WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's last night, 10-5, and club has a $4-3$ record on this 9-G, 10-day road trip to LAA (2-2), ARI (2-0), and OAK (0-1)...last night's loss snapped a $4-\mathrm{G}$ win streak $(9 / 5-8)$ that matched longest by the Rangers this season (also 4-0, 6/25-29)...have still won 4 of 5 and are 7-4 in last $11 \mathrm{G} . .$. team's 7 wins since $8 / 29$ rank T3rd-most in the A.L. (10-TOR, 8-SEA, 7 -TEXTB)...have lost 8 of 15,13 of 22,16 of 27 , and 22 of last 34 G...TEX has a 16-34 (.320) record since the All-Star break, T-fewest wins and the 2nd-lowest win pct. in MLB (WAS is 16-36, .308).. club was 18-18 after win on $5 / 9$, but has gone $33-71$ (.317) since reaching that point...currently 38 G under .500 , this after matching season high at 41 -under following loss last Sat. at LAA (also 41 -under after loss $8 / 28$ vs. HOU)...team had a 12-G losing streak from 7/10-25, T2nd-longest in club history and longest in 39 years ( $15,9 / 13-30 / 72 ; 12,4 / 22-5 / 6 / 82 ; 12$, 7/10-25/21).

- At 51-89 (.364), TEX has the 2nd-lowest win pct. in the A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB (ARI-319, 45-96; BAL-.329, 46-94; PIT-.362, 51-90)...team is assured of 5th consecutive losing season, most consecutive sub-. 500 campaigns in club history...club's 51 wins are T3rd-fewest in WSH/TEX franchise history thru 140 G (49-91 in 1973, 50-90 in 1963, 51-89 in 1961/1985/2021).
- TEX is 2-0-1 in last 3 series, this after having lost 7 of previous $8 \ldots$ club is $4-13-2$ in last 19 series and 6-20-5 in last 31 .

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 107 days (beg. $5 / 27$ )...has lost 11.5 games in division since the All-Star break, but has been between 30.0 and 33.0 GB since $8 / 20 \ldots$ since $5 / 25$, club has gone from 6.0 GB to 31.0 GB behind 1st place HOU , the 2nd-largest deficit in A.L. and 4th-largest in MLB (46.0 GB--ARI; 41.5 GB--BAL; 35.5 GB--PIT).

ON THE ROAD: TEX is $4-3$ to begin this road trip, already the most on any single road trip for Texas in 2020-21...with a win this weekend, would secure both a winning road trip and most wins on a single trip since going 5-1 from 6/18-24/18 at KC and MIN...won 4 straight Sun.-Wed. to match longest road win streak in 2020-21 (also 4-0, 4/13-19/21)...Texas is 20-52 (.278) on the road this season, 2nd-lowest win pct. in MLB...have lost 5 of 9,9 of 15 and 23 of last 30 G away from Arlington...lost 16 straight ( $5 / 10-6 / 11$ ) and 14 straight ( $7 / 4-$ 8/8) this season, the 2 longest road losing skids in Rangers history...the 16 consecutive road defeats matched the longest run in WSH/TEX franchise history, tied with the expansion Senators in their 1st season, 8/3-9/8/61

VS. OAKLAND: This weekend marks last of 4 trips and 11 G in the Bay Area in 2021 ( $0-2$ from $5 / 10-11$ at SF, 2-1 from 6/29-7/1 at OAK, 0-3 from 8/6-8 at OAK, 0-1 to open this weekend at OAK)...Rangers are $7-10$ vs. A's in '21, as last night's loss secured a defeat in the season series, the 5th straight year to drop the season series...have lost 7 of last 9 G after a $5-3$ start to the year...the series win 6/29-7/1 at OAK was Rangers' 1 st at the Coliseum since 2016 (2-1, 9/23$25 / 16$ ), as TEX is $9-30$ in the East Bay since the start of 2017. - TEX is $23-43$ (.348) vs. A.L. West clubs in '21...Rangers' lowest division win pct. in a full season was .341 (28-54), as team would need to go 3-6 in final 9 division G to avoid setting a new mark...TEX is just 8-27 (.229) on road vs. West.

STILL NO HOME RUNS: Texas has gone homerless in 4 straight games since DJ Peters' 2nd HR on Sun. at LAA, still averaging $5.0 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ over those 4 contests...marks 2nd-longest homerless span for club in '21 (7 G, 7/18-23)...the Rangers have scored 21 R since that last HR , the most runs scored by the club between HR since $5 / 25-31 / 14$, when TEX scored 30 R between HR by Michael Choice \& Leonys Martin.

- Last night was the 14th Rangers game in 2021 with no HR (TEX or opponent), including one in each of the 3 stops on this road trip spanning last 4 G (Mon. at LAA, Tues. at ARI, last night).

WE SHALL NOT FORGET: By presidential proclamation, today is designated as Patriot Day, a National Day of Service and Remembrance occurring on September
11 of each year in memory of those who died in the 9/11/01 attacks...today, Major League Baseball will once again pause to remember those who lost their lives and pay tribute to the men and women who continue to bravely serve our communities and country...among the on-field elements today, all caps will have memorial September 11th silhouetted ribbon patches on the right side and special line-up cards and base jewels will be used for games played today.

- On September 11, 2001, the Rangers were scheduled to play the 2 nd game of a 7 -game road trip in Oakland...the final 2 games vs. the A's as well as a 4 -game series in Seattle were postponed...the Rangers embarked via bus from San Francisco on Sept. 14 towards Texas, ultimately securing a charter flight in Bakersfield, CA that returned the team home...the season resumed on 9/18 and the 6 postponed games in OAK and SEA were played at the end of the year.. this marks just the 2nd time that TEX will have played here at the Coliseum on $9 / 11$ in the 20 years since the attacks (also $6-1$ win on 9/11/08 at OAK).

DON'T RUN ON ADOLIS: Adolis García threw out Matt Olson at 2nd base in the 2nd inning last night for his 13th outfield assist of the season, his 1st since 8/21 at BOS...García's 13 OF assists rank 2nd in MLB (16-BOS' Hunter Renfroe) and are T7th-most in a single season in Rangers history, most since Leonys Martin had 13 assists in 2015...García joins Martin (13 in 2015, 14 in 2013) as the only Rangers with 13+ OF assists in a season in the last 30 years beg. 1992...club record is 19 by Mickey Rivers in 1980.

LEODY LOVE: Leody Taveras had 2 hits, including a double and RBI last night...Taveras has hit safely in a career-best 5 straight games, with hits in 8 of his last 9 games beg. 8/30 at . $316 / .333 / .632 / .965$ (12-38) w/ 2 HR, 4 2B, a 3B, 5 RBI, and 6 R....his 7 XBH over that span are tied w/ BOS' Bobby Dalbec for most among ML rookies since 8/30, and his 12 hits rank 3rd among rookies in that span (12-CHC's Frank Schwindel, 13-TB's Wander Franco).

CHARLIE AND LEFTIES: Charlie Culberson enters today having gone 7 -for-13 with a $2 \mathrm{~B}, \mathrm{RBI}$, and no SO in his career against OAK starter Cole Irvin, including 6 -for-10 in 2021.. Culberson's . 357 BA vs. LHP is tied for the best among qualifying A.L. batters in 2021 (also TOR's Teoscar Hernandez), including a .433 BA (13-30) vs. LHP since start of August.

TO BE YOUNG: Texas has used a club-record 26 rookies this season, T3rd-most in MLB (28-BAL, 27-ARI, 26-TEX/MIA).. previous record was 23 in 2014 and 2019...team has seen 13 MLB debuts, 3rd-most in Rangers history (17-2014, 152019)...Texas leads MLB with club records for HR by rookies (61, prev. 51 in 2008) and games played by rookies (669, prev. 612 in 2014).

WHERE IS THE LOVE?: Kolby Allard enters today's start with 12 losses, tied for most on the club (also Mike Foltynewicz) and T4th-most in the A.L...he has not been given much help since joining the rotation, as his 2.36 runs of support per 9 innings while he is on the mound ranks as the lowest figure in MLB among pitchers with $15+$ starts...next-lowest on the list?: Foltynewicz at 2.63 RS/9.

DAYLIGHT FADING: Texas will play back-to-back day games to end this road trip, followed by a season-ending span in which just 4 of final 20 games will be day tilts...TEX has won both day games on this trip, and 3 of last 4 after a stretch of going 2-14 in day contests from 7/4-8/23...TEX offense in last 7 day games (4-3): .290/.348/.475/.823, 9 HR, 52 R (7.4 R/G)...batters have posted $10+$ hits in each of last 5 day games, hitting . 339 (21-62) w/ RISP in those contests.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER \#39 Kolby Allard, LHP (3-12, 5.00)

TODAY: The 24 -year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 28 th appearance/18th start of the season in today's 2 nd game of this 3 -G weekend set... has taken loss in 2 straight ( $0-2,6.17,9$ R-8 ER/11.2 IP), and his 12 losses are tied for team lead (Foltynewicz) and T4th-most in the A.L...hsi 25 HR allowed are T8th-most in the A.L. and he is averaging $2.26 \mathrm{HR} / 9$ as a starter...has gone 1-3, 4.50 ( $18 \mathrm{ER} / 36.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in $6 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ since the start of August to drop season ERA from 5.23 to 5.00 ....has 4 quality starts in that span after he entered August with 5 career QS...his $2.01 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ is 9th-lowest in A.L. among pitchers with 100.0 IP . one-or-zero BB issued in 13 of 17 starts...needs 1.1 IP to reach 200.0 innings for his career....over last 9 starts, LHB are hitting . 328 (19-58) w/ 8 HR and 1.119 OPS...tonight will mark his 18th consecutive start since being slotted into the rotation on $5 / 27$, as he has gone 2-12, 5.40 ( $55 \mathrm{ER} / 91.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) as a starter in $2021 \ldots$ has achieved career highs in appearances (27), starts (17), innings (111.2) and strikeouts (90) this season...opened season in the bullpen after making 2nd consecutive Opening Day roster and logged 10 relief appearances ( $1-0,3.15$ ERA) before moving to rotation...is in his 4th MLB campaign with Atlanta (2018) and Texas (2019-21)...was originally acquired by TEX from ATL in a trade deadline deal for RHP Chris Martin on 7/30/19...the Southern California native was selected by ATL in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2015 June draft out of San Clemente High School...Texas is $3-14$ in Allard's 17 starts.
LAST START: Took loss in Rangers' 4-1 defeat on Sat. at LAA ( 5.2 IP, $5 \mathrm{H}, 4 \mathrm{R}-3$ ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 82 pitches/ 55 strikes), his 1st career start (2nd app.) near his hometown of San Clemente...permitted just a solo HR by Juan Lagares (3rd inning) over the 1 st 5 innings, retiring 13 of 1st 14 BF , as he had allowed just 2 baserunners entering the 6th with TEX trailing 1-0...the 6th inning opened with the following sequence: BB-E5 (Culberson)-3-R HR by Ohtani...TEX managed a single run in the 9th to avoid a shutout against Jose Suarez, who posted a CG in Rangers' last defeat before a 4-G win streak.
vs. OAKLAND: Has gone 1-5, 6.46 (22 ER/30.2 IP) in $6 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ in career vs. OAK, including 1-3, 5.18 ( $14 \mathrm{ER} / 24.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in $4 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ in 2021...had lost each of 1st 5 career starts vs. A's before win in last outing on $8 / 15$ at Globe Life Field in Rangers' $7-4$ victory ( $6.1 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{H}, 3 \mathrm{R}$-ER)...that win ended career-long 8 -game losing streak, as 2 of 3 runs allowed came on solo HR by Matt Chapman (2nd inn.) and Mark Canha (6th inn.)...has just one career outing at the Coliseum, taking loss despite quality start on $6 / 30$ at OAK ( $6.0 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{H}, 3 \mathrm{R}$-ER).

HIGH QUALITY: Had quality starts in 4 straight to open August, this after entering the month with 5 QS in his career...it is T2nd-longest QS streak by a TEX pitcher this season: Gibson (9), Lyles/Allard (4).

- Over 1st 3 starts in August, recorded 3 straight quality starts without allowing a walk (1-1, 3.44 ERA), matching Derek Holland (3, 9/2-12/14) and Colby Lewis (3, 4/11-22/12) for the longest such streak in Rangers history.
WALKS: Ranks 9th in the A.L. (min. 100 IP ) with a career-low $2.04 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ rate. has walked 19 of $386(4.92 \%)$ batters faced since joining the rotation on $5 / 27$, issuing one-or-zero BB in 13 of 17 GS this season...went 76 straight batters faced without issuing a walk before free pass to Kyle Schwarber on $8 / 23$ at BOS.

ON ROAD: Has seen better results in his $14 \mathrm{G} / 9 \mathrm{GS}$ at home (2-7, 4.70) than on the road $(1-5,5.36)$ in 2021...has quality starts in 2 of last 3 on the road ( $0-1$ in those 3 GS ) and is $1-5,5.36$ ( $25 \mathrm{ER} / 42.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in his 8 road starts this season, with 10 total runs of support while he has been in the game ( $2.14 \mathrm{RS} / 9$ ).
AS STARTER / RELIEVER: Has gone 7-20, 5.92 (113 ER/171.2 IP) in 35 career starts and 1-1, 4.67 (14 ER/27.0 IP) in 15 career relief outings...this season, he is 2-12, $5.40(55 \mathrm{ER} / 91.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 17 starts and 1-0, $3.15(7 \mathrm{ER} / 20.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 10 relief outings...opened 2021 in bullpen before joining rotation on $5 / 27$ at SEA.

- As starter: $\mathbf{2 . 3 6}$ run support average ( $\mathrm{RS} / 9$ ) as a starter is lowest among MLB pitchers with $15+$ starts in '21...lost 8 consecutive starts from 6/24-8/4, the longest single-season streak of consecutive losing starts in Rangers history and longest in MLB this season...recorded career-high 9 strikeouts in 5.1 IP on $7 / 5$ vs. DET, becoming the 5 th Texas southpaw to ever record $9+$ K's in an outing of less than 6.0 IP...career-best 12.0 -inning scoreless streak spanning starts $6 / 5$ vs. TB, $6 / 12$ at LAD, and $6 / 19$ vs. MIN... win on $6 / 12$ at LAD for SoCal native was his 1st in 13 starts dating to 2019 ( $0-10,7.82$ ERA) and snapped TEX club-record 16-G road losing streak...outdueled Trevor Bauer in that victory, which was 1st win by a TEX LH starter since Mike Minor on 9/26/19 vs. BOS...allowed ca-reer-high 4 HR in final start before the AS break, 7/11 vs. OAK....his teams (ATL/ TEX) are 12-23 in his starts, with the Rangers losing 20 of last 23.
- As reliever: First win of ' 21 came in Rangers' come-from-behind 8-4 win on $5 / 22$ vs. HOU (1.1 IP, 0 R)....his 23 relief strikeouts were T3rd-most on club at the time of his move to the rotation...had 2.35 ERA ( 2 ER/7.2 IP) over his last 4 outings... worked 3.0 perfect IP on $4 / 16$ vs. BAL, longest relief outing of career...pitched perfect 9 th inning ( 3 K 's) to finish Rangers' $8-3$ win on $4 / 13$ at TB, earning club's celebratory Cowboy Hat for his effort.

OAK (L, $0.2 \mathrm{IP}, 2 \mathrm{H}$, $4 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, 2 \mathrm{SO}, 1 \mathrm{HR}$ )...recorded just two outs (both strikeouts), the 2nd-shortest outing by a Texas starting pitcher in 2021 to only Kyle Gibson's Opening Day start on $4 / 1$ at KC ( 0.1 IP, 5 R-ER) ... has fared better in his 3 road starts ( $2-0,3.60$ ERA) than in his 4 starts at Globe Life Field ( $1-2,5.63$ ERA) ...recorded at least one strikeout in 18 straight from $4 / 20-6 / 30$, and has K 's in 36 of 38 outings overall....career-high 7 K's on $4 / 12$ at TB, matching most in club history by a relief pitcher in 3.0 -or-fewer innings....had 10.2-inning scoreless streak from $4 / 25-5 / 19$, 2nd-longest by a TEX reliever this season...the Dallas-area product has seen Major League action with Texas in each of the last 3 seasons, working primarily as a reliever after coming up through the minor leagues as a starter...is in his 3rd full season in the TEX organization after being acquired in a 3 -player trade with the Pittsburgh Pirates on $7 / 31 / 18$... Texas is $4-3$ in his 7 starts this season, winning 3 straight.
