#### OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics completed their first sweep of three or more games since June 11-13 against New York (AL)...have won seven of their last nine games and are 3-0 on their current 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (3-0), Texas (three games) and Houston (four games).
- A.J. Griffin** earned the win in his second straight start after going winless in his previous four starts (0-2, two no decisions)...allowed his Major League leading 33<sup>rd</sup> home run of the season...pitched at least seven innings for the 10<sup>th</sup> time this season.
- Coco Crisp** (1 for 4, r, hr, rbi) hit his career-high tying 16<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the bottom of the first inning...was his 13<sup>th</sup> career leadoff home run and 11<sup>th</sup> with the Athletics...was his fifth leadoff home run this season.
- Jed Lowrie** (2 for 4, r, 2b, so) hit his 41<sup>st</sup> double of the season, which ties him for the fourth highest single-season total in Oakland A's history.

- James Loney** (2 for 4, r, hr, rbi) homered for the first time since July 26 at New York (AL)...snapped a 28-game homerless streak...was just his second extra-base hit in his last 25 games.
