## White sox at a glance

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last six games and six of nine as they continue a six-game, seven-day trip tonight with the opener at Oakland ... tonight's game will air nationally on MLB Network and be blacked out in the Chicago area.
- RHP Jimmy Lambert is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are 21 games over . 500 and lead the American League Central by 10.0 games over Cleveland (68-67).
- The Sox lost two of three at Kansas City over the weekend, including a 6-0 defeat in Sunday's deciding game.
- Following this three-game series at the Athletics to conclude the trip, the White Sox will return home for six games in seven days vs. Boston (9/10-12) and Los Angeles-AL (9/14-16).
- The Sox went 4-1 on their last homestand vs. the Cubs (2-1) and Pittsburgh (2-0) from 8/27-9/1 and 3-4 on their last trip to Tampa Bay (1-2) and Toronto (2-2) from 8/20-26.


## TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago's magic number to clinch the American League Central division title is 17 (combination of wins and Cleveland losses). - The White Sox are off to their best 137-game start since 2006 (also 79-58) and are looking to move a season-high matching 22 games over . 500 (also $9 / 1$ and 9/4).
- The Sox have scored 10-plus runs four times and two or less six times over the last 13 games since $8 / 22 \ldots$ they have hit 17 home runs over the last nine contests.
- White Sox starters own a 6.81 ERA (29 ER/38.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts over the last nine games ... the group has worked 6.0-plus IP just once over the the nine-game span.
- José Abreu, the reigning AL Player of the Month and MVP, needs two homers to record his fifth $30-H R / 100-R B I$ season.
- Yasmani Grandal is hitting $.545 / .633 / 1.318$ (12-22) with five homers, 15 RBI , six walks, eight runs scored and a 1.952 OPS in seven games since returning from the injured list on $8 / 27$.


## ROSTER MOVES

- The White Sox yesterday recalled RHP Jimmy Lambert from Class AAA Charlotte and optioned RHP Matt Foster to Charlotte

Foster remains with the club on the taxi squad.

- OF Adam Engel will begin an injury rehab assignment tonight with Charlotte ... he has been on the injured list since 8/16 (retroactive to $8 / 13$ ) with left shoulder inflammation.


## SUNDAY'S RECAP

- Three Kansas City pitchers combined on a six-hitter (all singles) and surrendered just seven total baserunners in its 6-0 win
- Chicago was shut out for the 10th time this season, sixth on the road and second at Kauffman Stadium.
- Salvador Pérez opened the scoring with a three-run home run in the first inning, his third of the series against White Sox pitching. - Dylan Cease suffered the loss after allowing four runs (three earned) on four hits with three walks and nine strikeouts in 5.0
allowed three earned runs or less for the 11th straight start. - Leury García (2-4) recorded Chicago's only multihit effort . Yoán Moncada's 17-game hitting streak was snapped.


## VIEW FROM THE TOP

- The White Sox are in position to make the playoffs in consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history, and capture their first American League Central title since 2008.
- The Sox have been in first place for 125 days (every day since $5 / 7$ ), their most in one season since 2012 (126) ... they have led the division by 9.0 -plus games every day since $8 / 1$.
- The White Sox currently have been a season-high tying 22 games over . 500 twice this season, and they have led the AL Central by as much as 12.0 games $(8 / 18)$.
- Per STATS, this marks the fifth season in franchise history they have owned a 10.0-plus game lead at any point in one season.


## RBI MACHINE

- José Abreu is attempting to join Cecil Fielder (1990-92 with Detroit) as the only players in history to lead the American League in RBI three straight seasons
- Abreu is tied for the major-league lead with 103 RBI this season, the sixth time in his seven full seasons he has reached that milestone ... he led MLB with 60 RBI in 2020 after topping the AL (second in MLB) with 123 in 2019.
- Rogers Hornsby (1920-22), Joe Medwick (1936-38), George Foster (1976-78) and Fielder are the only players in history to lead his league in RBI in three consecutive years
- Abreu ranks seventh in White Sox history with 774 RBI (Hall-of-Famer Eddie Collins is sixth with 804).


## WHITE SOK VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- The White Sox lead the season series, 3-1, after winning three of four from 8/16-19 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... they missed a chance for a series sweep with a 5-4 loss in the finale.
- The Sox are hitting .288/.362/.409 (38-132) with four home runs, own a 2.25 ERA ( $9 \mathrm{ER} / 36.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with one quality start and have outscored the A's by a 21-9 margin.
- The White Sox are 7-16 vs. the Athletics since 2017.
- Chicago and Oakland did not play during the 2020 regular season, but the A's defeated the Sox in the AL Wild Card Series $(2-1)$, winning the final two games after losing the opener.


## LEGENDARY RETURN

- Tony La Russa this week returns to manage at the Oakland Coliseum for the first time since 6/17/07 with St. Louis (10-6 win). - La Russa managed the A's from 1986-95, compiling a 798-673 (.542) record with four postseason appearances (1988-90, '92), three pennants (1988-90) and one World Series title (1989). - La Russa ranks second in A's history in managerial wins, trailing Bob Melvin (surpassed on 6/1/21).


## EDLISEUM CONUNDRUM

- The Sox have lost eight straight regular-season games at the Oakland Coliseum since 7/4/17 (outscored by a 65-29 margin). - The losing streak is the White Sox second-longest at the Athletics since the club moved to the Bay area in 1968 ... they previously lost 10 in a row from 5/18/01-5/6/03.
- Chicago has not won a game at Oakland since 7/3/17, or won a road series since going $3-1$ to open the 2016 season (4/4-7/16)


## WHO'S HOT?

- José Abreu is batting .323/.379/.630 (41-127) with nine doubles, 10 home runs, 26 RBI and a 1.008 OPS in 32 games since $8 / 1 \ldots$ he was named AL August Player of the Month.
- Yasmani Grandal is batting .317/.447/.721 (33-104) with 13 homers, 35 RBI and a 1.168 OPS in his last 32 games since 6/3 .. he has raised his average from . 131 to .227 during that span. - Luis Robert is hitting .367/.400/.633 (33-90) with six doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI , a 1.033 OPS and 19 runs scored in 21 games since returning from the injured list on 8/9.


## NEXT MAN UP

- Tim Anderson (left hamstring strain), Lance Lynn (right knee inflammation) and Lucas Giolito (left hamstring strain) are on the injured list ... Anderson (3.5), Lynn (3.4) and Giolito (3.3) have combined for a 10.2 fWAR this season.


## YOU CAN PUT IT ON THE BOARD

The Sox have hit 93 homers in 59 games since 6/30, tied with Tampa Bay for the second-most in MLB behind Toronto (94) by comparison, they hit just 72 homers in their first 78 games. - During the 59-game stretch, the Sox have 54 homers in 27 games at home and 39 in 31 road contests ... they have hit fourplus home runs 10 times this season (eight since $6 / 30$ ). - The White Sox are are 68-23 when homering, 38-5 when hitting multiple homers and 11-35 when going homerless

## GRAB SOME BENCH

- The White Sox lead MLB with 10.28 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, which would tie (Houston in 2019) for the second-highest mark in MLB history in a full season, trailing only the Astros in 2018 (10.44). - The Sox are attempting to join the 2015 Indians and 1980 Yankees as the only American League teams since 1947 with four pitchers ranking among the Top 10 in SO/9.0 IP.
- Dylan Cease (2nd, 11.93) and Lucas Giolito (5th, 10.23) rank in the Top 5 ... Carlos Rodón (12.64) and Lance Lynn (10.08) are just shy of the qualifying IP totals for the Top 10.
- Sox starters have struck out 10-plus batters a franchise-record 18 times this season, breaking the mark of 16 set in 2015 .


## SWEET HOME CHICAGO

- The White Sox are 46-24 (.657) at home this season, the best winning percentage in the American League (Tampa Bay is second at .634) and their best 70-game start since 2008 (48-22). - The .657 winning percentage at home would be their sec-ond-highest since 1984, trailing only the 2008 club (54-28, .659).


## WINNING WAYS

- With a 16-12 record in August, the White Sox recorded their seventh straight winning month, their longest streak since a nine-month run from June 1993-August 1994
- It marks the first time since 2008 they have begun a season with five straight winning months.
