### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 5-3 to start the second half of the season after losing four straight and 13 of 18 going into the All-Star Break...following yesterday's win and a Seattle loss, are now alone in third place in the American League West for the first time since May 21...Thursday's off day coupled with a loss by Seattle moved the A's into a tie for third place, ending a streak of 49 consecutive days in sole possession of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 35 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 22-36 (.379) since then...the A's .440 winning percentage ranks fourth lowest in the AL...are 15-15 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 28-42 in games started by righties...are 20-19 in day games and 24-37 at night...made a managerial change prior to June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA (97 er in 286.0 ip) and .226 (241 for 1068) opponents batting average over the last 32 games...now has a 3.29 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the AL** and fourth lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.355), ranks fourth in opponents batting (.244) and is tied for sixth in on-base percentage (.314)...snapped a 22-game streak without hitting a batter Friday when Cahill hit Granderson in the first inning...it was the longest streak since Aug. 9-Sept. 2, 1992 (23 games)...have just 24 hit batters this year, which is third fewest in the AL...allowed 17 runs in Friday's loss, which is the most runs the A's have allowed in a game since allowing 18 runs July 18, 2000 at Colorado...allowed nine of the runs in the third inning, the most they have allowed in an inning since surrendering 10 runs to St. Louis in the fifth inning June 16, 2007.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 13-12 with a 3.25 ERA (71 er in 196.1 ip), .227 (167 for 737) opponents batting average, 62 walks and 163 strikeouts over the last 32 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.39 ERA (231 er in 613.2 ip) for the season, which is the second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.37).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .297 (83 for 279) with 41 runs scored (5.13 per game) in eight games since the All-Star Break after batting .205 with 43 runs scored (2.39 per game) over the final 18 games before the break...are tied with Texas for the American League lead in hitting since the break...however, are batting .238 overall, which is second lowest in the AL...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.306) and slugging percentage (.344) and the second fewest runs scored (356)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit just 56 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League**...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 71 games...since 1979, the only longer streak by an A's team was a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15, 1994...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 22 home runs in the last 20 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...has surrendered 70 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 78 errors this season, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League...the errors have led to 55 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (101).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (17)...the offense has been successful in just 8 of 18 (44.4%) stolen base attempts over the last 13 games...has a stolen base percentage of 67.3 (68 for 101) for the year, which is second lowest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on this five-game road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-1)...snapped a six-game road losing streak with the win on Wednesday and are now 7-25 over their last 32 contests on the road...are 18-34 (.346) on the road for the season compared to 26-22 (.542) at home...have the third worst road record in the American League...return home following today's game for a seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles...are batting .250 (393 for 1575) with 183 runs scored in 48 home games (3.81 per game) and .228 (406 for 1779) with 173 runs scored in 52 games on the road (3.33 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest in the majors.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 11-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

**AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (37-52, .416)...the pitching staff posted a 3.13 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was second best in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break and the batting average and slugging percentage is third lowest...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

### A's vs. YANKEES

The A's trail in the season series 1-4 following last night's win...the win snapped an 11-game losing streak against the Yankees...that was an Oakland record for longest losing streak against New York and is the longest by an Athletics team since the Kansas City A's lost 14 in a row from Sept. 13, 1956-July 12, 1957...have now lost 15 of the last 17 games and are batting .199 (107 for 537) with 43 runs scored over that span...have lost six of the last seven and 13 of 15 in New York...have lost nine consecutive series, which is an Oakland record for consecutive series lost to any team...the previous was eight against Baltimore (May 13, 1977-April 29, 1979)...have lost each of the last three season series and are 5-25 (.167) against New York since 2008, which is the worst mark by an AL team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 219-259 against the Yankees...that includes 120-118 in Oakland and 99-141 in New York, including 2-10 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 760-1125 against the Yankees/Orioles.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 20<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 10-9 (.526) in his starting assignments this year and are 40-36 (.526) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 15 of his 19 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

**LAST FIVE STARTS:** Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last five starts and is 3-1 with a 1.36 ERA (5 er in 33.0 ip) and .175 (21 for 120) opponents batting average over that span...has walked 12 of struck out 37 in 33.0 innings...went 0-3 with a 4.34 ERA, a .264 batting average, 12 walks and nine strikeouts over his previous three starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.33), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.319), eighth in opponents batting average (.217) and 11<sup>th</sup> in wins (9)...is fourth in walks (54) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in wild pitches (6).

**STRIKEOUTS:** Ranks third in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.93)...had 111 strikeouts at the All-Star Break, which tied for the fourth best pre-Break total in Oakland history...it was the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986...the top three are Vida Blue (188 in 1971), Vida Blue (120 in 1975) and Catfish Hunter (119 in 1972).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .158 (16 for 101) average with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .269 (45 for 167) with no outs and .185 (51 for 275) with one or two outs...has held the first three spots in the batting order to a .194 (32 for 165) average...six of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

**THE LAST TWO YEARS:** Is 24-15 with a 2.89 ERA (103 er in 320.2 ip) over the last two years...the ERA is tied for fourth lowest in the American League over that span and the wins rank eighth.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 5-1 with a 1.51 ERA (8 er in 47.2 ip) in seven starts on five or more days rest and 4-5 with a 2.86 ERA (23 er in 72.1 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest and.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 2.96 ERA (25 er in 76.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 1.23 ERA (6 er in 44.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...has allowed eight of his nine home runs over the first four innings of a game.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 7-2 with a 1.88 ERA (15 er in 72.0 ip) and .186 (47 for 253) opponents batting average in 11 starts at home and 2-4 with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) and .259 (49 for 189) opponents average in eight starts on the road...is tied for first in the American League in home wins and ranks fourth in ERA...over the last two years, he is 15-5 with a 2.28 ERA (44 in 174.0 ip) and .194 (120 for 619) opponents average in 27 starts at home and 9-10 with a 3.62 ERA (59 er in 146.2 ip) and .257 (147 for 571) average in 25 starts on the road.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of two runs or fewer 11 of his 20 starts...has just nine runs of support in his six losses this year (33.2 ip, 2.41 RSA) and 27 runs of support in his 26 career losses (127.2 ip, 1.90 RSA)...is 26-1 in 35 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-25 in 41 starts with support of two or fewer.

**ALL-STAR:** Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Is 2-1 with a 2.00 ERA (4 er in 18.0 ip) over his first three starts of July...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Los Angeles a week ago today...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just four hits and two walks while striking out eight...each of his first six outs were strikeouts...allowed just two runners to advance into scoring position.

**GONZALEZ vs. NEW YORK:** Is 1-3 with a 6.33 ERA (21.1 ip, 18 h, 15 r, 15 er, 17 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...is 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (1 er in 6.2 ip) in one start in Yankee Stadium and 0-3 with a 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's loss in Oakland June 1...allowed a RBI double to Rodriguez in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...then surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...was relieved by Devine with one out in the seventh inning and the A's trailing 4-2...went 0-2 with a 10.80 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year...the first loss came in a 7-3 decision in Oakland on April 20...allowed three runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Posada and a two-run single by Swisher but then retired 11 of the next 12 batters before walking Johnson and Teixeira with one out in the fifth...also lost in a 6-2 decision on July 7 in Oakland...walked five batters and allowed eight hits in just 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the fourth inning on RBI singles by Pena and Jeter and a three-run home run by Teixeira...the win came in the A's 6-4 victory at New York July 25, 2009...blanked the Yankees on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and allowed his only run in the sixth inning when a Jeter walk was followed by a Gardner triple.

**RHP Guillermo Moscoso (3-5, 2.96 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 12<sup>th</sup> appearance and 10<sup>th</sup> start of the season...allowed seven runs, six earned, in 4.2 innings Tuesday in Detroit after allowing just one earned run (24.2 ip, 0.36 ERA) over his previous four starts...is now 1-2 with a 2.15 ERA (7 er in 29.1 ip) in his past five starts...is 2-1 with a 1.99 ERA (5 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts at home this season compared to 1-4 with a 3.66 ERA (13 er in 32.0 ip) in seven appearances, five starts, on the road...has never faced Tampa Bay in his career.

The A's bullpen has a 2.44 ERA (23 er in 84.2 ip) over the past 30 games dating back to June 17...is 3-4 with 11 saves, two blown saves, a .218 (67 for 308) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over that span...now has a 3.09 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.335) in the AL, third lowest on-base percentage (.313) and fifth lowest batting average (.233)...has the fewest wins (10) and is tied for the most losses (18)...is tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (17)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (68).
