### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 4-2...split a rain-shortened two game series in Texas after winning three of four in Oakland...the A's have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-52 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-296 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-139 in Oakland and 135-157 in Texas...including 68-69 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-378 against the Rangers/Senators.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Joey Devine** has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 82-game, 80.0-inning, 323-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

**Hideki Matsui** has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

**Kurt Suzuki** has caught 536 games, which is one away from tying Mike Heath for third most in Oakland history.

**Ryan Sweeney** has not committed an error this year and now has a 162-game errorless streak, which is tied for second longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 3-3 over the last six games but are 5-9 since winning a season high six in a row...are 39-49 (.443) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 17-29 (.370) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 16-30)...are eight games behind Texas in the AL West, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season...have not been more than eight games out since finishing the 2010 season nine games behind the Rangers...have spent each of the last 38 days and 45 of the last 46 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 49 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**PITCHING:** The A's tossed their fifth shutout of the season yesterday and now have a 1.88 ERA (38 er in 182.1 ip) and .197 (130 for 659) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...have a 3.05 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 3.02)...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 10-6 with a 1.86 ERA (27 er in 130.1 ip), .194 (91 for 469) opponents batting average, 37 walks, 105 strikeouts and eight home runs over the last 20 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.07 ERA (187 er in 544.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.06) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.99).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .211 (97 for 459) with 32 runs scored over the last 14 games (2.29 runs per game)...have just 28 walks and three hit batters over that stretch for a .259 on-base percentage (4 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 10 of those 14 games and have scored just 304 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.235), slugging percentage (.340) and on-base percentage (.301)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit just 47 home runs, which is **the fewest in the American League** and second fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 59 games...the last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed seven home runs in the last eight games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 55 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 68 errors, which ranks second in the American League to Texas (72)...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is second in the majors to the Rangers (48)...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (91).

**AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a losing record for the third consecutive season as they are 39-49 (.443)...were 43-46 (.483) last year and 37-49 (.430) in 2009...the pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA and has not posted an ERA under 3.09 before the break since 1981 (2.81)...has 609 strikeouts which is tied for the third best pre-break total in Oakland history (635 in 2008, 613 in 2001)...has yielded 55 home runs and have not surrendered fewer than 65 before the break since 1989 (54)...are batting .235 with a .340 slugging percentage and .301 on-base percentage...have not hit under .243 before the break since 1982 (.231), have not slugged under .355 since 1979 (.337) and have had an on-base percentage under .302 just once (.300 in 1979)...have 47 home runs and have hit fewer than 53 just once (42 in 1968)...are averaging 3.45 runs per game (304 r in 88 g), which is currently the third lowest pre-break total in Oakland history (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-19 (.387) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Cubs, 10-17)...are 9-20 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their final road trip before the All-Star break tonight with this four-game series against Texas...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 games on the road...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2)...are now 23-21 (.523) at home and 16-28 (.364) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...are batting .245 (353 for 1443) with 163 runs scored in 44 home games (3.70 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have the second lowest road batting average in the majors (Washington, .219).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's lost two of three to Seattle to begin this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three American League West opponents...after this four-game series at Texas the A's host Los Angeles in a four-game series after the All-Star Break...are 13-12 (.520) against the West for the season but are 26-37 (.413) against everyone else.

**ALL-STAR:** Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team Sunday...it is his first All-Star selection...Gonzalez was also named AL Co-Player of the Week Tuesday along with Toronto's Jose Bautista after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a ML leading 16 strikeouts last week.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have five players on the DL (Anderson, Balfour, Braden, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...it is the 147<sup>th</sup> start of his career, his 91<sup>st</sup> as an Athletic...his teams are 92-54 (.630) in his starting assignments, including 59-31 (.656) with the A's.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

**WITH THE A'S:** Last Friday against Arizona, made his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 37-19 record and a 3.42 ERA (208 er in 547.2 ip) in 98 games, 90 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

**SINCE 2003:** Has 864 strikeouts in 851.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.13 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.01)...has a .224 (698 for 3123) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221 and Jason Schmidt, .223).

**LAST START:** Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona last Friday in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

**HARDEN vs. TEXAS:** Is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA (66.1 ip, 57 h, 34 r, 31 er, 30 bb, 65 so, 3 hr) in 12 career appearances, 11 starts...that includes 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA (12 er in 44.0 ip) in seven games, six starts, in Oakland and 1-1 with a 7.66 ERA (19 er in 22.1 ip) in five starts in Texas...is 5-2 with a 4.27 ERA (31 er in 65.1 ip) in his 11 starting assignments...pitched for Texas last year and is 3-3 with a 5.48 ERA (41 er in 67.1 ip) in 15 career appearances at Rangers Ballpark...last faced the Rangers May 11, 2008 and had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed a RBI double to Bradley in the first, a RBI single to Kinsler in the second, a two-run single by Saltalamacchia in the third and a Hamilton RBI triple in the fourth...left after 3.2 innings trailing 5-4.

**REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters and .143 (2 for 14) against right-handers.

**2010 RECAP:** Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in the American League in hit batters (9)...tied for fourth on the club in strikeouts (75), was fifth in starts and pitched the sixth most innings (92.0)...was also second on the team in hit batters and third in walks.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .238 (40-for-168) against right-handed hitters and .273 (51-for-187) against left-handers...yielded a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 the second time and .372 after that...his career numbers are .196 (238 for 1214), .222 (246 for 1109) and .268 (214 for 800).

**THIS AND THAT:** Posted a 4.40 ERA at home and 6.70 on the road...was 2-3 with a 4.41 ERA in nine starts on four days rest and 3-2 with a 6.47 ERA in his other nine starts...compiled a 0-3 record and a 7.43 ERA in six outings during the day and was 5-2 with a 4.96 ERA in 14 night games...went 5-5 with a 5.34 ERA in 18 starts and 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA in two relief appearances...his longest outing was 7.0 innings twice and he tossed six or more innings in six of his 18 starts...the Rangers were 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments...went 2-0 in four starts with run support of four or more and is 41-0 in 55 such starts in his career.

**2010 HIGHLIGHTS:** Opened the season as Texas' number two starter, going 0-1 with a 4.58 ERA in his first four outings...recorded his first win as a Ranger April 28 against Chicago (AL)...two of his five wins came against the White Sox...worked 7.0 shutout innings and struck out a season-high nine to win at Oakland in next start May 3...went 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA over a three-start stretch from April 28 to May 8...then went 1-2 with an 8.28 ERA over his next six starts before going on the disabled list June 12 with a left gluteal muscle strain...surrendered a career high four home runs in his final start before the injury, June 11 at Milwaukee...went 0-2 with a 5.19 ERA in four starts at Triple-A Oklahoma City on a rehab assignment...was reinstated July 31 and allowed one earned run in 7.0 innings in a win at Los Angeles (AL) that night...lasted just 2.1 innings in his next outing Aug. 7 at Oakland and returned to the DL Aug. 15, retroactive to Aug. 8 with right shoulder tendinitis...made another rehab start Aug. 18 against Reno, allowing one unearned run in 6.0 innings...was reinstated Aug. 23, working 6.2 no-hit innings that day against Minnesota before leaving the game with five walks and 111 pitches...Matt Harrison recorded the final out in the seventh and Darren O'Day worked a hitless eighth before Joe Mauer singled off Neftali Feliz with one out in ninth for the Twins' only hit in a 4-0 Rangers win...it was the longest hitless outing ever by a Texas starter who did not finish the game and second longest in majors in 2010 to the Twins' Kevin Slowey who tossed 7.0 hitless innings against Oakland Aug. 15...prior to that pair, no pitcher had posted at least 6.2 hitless innings in a non-complete game since Braves' Damian Moss (7.0 ip) May 3, 2002 at St. Louis...was 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA in two starts following his return from the DL before going to the bullpen at the start of September...pitched twice in relief (4 er in 2.2 ip) before completing the season with a no decision in a spot start Sept. 29 vs. Seattle...was not on the Rangers postseason roster.

<b>LHP Gio Gonzalez (8-5, 2.31 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his 18 <sup>th</sup> start of the season...was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team last Sunday...it is his first All-Star selection...was named AL Co-Player of the Week on Tuesday after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and .153 opponents batting average over his last four starts...has walked just nine and struck out 34...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win over Arizona last Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 7 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.18 ERA in nine career appearances, seven starts, against Texas...including a three-game winning streak over his last four starts (2.10 ERA)...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-2 decision May 1 in Oakland (6.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so).	

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**Save/Save Opportunities: 23/31 (74.2%)**

The A's bullpen has converted each of its 10 save opportunities since June 10 and has a 1.92 ERA (14 er in 65.2 ip), .209 (50 for 239) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over that 24-game span...now has a 3.01 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the pen is tied for third in the AL in saves (23) and has the fourth best save percentage (74.2%)...has the lowest opponents batting average (.230) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.334)...is tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (15)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (58)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and the most losses (17).

**Last Outing:** 7/6 vs. Seattle (S, 1.0 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)

**First Hitters: 1-14 (0 bb)**

- Has converted each of his last eight save opportunities after he was charged with the blown save in his first opportunity...is 59 for 67 (88.1%) in his career, which is the best percentage in Oakland history...needs two more saves to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.
- Has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 outings (1 er in 11.1 ip, 0.79 ERA).
- Has held opponents to a .143 batting average, including .100 (2 for 20) against right-handers and .172 (5 for 29) against lefties.
- Retired each of his first 12 first batters faced before allowing a single to Gutierrez in Tuesday's loss...first batters are 1 for 14 (.071) for the season.
- Has not faced the Rangers this year...is 1-1 with three saves, three blown saves and a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) in 15 career appearances against Texas...has been charged with three of his eight career blown saves in Rangers Ballpark and has not converted a save here.
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

**Last Outing:** 6/21 at New York (S, 1.1 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 2 so)

**First Hitters:** 7-31 (2 bb)

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 28 retroactive to June 22 with a strained right oblique...it is his sixth career appearance on the DL...made a rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento Tuesday at Fresno (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb).
- Had not allowed a run in nine of his final 10 outings before the injury (1 er in 10.0 ip, 0.90 ERA).
- Is tied for fifth among American League relievers in wins (4) and tied for third in first batter strikeouts (12).

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A’s 7-2 win over Arizona last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career high 119 pitches in 7.0 innings...allowed one run, his third consecutive start with one run or fewer...the run came in the fourth inning on a Nady RBI single, snapping his scoreless streak at 16.0 innings.

**GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS:** Is 4-1 with a 2.18 ERA (45.1 ip, 38 h, 11 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 33 so, 3 hr) in nine career appearances, seven starts...is 1-1 with a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in four games in Texas and 3-0 with a 1.27 ERA (4 er in 28.1 ip) in five games in Oakland...is 4-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) in his seven starts...including a three-game winning streak over his last four starts (6 er in 25.2 ip, 2.10 ERA)...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-2 decision May 1 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and two outs in the seventh and Ziegler allowed one of those runners to score...had his scheduled start on May 11 at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his second since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 2-8 (.200) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-37 (.439) in his 66 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer all 10 times.

**FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-5 despite a 3.72 ERA (48.1 ip, 49 h, 25 r, 20 er, 10 bb, 28 so) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the losing streak is a career-high, topping his previous high of four from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of three runs or less in each of his last seven starts...his season run support is 3.45 (27 rs in 70.1 ip)...has 10 runs of support in his five losses (35.1 ip, 2.55 RSA).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed just two home runs in 70.1 innings, which **match the fewest** among Major League pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched (Johnson, FLA 60.1 ip)...both of the home runs have come against Seattle and have been solo shots by left-handed hitters (Kennedy, Bard).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .185 (15 for 81) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .317 (57 for 180) after that...opponents are batting .381 (16 for 42) with runners in scoring position.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Has committed four errors, which is **tied for the most** among Major League pitchers (Garza, CHI-NL; Verlander, DET)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

**McCARTHY vs. TEXAS:** Is 1-2 with a 2.86 ERA (22.0 ip, 14 h, 11 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, three starts...that includes 0-1 with a 1.23 ERA (1 er in 7.1 ip) in two games, one start, in his home ballparks and 1-1 with a 3.68 ERA (6 er in 14.2 ip) in three games, two starts in Texas...is 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA (6 er in 18.2 ip) in his three starting assignments...pitched for Texas from 2007-09 and is 8-6 with a 3.84 ERA (52 er in 122.0 ip) in 25 games, 24 starts, in Rangers Ballpark...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's win in 10 innings May 2 in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eighth and Matsui in the 10<sup>th</sup> for the win.

**LAST 11 STARTS:** Is 2-6 with a 4.30 ERA (32 er in 67.0 ip) and a .270 (67 for 248) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...has received three runs of support in each of his last 11 starts and his run support average over that stretch is 1.88 (14 rs in 67.0 ip)...received run support of 5.68 over his first eight starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is  **tied for eighth**  in the American League in wins (8)...ranks **second** in most stolen bases allowed (19) and wild pitches (11) and **fourth** in walks (49)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA (7 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition this year and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA (35 er in 81.2 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-7 record and a 2.23 ERA (42 er in 169.1 ip) in 27 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 22-20 with a 4.34 ERA (157 er in 325.1 ip) in 54 starts against everyone else.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .140 (7 for 50) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is **second lowest in the American League (Harrison, TEX .132)**...opponents are hitting .208 (20 for 96) with runners in scoring position...that includes .114 over his first eight starts and .262 (16 for 61) over his last nine starts...has allowed 10 home runs and seven have been solo shots.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 4-5 with a 4.10 ERA (36 er in 79.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

**WINS:** Is 26-13 with a 2.92 ERA (101 er in 311.0 ip) and .227 (256 for 1126) opponents batting average in 48 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are **fifth** most in the majors over that span...is 36-27 (.571) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday (42, Vida Blue).

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** He had a no decision in the A’s 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A’s sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A’s 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9** but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A’s 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...is the first A’s pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A’s starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...extended his losing streak to three games in the A’s 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A’s scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A’s 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A’s 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout... the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A’s 2-1 win over San Francisco **June 19** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 118 pitches and retired 16 of the final 17 hitters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A’s 4-1 win at Philadelphia **June 25**...retired 12 straight and 17 of 18 at one point...was the losing pitcher in the A’s 5-4 loss to Florida **June 30** in Oakland...allowed just one unearned run over the first four innings as Ramirez scored on a DeJesus error in the second...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning and was relieved by Magnuson after lasting just 4.2 innings...it was his fifth outing of the season under 5.0 innings.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
