RAY MATTER—The Rays had their modest 2-game win streak snapped last night losing 4-3 in 15 innings in the longest road game in club history... the Rays are 4-3 on this 9-game, 3-city road trip (2-1 at BAL, 2-1 at LAA and 0-1 here)...Rays have scored 3 runs or less 6 of the 7 games on the trip and 8 of their last 9 games...Rays have pitched to a 2.02 ERA (66.2-IP, 45-H, 15-ER, 79-SO) on the road trip, but have batted .201 (49-for-244) including .185 (10-for-54) with runners in scoring position...Rays are 6-5 in their last 11 games while pitching to a 1.84 ERA (107.2-IP, 65-H, 22-ER, 129-SO).

- + The Rays are 8-9 since the All-Star break while pitching to an AL-best 2.67 ERA (161.2-IP, 48-ER) with a major-league-high 179 SO.
- + The Rays are 12-13 in July, 18-25 since they were last in first place on June 11 and 34-41 since they were a season-high 11 games over .500 (19-8) on May 4.
- + The Rays 18-14 on the road since May 13...they are 15-22 at home during that same span.

<u>CAUTION: FALLING RECORDS</u>—Last night's 4-3, 15-inning loss saw five club records fall and one tied:

- + Longest road game in by time (5:09) and innings (15)
- + Most Pitchers Strikeouts, Game (21)

- + Most Consecutive Scoreless Innings (24)

RAYS 4TH TO JOIN 20 Ks, 10 BBs CLUB SINCE 1919—With 21 strikeouts and 10 walks (3-IBB) last night, the Rays became just the 4th team since 1919 to strike out 20 or more batters in a game and walk 10 or more (see below)...the Rays 21 strikeouts were the most by any team in a game since Aug 6, 2007 when the A's fanned 21 in a 13-inning, 9-7 win at Texas... it was the most strikeouts by a losing team since June 8, 2004 when the Angels struck out 26 Brewers in 17 innings and lost 1-0.

JULY PUNCHOUTS—The Rays have struck out a major league-high 230 batters in July, most by an AL team since the 1964 Indians fanned 264 behind **Sam McDowell**'s 44...the Rays have struck out 10 or more batters in 11 of the last 16 games for a total of 170 in 152.2 innings pitched.

RAYS BULLPEN IS MAJORS' BEST SINCE THE BREAK—In their last 37.1 innings the bullpen has allowed only 2 runs and struck out 54...Rays relievers have worked 58.2 innings since the All-Star break and have been scored upon in only 5 of those innings...their 1.53 ERA (58.2-IP, 10-ER) since the break is tops in majors.

HITS ARE SCARCE—In the last 9 games (4-5), the Rays and their opponents have combined to hit .196 (119-for-608)...the Rays have batted .199 (61-for-307) and their opponents .193 (58-for-301)...overall, Rays opponents are batting just .238, lowest in the AL...Rays also led the AL in lowest opp avg. in 2010 and 2011...the last team to lead the AL in that category for three consecutive seasons was the 1983-85 Tigers.

RAYS vs. A's—Last night was the 3rd extra-inning game between these two teams in their last 5 games (since last Aug 7) and the Rays have lost them all...Oakland Coliseum is historically the Rays toughest AL port...the Rays are 19-47 (288) all-time here...they were 6-30 here prior to Manager Joe Maddon's arrival, but are 13-17 since...their overall mark vs. the A's of 49-84 (.368) is also the lowest winning pct. vs. an AL foe, but the Rays trail only 24-25 since the start of the 2007 season...A's have 3 of 4 in 2012.

RAYS AND THE 1914 YANKEES — The Rays are batting .199 (61-for-307) over their last 9 games dropping their overall average from .233 to .230, lowest in the majors...the Rays also continue to lead the majors in walks...only once in major league history has a team led the majors in walks while finishing last in batting...that team was the 1914 Yankees...Rays rank just below Oakland and Seattle (both at .232)...in the DH era (since 1973), there has never been a season when the AL had the three lowest-hitting teams in the majors, and the 1981 Blue Jays (.226) are the only AL team to finish with a lower average...the Rays are batting .188 (26-for-138) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star break.

AL EAST IS A BEAST—All 5 teams in the AL East enter play today .500 or better... that's the latest into the season that has ever happened...in fact, since the current divisional format began in 1994, only one other division has had 5 teams .500 or better this deep into the season: 2005 NL East (all 5 teams finished .500 or better).

TIGHTEST AL WILD CARD RACE SINCE

2005—Presently, eight teams are within 6.0 games of the AL's first Wild Card slot... since the Wild Card format began in 1994, there has only been one season in which the AL Wild Card race has been this tight this late...in 1995 there were 8 teams within 6.0 games as late as Aug 6.

WHERE NO MAN HAS GONE BEFORE—Fernando Rodney has 30 saves and a 0.76 ERA...since the save became an official statistic in 1969, no major league pitcher has ever finished the month of July with Rodney's current combination of saves and ERA...the closest to doing so were ATL John Smoltz (40, 0.81) in 2003 and Dennis Eckersley (32, 0.81) in 1990.

<u>COMPARING PRICE</u>—David Price made his 21st start last night...of all the AL Cy Young Award winners since 1969, only 7 matched Price's 14 wins and 2.64 ERA after their first 21 starts of their Cy Young season:

FIELDING: SECOND HALF TURNAROUND—After making 71 errors in 86 games before the All-Star break (2nd most in the majors), they have made only 7 in the first 17 games since the break...Rays have been errorless in 10 of their last 13 games, but their 78 errors are already 5 more than they made all of last season...Rays have allowed only 3 unearned runs in the last 33 games after allowing a ML-high 40 in their first 76 games.

LIFE WITHOUT LONGO—In the 4th game of his current rehab assignment, 3B **Evan Longoria** (partially torn left hamstring) went 1-for-3 last night with a walk in Triple-A Durham's 7-6, 12-inning loss at Norfolk (Orioles)...in his 4 games with Durham—all as the DH—he is 2-for-12 with 4 walks and 2 RBI...the Rays are 38-42 since Longoria has been out...they were 15-8 at the time he went on the DL...**Ryan Roberts** is the 8th different Ray to play 3B in Longoria's absence and the 9th overall, most by an AL team since the 2007 Blue Jays.

- 30-year-old will make his 22nd start of the season, 11th on the road
- Last start: On Thu at BAL, allowed 5 runs in the 5th inning and took the loss as the Rays dropped the series finale at Camden Yards...the game was scoreless before Baltimore's 5-run rally...his line: 6 IP, 6 H, 5 R/ER, 5 BB, 10 SO, 1 HBP, 108 pitches, 70 strikes...his 5 BB tied a career high.
- AL rankings: T-8th in innings pitched (137.1), 6th in SO (134), 8th in GB/FB ratio (1.92) and 2nd in pitches per outing (110.6)...his .340 opponents' batting avg. on balls in play (BAPIP) is 2nd highest in the majors.
- Has allowed 3-plus runs in an inning in 5 of his last 11 starts...has allowed 1st-inning runs in almost half his starts this year (10 of 21)
- Has a 5.45 career ERA (239.1-IP, 145-ER) in the month of July, his highest of any month by almost a full run (4.47 career ERA in June)...has a 6.06 ERA (32.2-IP, 22-ER) so far this July.
- Has pitched 6 innings or less in 10 starts this season...only did it 5 times all of last year.
- Has blown a lead in 7 of his 21 starts this year including 6 of his 11 starts at home.
- Leads the majors with 156 hits allowed...this season opponents have a .281 batting avg., .340 avg. on balls in play (BABIP) and he has allowed 10.2 H/9 IP...in 2011, posted a .215 opp avg., .258 BABIP and vielded 7 0 H/9 IP
- Through his first 6 starts was 5-0 with a 3.05 ERA, but in 15 starts since then is 3-7 with a 5.16 ERA (96-IP, 55-ER)...the Rays were 6-0 in his first 6 starts but are 6-9 in his last 15 starts.
- According to FanGraphs, is throwing his fastball only 27.9 percent of the time, far less than any other AL pitcher...next closest is LAA Dan Haren (38.6) and the only pitcher in MLB who throws the fastball less is NYM R.A. Dickey (13.8)...coming into the year, averaged 45.2 pct. fastballs for his career...throws his change-up for 30.0 percent of his total pitches, most in the AL.
- Has already allowed 13 unearned runs this season, most in the majors and a new career high...only allowed 5 unearned runs all of last year...the record for unearned runs in a season for a Rays pitcher is Wilson Alvarez with 17 in 1999.
- Has thrown 6 or more innings in 47 of his last 54 starts dating back to the start of 2011...has not finished the 8th inning since April 21, averaging 6.1 IP per outing over his last 16 starts since then...worked 8 innings or more in 18 of his previous 33 starts dating back to April 19 last year
- Has not finished the 8th inning since April 21 vs. MIN...led the majors with 11 CG last year...no other pitcher in history has had 11 or more complete games in one season and then gone 22 starts without a complete game the next year.
- Has averaged 16.9 pitches per inning this year, 7th highest in the AL...averaged a league-low 14.3 pitches per inning last year. When he is ahead in the count, opposing hitters are batting only .198 (39-for-197)....when he is behind, they hit .374 (55-for-147).
- Allowed double-digit hit totals in 4 straight outings from June 28–July 15, totaling 45 hits in 26.2 IP...it was the longest streak by an AL pitcher since OAK Dan Haren did it in 4 straight starts from Sep 1-17, 2007...it was tied for the 2nd-longest streak ever by a Rays pitcher, as Tanyon Sturtze also went 4 straight outings with 10-plus hits from Aug 23-Sep 9, 2002...the Rays record is 6 straight starts by Albie Lopez from May 19-June 16, 2001.
- Has allowed 10-plus hits 6 times this year...the rest of the Rays staff combined has only done that 3 times.
- On June 28 vs. DET, allowed a career-high 14 hits, tying the club record, in a 5-2 loss opposite Max Scherzer...his line: 7.2 IP, 14 H, 4 R/ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 123 pitches, 84 strikes...took his first career loss against the Tigers, the only AL team he was still undefeated against (5-1).

- Is 1-2 with a 6.46 ERA (30.2-IP, 22-ER) in 5 career starts at the Coliseum.
- On Mother's Day (May 9) 2010 at OAK, pitched opposite Dallas Braden who threw a perfect game and the A's won, 4-0...his line: 6 IP, 11 H, 4 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 108 pitches, 72 strikes.
- Last start: On July 27, 2011 at OAK, lost to Trevor Cahill and the A's 13-4...his line: 4 IP, 12 H, 10 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR, 80 pitches, 51 strikes. gave up 12 hits in 22 AB to Oakland hitters including 3 2B and 2 HR...14 of the 25 batters he faced reached safely...saw his ERA rise half a run (2.53 to 3.03).

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Ejected July 18 vs. CLE in the 7th inning by home plate umpire Dan lassogna, his first of the season and 24th as a Ray, extending his club record.
- + Is the longest-tenured and winningest manager in Rays history at 548-526 (.510)...has a 421-329 (.561) record since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival...overall is 567-536 (.514) in his career, including a 19-10 interim stint with the Angels in 1999.
- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2011) is in his 7th season as Rays skipper...only three current major league managers have been at their posts longer: LAA Mike Scioscia (2000), MIN Ron Gardenhire (2002) and PHI Charlie Manuel (2005)...April 16 at BOS marked his 500th career win with the Rays...is 1 of 5 active managers with 500 wins with their current team...also Manuel, Scioscia, Gardenhire and DET Jim Leyland.
- + Managed his 1,000th game with the Rays on May 5...became the 5th manager in the modern era to manage at least 1,000 games for one team without ever playing in the majors, joining BAL Earl Weaver, NYY Joe McCarthy, PIT Jim Leyland and PHI Danny Ozark.
- + Earned 26 of 28 first-place votes from the BBWAA last fall in the Manager of the Year balloting...finished 3rd in 2010.

- + Has only started 7 of the Rays last 27 games...during that span, has gone 3-for-37 with 20 SO and only 2 XBH and 1 BB...went 7-for-20 with 1 HR, 3 2B and 6 RBI in his first 7 games (5 starts) for the Rays.
- + Of his 18 career HR, 9 either tied the game or gave his team the lead, 9 have come in the 8th inning or later and 6 have come as a PH.
- + Batting .172/.213/.362 with 2 HR, 9 RBI and 5 2B in 24 games since joining the Rays...has appeared at 3B (13 games, 8 starts) and 2B (9 games, 4 starts)....hit .075 (3-for-40) with 2 HR and 6 RBI in 25 games for the Brewers.

TOMORROW'S START & 2012 NOTES

- 24-year-old will make his 13th start of the season, 22nd of his career...it will be his 6th start on the road this year.
- Last start: On Fri at LAA, only allowed 3 runs in 7 innings but still took the loss opposite Dan Haren in a 3-1 defeat for the Rays...his line: 7 IP, 8 H, 3 R/ ER, 0 BB, 3 SO, 93 pitches, 65 strikes...allowed all 3 runs in the 3rd inning, surrending 4 straight 2-out hits...retired 13 of the final 15 batters he faced.
- On July 21 vs. SEA, left the game after the 2nd inning with a lower right leg contusion...X-rays were negative...the Rays bullpen threw 7 scoreless innings but the Mariners still won. 2-1.
- Since winning his first 2 starts of the season, has gone 2-8 with a 5.49 ERA (57.1-IP, 35-ER) over his last 10 starts.
- On June 17 vs. MIA, allowed just 2 hits and struck out 10 in 7 scoreless innings...in 6 starts since then, has gone 1-5 with a 6.25 ERA (31.2-IP, 22-ER), 43 hits and 11 BB...has allowed 1st-inning runs in 4 of those 6 starts.
- Throws his change-up 39.3 pct. of the time, the highest rate among all pitchers in the majors...James Shields currently leads all qualifying AL pitchers but even he only throws it 30.0 pct. of the time.
- Opposing lineups are batting .329 (23-for-70) against him with runners in scoring position this year...has held opponents to a .238 (36-for-151) avg. with the bases empty compared to a .342 (39-for-114) avg. with runners on base
- Has a 3.05 groundball/flyball (GB/FB) ratio, which leads the majors since his debut on May 19...though 60.2 pct. of the balls hit off him are groundballs, opposing lineups still have a .327 average on balls put in play (BAPiP), which would rank 4th-highest in the AL if he qualified.
- Has only allowed 6 HR in 21 career major league starts (122 IP)...has never allowed a home run to a right-handed batter (214 PA).
- Has given up multiple runs in an inning (2 or more) in 10 of his 12 starts this year.
- Has held the top half of the order (batters 1-thru-5) to a .264 avg. (42-for-159) this season...however the bottom half of the order (batters 6-thru-9) is batting .311 (33-for-106) against him.
- His first complete game of his pro career was the first of its kind in more than 16 years, allowing career highs with 8 runs and 13 hits as the Rays were shut out, 8-0, on June 25 at KC...the last CG with 13 or more hits and 8 or more runs was thrown by BOS Tim Wakefield in 1996...Wakefield's CG is the only other one like it in the last 27 years.
- On May 25 at BOS beat Jon Lester, 7-4...it was the first career start at Fenway Park for Cobb, who was born in Boston.
- Made his season debut on May 19 vs. ATL, earning the win opposite Randall Delgado.

 Was recalled from Triple-A Durham on May 19 to take injured Jeff Niemann's place in the rotation.
- Was 1-4 with a 4.14 ERA (41.1-IP, 19-ER) in 8 starts at Triple-A Durham this season...allowed 2 runs or less in 6 of his 8 starts but had two outings where he allowed 6 ER on April 24 (4-IP, 6-ER) and May 9 (1.2-IP, 7-R, 6-ER) that significantly raised his ERA.
- Recalled on April 15 and flew to Boston to join the big league club as a member of the team's bullpen...James Shields pitched 8.1 innings on April 16 and Cobb was optioned back to the minors the next day.

COBB vs. ATHLETICS

In his only previous start against the A's, made his final start of the 2011 season on Aug 6 vs. OAK and was removed after 4.1 IP with discomfort in his right hand, later found to be thoracic outlet syndrome...allowed 5 R/ER in that start and saw his season ERA go from 2.79 to a season-ending 3.42... the Rays were shut out 8-0 as Brandon McCarthy threw 8 shutout innings...Cobb underwent season-ending surgery on Aug 18 to remove a blood clot and blockage in the area of his first right rib.
