SUNDAY FUNDAY: The Royals won 5-3 on Sunday at Target Field to take two of three from the Twins and finish 4-3 on their second-to-last road trip of the season...Kris Bubic took a 3-1 lead into the sixth, when he loaded the bases with one out and exited in favor of Domingo Tapia, who allowed two of the three inherited runners to score on Brent Rooker's game-tying, two-run double...the score remained tied into the eighth when Kyle Isbel-who was recalled from Triple-A earlier in the day-hit the go-ahead RBI single in his first big league game since April 21...Andrew Benintendi added a sac. fly in the ninth-his 14th RBI in seven games on the trip-and Scott Barlow earned his 12th save of the year and his second on the trip with a scoreless ninth

ROSTER MOVES: The Royals announced yesterday that right hander Joel Payamps has been reinstated from the Injured List....he takes the roster spot of right hander Scott Blewett, who was optioned following Sunday's game. On Sunday night, the Royals announced that right hander Ronald Bolaños has been reinstated from the 60-day Injured List and optioned to Triple-A Omaha...the Royals' Major League Reserve List is now at 40.

WEEKLY HONORS: Major League Baseball yesterday named Andrew Benintendi the American League Player of the Week for the period of Sept. 6-12, in which he hit . 500 (14-for-28) with three doubles, three HR and led the Majors in hits and RBI (14)...this marks Benintendi's first career Player of the Week honor and the second for the Royals in three weeks, following Salvador Perez from Aug. 23-29...Benintendi's 14 RBI last week matched the franchise record for RBI on a trip of seven games or fewer, according to Bally Sports Kansas City, joining Jeff King, who had 14 RBI on a seven-game trip in 1997 and Kendrys Morales, who had 14 RB on a six-game trip in 2016...Benintendi had an RBI in six of the seven games, including four go-ahead RBI and two game-winning RBI...on Wednesday in Baltimore, he homered and drove in five of the Royals' eight runs.

CLEMENTE NOMINEE: Major League Baseball announced today that Salvador Perez has been named the Royals' 2021 nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award, baseball's most prestigious individual honor...the award is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions both on and off the field...Perez has been prominently involved with Teach for America over the last several years, and has coached a clinic for kids through the Carlos Fortuna Organization in Bogota, Columbia....he also filmed surprise messages for Royals fans during the lockdown, supported essential workers at local grocery stores during the pandemic, continued his work as a member of "Sarah's Soldiers" by supporting local police officer, Sarah Olsen through her battle with ALS and once again partnered with Braden's Hope for Childhood Cancer.

Tomorrow marks the 20th annual Roberto Clemente Day, which was established by Major League Baseball to honor Clemente's legacy as a humanitarian and to formally acknowledge club nominees of the Roberto Clemente Award...the league-wide winner will be selected via a blue ribbon panel, including Baseball Commissioner Robert D. Manfred Jr., representatives from MLB-affiliated networks, MLB.com, as well as Roberto's children, Enrique, Luis and Roberto Clemente Jr...beginning today, fans can vote for the Roberto Clemente Award through the end of the season via mlb.com/clemente21.

BIRTHDAYS IN THE BULLPEN: Royals rookie Jake Brentz is celebrating his 27th birthday today, and shares this date of birth with current players Gregory Polanco (24), Cody Anderson (23) \& Reds manager David Bell (49)

+ Right hander Kyle Zimmer yesterday celebrated his 30th birthday and on Thursday, Jakob Junis-who is currently on the 10-day Injured List with a right shoulder impingement-will celebrate his 29th birthday.

VS. ATHLETICS: The Royals will begin a three-game set with Oakland tonight for their first meeting with the Athletics since June 10-13, when the Royals lost three of four...the Royals have lost 12 of their last 16 games vs. the Athletics, in which they've been outscored 83-48 (-35)...they are seeking their first series win over the A's since taking two of three from Aug. 14-16, 2017 in Oakland, and the Royals have not won a series vs. the A's at Kauffman Stadium since taking two of three from April 17-19, 2015, going 3-11 at home vs. the A's since.

ON DECK: The Royals begin a six-game homestand tonight vs. Oakland and Seattle, which will mark their final games outside the American League Central division...following this homestand, the Royals will play each of LOVE FOR LOPEZ: Nicky Lopez reached on an infield single in the first inning on Sunday to extend his hit streak to nine games-including seven multi-hit efforts-a stretch in which he's batting . 425 (17-for-40)...the hit also extended his career-best on-base streak to 22 games, which is the fifth-longest active run in the Majors and the longest streak by a Royal since Jorge Soler reached in 25 straight from Sept. 14, 2019-Aug. 3, 2020.. Lopez leads the Majors with 36 hits during the streak and is batting . 391 -which ranks second in the Majorswith a . 446 on-base percentage that ranks third in the American League and fifth in the Majors since Aug. 21.

Lopez has 66 hits in 51 games since the All-Star break, one shy of Freddie Freeman (53 games) for the Lopez has 66 hits in 51 games since the All-Star break, one shy of Freddie Freeman ( 53 games) for the Majors lead among left-handed batters.. his .340 batting average since the break leads all American League left handers and his .385 on-base percentage ranks fourth among AL lefties

+ After batting . 226 (36-for-159) through his first 59 games of the season, Lopez is batting a Major League-best . 343 ( 91 -for-265) in his last 73 games since June 15 with an American League-leading .392 on-base percentage, which ranks fifth among all big leaguers during that time.

SALVY SPLASHES: Salvador Perez is homerless in his last four games, but his 42 home runs rank third in the Majors behind Shohei Ohtani (44) and Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (45)... his 194 career homers are three shy of Mike Sweeney (197) for second in Royals history, and with 19 games remaining, Salvy is six homers shy of matching Jorge Soler ( 48 HR in 2019) for the club's single-season record, and he's attempting to become the first Royal to lead the Majors in HR....after hitting 21 HR in 89 games before the All-Star break, Perez leads the Majors since the break with 21 homers in 53 games

+ Salvy enters today with 105 RBI, second most in the Majors behind José Abreu (107), and he's attempting to become the second Royal to lead the Majors in RBI, and would join Hal McRae, who recorded a Majors-best 133 RBI in 1982...Salvy has 52 RBI in 53 games since the All-Star break, second most in the Majors, and he's on pace for 119 RBI, which would be third-highest single-season total in Royals history behind Sweeney (144 in 2000) and McRae (133 in 1982), and would be the most by any player who played at least 75\% of his games at catcher since Mike Piazza had 124 RBI in 1999 .
+ The last to lead the Majors in both HR and RBI was Giancarlo Stanton in 2017, when he won the National League Most Valuable Player Award. + In his last 162 games since Aug. 11, 2020, Perez is batting 283 ( 178 -for- 629 ) with 90 runs, 26 doubles, 50 home runs, 128 RBI and an .885 OPS. + Of Salvy's 42 home runs, 28 have come as a catcher, leaving him seven shy of Iván Rodríguez's American League record of 35 HR as a catcher, set in 1999, according to Elias...Perez is on pace for 48 home runs overall, which would be the most in Major League history by a player who played at least $75 \%$ of his games at catcher...the current standard is 45 (including 38 as a catcher), set by Johnny Bench in 1970
+ Perez has three HR and eight RBI in his last two home games, and has 22 homers and 58 RBI in 69 games at Kauffman Stadium this year...his 22 HR are the most in a single season in the 49-year history of this ballpark, one more than Chili Davis (1997), Dean Palmer (1998) and Soler (2019),
+ Salvy hit. 400 (6-for-15) in the Royals' visit to Oakland in June, including a three-hit, two-HR game on June 11 and a two-hit game two days later

JACKSON KOWAR is making his fifth start (6th appearance) of his rookie season he was chosen by Kansas City with the 33rd pick in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, which the Royals received as compensation for Lorenzo Cain signing with Milwaukee.

THE LONG GAME: Kowar suffered the loss in Kansas City's 7-3 defeat in Baltimore a week ago tonight, in which he was charged with a career-high six runs on five hits and four walks in 6.0 innings, with seven strikeouts...he walked the first two batters before yielding an RBI single and an RBI groundout, followed two batters later by a two-run home run by DJ Stewart to put the Royals in an early 4-O hole...he was tagged for another two-run homer in the third-this one by Austin Hays-but went on to retire 12 of the next 14 to complete 6.0 innings for the second straight start, while setting a new career high with seven strikeouts, including five via his changeup.

+ The Royals are $0-4$ in his starts, but he's recorded 6.0 innings in each of his last
two starts since his Sept. 1 recall, after pitching 2.0 innings over his first two starts.
GOOD FOR A CHANGE: Kowar has recorded 13 strikeouts in 12.0 innings over two starts since his Sept. 1 recall, and 10 of those 13 strikeouts have come via his changeup, including five on Sept. 1 vs. Cleveland and five a week ago tonight in Baltimore...the five strikeouts via changeup match Kris Bubic (Aug. 21 at Cubs) for the most strikeouts on a changeup by a Royal this season, and are the most by a Royals right-handed starting pitcher since Edinson Vólquez fanned five with his changeup more than five years ago, on Aug. 30, 2016 vs. the Yankees...in his last two starts, opponents are batting just . 167 (3-for-18) vs. his changeup with 10 strikeouts.

JACKSON'S JOURNEY: Kowar was recalled on Sept. 1 for his second big league stint, and has pitched 6.0 innings in each of his two starts since, after recording just two and four outs in his first two big league starts during his first stint...on Sept. 1 vs. Cleveland, he allowed two runs in 6.0 innings, and in his last start a week ago tonight in Baltimore, he was charged with a career-high six runs in 6.0 innings, but struck out a career-best seven batters...before making his debut on June 7, he went 5-0 with a 0.85 ERA ( 3 ER in 31.2 IP) in six starts with Triple-A Omaha to begin the season. he returned to Omaha on June 27, and made 11 appearances there before returning to Kansas City this month...in 17 appearances ( 16 starts) with Omaha overall this season, Kowar went $9-4$ with a 3.46 ERA ( 31 ER in 80.2 IP) \& 115 strikeouts ( $12.8 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ).

VS. OAKLAND: Kowar is making his sixth career outing tonight and second vs. Oakland, which becomes the first team he will face twice...in his second career star on June 12 at The Coliseum, he was charged with four runs on five hits and three walks while recording just four outs in an 11-2 loss...he threw 57 pitches, 29 of which were strik

OP OF THE CLASS: In his debut on June 7 in Anaheim, Kowar became the fifth player selected by the Royals in the 2018 Draft to make his Majors debut, joining Brady Singer (18th), Daniel Lynch (34th), Kris Bubic (40th) and Kyle Isbel (3rd round)...according to Elias, the 2021 Royals are the fourth team in the last 27 seasons-since 1995-to have four different homegrown pitchers from the same draft class start a game in the same season, joining the 2018 St. Louis Cardinals, 1995 Chicago White Sox and 1995 New York Mets...all four are now part of the Royals' six-man rotation, and that foursome has started 59 of the Royals' 144 games this season (including tonight), accounting for $41.0 \%$ of the team's games.

+ Since the first year of the Draft in 1965, there have been 14 instances of a team selecting at least four pitchers in the first round... according to ESPN Stats \& Info, the Royals are the first of those teams to have four first-round picks from the same draft class pitch for them in the Majors.


## TOMORROW NIGHT'S STARTER: LHP MIKE MINOR (8-12, 5.05)

+ Minor will make his team-leading 29th start of the season and 210th of his career tomorrow night against the Athletics at Kauffman Stadium.
+ In his last start in Baltimore last Wednesday, Mike did not figure into the decision of a 9-8 Royals loss, despite tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in which he scattered just five hits, marking his longest scoreless offering since throwing a 7.0-inning complete game shutout in Game 2 of a doubleheader on Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle (with the Athletics)...he retired each of his first six batters, before yielding a leadoff single in the third inning...escaped a bases-loaded, one-out jam in the third with back-to-back strikeouts of Ryan Mountcastle and Austin Hays to strand all three base runners...stranded two more in the fourth, pitched around a leadoff single in the fifth and finished his night with a 1-2-3 sixth inning. + He did not walk a batter last Wednesday...he's issued one walk or fewer in 15 of his 28 starts, including eight of the last 10 and each of his last five.
+ Over 11 career appearances ( 8 starts) vs. Oakland, Minor is $3-5$ with a 5.36 ERA ( 29 ER in 48.2 IP), which is his third highest ERA against any opponent...he faced the Athletics on June 10 this year in Oakland and pitched 7.0 innings of one-run ball, scattering three hits and eight strikeouts.
+ In 14 home starts this season, he's gone $4-7$ with a 5.18 ERA ( 47 ER in 81.2 IP)...he's tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven of his last 10 starts at home.


## MANAGER MIKE MATHENY

+ With a win on Opening Day vs. Texas, Mike Matheny-in his ninth season as a Major League manager-became the ninth active manager to record a win vs. all 30 teams, according to Elias, joining Dusty Baker (24th season), Bud Black (14th season), Terry Francona (21st season), Joe Girardi (13th season), AJ Hinch (8th season), Joe Maddon (18th season), Don Mattingly (11th season) and Bob Melvin (18th season).
+ The game on July 30 marked Matheny's 162nd game as Royals manager, in which he went 71-91, matching the number of wins the Royals had in Ned Yost's first full season as manager in 2011, and marked a 12-game improvement on the Royals' 2019 season under Yost, in which they went 59-103.
+ Matheny was named the Royals' 17th full-time manager on Oct. 31, 2019 and has a 682-586 record over nine seasons as a manager-including seven years in St. Louis-and his 682 wins are the ninth most among active managers...his .538 win percentage ranks sixth among active skippers.
+ This is Matheny's second big league managerial stint, after leading the St. Louis Cardinals from 2012-2018, then serving as a Special Advisor to Player Development for the Royals during the 2019 campaign.... he posted a winning record in each of his seven seasons with St. Louis, including a Major League-best 100 victories in 2015...Matheny led the Cardinals to the postseason in each of his first four seasons from 2012-15, becoming the first manager to do that in Major League history....under his leadership, the Cardinals were a Wild Card qualifier in 2012, before winning three-straight National League Central titles (2013-15) and winning the National League pennant in 2013


## REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

+ Royals' replay specialist Bill Duplissea was unsuccessful in his most recent challenge on Aug. 27 in Seattle where replay upheld a juggling catch by second baseman Abraham Toro to retire Andrew Benintendi.
+ He's challenged 115 calls since 2018, and just six of them have been confirmed, including four this season, the first of which came on May 13 and snapped a streak of 35 challenges without one being confirmed...he also had a streak of 48 straight without a confirmed from Sept. 27, 2017-April 9, 2019.
+ Duplissea is 16 -for- 31 on challenges this season, and owns a Majors-best $69.5 \%$ success rate ( 132 -for-190) since 2016, well ahead of the Yankees, who rank second with a $64.5 \%$ overturn rate, and well above the Majors average, which is $49.7 \%$ this season as of the last update from Major League Baseball on Sept. 9...the Royals have finished in the top three in replay success rate in each of the last five seasons from 2016-20, including a 78.6 success rate in 2018, which is the best rate by any team since 2016.
