ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Angels by a 5-1 score yesterday to capture the series victory...have won 7 of their last 8 games and 8 of their last 10...are 16-8 over their last 24 games, 23-14 over their last 37, 27-15 over their last 42, 30-21 over their last 51, 35-24 over their last 59, 41-28 over their last 69, 52-34 over their last 86, 55-35 over their last 90 and 65-44 over their last 109...are 33-22 in day games and 53-48 at night... are 42-33 at T-Mobile Park and 44-37 on the road...are 70-25 when scoring at least 4 runs and 16-45 when scoring 3 or fewer runs....are 57-9 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Series Openers - The Mariners are 31-19 (.620) in series openers this season.
- Flex On Them - Seattle is 20-9 (.690) when Chris Flexen starts this season.
- Joy Division - Seattle is 43-27 (.614) against the American League West Division this season.
- Series-ly Good - The Mariners own an 18-9-2 series record since June 14, winning or splitting 20 of their last 29...the Mariners own a 26-19-5 record in 50 series this season.
- Vs. Lefties - Seattle is $34-26$ (.567) in games against left-handed starting pitchers.
- The Comebacks - The Mariners yesterday earned their 38th comeback victory of the season.
- 1-Run Games - Seattle is 33-18 (.647) in 1-run games, leading MLB with 33 one-run victories. SWEET SIXTEEN...the Mariners (86-70) are a season-high 16 games above .500 for the 2nd time this season...they were also 16 games above at 85-69 on Sept. 24 ...with a win tonight, Seattle would be 17 games above the .500 mark for the first time since Aug. 26, 2018 when they were 74-57.
BRING YOUR 'A' GAME...the Mariners have won 9 consecutive games against the Athletics since July 23... with a win tonight, Seattle would tie the franchise record for most consecutive wins against a single opponent...the Mariners defeated the Kansas City Royals in 10 straight games from June 14-Sept. 24, 1985...they also defeated the Baltimore Orioles in 10 straight games from June 22, 2000-May 31, 2001.

FOUR CONSECUTIVE AND SIX OF SEVEN WINNING MONTHS ...the Mariners are 15-8 in 23 September contests and clinched their 4th consecutive winning month...the Mariners have gone 14-12 (.538) in June, 14-10 (.583) in July and 15-13 (.536) in August...Seattle last recorded 4 consecutive winning months from June-Sept. 2009...this season, the Mariners have put together a winning record in 5 of 6 months, going 15-12 (.556) in April and 13-15 (.464) in May...the Mariners have put together a winning record in 6 of their last 7 months, going 12-11 (.522) in Sept. 2020.
KRUSHING IT IN SEPTEMBER...Jarred Kelenic yesterday hit a game-tying home run in the 7 th inning off Shohei Ohtani...it was Kelenic's 14th home run of the season and his 7th in September...in 23 games during the month, he is batting .235 ( $20 \times 85$ ) with 15 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7 homers, 16 RBI and 9 walks, getting on-base at a . 309 clip, slugging .553 with an .861 OPS...among AL rookies in the month, he ranks 1st in runs (15), 1st in home runs (7), 1st in total bases (47) and T1st in RBI (16) with Bobby Dalbec-BOS. FRANCING IN THE MOONLIGHT...Ty France is rated as Seattle's most valuable player by BaseballReference WAR (3.9) and FanGraphs WAR (3.3) this season...he is batting . 290 ( $159 \times 549$ ) with 78 runs, 29 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs, 68 RBI and 42 walks this season...since the All-Star Break, he is batting .322 ( $82 \times 255$ ) with 39 runs, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 16 walks, with his 82 hits tied for most in the American League since the break....he ranks 2nd in the Majors with 26 hit-by-pitches...he is rated by FanGraphs as the best defensive first baseman in the Majors (min. 800 innings at first base).
COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR?...Mitch Haniger has 35 home runs and 88 RBI this season after missing the 2020 campaign due to injury...he's played in 151 of Seattle's 156 games, batting . 250 ( $149 \times 595$ ) with 105 runs scored, 23 doubles, 2 triples, 35 homers, 88 RBI, 52 walks and 281 total bases...he is the first Seattle player with score 100 runs in a season since Robinson Canó scored 107 in 2016 and the first Seattle outfielder since Ichiro Suzuki scored 103 in 2007.
SEAGER'S SEVEN...Kyle Seager has reached base safely in 6 of his last 7 games (9/20-c), batting . 393 (11x28) with 3 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run and 4 RBI in that span, getting on-base at a .414 clip, slugging .643 with a 1.057 OPS...Seager has 35 home runs and 100 RBI on the season, both representing career highs and ranking 9th in the American League in both categories.
SADLER'S STREAK...Casey Sadler has not allowed a run over his last 24 appearances since July 27 ...the streak has spanned 22.2 innings, with Sadler walking 4 and striking out 18 during the streak...opponents are batting just . 137 (10x73) against him in that stretch...his 24 -game scoreless streak is 2nd-longest in franchise history, trailing only Shigetoshi Hasegawa's franchise record 25 -game scoreless streak.. Hasegawa did not allow a run in 25 consecutive appearances from June 3-Aug. 17, 2003.
STARTS AT THE TOP...J.P. Crawford reached base 3 times yesterday, going 2-for-4 with a run, his 35th double of the season and a walk...in his last 25 games, he is batting .308 ( $32 \times 104$ ) with 19 runs, 7 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI and 13 walks, getting on-base at a .381 clip, slugging .462 with an .843 OPS.
ON THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff has the 2nd-lowest walks-per-9 innings ratio (2.70) in the American League since Aug. 1, trailing only Tampa Bay (2.65)...Seattle pitchers have surrendered 139 walks in that span, 3rd-fewest in the AL behind Tampa Bay (135) and Oakland (138)...Mariners starters have allowed 4 or fewer runs in 13 of their last 14 outings and 3 or fewer in 12 of their last 14.
END OF THE ROAD...Seattle played its final road game of the 2021 regular season yesterday...the Mariners finish the season with a 44-37 (.543) on the road, their best road record since also finishing 44-37 in 2018...this season is tied for the 5th-best road record in franchise history, trailing 2001 (.728, 59-22), 2014 (.568, 46-35), 1997 (.556, 45-36) and 2002 (.556, 45-36).
ONE MORE FOR THE ROAD...the Mariners went 19-6 (.760) over their final 25 road games this season.. the .760 winning percentage since Aug. 8 ranks best in the American League and 3rd-best in the Majors to San Francisco $(.818,18-4)$ and St. Louis (.815, 22-5)...the 19-6 record is the Mariners best $25-$ game stretch on the road since going 19-6 over 25 road games from May 16-July 3, 2003...the Mariners have won 6 of their last 8 road series.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners were victorious over the Los Angeles Angels in yesterday's series finale, winning by a 5-1 score after trailing 1-0 through 6 innings...Seattle tied the game in the 7 th and pulled ahead 5-1 in the 8th with a 4 -run frame, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that the Mariners lead the Majors this season with 37 go-ahead RBI in the 8th inning or later?...Seattle easily paces the league, with the New York Yankees and Tampa Bay Rays tied for the 2nd-most go-ahead RBI in the 8th inning or later with 33.

## ABOUT FLEXEN

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 41st career start (57th appearance), his 30th start of 2021 and 5th career start against Oakland, all of them this season
- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-year contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School...made his ML debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at SD.
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012.. played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the footbal team for 2 years...was committed to Arizona State University before signing with the Mets.
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA (236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games ( 105 starts)...in 2013 was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
- In his Mariners debut on April 3, 2021, became the 900th Seattle Mariners player in franchise history.
- Recorded his 100th career strikeout when he struck out Cavan Biggio on 6/29 against Toronto (in Buffalo).
LAST OUTING...W\#13 at Oakland on Sept. 22...tossed 7.0 innings allowing just 1 run (solo HR) on 3 hits and 2 walks while tying his career high with 8 strikeouts (last: 6/15/21 vs. MIN).
AMONG AL LEADERS...Flexen ranks among the American League leaders several categories, including 1st in GIDP (21), T2nd in wins (13), T4th lowest walk per 9.0 IP (2.02), 6th in ERA (3.56), T6th most quality starts (15), and T9th in innings pitched (169.1).
DISTINGUISHED COMPANY...Flexen is the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record a 10-win season in their first season with the Mariners joining Floyd Bannister (1979), Gaylord Perry (1982), Matt Young (1983), Mark Langston (1984), Tim Belcher (1995), Sterling Hitchcock (1996), Jeff Fassero (1997), Freddy Garcia (1999), Aaron Sele (2000), Miguel Batista (2007), Joe Saunders (2013) and Roenis Elias (2014)...tied with Batista (20 GS) for the 3rd fastest to achieve the feat behind Aaron Sele (17 GS) and Freddy Garcia (19 GS).
WINNER...the Mariners are 20-9 (.690) in Flexen's 29 starts this season...posted a ca-reer-best 4-game winning streak, June 15-July 16...went 4-0, 1.36 (39.2 IP, 6 ER) in 6 starts during the streak...struck out 29 while walking just 8 and has limited opposing hitters to a . 200 BAA...his previous career-best winning streak was 3 games (4/245/14/21).
LATELY...Flexen is $4-1$ with a 3.12 ERA (21 ER, 60.2) with 49 strikeouts and 16 walks over his last 10 starts dating back to August 2...his 3.12 ERA during that span is 9th best in the American League among qualifiers.
BIRTHDAY MONTH...went $3-2$ with a 3.38 ERA (11 ER, 29.1 IP) in 5 starts in July...walked 5 and struck out 17 in the month.
ONE AND DONE...has recorded 11 games this season where he has tallied at least 6.0 innings while allowing 1 earned run or fewer, tied for 3rd most in the American League (also: Frankie Montas-OAK) behind Gerrit Cole (NYY) and Robbie Ray (TOR) who each have 12.
CAREER DAY...earned win \#6 this season against Minnesota after setting career highs in innings pitched, strikeouts and (then) pitches thrown....went 8.0 scoreless IP, allowing 4 hits, striking out 8 without walking a batter... 26 BF in 8.0 IP...threw 107 pitches, 77 for strikes.
FIRST 11 AT HOME...Flexen went 6 -3 with a 1.89 ERA (14 ER, 66.2 IP) in his first 11 home starts with the Mariners (April 3-July 22)... his 1.89 ERA was the lowest in club history through a player's first 11 home starts of a season, ranking ahead of Félix Hernández (2.09 in 2014) and James Paxton (2.15 in 2017).

FIRST WIN...earned his first win as a Mariner in his first Mariners start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts on April 3 vs. San Francisco...became first Mariners pitcher to throw 5.0+ scoreless innings in his debut with the team since LH Wade LeBlanc threw 6.0 scoreless IP on June 24, 2016 in his Mariners debut in a 4-3 win vs. St. Louis...marked Flexen's first win in the Majors in 1,319 days (Oct. 1, 2017 w/New York-NL at Philadelphia).
DOMINATING THE KBO...spent 2020 season with Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization and went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA ( 39 ER 116.2 IP) with 30 walks and 132 strikeouts over 21 starts...struck out $28 \%$ of batters faced, the 4th-highest rate in the KBO.
