TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the 2021 regular season with the last of 3 games against the Oakland Athletics (2-0)...following an off day tomorrow, will host the Los Angeles Angels for a 3-game series (10/1-10/3) at T-Mobile Park to close out the regular season..are coming off an $8-2$ road trip against Kansas City (2-1), Oakland (4-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW, as well as broadcast on 710 ESPN and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Athletics last night by a 4-2 score to capture the series victory...have won 9 of their last 10 games and 10 of their last 12...are 18-8 over their last 26 games, 25-14 over their last 39, 29-15 over their last 44, 32-21 over their last 53, 37-24 over their last 61, 43-28 over their last 71, 54-34 over their last 88, 57-35 over their last 92 and 67-44 over their last 111...are 33-22 in day games and 55-48 at night...are 44-33 at T-Mobile Park and 44-37 on the road...are 72-25 when scoring at least 4 runs and 16-45 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 59-9 when out-hitting their opponent.

- Joy Division - Seattle is 45-27 (.625) against the American League West Division this season.
- Never Gonna Give You Up - The Mariners are a half-game back of an AL Wild Card spot coming into play tonight...they were 4.0 games back of a Wild Card spot 2 weeks ago today, going 10-2 since then. - Recent Finales - Seattle has won 10 of its last 12 series finales.
- Series Record - The Mariners own an 19-9-2 series record since June 14, winning or splitting 21 of their last 30...the Mariners own a 27-19-5 record in 51 series on the season.
- Say Do You Remember - Seattle is 17-8 (.680) in 25 September games, the 2nd-best September winning percentage in the AL behind Toronto (.692, 18-8).
- Debuts - RHP Matt Brash was selected from Triple-A Tacoma yesterday... when he debuts will become the 11th Mariners player to make Major League debut this season and 63rd Mariners player overall.
- 1-Run Games - Seattle is 33-18 (.647) in 1-run games, leading MLB with 33 one-run victories.

BELIEVE...the Mariners ( $88-70$ ) are a season-high 18 games above . 500 ...they are 18 games above for the first time since Aug. 25, 2018 when they were 74-56... with a win tonight, the Mariners would be 19 games above .500 for the first time since Aug. 12, 2018 when they were 69-50.
FRANCHISE RECORD STREAK...the Mariners have won 11 consecutive games against the Athletics since July 23, setting the franchise record for most consecutive wins against a single opponent...the streak surpasses when Seattle defeated the Kansas City Royals in 10 straight games from June 14-Sept. 24, 1985 and the Baltimore Orioles in 10 straight games from June 22, 2000-May 31, 2001.
SADLER SETS TEAM RECORD...Casey Sadler has not allowed a run over his last 26 appearances since July 27, setting a franchise record and surpassing Shigetoshi Hasegawa's 25 -game scoreless streak (6/38/17/2003)...it's also tied for the longest streak in the Majors this season with Andrew Chafin-CHC ( 26 G , $5 / 8-7 / 21$ ) and Josh Taylor-BOS ( 26 G, 4/30-7/5)...Sadler's streak has spanned 25.0 innings, walking 4 and striking out 19 during the streak...opponents are batting just . 125 ( $10 \times 80$ ) against him in that stretch...on the season, Sadler's 0.72 ERA is lowest in the Majors among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched.
40 COMEBACKS...the Mariners earned their 3rd consecutive comeback win last night, also their 40th comeback win of the season...it is the first time Seattle has reached $40+$ comeback wins in a season since they recorded 45 comebacks in 2007...the 40 comebacks this season are 4th-most in the American League behind Boston (46), Tampa Bay (46) and New York (43).
AL COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR?...Mitch Haniger hit his 100th career home run last night.. he's hit 3 home runs in his last 2 games and has 38 home runs and 95 RBI on the season...Haniger ranks T5th in home runs (38), T5th in runs scored (108) and 8th in total bases (293) in the American League this season...in 25 September games, he is batting $.260(26 \times 100)$ with 18 runs, 3 doubles, 9 home runs, 22 RBI and 11 walks with an .896 OPS...his 43 RBI in the 7th inning or later this season are most in the Majors. TORREN' IT UP...Luis Torrens went 3-for-4 last night...in 22 September games, he's batting . 361 (22x61) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 8 RBI...he's slugging . 459 with an 834 OPS in September...in 75 games since June 15, Torrens is batting .272 ( $65 \times 239$ ) with 30 runs, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 41 RBI and 24 walks, getting on-base at a . 336 clip, slugging .485 with an .821 OPS.
ALWAYS ON BASE...J.P. Crawford went 2-for-5 with 2 doubles last night...his 37 doubles this season are tied for 5th-most in the American League...in 27 games since August 30, he is batting .325 ( $37 \times 114$ ) with 22 runs, 9 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI and 13 walks, getting on-base at a .391 clip, slugging .482 with an . 873 OPS...J.P. has tallied 122 non-pull hits (straightaway + opposite field) this season, tied for 2nd-most in the Majors with DJ LeMahieu-NYY and trailing only Bo Bichette-TOR (123).
DOMINATE THE ZONE...since August 1, the Mariners staff has the lowest walks-per-9 innings ratio (2.62) and are tied for the fewest walks (140) in the American League...Mariners starting pitchers have allowed 4 or fewer runs in 15 of their last 16 outings and 3 or fewer in 13 of their last 16.
STRIKER!...the Mariners pitching staff threw $77.0 \%$ strikes ( 87 of 113 ) in last night's game, their highest total of the season and highest since throwing $78.0 \%$ strikes on July 7, 2018 vs. Colorado...Tyler Anderson's $87.0 \%$ strikes ( 40 strikes/46 pitches) last night made for the highest total by a starting pitcher in the Majors this season (min. 40 pitches), surpassing Kevin Gausman-SF (86.1\%) on May 30.
TY IS THAT GUY...Ty France is batting . 293 (163x557) with 81 runs, 30 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs, 72 RBI and 44 walks this season...since the All-Star Break, he is batting . 327 ( $86 \times 263$ ) with 42 runs, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 35 RBI and 18 walks, with his 86 hits leading the American Leaque since the break...his 26 hit-by-pitches are tied for most in the Majors with Mark Canha-OAK.
KELENIC IN SEPTEMBER...Jarred Kelenic walked and scored a run in last night's win...in 25 September contests, he is batting .242 ( $22 \times 91$ ) with 18 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 16 RBI and 11 walks, getting on-base at a 324 clip, slugging .538 with an . 862 OPS...among American League rookies in the month, he ranks 1st in runs scored (18), T1st in home runs (7) with Ryan Mountcastle-BAL, 1st in total bases (49) and T1st in RBI (16) with Bobby Dalbec-BOS.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners pitching staff did not allow a walk in last night's $4-2$ win...that came after walking just 1 the previous night in a 13-4 win vs. Oakland, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that it is the 9th instance this season that Seattle's pitching staff has walked 0 or 1 batters over a 2 -game span, most in the Majors?...the Mariners pitching staff has surrendered 0 or 1 walk over a 2-game span from May $\frac{1}{13-14}$, July 8-9, July 30-31, July 31-Aug. 1, Aug. 10-11, Aug. 11-12, Aug. 15-17, Aug. 17-18 and Sept. 27-28...the Chicago White Sox have the 2nd-most instances (8) of 0 or 1 walk over a 2 -game span in the Majors this season.

- 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 24th start of his MLB career, all of them coming this season, and his 4th start against Oakland.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau.
- Named to the Mariners 60-man roster prior to the start of the 2020 season...spent season pitching at Mariners Alternate site in Tacoma.
- In 2019, split season between A West Virginia (4/4-5/1), High-A Modesto (5/2-7/14), and Double-A Arkansas (July 15-end), going 10-5 with a 2.13 ERA (32 ER, 135.0 IP ) in 26 combined starts in first professional season.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Among all MiL pitchers in 2019, ranked 3rd in ERA (2.13), 5th in average (.198), T7th in strikeouts (165), while his 10 wins were 2nd-most among all Mariners farmhands.
- \#100 - reached 100 career strikeouts on 9/1/2021 vs. HOU with a strikeout of Yordan Álvarez.
LAST OUTING...ND in last start on 9/24 at LAA...threw career high 110 pitches going 5.1 innings allowing 5 hits and 4 runs with 4 strikeouts and 3 walks.
STELLAR SEPTEMBER...Gilbert owns a 2.93 ERA (9 ER, 27.2 IP) in September with 27 strikeouts and 6 walks.

WHAT A STRETCH...between May 25 - Aug. 10, Gilbert went 5-1 with a 3.51 ERA ( 26 ER, 66.2 IP) in 13 starts...during this stretch he limited opponents to a . $213(52 \times 244)$ average, while walking 16 and striking out $77 . .$. the Mariners won the first 11 of his starts during the stretch (11-2 overall).
LUCKY 11...from May 25-July 30 Seattle recorded 11 consecutive victories in Gilbert starts...the 11 consecutive team wins in his starts ranks 3rd in Mariners history...Gilbert trails just 2 streaks: 13 GS, Jamie Moyer (7/189/24/2001) and 13 GS Aaron Sele (4/4-6/12/2001)...Gilbert is just ahead of Randy Johnson who had a pair of 10 start streaks within the same season (4/27-6/10/1995 and 8/11-10/02/1995)...statistic via Stats Perform.
SHUT OUT...W\#3 in 4-0 win over the Yankees on July 8 at T-Mobile Park... struck out 8 over 7.0 scoreless innings allowing just 1 hit and 1 hit by pitch... became the 2 nd-youngest pitcher in franchise history to toss 7.0 or more shutout innings while allowing 1 hit or less.
REMARKABLE ROOKIE...Gilbert is set to make his 24th start this season in today's game; he's the 16th Mariner to make 20 starts in their rookie season...Gilbert also had the 2nd most strikeouts (101) by a Mariners rookie through their first 19 starts behind Michael Pineda (119 in 2011)...Gilbert and Pineda are the only Mariners rookies to have at least 100 strikeouts through 19 career starts...Gilbert ranks 6th in franchise history for strikeouts by a rookie with 124, passing teammate Yusei Kikuchi who ranks 7th with 116 strikeouts during his rookie season in 2019.
HALF CENTURY...became the 6th pitcher in franchise history to tally at least 50 strikeouts through his first 10 career games on July 8 vs. New York-AL...his 84 strikeouts through his 1st 15 starts are T3rd-most in franchise history (also: Nate Karns in 2016), trailing only Michael Pineda (94 in 2011) and Felix Hernandez (94 in 2006).

MLB DEBUT...made his MLB debut on May 13 vs. CLE...threw 4.0 innings and allowed 4 earned runs on 5 hits and no walks with 5 strikeouts and 2 home runs in 4-2 loss...was tagged with the loss...tossed 71 pitches (52 strikes) and two wild pitches...notched his first career strikeout in the 3rd inning (Céasar Hernández).....became the 42nd Mariners pitcher to start in MLB debut, the first since Justin Dunn, Sept. 12, 2019 vs. CIN.
A NIGHT TO REMEMBER...Logan Gilbert (\#28) and Jarred Kelenic (\#4) made their MLB debuts on May 13 vs. Cleveland, becoming the highest ranking duo to debut in the same game since MLB.com began prospect rankings in 2011...there have only been 2 other instances where multiple top-100 prospects debuted for the same team in the same game...on July 23, 2013, outfielders Jake Marisnick (\#70) and Christian Yelich (\#13) both debuted for Miami...on Sept. 21, 2016, outfielders Manuel Margot (\#45) and Hunter Renfroe (\#92) both debuted for San Diego..
TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...during the 2019 season, was named Pitcher of the Week twice en route to being named an All-Star for both the California (Single-A) League and Texas (Double-A) League, as well as an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star...rated as the \#4 Prospect in the Texas League and the \#7 Prospect in the California League by Baseball America following the season.
PITCHER OF THE YEAR...received the Jamie Moyer Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award following the 2019 season...was honored in a pregame ceremony at T-Mobile Park along with other minor league award winners in the Mariners farm system on Sept. 27, 2019.
2019 RECAP...made his professional debut, splitting the season between A West Virginia (4/4-5/1), High-A Modesto (5/2-7/13), and Double-A Arkansas (July 15-end), going 10-5 with a 2.13 ERA (32 Er, 135.0 IP ) in 26 combined starts in first professional season...limited opponents to a $.198(95 \times 481)$ average, while walking 33 and striking out 165...among all minor league pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 3rd in ERA (2.13), 5th in average (.198), T7th in strikeouts (165), while his 10 wins were 2nd-most among all Mariners farmhands.
AMONG STETSON ROYALTY...Gilbert is 1 of 3 active Stetson University players in the Major Leagues, joining Jacob deGrom and Corey Kluber,, which places Gilbert alongside 2 Cy Young Award winners...was the first pitcher from Stetson to be taken in the 1st round, and 1st Hatters 1st-rounder since 2003 (Brian Snyder)...drafted as highest pick in Stetson history at \#14...during his 3 seasons with Stetson, Gilbert was 23-3 with a 2.48 ERA... started in 33 of his 52 appearances, and pitched a total of 250.2 innings for the Hatters...ranks 1st in Stetson history for lowest opponent batting average (.201), 2nd in most strikeouts per 9 innings (11.24), 4th in most strikeouts (313), and 1st in most strikeouts looking (84)...in final season with the Hatters, he ranked 1st in the nation in fewest hits allowed per 9 innings (5.4), 2nd in total strikeouts (163), 4th in ERA (2.72), and 4th in WHIP (0.80).
