A's vs. WHITE SOX

The season series is tied at three games each...the A's are 2-1 in Chicago and 1-2 in Oakland...went 5-4 against the White Sox last year and have won the season series in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are now 59-34 (.634) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the **best record by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 286-264 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 151-129 in Oakland and 135-135 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 963-1019 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton has played 417 career games at first base, which is three away from tying Scott Hatteberg for third in Oakland history...is 8 for 21 (.381) with five RBI and two runs scored in six games against the White Sox this year.

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 51 games in the outfield and now has a 292-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Cliff Pennington is batting .311 (28 for 90) over his past 26 contests (since May 10) after hitting .217 in his first 35 games.

Ryan Sweeney is batting .315 (23 for 73) over his past 26 games (since May 3) after batting .222 in his first 16 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are on a season-high nine-game losing streak after winning a season-high four consecutive games...it is their longest losing streak since losing 10 consecutive games from July 28-August 7, 2008...are 5-16 over the last 21 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high eight games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent the last 10 days and 17 of the last 18 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 21 days in fourth...are now a season-high nine games under .500...began the season without a sweep or being swept in the in the first 13 series, an Oakland record to start a season...have since swept or been swept in seven of their past eight series.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters are 0-7 with a 6.88 ERA (39 er in 51.0 ip) and a .302 (61 for 202) opponents batting average during the nine-game losing streak after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a **Major League-leading** 3.17 ERA for the season...have allowed 28 home runs this season, which is fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.357), are fourth in most walks allowed (128) and rank sixth in innings pitched (394.1).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.23 ERA for the season, which ranks **first in the American League** and fourth in the majors...have allowed one or more home runs in eight of the past nine games (12 total over that span)...however, have allowed just 41 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.354) and rank fourth in on-base percentage (.315)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs this season...opponents have been successful in just 42 of 67 (62.7%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 25 caught stealings are tied for the most in the majors (Kansas City).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (65 for 308) during the nine-game losing streak and are now batting .238 for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...are tied for the second lowest slugging percentage (.346) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.304)...have the fewest runs scored (223) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (384)...have hit 34 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 87 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout seven times this season, which is second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 8).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 45 errors this season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 71 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-6 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (four games)...have now lost 12 of their past 14 road games...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-21 (.382) on the road for the season, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 6-16)...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .226 (264 for 1167) with 109 runs scored in 34 games on the road (3.21 per game).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-12 (.520) record in day games and are 14-24 (.368) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the worst mark at night...are 10-7 (.588) in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 17-29 (.370) against right-handed starters...are 20-6 when scoring four or more runs and 7-30 when scoring less than four...are 21-10 when scoring first and 6-26 when the opponent scores first...are 7-14 in the first game of a series and 12-9 in the last game of a series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-8 in extra-inning games this year...the 13 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the eight losses are second most (Los Angeles-AL, 9)...the 13 extra-inning games are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high was a 14-inning, 9-8 loss at Boston on Saturday...the time of game of 5:17 is tied for seventh longest in Oakland history...are 7-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-12 in one-run games and are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's went 3-9 in their stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-3 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York, 0-3 at Boston)...the stretch marked just the second time this year the A's had traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-12 (.294) against the East this year.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season...the A's are 6-7 (.462) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-32 (.573) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in seven of his 13 starts, allowed one run or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 4.13 ERA (15 er in 32.2 ip) and .280 (33 for 118) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four from July 27 to August 11, 2009...has walked 15 and allowed five home runs in 32.2 innings during the losing streak after yielding 16 walks and three home runs in 52.1 innings over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (2.65), tied for ninth in winning percentage (.667) and tied for 10th in wins (6)...also ranks third in wild pitches (7) and eighth in walks (31)...the seven wild pitches match Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (10 for 60) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is **tied for the fourth** lowest mark in the American League...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .170 (17 for 100) average...has allowed eight home runs and six have been solo shots.

WINS: Is 24-10 with a 2.73 ERA (84 er in 276.2 ip) and .223 (222 for 996) opponents batting average in 42 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fourth most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-15 (.643) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 69-90 (.434) with all other pitchers...is 34-24 (.586) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 3-2 with a 3.44 ERA (20 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest and 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (5 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed four runs in the first inning over his last two starts after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...allowed just five runs in the first inning all last year for a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip).

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA (9 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts at home this year and 3-1 with a 3.22 ERA (16 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the **sixth** lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-12 with a 3.06 ERA (85 er in 250.0 ip) in 39 career starts in Oakland and 13-12 with a 4.15 ERA (97 er in 210.1 ip) in 36 starts on the road.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings, a RBI single by Hafner in the third inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...allowed four runs to snap a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco **May 20**...allowed his first first-inning run of the season but shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles **May 25**...the score was tied at 1-1 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth on back-to-back home runs by Hunter and Callaspo and a RBI double by Willits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...left trailing 4-0 as Colon shutout the A's on four hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston last Saturday...allowed a solo home run to Gonzalez in the first and a RBI single to Drew in the fifth...the A's tied the game with two runs in the sixth but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth on a Pedroia RBI single, a Youkilis RBI double and a Crawford RBI single...left after seven innings trailing 5-3 and the score was 7-3 when the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings.

CAHILL vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-2 with a 3.70 ERA (41.1 ip, 40 h, 20 r, 17 er, 14 bb, 18 so, 3 hr) in seven career starts...is 0-0 with a 6.08 ERA (9 er in 13.1 ip) in three starts in Chicago and 1-2 with a 2.57 ERA (8 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2 ip, 16 h, 8 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 4 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...had a no decision in his first start, a 6-5 A's loss in 10 innings at Chicago on April 12...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the second on a three-run home run by Ramirez and a Konerko fielders choice...was relieved by Breslow with two outs in the fifth inning after throwing 97 pitches...left trailing 4-3 but the A's scored twice in the sixth to get him off the hook...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss in Oakland May 15...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...after the A's tied the game in the fifth, he allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh...his own error allowed one run to score and Ramirez added a RBI single.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Graham Godfrey (0-0, --- ERA): Will be making his Major League debut...is the 42 nd pitcher in Oakland history to make a start in his debut...the previous 41 have combined for a 13-14 record and a 3.62 ERA...combined for a 7-1 record, a 2.32 ERA and a .221 opponents batting average in 10 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...his .221 opponents batting average included a .188 (18 for 96) mark against left-handed hitters and .250 (27 for 108) against right-handers...was 33-32 with a 4.20 ERA (278 er in 590.0 ip) in 119 career minor league appearances, including 103 starts, over five minor league seasons.	

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 13/21 (61.9%)

The A's bullpen has allowed a run in four of its past six games (10 er in 21.0 ip, 4.29 ERA) after not allowing a run in five of its previous six games (1 er in 19.2 ip, 0.46 ERA)...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.36 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...is tied for fourth fewest in home runs allowed with 13...is 13 for 21 (61.9%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 21 save opportunities are tied for fifth fewest but the eight blown saves are tied for sixth most...are tied for third in the AL in opponents batting average (.234) and rank fourth in on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.346)...have allowed 35.6 percent of inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

Last Outing: 6/8 at Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 2 so)

First Hitters: 0-4 (0 bb)

- Entered the game in the 11th inning Saturday and was charged with a blown save after allowing one run in one inning...it was his first save opportunity since converting the save September 17, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Has not allowed a run in three of four appearances (1 er in 4.0 ip, 2.25 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has not allowed a run and has a win and a save in three career appearances against the White Sox (3.2 ip, 1 h, 0 bb, 4 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

Last Outing: 6/6 at Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)

First Hitters: 5-25 (1 bb)

- Has allowed five runs in 5.0 innings (9.00 ERA) over his past five appearances, which has raised his ERA from 1.31 to 2.81 (8 er in 25.2 ip)...however, has not allowed a run in 22 of 26 appearances this season.
- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) in 13 appearances at home compared to a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) in 13 appearances on the road...has a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip) in 15 appearances at night and a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) in 11 games during the day.
- Is tied for fourth among AL relievers in wins (3).
- Has held opponents to a .198 (18 for 91) batting average...opponents are 1 for 12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.
