ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost four of their past six games...however, have won five of their last nine and nine of their last 15...have spent each of the last 14 days in third place and 18 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) titles...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have combined for a 1.93 ERA (15 er in 70.0 ip) over their past 11 games and are now 9-6 with a 2.37 ERA (39 er in 148.1 ip) this season...the ERA ranks **first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers...are second in the majors in innings pitched (148.1) and fourth in strikeouts (119)...have allowed three earned runs or less in 18 of their 23 games this season, including five games in which they did not allow a run...have allowed eight home runs this season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.54 ERA (58 er in 205.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...are also first in opponents slugging percentage (.320), tied for first in on-base percentage (.292) and rank third in opponents batting average (.228)...have recorded 172 strikeouts, which ranks fourth in the American League, and have allowed 69 walks, sixth fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers lead the majors with eight pickoffs (Anderson 4, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 12 of 19 (63.2%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors...the offense has been successful in 19 of 24 (79.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the eighth best percentage in the majors...stole 156 bases last season, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have been shut out in three of their past five games and have now been shut out four times this season...were shut out in consecutive games Thursday and Friday in Seattle, which was their first time being shut out in consecutive games since May 13-14, 2008 at Cleveland...have scored a total of 80 runs, which is the fifth fewest in the American League...are 8-2 when scoring four runs or more and 3-10 when scoring less than four...are batting .241 (188 for 781) on the season, which is the fifth lowest average in the AL...their 10 home runs are the second fewest in the majors, but their 45 doubles are tied for fourth most in the majors...are hitting .218 (46 for 211) with runners in scoring position, the fourth lowest average in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 10 of their last 13 games and have a total of 14 over that span...their 23 errors total are tied for the most in the majors...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-4 in one-run games this year...have had 10 of their 23 games this season decided by two runs or less and are 4-6 in those games...are 2-3 in extra-inning games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this seven game road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (0-1)...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (1-1)...are now 4-5 at home and 7-7 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 6-2 in day games and 5-10 at night...the day record is tied for third best in the majors and the night record is tied for third worst...have a 2.00 ERA (16 er in 72.0 ip) during the day, which is the second lowest majors, and a 2.83 ERA (42 er in 133.2 ip) at night, which is fourth best...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record for day games and 46-60 (.434) record at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used 16 different lineups through their first 23 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used seven times.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (106)...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have four (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) after reinstating Wuertz yesterday...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

A's vs. ANGELS

The A's are 0-1 against the Angels this season following last night's loss...lost the season series to the Angels 8-11 last season...went 2-7 in Anaheim and 6-4 in Oakland...have now lost the season series in each of the past three seasons and in six of the previous seven...are 60-74 (.448) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 365-297 against the Angels...that includes 190-140 in Oakland and 175-157 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 414-374 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 260-game errorless streak, which is the **longest active streak among all Major League outfielders**...his last error came on September 15, 2008...is a .332 (69 for 208) career hitter against the Angels, his highest average against any American League team.

Mark Ellis has recorded 200 career doubles and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for **eighth most in Oakland history**.

Brian Fuentes has six saves this season, which is tied for **third most in the Major Leagues**.

Hideki Matsui has scored a combined 1,499 runs between the United States and Japan, leaving him one away from the 1,500th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in **1997** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 1-3 in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 28-32 (.467) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in each of his four starts this season, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked one batter or fewer four times.

DON'T WALK: Has walked only three batters in four starts this season, which ties him for the fifth fewest walks in the American League and 11th fewest in the majors among starting pitchers...has now walked one batter or fewer in 27 of his 60 career starts, including eight starts in which he did not walk a batter.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has allowed seven earned runs in 30.0 innings this season for a 2.10 ERA, which ranks eighth lowest in the American League...has a 1.99 ERA (5 er in 22.2 ip) in three starts at night, which is eighth lowest in the AL, and a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) during the day.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss to Toronto on April 5...allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits over eight innings, walking one while striking out two...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...Lind drove in Davis with a sacrifice fly, Hill singled home Escobar and Encarnacion scored Hill with a double...Snider then brought in Rivera, who had reached on a Kouzmanoff throwing error, on a groundout to tie the game at 5-5...then pitched two more scoreless innings before being relieved by Blevins to start the ninth after throwing 89 pitches...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle, a no decision in a 7-4 Rangers win (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so).

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...was replaced by Blevins with one out and runners on second and third in the eighth inning, with both runners going on to score.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 8-4 loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss.

LAST START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle Thursday...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes.

McCARTHY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a 3.82 ERA (30.2 ip, 33 h, 17 r, 13 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 2 hr) in seven appearances...is 0-1 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts...is 0-1 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) in four games, three starts, in Anaheim and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in three relief appearances at home...has not faced the Angels since August 28, 2008 when he had a no decision in a 7-5 Rangers loss...allowed two runs, one earned, over six innings...also had two starts in 2007 and combined to go 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) in those games...had a no decision in a 5-4 Rangers win on July 15 of that year, allowing three earned runs on six hits in 6.0 innings...took the loss in a 5-3 decision on April 4...allowed five runs, three earned, while allowing a career-high 10 hits in six innings.

2010 RECAP: Was 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games, nine starts, at Triple-A Oklahoma City in a season interrupted by right shoulder problems...had three stints on the DL with the RedHawks and was added to the Rangers' 60-day disabled list July 29...struck out 44 and walked just 11 in 56.1 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .234 opponents batting average, which broke down to .227 (22 for 97) against left-handed hitters and .240 (29 for 121) against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties and six were solo shots...opponents batted .190 with runners in scoring position and .208 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Was 4-1 with a 1.99 ERA in seven games at home and 0-1 with a 6.89 ERA in four outings on the road...tossed 7.0 innings in each of his first four starts but would reach that mark just once over his final five starts...allowed two runs or fewer in six of his nine starts and walked two batters or fewer all nine times.

MORE FROM 2010: Spent most of the spring with Texas, going 1-3 with an 8.03 ERA in four spring training starts before he was optioned to Oklahoma City March 27...went 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA over his first four starts with the Red Hawks before he was placed on the disabled list April 26 with a right scapula stress reaction...was reinstated June 3 and made two relief appearances (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 so) before returning to the DL June 8 with right shoulder inflammation...reinstated June 18 and had a no decision in a start June 19 at Nashville (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so) before returning to the DL June 22 with the same injury...was recalled by Texas July 29 and immediately added to the Major League 60-day DL...returned to Oklahoma City on a rehab assignment Aug. 20 and went 2-2 with a 4.56 ERA over his final four starts...picked up the win in his first start to lower his season ERA to 2.39 but then allowed a season-high nine runs in 5.0 innings in an 11-3 loss at Albuquerque Aug. 25...struck out a season-high nine in 7.0 innings Aug. 30 against Nashville...allowed just one run in that game for the win...made one postseason start Sept. 9 and was the losing pitcher in a 3-2 loss to Memphis in Game 2 of the first round of the playoffs (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

WINTER LEAGUE: Made four starts for Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 2-0 with a 1.96 ERA and .227 opponents batting average.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Tyson Ross (1-2, 4.82 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the season, his second start...made his first start of the season and took the loss in the A's 4-0 defeat in Seattle Friday...pitched a career-high 4.1 innings, but also allowed a career-high four walks and three runs, which matched his career high...had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win over Detroit April 17...entered the game in the ninth after Cahill allowed one run over eight innings...rook the loss in a 3-0 A's defeat April 14 against Detroit...relieved Gonzalez to start the seventh inning...allowed an RBI double to Raburn in the seventh and later walked Peralta and Boesch to start the eighth...was then replaced by Blevins who allowed both runs to score...earned the win in his first appearance of the season, a 2-1 A's win in Chicago April 11...entered the game in relief of Braden to start the seventh inning and then pitched three shutout innings...is 0-1 with a 4.70 ERA (7.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in three appearances against the Angels...is 0-1 with a 7.38 ERA (3 er in 3.2 ip) in one start and has no decisions and a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in two relief appearances.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

2-6, 2.98 ERA (57.1 ip, 40 h, 29 r, 19 er, 31 bb, 53 so, 6 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 6/9 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in each of its past eight games and has a 1.31 ERA (3 er in 20.2 ip) over that span...ranks second in the American League and 10th in the majors with a 2.98 ERA (19 er in 57.1 ip) overall this season...has been charged with six of the team's 12 losses, which are tied for the most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted six of nine (66.7%) save opportunities, which is tied for the third lowest percentage in the AL...the three blown saves are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank first in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.292) and slugging (.320) and are second in opponents batting average (.228)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities in 2010, which was third best in the AL.

- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in three appearances at home and a 4.91 ERA (2 er in 3.2 ip) in five road appearances.
- Had a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in five games against the Angels last year...however, has a 6.46 ERA in 15 career appearances (15.1 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 16 so).
- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has allowed six of eight inherited runners to score this season (75.0%), which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League.
- Is holding opponents to a .148 (4 for 27) batting average this season.
- Had a 6.23 ERA (3 er in 4.1 ip) in five appearances against Los Angeles last year and has a 4.27 ERA in 14 career appearances against the team (12.2 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 12 so).

- The 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but the first where he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings after yielding five in 64.2 innings over his first three years.
