## WHITE SOX AT A GLANGE

- The Chicago White Sox have won five of their last eight games and seven of 11 as they conclude a six-game, seven-day trip this afternoon with the deciding game at the Oakland Coliseum - RHP Reynaldo López is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are 21 games over . 500 and lead the American League Central by 11.0 games over second-place Cleveland (68-69). - The Sox have split the first two games with the Athletics after losing two of three at Kansas City last the weekend
- Following tomorrow's series finale at the Athletics to conclude the trip, the White Sox will return home for six games in seven days vs. Boston (9/10-12) and Los Angeles-AL (9/14-16).
- The Sox went 4-1 on their last homestand vs. the Cubs (2-1) and Pittsburgh (2-0) from 8/27-9/1 and 3-4 on their last trip to Tampa Bay (1-2) and Toronto (2-2) from 8/20-26.


## TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are off to their best 139-game start since 2006 (also 80-59) and are looking to move a season-high tying 22 games over . 500 for the fourth time this season
- Chicago is looking to win its first series at the Oakland Coliseum since 4/4-7/16 (3-1 record).
- Reynaldo López owns a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP), . 150 (1280) opp. average, 0.71 WHIP, 23 strikeouts and just one homer allowed in his last seven appearances/five starts (five scoreless). - José Abreu, the reigning AL Player of the Month and MVP, needs two homers to record his fifth 30-HR/100-RBI season. - Yasmani Grandal is hitting $.517 / .615 / 1.138$ (15-29) with five homers, 16 RBI , eight walks, nine runs scored and a 1.753 OPS in nine games since returning from the injured list on $8 / 27$.


## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Oakland scored in four of the first six innings and turned three double plays in the first three frames in its 5-1 win over Chicago. - Matt Chapman connected on a solo homer off Dallas Keuchel in the second and was followed by RBI singles from Yan Gomes in the fourth and Matt Olson in the fifth ... the Athletics added two runs in the sixth to extend the lead to five.
- The White Sox scored their only run in the fifth on César Hernández's fielders choice to first baseman Olson.
- Keuchel fell to 8-9 after allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.2 IP ... he allowed five-plus runs for the fourth consecutive start. - Pinch-hitter Romy González singled in the ninth for his first career hit ... Chicago was 1-10 with RISP and left seven on base.


## EL REY DE OAKLAND

- Reynaldo López is 2-1 with a 0.77 ERA (2 ER/23.1 IP), 24 strikeouts, a . 173 (14-81) opp. average and just one home run allowed in four career starts vs. Oakland.
- He owns a 14.1 scoreless IP streak dating back to the fourth on 7/14/19, has allowed one unearned run over his last three starts (17.1 IP) and has not allowed an earned run since 4/16/18.


## POSTSEASON OUTLOOK

- Chicago's magic number to clinch the American League Central division title is 14 (combination of wins and Cleveland losses). - The White Sox currently own the third-best record in the AL, 1.0 game behind AL West-leading Houston (81-57) and 7.5 games behind AL East-leading Tampa Bay (88-51)


## VIEW FROM THE TOP

- The White Sox are in position to make the playoffs in consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history, and capture their first American League Central title since 2008.
- The Sox have been in first place for 127 days this season, including every day since $5 / 7 \ldots$ the last season they were atop the division for more days was 2005 (182).
- Chicago has been a season-high 22 games over .500 (three times), and led the AL Central by as many as 12.0 games ( $8 / 18$ ) it has led the division by 9.0 -plus every day since $8 / 1$.


## RBI MACHINE

- José Abreu is attempting to join Cecil Fielder (1990-92) as the only AL players to lead the league in RBI three straight seasons. - Abreu ranks second in the major leagues with 103 RBI this season, the sixth time in his seven full seasons he has reached that milestone ... he led MLB with 60 RBI in 2020 after topping the AL (second in MLB) with 123 in 2019.
- Rogers Hornsby (1920-22), Joe Medwick (1936-38), George Foster (1976-78) and Fielder are the only players in history to lead his league in RBI in three consecutive years.
- Abreu ranks seventh in White Sox history with 774 RBI (Hall-of-Famer Eddie Collins is sixth with 804).


## WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- The White Sox lead the season series, 4-2, and clinched their fourth season series victory in the last seven years ... the Sox won three of four from 8/16-19 at Guaranteed Rate Field. - The Sox are hitting .296/.365/.398 (61-206) with four home runs, own a 2.89 ERA (17 ER/53.0 IP) with one quality start and have outscored the A's by a 28-17 margin.
- The White Sox are 8-17 vs. the Athletics since 2017.
- Chicago and Oakland did not play during the 2020 regular season, but the A's defeated the Sox in the AL Wild Card Series.


## BOLISEUM BONUNDRUM

- The Sox have lost nine of the last 10 regular-season games at the Oakland Coliseum since 7/4/17 (outscored 73-36).
- The White Sox snapped an eight-game losing streak at the Coliseum on Tuesday, their second-longest since the A's moved to Oakland in $1968 \ldots$ they lost 10 in a row from 5/18/01-5/6/03. - Chicago has not won a road series at the Athletics since winning three of four games to open the 2016 season (4/4-7).


## CUBAN CONNECTION

- CF Luis Robert (2nd, .364), 3B Yoán Moncada (T11th, .325) and 1 B José Abreu (13th, .322) rank among the American League leaders in batting average since $8 / 14 \ldots$ Chicago and Boston are the only teams with three players in the Top 13 during that span - Moncada has hit safely in 18 of 20 games, Abreu has hit safely in 17 contests with five homers and 18 RBI ( 23 games total), and Robert owns 10 multihit efforts over 20 games since 8/14.


## WHO'S HOT?

- José Abreu is batting .313/.376/.604 (42-134) with nine doubles, 10 homers, 26 RBI and a .980 OPS in 34 games since $8 / 1 \ldots$ he was named AL Player of the Month for August.
- Yasmani Grandal is batting .324/.454/.712 (36-111) with 13 homers, 36 RBI and a 1.166 OPS in his last 35 games since 6/3
.. he has raised his average from . 131 to .233 during that span. - Luis Robert is hitting .350/.381/.590 (35-100) with six doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI , a . 971 OPS and 20 runs scored in 23 games since returning from the injured list on 8/9.


## NEXT MAN UP

- Tim Anderson (left hamstring strain), Lance Lynn (right knee inflammation) and Lucas Giolito (left hamstring strain) currently are on the White Sox injured list ... Anderson (3.5), Lynn (3.4) and Giolito (3.3) have combined for a 10.2 fWAR this season.


## YOU CAN PUT IT ON THE BOARD

- The Sox have hit 93 homers in 61 games since 6/30, tied with the fifth-most in baseball during that span ... by comparison, they hit just 72 homers in their first 78 games of the season.
- During the 61-game stretch, the Sox have 54 homers in 27 games at home and 39 in 33 road contests ... they have hit fourplus home runs 10 times this season, including eight since $6 / 30$. - The White Sox are are 68-23 when homering, 38-5 when hitting multiple homers and 12-36 when going homerless


## GRAB SOME BENCH

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 10.21 strikeouts per 9.0 IP , which would be the sixth-highest mark since 1900. the top six SO/9.0 IP marks have been since the start of 2018.
- The Sox are attempting to join the 2015 Indians and 1980 Yankees as the only American League teams since 1947 with four pitchers ranking among the Top 10 in SO/9.0 IP.
- Dylan Cease (2nd, 11.93) and Lucas Giolito (4th, 10.23) rank in the Top 5 ... Carlos Rodón (1st, 12.64) and Lance Lynn (5th, 10.08) are just shy of the qualifying IP totals for the Top 10.
- Sox starters have struck out 10-plus batters a franchise-record 18 times this season, breaking the mark of 16 set in 2015.


## SWEET HOME CHICAGD

- The White Sox are 46-24 (.657) at home this season, the best winning percentage in the American League (Tampa Bay is second at .634) and their best 70-game start since 2008 (48-22). - The . 657 winning percentage at home would be their sec-ond-highest since 1984, trailing only the 2008 club (54-28, .659).


## ON DECK: US. BOSTON RED SOX

- The White Sox and Red Sox split four games from 4/17-19 at Fenway Park ... both Chicago wins came in a DH sweep on 4/18. - Chicago is hitting .286/.319/.429 (36-126) with two home runs, owns a .570 ERA (19 ER/30.0 IP) with zero quality starts, and has been outscored by a 21-16 margin this season.
- The White Sox have won three of the last five games but lost
seven of the last 10 overall, and seven of 10 in Chicago
