TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-city, 10-game road trip (4-1) with the 3rd of 4 games against the Oakland Athletics (2-0)...are coming off a series win at Kansas City (2-1)...will also travel to Los Angeles-AL (3 G, 9/24-9/26) on the trip...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW, as well as broadcast on 710 ESPN and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Athletics by a 5-2 score yesterday...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive games and are 12-7 over their last 19 games, 19-13 over their last 32, 23-14 over their last 37, 24-15 over their last 39, 26-20 over their last 46, 31-23 over their last 54, 37-27 over their last 64, 48-33 over their last 81, 51-34 over their last 85 and 61-43 over their last 104 ...are 32-22 in day games and 50-47 at night....are 42-33 at T-Mobile Park and 40-36 on the road...are 66-25 when scoring at least 4 runs and 16-44 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 54-9 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Series Record - The Mariners own a 16-9-2 series record since June 14, winning or splitting 18 of their last 27...the Mariners own a 24-19-5 overall series record this season.
- Against Southpaws - Seattle is 32-26 (.552) in games against left-handed starting pitchers.
- 1-Run Games - The Mariners are 31-18 (.633) in 1-run games, leading MLB with 31 one-run victories
- Happy Birthday - RHP Justin Dunn celebrates his 26 th birthday today.

HIGH WATER MARK...Seattle is a season-high 13 games above . 500 for the 3rd time this season...they were also 13 games above at 75-62 on Sept. 5 and 77-64 on Sept. 10... with a win tonight, Seattle would be 14+ games above . 500 for the first time since they closed the 2018 season at 89-73.
UP UP AND AWAY...the Mariners are $15-5$ in their last 20 road games...their .750 road winning percentage is best in the American League since Aug. 8 and 3rd-best in the Majors to San Francisco (.824/14-3) and St. Louis (.762/16-5)...it is the Mariners best 20-game road stretch since they went 15-5 in 20 road games from Sept. 15, 2018-April 20, 2019...Seattle has won 4 of its last 6 road series since Aug. 17.
BRING YOUR A-GAME...Seattle has won 7 consecutive games against Oakland since July 23 and 4 consecutive games at the Oakland Coliseum since Aug. 23...the Mariners are 6-1 at the Coliseum this season, tied for their 3rd-most wins at the Coliseum in a single season...Seattle's most wins at the Coliseum in a season is 8 , done twice (2007, 2016)...the Mariners have won $7+$ consecutive games against the A's for the first time since they won 8 consecutive games against them from May 17-Sept. 26, 2017.
DOMINATE THE ZONE...since August 1, the Mariners pitching staff has the fewest walks (113) and lowest walks-per-9 innings (2.42) in the Majors...in 46 games since August 1, the pitching staff has the 2nd-highest strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.26) in the American League, trailing only Toronto (3.47).
MARINERS CLINCH WINNING SEASON...the Mariners won their 82 nd game of the season last night, securing the 15th winning season in franchise history...Seattle has finished above .500 in 1991, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2007, 2009, 2014, 2016, 2018 and now 2021.
MULTI-TRIPLE INNING...last night, Jarred Kelenic and Dylan Moore both tripled in the 4th inning off Oakland starter Paul Blackburn...it was Kelenic's first career triple....it marked the 22nd time in franchise history that the Mariners recorded multiple triples in the same inning and the first time since Sept. 3, 2018 vs. Baltimore, when Cameron Maybin and Mitch Haniger both tripled off Orioles starter Josh Rogers.
J.P. THE CATALYST...J.P. Crawford went 3 -for-5 with a double, home run and 2 RBI last night...he has reached base safely in 19 of his last 20 games ( $8 / 30-\mathrm{c}$ ), hitting safely in 16 of those 20...he's batting .321 (26x81) with 16 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 12 RBI and 12 walks in that span, getting on-base at a . 404 clip, slugging .494 with an .898 OPS.
KELENIC'S SEPTEMBER...in 18 September games, Jarred Kelenic is batting .265 (18x68) with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 15 RBI, 6 walks and 2 stolen bases...he's gotten on-base at a 324 clip, slugging 618 with a . 942 OPS...his 6 home runs, 13 runs scored and 42 total bases lead American Leaque rookies during the month, while his 15 RBI are tied for the lead with Bobby Dalbec-BOS.
FRANCE FRANCE REVOLUTION...Ty France has hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games...this season, France is batting .291 ( $155 \times 532$ ) with 75 runs, 29 doubles, 1 triple, 16 home runs, 64 RBI, 40 walks and 24 hit-bypitches, getting on-base at a .364 clip, slugging .440 with an .804 OPS....he's batting .328 ( $78 \times 238$ ) since the All-Star Break, with his 78 hits ranking 3rd-most in the AL since the break.
MOORE THAN A FEELING...Dylan Moore hit a 2 -run triple last night...he ranks 4th on the Mariners with 23 RBI with 2 outs this season...Moore is batting $.385(5 \times 13)$ with 3 runs, 1 triple, 3 RBI and 1 walk in his last 4 games, with a .429 on-base percentage, .538 slugging percentage and .967 OPS.
SADLER'S STREAK...Casey Sadler has not allowed a run over his last 23 appearances since July $27 \ldots$..the streak has spanned 20.2 innings, with Sadler walking 4 and striking out 16 during the streak.. opponents are batting just . 136 ( $9 \times 66$ ) against him in that stretch...his 23 -game scoreless streak is 2 ndlongest in franchise history, trailing only Shigetoshi Hasegawa's franchise record 25-game scoreless streak...Hasegawa did not allow a run in 25 consecutive appearances from June 3-Aug. 17, 2003.
SECOND-HALF SEAGS...Kyle Seager hit 2 doubles last night.... he has 18 home runs and 49 RBI since the All-Star Break...the 49 RBI are 3rd-most in the American League since the break, trailing Salvador Perez-KC (62) and Teoscar Hernández-TOR (60)...Seager's 18 homers are tied for 4th-most in the AL since the break, while his 30 walks are tied for 6th-most....he is 1 RBI away from becoming the 17th Mariners player to record a 100 RBI season and the first since Nelson Cruz had 119 RBI in 2017.
PATIENCE AT THE PLATE...Seattle batters are averaging 4.00 pitches per plate appearance this season, 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...the New York Yankees lead MLB with 4.09 pitches per plate appearance... San Francisco (3.97), Detroit (3.96) and Baltimore (3.94) round out the top five.
WINNING WAYS...the Mariners are 11-7 in September...they finished August 15-13 (.536), their 3rd straight winning month...the Mariners went 14-12 (.538) in June and 14-10 (.583) in July...Seattle last recorded 3 consecutive winning months from March/April-June 2017...this season, the Mariners have put together a winning record in 4 of 5 months...they went 15-12 (.556) in April and 13-15 (.464) in May...the Mariners have put together a winning record in 5 of their last 6 months, going 12-11 (.522) in Sept. 2020.

AS YOU KNOW...Marco Gonzales tossed a quality start last night, allowing 2 earned runs over 6.0 innings en route to his 8th consecutive winning decision, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that it is the 2nd time this season the Mariners starting rotation has recorded 3 consecutive quality starts?...Logan Gilbert (Sept. 19 at KC), Tyler Anderson (Sept. 20 at OAK) and Gonzales have led the Mariners to 3 consecutive victories with their quality starts...Gonzales (Aug. 1 at TEX), Chris Flexen (Aug. 2 at TB) and Yusei Kikuchi (Aug. 3 at TB) accomplished the feat earlier this season...AND LASTLY....if Flexen goes at least 6.0 innings and allows 3 or fewer earned runs tonight, the Mariners will have $4+$ consecutive quality starts for the first time since they registered 6 consecutive from Aug. 30-Sept. 7, 2020, going 6-0.

## ABOUT FLEXEN.

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 40th career start (56th appearance), his 29th start of 2021 and 4th career start against Oakland, all of them this season.
- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-year contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020.
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School... made his Major League debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at San Diego.
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012.. played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the footbal team for 2 years.....was committed to Arizona State University be fore signing with the Mets.
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA ( 236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games (105 starts)...in 2013, was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
- In his Mariners debut on April 3, 2021, became the 900th Seattle Mariners player in franchise history.
- Recorded his 100th career strikeout when he struck out Cavan Biggio on 6/29 against Toronto (in Buffalo).
LAST OUTING...W \#12 in last start on 9/17 at KC...allowed just 1 run on 6 hits and 2 walks over 5.2 innings pitched...left the game with the bases loaded in the 6th inning before the bullpen recorded the final out of the inning.
DISTINGUISHED COMPANY...Flexen is the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record a 10-win season in their first season with the Mariners joining Floyd Bannister (1979), Gaylord Perry (1982), Matt Young (1983), Mark Langston (1984), Tim Belcher (1995), Sterling Hitchcock (1996), Jeff Fassero (1997), Freddy Garcia (1999), Aaron Sele (2000), Miguel Batista (2007), Joe Saunders (2013) and Roenis Elias (2014)...tied with Batista (20 GS) for the 3rd fastest to achieve the feat behind Aaron Sele (17 GS) and Freddy Garcia (19 GS).
WINNER...the Mariners are 19-9 (.679) in Flexen's 28 starts this season...posted a career-best 4-game winning streak, June 15-July 16...went 4-0, 1.36 (39.2 IP, 6 ER ) in 6 starts during the streak...struck out 29 while walking just 8 and has limited opposing hitters to a . 200 BAA...his previous career-best winning streak was 3 games (4/24-5/14/21).
LATELY...Flexen is $3-1$ with a 3.35 ERA (20 ER, 53.2) with 41 strikeouts and 14 walks over his last 9 starts dating back to August 2...his 3.35 ERA during that span is 12th best in the American League among qualifiers.
BIRTHDAY MONTH....went 3-2 with a 3.38 ERA (11 ER, 29.1 IP ) in 5 starts in July...walked 5 and struck out 17 in the month.
ONE AND DONE...has recorded 10 games this season where he has tallied at least 6.0 innings while allowing 1 earned run or fewer, tied for 3rd most in the American League (also: Nathan Eovaldi-BOS, Sean Manaea-OAK and Lance Lynn-CHW) behind Gerrit Cole (NYY) who has had 12 such starts and Robbie Ray (TOR) who each have 12.

IRST 11 AT HOME...Flexen went 6-3 with a 1.89 ERA (14 ER, 66.2 IP) in his
first 11 home starts with the Mariners (April 3-July 22)...his 1.89 ERA was the lowest in club history through a player's first 11 home starts of a season, ranking ahead of Félix Hernández (2.09 in 2014) and James Paxton (2.15 in 2017).
FIRST WIN...earned his first win as a Mariner in his first Mariners start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts on April 3 vs. San Francisco...became first Mariners pitcher to throw $5.0+$ scoreless innings in his debut with the team since LH Wade LeBlanc threw 6.0 scoreless IP on June 24 , 2016 in his Mariners debut in a 4-3 win vs. St. Louis...marked Flexen's first win in the Majors in 1,319 days (Oct. 1, 2017 w/New York-NL at Philadelphia).
DOMINATING THE KBO...spent 2020 season with Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization and went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA (39 ER 116.2 IP) with 30 walks and 132 strikeouts over 21 starts...struck out $28 \%$ of batters faced, the 4th-highest rate in the KBO.
