (.809) and 2nd in runs/game at home (5.45)... The pitching staff has posted a 3.94 ERA during home contests (8th in the AL) to go with a .242 opponents' AVG (7th) and a 1.27 WHIP (10th).

#### **BICHETTE HAPPENS:**

\*Bo Bichette doubled, was hit by a pitch and scored as part of a 1-for-3 evening...His 99 runs trail only Guerrero Jr. (100) for the most in MLB...Has hits in each of his last eight games while going 11-for-32 (.344) with three doubles, a home run and four RBI... His 149 hits this season are currently tied for 4th most in the AL (T-5th in MLB).

#### **HOMER HAPPY:**

- The Blue Jays have now hit an AL-high 200 home runs this season, trailing only San Francisco (201) for the most in the Majors...The 200 homers are 4th most through 133 games in team history.
- The Jays lead MLB in team SLG (.452) and OPS (.778) while ranked 2nd in AVG (.263), 3rd in hits (1,176), 4th in XBH (435), 6th in OBP (.327) and 7th in runs (667).

### **THE 10TH DEGREE:**

The Blue Jays recorded 10 hits last night...Marked their 56th game with double-digit hits, 2nd most in MLB (HOU - 58)...The Jays have also now scored double-digit runs 17 times, tied for 2nd most in MLB (CIN - 19: BOS - 17).

### **FINALLY HOME:**

- The Blue Jays returned home on July 30 for their first action at Rogers Centre in nearly two years...The Blue Jays are the first team to play home games in three different cities in the same season (Dunedin, Buffalo, Toronto) since 1903, when both the Cleveland Naps and the Detroit Tigers did so... Toronto is the 1st team (since 1901) to play home games in three different states/provinces in the same campaign.
- It was 670 days between games in Toronto...The 670 days away marked the longest such stretch in MLB history, as the Marlins went 327 days in between from the end of 2019 until their delayed 2020 home opener.

- ▶The Blue Jays went 2-2 vs. the A's when the clubs last met back in Oakland in May...Did not meet last season but swept the Athletics, 6-0, in 2019 while outscoring them, 36-13.
- Marcus Semien went 7-for-17 with two doubles, a homer and two RBI in the four games vs. his former team in May...Has now batted .286 (10-for-35) with five extra-base hits and six RBI over his nine career games against them.
- George Springer leads all current Blue Jays with 102 career contests against Oakland...Has hit .264 (105for-398) with 20 doubles, two triples, 19 home runs and 53 RBI in those meetings for an .813 OPS.
- Jarrod Dyson has played 41 career games vs. OAK, batting .293 (34-for-116) with three doubles, a triple, a homer and eight RBI.

#### **TODAY'S GAME:**

- Making his 27th start of the season and his 4th at Rogers Centre...Picked up his 2nd win as a Blue Jay his last time out, on 8/29 at DET, giving up an unearned run and 6 hits over 7.0 frames with no walks and 11 strikeouts...Became the 3rd player in franchise history to go 7.0+ IP with 0ER, 0BB, and 11+ K's in a start, joining Rogers Clemens (2x) and Chris Carpenter
- His 3.53 ERA is 6th best in the AL while his 153.0 IP rank 7th.
- His overall opponents' AVG of .232 ranks 8th in the AL (min. 400 BF)...Has kept right-handed hitters to a .190 (56-for-294) AVG, 9th in the AL and 16th in MLB.
- His 5 defensive runs saved are 2nd most among all pitchers this season (Dallas Keuchel 10)...His 3 pickoffs this season are tied for tops in the AL and tied for 6th most in MLB.

- Took a no-decision in G2 of a doubleheader on 8/7 vs. BOS...Threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball with 5 hits, no walks, and 6 strikeouts...Over his last 3 starts, held a 0.47 ERA (1 ER/19.0 IP) with 13H, 1BB, and 17K.
- Won his Blue Jays debut on 8/1 vs. KC, throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with 5 hits, a walk, 3 hit batters, and 7 strikeouts...Became the 13th player all-time to throw 6.0+ scoreless innings in his Blue Jays debut.
- Acquired by Toronto from Minnesota on 7/30 in exchange for INF Austin Martin and RHP Simeon Woods Richardson.
- Made his last start for the Twins on 7/24 vs. LAA, throwing 7.0 innings with 2R/0ER on 3 hits with 4 strikeouts and now walks...Was his 2nd ER-free start this year (4/3 at MIL).
- Shouldered his 4th loss of the season 7/19 at CWS in the 2nd game of a doubleheader, despite recording his 4th career complete game in a 5-3 Twins loss...Worked 6.0 innings, allowing 5 runs on 4 hits (3 HR) with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts...Yielded just 2 hits (both H were homers) through the first six innings before allowing a walk-off, 3R-HR to Gavin Sheets... Marked his 2nd career complete game with fewer than 9.0 IP, also pitching a 6.0-inning complete game on 9/27/19 at KC (game due to inclement weather)...Gave his 3 straight starts of 8+ K's in the same season for the 3rd time in his career (last: 9/14-9/28/18).
- Took a no-decision on 7/11 vs. DET, working 7.0 innings and allowing 4 runs on 3 hits (4BB, 8k) in a game the Twins ultimately won in extra innings, 12-9...Tossed 108 pitches, his most in a game this season and most since throwing 113 on 7/20/19 vs. OAK... Worked at least 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts for the first time since 9/10-9/16/19.
- Picked up the win on 6/12 vs. HOU with 7.0 innings and 2 runs allowed... Was his 32nd career victory at Target Field, tied with former Twin Kyle Gibson for most in the ballpark's history.
- On 5/15 vs. OAK, fanned Seth Brown in the 5th inning for his 700th strikeout...Became the 15th Twin to reach 700 strikeouts and the 28th Twin to reach 700.0 innings pitched.
