ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last eight games but are 6-10 over the last 16 contests...are in second place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and eighth time in the last 10 days...trail Los Angeles by one game...have 119 days alone in first place, eight days tied for first, 11 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...the 127 days in first place are the A's most since 1992 (136)...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...currently have the first Wild Card spot, six games ahead the second Wild Card (Seattle) and 6½ games ahead of the third place team (Detroit)...are 21-21 over the last 42 games (since July 9) after starting the year 57-33...are 78-54 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to the Angels (79-53)...had the best record from June 18 to August 15 and have been in the top two every day since May 31.

LATE COMEBACKS: The A's scored three times in the ninth inning last night after trailing 3-2 after seven innings...it was the A's **Major League leading and Oakland record tying 12th** win when trailing after seven innings (also 1969)...also lead the majors with seven wins when trailing after eight innings, which is second best in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...improved to 21-12 in games decided in the last at bat are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and winning percentage and are tied for second in games...are 27-27 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 51-27 in games decided by three runs or more.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 165 runs, which is **the most in the majors** (Los Angeles-AL, 104)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .227 (95 for 418) with 48 runs scored over the last 13 games (3.69 runs per game)...**lead the majors** in runs (634) and walks (486), have the second fewest strikeouts (903), rank fifth in home runs (133) and on-base percentage (.325), eighth in slugging percentage (.398) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (382).

PITCHING: The A's rank second in the American League in ERA (3.26) and opponents on-base percentage (.294) and third in opponents batting average (.234) and slugging percentage (.354)...have issued the third fewest walks (348) and rank fourth in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-13 with a 4.61 ERA (87 er in 170.0 ip) over the last 29 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...for the season, the starters are tied for second in the American League in wins (55), rank third in ERA (3.45) and tied for third in complete game shutouts (2)...have the second fewest losses (38).

IN AUGUST: The A's are hitting .232 (189 for 813) in August, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...are averaging 3.96 runs per game (99 runs in 25 games)...averaged 5.48 runs per game in April, 5.07 in May, 5.08 in June and 4.52 in July...have a 12-13 record and need to go 3-1 over the remaining four games to finish with a winning record...have not posted a losing record in a month since May of 2012 when they went 11-16...currently have a streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an AL team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's have 30 games remaining and 23 of those will be played against American League West competition (7 vs. Los Angeles, 7 vs. Texas, 6 vs. Seattle, 3 vs. Houston)...the exceptions are a four-game series at Chicago-AL (Sept. 8-11) and a three-game series against Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...the A's are 31-22 (.585) against the AL West for the season...have the best intra-division record in the West.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) and have lost eight of the last 11 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 17-25 since then...are 35-31 (.530) on the road for the season...went 3-2 on the last homestand against New York-NL (1-1) and Los Angeles (2-1)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...are 43-23 (.652) in Oakland, which is the best home record in the majors ahead of the Angels (43-24, .642)...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 37-14 since then...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 72 of 86 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.0%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 76 of their 90 (84.4%) attempts, which is the highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: Jonny Gomes had a sacrifice fly in the sixth inning last night for the A's 19th pinch RBI of the season...those are the A's most pinch RBI since 2000 (20)...A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 46 (.109) with five walks...lead the American League in walks (19), extra base hits (9) and sacrifice flies (3), are tied for the lead in doubles (6), tied for second in home runs (3) and rank third in hits (24), RBI and plate appearances (133).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 32 assists, which ranks second in the American League (Minnesota, 33)...the A's have committed 18 errors in the last 22 games and now have 88 for the season, which ranks third in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed John Jaso on the seven-day disabled list Monday (concussion) and have now added five players to the DL over the last 32 days (Gentry, Punto, Lowrie and Doolittle)...began the season with seven players on the DL and used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27...have used the DL 18 times this year after using it 13 times in 2013...have had at least three players on the DL all year...currently have seven players on the DL (Blanks, Doolittle, Griffin, Jaso, Lowrie, Parker and Punto), which matches the season high (March 31-April 6)...Blanks, Griffin and Parker are on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 8-4...are 5-1 in Oakland and 3-3 in Anaheim...three of the six games at Anaheim have gone extra innings and the average time of game in those six games is 3:43 (1340 minutes)...have scored just one run in two of the four losses this year and have been held to one run or fewer in 15 of their last 21 losses to the Angels (including seven shutouts)...have won each of the previous three season series and are 40-29 (.579) against the Angels over the last four years...including 32-4 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 405-325 against the Angels...that includes 210-154 in Oakland and 195-171 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 454-402 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has 39 double plays, which is the most by a Major League third baseman, second most in Oakland history (43, Eric Chavez in 2006) and third most in Athletics history (46, Sammy Hale in 1927)...**Craig Gentry** has a stolen base percentage of 95.2%, which is tied for the best in the majors and tied for the best in Athletics history (Javier, 1988)...**Eric O'Flaherty** recorded his first Major League save last night...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in six games against Los Angeles this year (6.2 ip) and nine games in his career (12.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1938** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Chicago on Connie Mack Day at Shibe Park, their seventh consecutive twin bill in eight days...in **1974** the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY’S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-7, 3.00 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28, 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1, and is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (15 er in 25.0 ip) and .303 (30 for 99) opponents average over his last four starts.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win in his last start to snap his career-high and A's season-high tying four-game losing streak...posted a 4.94 ERA and .284 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned four starts from August 1-16.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.322), tied for sixth in wins (13) and eighth in ERA (3.00) and opponents batting average (.233)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in wild pitches (11), ranks seventh in walks (59), and tied for 10th in complete games (1).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start Friday against the Angels, the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has surrendered 11 home runs in 171.0 innings for an average of 0.58 home runs per nine innings, which ranks 10th lowest in the American League...10 of the 11 home runs have been solo shots, eight have come at home and eight have been hit at night...has yielded just 15 home runs in 235.0 career innings (0.57 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-1 with a 2.14 ERA (17 er in 71.1 ip) in 10 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA (40 er in 99.2 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else...is now 11-2 with a 1.84 ERA (22 er in 107.1 ip) in 16 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.81 ERA (54 er in 127.2 ip) in 22 games against all other teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed one of his two home runs in his last start to Josh Hamilton, the Angels cleanup hitter...it was the first extra base hit he allowed to a number four hitter this year...they are batting .145 (10 for 69) with five RBI...his .188 slugging percentage against the fourth batting slot in the lowest in the majors and his batting average is second lowest (Scherzer, .135)...opponents are batting .186 (30 for 161) with two doubles and two home runs (.236 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...has allowed a .188 (42 for 223) batting average and .229 slugging percentage (three doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

WINS: Has won 13 games this year and is now 18-10 (.643) in 38 career games...the 18 wins are fourth most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 38 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash went 21-9 (.700) over his first 38 games from 1966-67 (lost game 39), Tim Hudson went 21-4 (.840) from 1999-2000 (no decision in game 39) and Vida Blue went 19-4 (.864) from 1969-71 (won game 39).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 26 starts...is 1-7 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-9 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out six times this year, including four times in games Gray has started

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for the Major League lead with four losses in August...had just six losses over the first 33 games of his career...has a 2.71 ERA (22 er in 73.0 ip) on the road, which ranks seventh in the American League...has a 2.78 ERA (33 er in 106.2 ip) in 16 starts at night, which ranks ninth in the American League...is 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA (24 er in 102.2 ip) in 15 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 45 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 61)...has allowed 17 of his 63 runs in the fifth inning for a 5.68 ERA (16 er in 25.1 ip)...the A's are 16-10 (.615) in his starting assignments this year and are 22-14 (.611) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 22 of his 26 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career...earned AL Pitcher of the Month a second time after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in

July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season along with Barry Zito (August and September, 2001) and Dave Stewart (April and September, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high two home runs...yielded solo one-out home runs to Trout in the first inning and Hamilton in the fourth...took a 5-2 lead into the ninth inning and after retiring Pujols, he walked Hamilton...was relieved by Doolittle, who allowed Hamilton to score before earning the save.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-0 with a 2.74 ERA (23.0 ip, 19 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 18 so, 3 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts...is 2-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the first win came in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on June 1...blanked the Angels on four hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fifth inning on back-to-back sacrifice flies by Aybar and Pujols...had a 6-2 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Aybar in the seventh...also picked up the win in his last start (see last start above)...his other two appearances came in 2013...pitched in relief in his second career outing July 19 at Los Angeles (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win September 17 in Oakland...allowed a two-out solo home run to Trout in the first inning but that was the only run he would allowed in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first and won it on a Donaldson single in the bottom of the ninth.

LHP Jon Lester (13-8, 2.53 ERA): Is 7-1 with a 1.64 ERA over his last 13 starts after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...is 3-1 with a 2.59 ERA in fove starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...has allowed just three home runs over his last 13 starts and 93.1 innings...is 4-1 with a 2.22 ERA in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 9-7 with 2.65 ERA in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 4-1 in his starting assignments...over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (102), seventh in strikeouts (1308), eighth in games started (220) and 10 th in innings pitched (1409.2)...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 4-2 with a 4.04 ERA in nine career regular season starts against Los Angeles...had a no decision in his only start this year (see last start).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.26 ERA (21 er in 83.2 ip) and .194 (58 for 299) opponents batting average over its last 31 games (since July 24).
- Went 1-for-3 in save opportunities last night and is 29-for-46 (63.0%) for the season...that is the third lowest percentage in the American League...have the fourth fewest saves.
- The A's lead American League bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.278), rank second in batting average (.221) and slugging percentage (.321) and third in ERA (2.86)...has the third fewest home runs (31) and is tied for the third fewest losses (16).
- Has issued 107 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 104)...are averaging 2.42 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
- First batters faced are hitting .216 (74 for 343), which is fourth lowest in the AL...have 18 first batter walks, which is second fewest, and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.262)...have 11 first batter home runs, which is tied for third most.

FRIDAY’S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-8, 2.53 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-1 with a 2.59 ERA (10 er in 34.2 ip) in five starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-8 with a 2.53 ERA (50 er in 177.2 ip) in 26 starts overall...is 7-1 with a 1.64 ERA (17 er in 93.1 ip) over his last 13 starts (since June 12) after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **fifth** in the American League in ERA (2.53), **sixth** in strikeouts (181) and innings pitched (177.2), **tied for sixth** in wins (13) and **eighth** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.64), opponents on-base percentage (.282) and opponents slugging percentage (.347)...is also **second** in unearned runs (13), **third** in most pitches per game (109.1), **tied for third** in shutouts (1) and reaching on an error (8), **tied for seventh** in opponents grounded into double plays (18) and **tied for ninth** in complete games (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just three home runs over his last 13 starts and 93.1 innings (0.29 per nine innings)...has surrendered 11 home runs in 177.2 innings overall and his average of 0.56 home runs per nine innings is **seventh** lowest in the American League...10 of the 11 home runs have been hit by right-handers and nine have been solo shots.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 4-1 with a 2.22 ERA (12 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 9-7 with 2.65 ERA in 19 starts before the break...is **tied for sixth** in the American League in post All-Star Break wins and ranks **ninth** in ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 2.72 ERA (25 er in 82.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-4 with a 2.67 ERA (29 er in 97.2 ip) in 15 starts at night compared to 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day...has the **seventh** lowest night ERA in the American League and the **eighth** lowest day ERA.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-4 with a 3.39 ERA (30 er in 79.2 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 7-4 with a 1.84 ERA (20 er in 98.0 ip) in 14 starts at home...has the **lowest** home ERA in the American League and **third** lowest in the majors...is 6-0 with a 0.95 ERA (7 er in 66.2 ip) over his last nine starts in his home ballpark (three in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park and has not allowed any in the Coliseum.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he is **tied for third** among Major League pitchers in wins (102), **tied for seventh** in strikeouts (1308), ranks **eighth** in games started (220) and **10th** in innings pitched (1409.2)...is one of **three** Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (**Hernandez**, **Hamels**) and one of **seven** with 162 or more innings pitched.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 17-9 (.654) in his starting assignments, including 4-1 with Oakland and 13-8 with Boston...they are 147-99 (.598) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 15 of his 26 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his fourth straight Opening Day start **March 31** at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts...struck out a career-high 15 batters **May 3** against Oakland...picked up the 107th win of his career **June 12** against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list...struck out six on **June 17** against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list...finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA...struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball **July 10** against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City **July 20**...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history...had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning **July 25** at Tampa Bay...went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July and the lowest single month ERA of his career...was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City **August 2** in Oakland...tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota **August 7** in Oakland...it was his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game...had his seven-game winning streak snapped in the A's 4-3 loss at Atlanta **August 17**...the streak fell one short of his career high of eight (April 28-June 16, 2010)...logged a 1.46 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts from June 12 to Aug. 12...yielded just one home run in 80.1 innings...walked 14 (1.57 per nine innings) while striking out 74 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.29.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Angels on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...then allowed three straight hits to start the seventh inning, including a RBI single by Aybar...left after seven innings with the scored tied 1-1 and the A's scored once in the eighth for the win.

A's AND CUBS: Is 4-3 with a 3.86 ERA (29 er in 67.2 ip) in 10 starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...is 6-10 with a 3.23 ERA (63 er in 175.2 ip) in 26 starts overall...was acquired from Chicago July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 2-2 with a 4.78 ERA (20 er in 37.2 ip) and .260 (39 for 150) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first four starts with the A's.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is **tied for sixth** in the majors in no decisions by a starter (11), **tied for seventh** in unearned runs (11), **tied for eighth** in hit batters (10), **tied for 18th** in strikeouts (156) and **tied for 19th** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.80).

WITH THE A'S: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 10 starts with the A's...has issued just 10 walks in 67.2 innings (1.33 per nine innings) while striking out 53 (5.30 strikeout-to-walk ratio)...has surrendered nine home runs in 67.2 innings with the A's (1.20 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...tossed six or more innings in each of first eight starts with the A's, which is the second longest streak by a pitcher to start his A's career since at least 1914...the longest is 10 by Willie Adams (June 11-Sept. 6, 1996)...became the first pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the Athletics since Jesse Flores in 1943...walked one batter or fewer while tossing seven or more innings in his first four starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .274 (46 for 168) when leading off an inning...has allowed 11 doubles, a triple and six home runs in that situation for a .458 slugging percentage...has a .229 (112 for 489) batting average and .352 slugging percentage after that (22 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs)...has a .289 (89 for 308) average and 12 home runs against the one through four hitters in the batting order, .198 (69 for 349) with four home runs against the five through nine hitters.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (17 er in 38.2 ip) and .231 (34 for 147) opponents batting average in six starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is now 4-5 with a 2.91 ERA (32 er in 99.0 ip) and .223 (82 for 368) opponents batting average in 15 starts in his home ballpark compared to 2-5 with a 3.64 ERA (31 er in 76.2 ip) and .263 (76 for 289) opponents average in 11 starts on the road.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is **tied for ninth** most among Major League pitchers...also ranks **tied for seventh** in putouts (17) and **tied for 19th** in total chances (36).

THIS AND THAT: Has three wins in eight starts since the All-Star Break after tallying three wins in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 7-3 (.700) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 40-53 (.430) in his 93 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 27 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 15 of his 27 starts and walked two batters or fewer 23 times...his 175.2 innings pitched are the second highest total of his career (213.2 last year)...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

WITH THE CUBS: Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh **March 31**...tossed 7.0 shutout innings to extend his Opening Day scoreless streak to 16.0 innings...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) **May 5**...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches...snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco **May 26**...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average was third lowest...allowed eight runs in 3.0

SUNDAY’S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (14-6, 3.08 ERA)

LAST 11 STARTS: Is 5-4 with a 4.57 ERA (32 er in 63.0 ip) and .280 (68 for 243) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts (since June 24)...went 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts.

BY MONTH: Is 2-3 with a 6.28 ERA (20 er in 28.2 ip) and .319 (36 for 113) opponents batting average in five starts in August...the ERA is **fifth** highest in the American League...posted a 3.12 ERA or lower in each of the first four months of the season...went 3-0 with a 1.38 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in four starts in July...the ERA was the second lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.22 in May, 2008) and it ranked fourth in the American League in July...was 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history (35).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Has allowed a .180 (20 for 111) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .082 (4 for 49) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is the **lowest** in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title and his average with RISP is **fourth** lowest...since 1974, the lowest mark with RISP and two outs by an Athletic is .138 by Bartolo Colón in 2013.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .145 (45 for 311) batting average with two strikes, which ranks **fifth** in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 12 of his 14 home runs this year and 28 of his 33 over the last two years to righties...has walked just four batters to lead off an inning...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .086 (5 for 59) batting average, which is the **lowest** mark in the majors.

14-GAME WINNER: Has a career-high 14 wins, surpassing his previous best of 13 from 2007 with Tampa Bay...they match the most by an A's pitcher before the end of August over the last eight years...the last A's pitcher with more than 14 wins before the end of August is Barry Zito, who had 15 in 2006...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had 11 wins at the All-Star Break, joining Mark Mulder (12 in 2003 and 2004) and Barry Zito (11 in 2002) as the only A's left-handers over the last 39 years to win at least 10 games before the break.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-3 with a 5.09 ERA (23 er in 40.2 ip) and .313 (50 for 160) opponents batting average in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 11-3 with a 2.38 ERA and .206 opponents batting average before the break.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-3 with a 2.15 ERA (19 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more compared to 10-3 with a 4.00 ERA (35 er in 78.2 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (9 er in 54.1 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.91 ERA (45 er in 103.2 ip) in 18 starts at night...has the **second** lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed just one home run in 54.1 innings during the day...is now 10-3 with a 2.39 ERA (29 er in 109.1 ip) in 18 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-12 with a 4.18 ERA (96 er in 206.2 ip) in 37 starts at night.

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field...earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998.
- Won his second consecutive Home Run Derby July 14, joining Ken Griffey, Jr. (1998-99) as the only players to win back-to-back derbies...hit a total of 30 home runs and defeated the Reds Todd Frazier 9-1 in the finals.
- Singled in the first inning July 18 to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.

- Doubled in the sixth inning July 20 against Baltimore to snap a career-high streak of 18 consecutive games without an extra base hit.
- Matched his career high with five RBI July 23 against Houston.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm...made one rehab appearance with Stockton May 31 against Modesto (1.0 ip) and was reinstated from the DL June 3.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and he added a third Aug. 12 at Kansas City.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...added the game-winning three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning July 18 against Baltimore...it was the third walk-off home run of his career (April 12, 2013 vs. Detroit)...the three career walk-off home runs are tied for fifth most in Oakland history...it was his fifth career walk-off hit
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)...received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre...

is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher

since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career.
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more and no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3,

2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.

- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.

- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 to snap a career-high 0 for 18 streak.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.

- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
