RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered an 11-4 loss to Oakland last night. Rick Porcello (3-3) allowed four runs in five innings of work to take the loss for Detroit. Miguel Cabrera led the Tigers with two hits and two RBI, while Dmitri Young added a run-scoring single. The Tigers continue a nine-game road trip with the third game of a four-game series at Oakland this evening. The trip concludes with with a two-game series at Chicago beginning on Monday evening. Detroit returns home for a five-game homestand with Minnesota and Pittsburgh beginning on May 16.

ON THE ROAD: Tonight at Oakland marks the sixth game of a 24-game stretch in which 19 of Detroit's games will be played on the road. The Tigers have posted a 24-13 record in road games dating back to August 11, 2011. Detroit is second among all major league clubs with a .649 winning percentage on the road during that stretch.

MIGGY'S THE MAN VERSUS OAKLAND: Miguel Cabrera is hitting .349 (44x129) with 10 doubles, 11 home runs and 34 RBI in 36 games during his career versus Oakland. He is second among active major league players since the start of the 2008 season with a .459 on-base percentage versus the Athletics, while he is third with a .682 slugging percentage and one home run every 11.73 at-bats and fourth with a .349 batting average.

STARTING WELL: The Tigers have posted 10 quality starts in the club's last 12 games. Club starters have posted a 2.71 ERA (76.1IP/23ER) and 69 strikeouts during the stretch dating back to April 28, while limiting opponents to a .227 batting average (64x282).

A LONG STRETCH WITHOUT BEING BLANKED: The Tigers scored four runs last night at Oakland, marking the 100th straight game dating back to July 17, 2011, in which the club has not been shut out. It is tied for the second-longest such streak in Tigers history, matching a streak of 100 straight games with at least one run scored by the club May 27-September 9, 1935. The franchise record for the longest stretch of games without being shut out is 110 games established August 28, 1992-June 29, 1993. (Source: STATS LLC)

PAPA GRANDE CONVERTS HIS SAVE CHANCES: Jose Valverde has converted 81 of his 86 save opportunities for the Tigers since the beginning of the 2010 season. He is tops among all major league pitchers during that stretch by converting 94.2 percent of his save opportunities. Valverde is 19 saves shy of reaching 100 during his Tigers career as he looks to become the fifth pitcher in club history to record 100 saves for the team.

JACKSON SWINGS INTO ACTION: Austin Jackson enters this evening's game at Oakland having hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games. During the 14-game stretch, he is batting .393 (22x56) with five doubles, a home run and seven RBI. Jackson is currently eighth in the American League with a .320 batting average this season.

CABRERA, FIELDER FORM POWERFUL COMBO: Miguel Cabrera and Prince Fielder are among the leaders in the major leagues in home runs and RBI since the start of the 2006 season. Fielder is third in the major leagues with 233 home runs during that stretch, while Cabrera is seventh with 206 home runs. Cabrera is second in the major leagues with 721 RBI since the start of the 2006 season, while Fielder is seventh with 662 RBI.

FLAWLESS IN CENTER FIELD: Austin Jackson enters tonight's game at Oakland having not committed an error over his last 102 games in center field for the Tigers dating back to June 30, 2011, a stretch of 243 total chances. He is sixth among all American League outfielders with a .994 fielding percentage since the start of the 2011 season.

RADIO BOOTH UPDATE: Tigers radio broadcaster Jim Price, per the club's request, did not accompany the team on the long journey out West. Price will return to the booth when the Tigers host Minnesota on May 16. Former Tigers pitcher Dan Petry will serve as radio analyst and join Dan Dickerson for the entire road trip.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Jim Leyland is in his seventh season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 535-470 record (.532).

- Leyland enters tonight's game with 1,604 wins during his major league managerial career, 16th-most all-time in major league history. He is 15 wins shy of matching Ralph Houk for 15th-most all-time in major league history with 1,619 wins. Leyland is tops among all active major league managers with 1,604 wins.
- Tonight's game marks the 3,208th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.
- Leyland is one of only five managers in Tigers history to register at least 500 victories with the club. Sparky Anderson (1,331 wins), Hughie Jennings (1,131 wins), Bucky Harris (516 wins) and Steve O'Neill (509 wins) are the four other managers in Tigers history with at least 500 wins with the club.

FILLING YOU IN ON FISTER: In his first full season with the Tigers, Fister makes his third start of the 2012 season this evening versus the Athletics.

RETURNING TO ACTION: Fister returned to action on May 7 at Seattle after being reinstated from the disabled list earlier that day. He had been sidelined since April 8 with a left costochondral strain.

REHAB START WITH TOLEDO: Fister joined Triple A Toledo to make one start on May 2 versus Pawtucket as part of an injury rehabilitation assignment. He fanned five batters in four scoreless innings.

LIMITING THE RUNS AGAINST OAKLAND: Fister is making the 11th start of his career against the Athletics this evening. He has limited Oakland to two-or-fewer runs in eight of his previous 10 outings versus the club.

LOOKING BACK AT THE LAST TIME HE STARTED HERE: Fister limited the Athletics to one run over eight innings of work to earn the win in his last start in Oakland on September 16, 2011, helping the Tigers clinch the American League Central Division title that evening.

WORKING AT LEAST SEVEN INNINGS WITHOUT A WALK: Fister did not issue a walk as he tossed seven shutout innings on May 7 at Seattle. It marked the 13th time in his major league career he has pitched at least seven innings and not allowed a walk, including the sixth time he has accomplished that feat during his Tigers career.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Fister is making the sixth start of his career at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening. In his previous five outings, he is 2-2 with a 2.60 ERA (27.2IP/8ER).

STOPPING THE RUNNING GAME: Fister has allowed only six stolen bases in his 73 outings at the major league level during his career. Seven runners have been caught attempting to steal during his career, including one via a pitcher caught stealing.

HEADED TOWARDS 100 CAREER STARTS: Fister is making the 72nd start of his major league career this evening versus the Athletics, 28 starts shy of 100 during his career.

ESTABLISHING CAREER BESTS IN 2011: Fister established career highs with 11 wins, 216.1 innings pitched and 146 strikeouts during the 2011 season with Detroit and Seattle.

CHECKING THE LEADER BOARDS: Fister finished fourth in the American League with a 2.83 ERA and 1.5 walks per nine innings during the 2011 season.

STELLAR DOWN THE STRETCH WITH THE TIGERS: Fister compiled a career-best seven-game winning streak with the Tigers August 20-September 26, 2011. During the eight-outing (seven-start) stretch, he posted a 0.65 ERA (55.2IP/4ER) and 52 strikeouts.

SUPER SEPTEMBER: Fister was tabbed both the American League and Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September of 2011 after posting a 5-0 record, 0.53 ERA (34.0IP/2ER) and 34 strikeouts in five outings (four starts). He led the American League with a 0.53 ERA during the month, while he tied for the lead with five wins and tied for seventh with 34 strikeouts.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fister was acquired by the Tigers in a six-player deal with the Seattle Mariners on July 30, 2011. He was originally selected by Seattle in the seventh round of the June 2006 draft.
