TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-city, 10-game road trip with the 2 nd of 4 games against the Oakland Athletics (1-0)...are coming off a series win at Kansas City ( $2-1$ )...will also travel to Los Angeles-AL ( $3 \mathrm{G}, 9 / 24-9 / 26$ ) on the trip...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW, as well as broadcast on 710 ESPN and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS ...the Mariners defeated the Athletics by a 4-2 score in yesterday's series opener...have won 11 of their last 18 games and 12 of their last 20...are 22-14 over their last 36 games, 23-15 over their last 38, 25-20 over their last 45, 30-23 over their last 53, 36-27 over their last 63, 47-33 over their last 80, 50-34 over their last 84 and 60-43 over their last 103...are 32-22 in day games and 49-47 at night...are $42-33$ at T-Mobile Park and 39-36 on the road...are 65-25 when scoring at least 4 runs and 16-44 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 53-9 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Joy Division - The Mariners are 38-26 (.594) against the AL West Division this season.
- Series Record - The Mariners own a 16-9-2 series record since June 14, winning or splitting 18 of their last 27...the Mariners own a 24-19-5 overall series record this season.
WINNER WINNER.... with a win tonight, the Mariners would match a season-high 13 games above .500 .. they have been 13 games above . 500 twice this season, at $75-62$ on Sept. 5 and 77-64 on Sept. 10... Seattle's next win this season will be its 82 nd of the season, securing an above-. 500 season...the Mariners would secure their 15th winning season in franchise history with their next victory...Seattle has finished above .500 in 1991, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2007, 2009, 2014, 2016 and 2018. AWAY WE GO ...the Mariners are 14-5 in their last 19 road games...their . 737 road winning percentage is best in the American League since Aug. 8 and 3rd-best in the Majors to San Francisco (.813/13-3) and St. Louis (.750/15-5)...Seattle has won 4 of its last 6 road series since Aug. 17.
SETTLE IT ON THE PITCH ...since August 1, the Mariners pitching staff has the fewest walks (111) and lowest walks-per-9 innings (2.43) in the Majors...in 45 games since August 1, the pitching staff has the 2nd-highest strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.27) in the American League, trailing only Toronto (3.71).
SEAGER TIES CAREER-HIGH...Kyle Seager went 3 -for-4 with a double and 3 RBI last night...he has 99 RBI on the season, tying a career-high set in 2016...he is 1 RBI away from becoming the 17 th Mariners player to record a 100 RBI season and the first since Nelson Cruz had 119 RBI in 2017.
SECOND-HALF SEAGS...Kyle Seager has 18 home runs and 49 RBI since the All-Star Break...the 49 RBI are 3rd-most in the American League since the break, trailing Salvador Perez-KC (62) and Teoscar Hernández-TOR (59)...Seager's 18 homers are tied for 4th-most in the AL since the break, while his 30 walks are tied for 6th-most.
MITCH KEEPS IT 100...Mitch Haniger reached base 3 times last night, going 2 -for- 3 with a run, 2 doubles and a walk...his second double of the night was his 100th career double, including 98 in a Mariners uniform...Haniger is on the cusp of another career milestone, coming into play tonight with 498 career hits...he is batting .253 ( $145 \times 572$ ) with 102 runs, 22 doubles, 2 triples, 34 home runs, 84 RBI and 51 walks in 145 games this season.
SAY DO YOU REMEMBER...in 17 September games, Jarred Kelenic is batting . 266 ( $17 \times 64$ ) with 12 runs, 4 doubles, 6 home runs, 15 RBI, 6 walks and 2 stolen bases...he's gotten on-base at a .329 clip, slugging .609 with a .938 OPS...his 6 home runs, 12 runs scored and 39 total bases lead American League rookies during the month, while his 15 RBI are tied for the lead with Bobby Dalbec-BOS.
FRANCE FRANCE REVOLUTION...Ty France has hit safely in 7 consecutive games (9/13-c)...this season, France is batting 294 (155x527) with 75 runs, 29 doubles, 1 triple, 16 home runs, 64 RBI, 40 walks and 24 hit-by-pitches, getting on-base at a .367 clip, slugging .444 with an .811 OPS...he's batting .335 (78×233) since the All-Star Break, tied for most hits (78) in the American League since the break.
YOU'RE ALWAYS ON BASE...J.P. Crawford went 2 -for- 4 with a run and double last night...he has reached base safely in 18 of his last 19 games (8/30-c), hitting safely in 15 of those 19...he's batting . 303 (23x76) with 15 runs, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI and 12 walks in that span, getting on-base at a . 393 clip, slugging .434 with an .827 OPS.
SADLER'S STREAK...Casey Sadler has not allowed a run over his last 22 appearances since July 27...the streak has spanned 19.2 innings, with Sadler walking 4 and striking out 16 during the streak.. opponents are batting just . 143 ( $9 \times 63$ ) against him in that stretch...his 22 -outing scoreless streak is tied for 2nd-longest in Mariners history with Lucas Luetge (Apr. 17-June 15, 2012) and Ed Vande Berg (Aug. 30, 1982-Apr. 16, 1983)...the trio trail only Shigetoshi Hasegawa's franchise record 25-game scoreless streak...Hasegawa did not allow a run in 25 consecutive appearances from June 3-Aug. 17, 2003.
THE BULLPEN...the Mariners have the 3rd-best bullpen in the Majors this season by FanGraphs WAR (6.5), trailing Tampa Bay (7.2) and Chicago-AL (7.0)...Seattle relievers are $40-27$ with 44 saves and a 3.98 ERA (252 ER, 569.2 IP) with 193 walks and 564 strikeouts.
CLOSE GAMES...Seattle has played 77 games this season decided by 1 or 2 runs, 6th-most in the Majors and 2nd-most in the American League to the Yankees (85)...the Mariners are 46-31 (.597) in 1 or 2-run games, with their . 597 winning percentage ranking 3rd-best in MLB to the Yankees (.624/53-32) and San Francisco (.622/46-28)...Seattle has played 49 one-run games, most in the American League and 4th-most in the Majors, trailing the Mets (61), Atlanta (52) and Philadelphia (51)...the Mariners are 31-18 in 1-run games, with their 31 one-run wins leading the Maiors and their .633 winning percentage ranking 2 nd in the AL and 3rd in the Majors to the Angels (.657/23-12) and San Francisco (.651/28-15).
PATIENCE AT THE PLATE...Seattle batters are averaging 4.00 pitches per plate appearance this season, 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...the New York Yankees lead MLB with 4.09 pitches per plate appearance... San Francisco (3.97), Detroit (3.96) and Baltimore (3.95) round out the top five.
WINNING MONTHS...the Mariners are 10-7 in September...they finished August 15-13 (.536), their 3rd straight winning month...the Mariners went 14-12 (.538) in June and 14-10 (.583) in July...Seattle last recorded 3 consecutive winning months from March/April-June 2017...this season, the Mariners have put together a winning record in 4 of 5 months...they went 15-12 (.556) in April and 13-15 (.464) in May...the Mariners have put together a winning record in 5 of their last 6 months, going 12-11 (.522) in Sept. 2020.
AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Seager leads the Majors with 31 go-ahead RBI this season...he ranks 1 goahead RBI in front of Oakland's Matt Olson (30), but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Seager also led the Majors in go-ahead RBI (15) last season?...if Seager can maintain his lead through the end of the season, he would become just the 5th player since 1916 to lead the Majors in go-ahead RBI in back-to-back seasons...Seager would join Irish Meusel-NYG (1923-24), Lou Gehrig-NYY (3 consecutive, 1932-34), Frank McCormick-CIN (3 consecutive, 1938-40) and Miguel Cabrera-DET (2012-13).

## ABOUT GONZALES.

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 23 rd start of the season, 119th career appearance (111th career start) and his 14th career start against Oakland and 4th this season.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 years (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program.
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado.
- Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righet-ti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).
LAST TIME OUT...ND in last start on $9 / 15$ vs. Boston...recorded his 10th quality start of the season after allowing 3 runs on 3 hits and 2 walks over 6.0 innings of work with 7 strikeouts.
\#500...recorded his 500th career strikeout of the season when he struck out Hunter Dozier in the 4th inning on $8 / 29$ in a Mariners $4-3$ win.
7 for \#7....Gonzales extended his winning streak to 7 games after beating the Diamondbacks in his last start on 9/10...the winning streak is the longest of Gonzales' career, and is tied for the 8th longest winning streak in the Majors this season...Kyle Hendricks-CHC (11 games) has the longest streak in the Majors this season
(BULL)DOG DAYS OF SUMMER...since the All-Star Break, is $7-0$ with a 2.53 ERA (19 ER, 67.2 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 15 walks over 11 starts (7/20-c)... has pitched at least 5.0 innings allowing 3 runs or fewer in 10 of 11 starts, recording quality starts in 7 of his last 9 starts (Aug 1-c)...his 2.53 ERA since the All-Star break is 3rd-best in the American League (min. 40.0 IP ), trailing Cal Quantrill-CLE (1.79), Robbie Ray-TOR (2.00).

COMPLETELY DOMINANT...tossed 3rd career complete game in a 3-1 Mariners win against Texas on Aug. 12... matched his career highs in innings pitched (9.0), strikeouts (9) and surrendered the fewest hits in any of his 3 complete games (2)...the only run allowed came via a home run to Charlie Culberson with 2 outs in the 2nd inning...he faced the minimum in 8 of 9 innings.
SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL LEFTY...Gonzales received 4 or fewer runs of support in his first 19 starts this season, including 1 or fewer runs in 8 starts...through his first 19 starts, averaged 3.35 runs per game, the 3rd-lowest mark in the AL over the same span (min. 80 IP), trailing Mike Foltynewicz-TEX (2.63), and Jose Urena-DET (3.28), while ranking ahead of Dylan Bundy-LAA (3.47)...dating back to June 2, 2018, Gonzales is $35-0$ in 40 starts when he receives at least 3 runs of support, but is 4-26 w/12 ND in games in which he receives 2 or fewer runs of support.
FOR OPENERS...made his 3rd consecutive Opening Night start on April 1 vs. SF, but his 1st in T-Mobile Park... started opener at HOU last July, and was charged with loss (4.1 IP, 3 ER )....made 1st career Opening Night start on $3 / 20 / 19$ vs. OAK in Opening Series in Tokyo...was winning pitcher, allowing 3 ER in 6.0 IP...got the no-decision in the 2021 Opening Night start...overall, is 1-1, 6.06 (16.1 IP, 11 ER ) in 3 total Opening Day starts.
OPENER x 3 ... with his Opening Night start, Marco became just the 4th Mariners pitcher in history to make 3 or more Opening Night starts..he joins Félix Hernández (11), Randy Johnson (6) and Jamie Moyer (4) with 3 or more Opening Night starts....only Hernández (7) and Johnson (2) have more than 1 Opening Night win; a win tonight would give Marco 2.
MILESTONES...Gonzales is scheduled to make his 104th career start (107th appearance) as a Mariner today, he moved past James Paxton (103) for 19th in starts in club history with his last start....he is tied for 11th in club history with Matt Young at 45 wins..at 481 strikeouts, trails Jim Beattie who ranks 14th all-time with 563 strikeouts...he is 19 strikeouts away from becoming only the 15 pitcher in club history to record at least 500 strikeouts as a Mariner.
2020 LEADERBOARD...struck out 9.14 batters per walk ( $64 \mathrm{SO}, 7 \mathrm{BB}$ ) last season, the best ratio in MLB...also among the AL leaders in wins (T2 w/7), fewest BB per 9.0 IP (2nd, 0.90), win \% (3rd, .778), WHIP (3rd, 0.95), ERA (8th, 3.10), IP (7th, 69.2) and opponents batting average against (10th, .222).
