OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-6) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (8-3)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won yesterday to snap a short two-game losing skid...have yet to win or lose more than two games in a row this season...**have now out-scored the opposition 47-1 in their six wins** and have been out-scored 38-18 in their six losses...are 6-6 for the season and in sole possession of first place in the American League West...lead Houston and Los Angeles by a half game...have held at least a share of first nine of the first 13 days of the season...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.64 ERA (32 er in 109.0 ip), which ranks first in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of the first 12 games and have a 2.63 ERA (21 er in 72.0 ip), which ranks second in the AL...opponents are hitting .208 (54 for 259) against A's starters, which is second in the AL...the A's recorded their fifth shutout last night in their 12th game after recording their fourth in their ninth game...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1910, the A's are **the first AL team** with four shutouts in their first nine games...the five total shutouts are the most in the majors...three of the five shutouts have been by eight or more runs (4-0, 8-0, 10-0, 12-0, 5-0)...last year, the A's had three shutouts of eight or more runs the entire season.

OFFENSE: The A's reached double figures in hits in six of their first eight games but have been held to single digits in each of the last four...are batting .284 (122 for 430), which ranks third in the American League and the majors...lead the AL in doubles (28) and the majors in triples (5)...are tied for the fourth fewest home runs (10) in the AL...have recorded at least one stolen base in three of the past four games after going eight games without a steal to start the season...A's pinch hitters are 1-for-6 with two walks.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors on the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...made at least one error in six of the first seven games but have committed just one error over their last five games...have turned 14 double plays, which are the second most in the AL...have turned at least one double play in 10 of 12 games this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated Sunday...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...

began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

WITH BEANE AS THE GENERAL MANAGER: The A's have compiled a 1490-1274 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9).

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...R.J. Alvarez was the youngest (23 years, 301 days) and Ben Zobrist was the oldest (33 years, 314 days) until Cody Ross joined the club on April 8 (34 years, 103 days on Opening Day)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster after having none last year...however, two of those players have been optioned (Burns, Laden-dorf), leaving the A's with three rookies currently (Alvarez, Canha, Grave-man)...used just two rookies the entire season last year.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001...had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the regular season series last year, 2-5...lost two of three in Oakland and were 1-3 in Kansas City...also lost the American League Wild Card game at Kansas City on Sept. 30, 9-8 in 12 innings...are 29-21 in regular season games against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season and have won four of the six season series since then...all-time, the A's are 308-255 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-111 in Oakland and 139-144 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler hit in his 12th straight game to start his A's career, extending his Oakland record...is also the longest hitting streak in the majors this season...the **A's bullpen** recorded its first save last night (**Chavez**), becoming the final AL team to record a save this season...only Miami has yet to record a save in 2015...**Ike Davis** is riding an eight-game hitting streak, which is his longest since a nine-game streak from June 9-18, 2012, with New York-NL...his career-best streak is 11 games (April 17-29, 2011).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1981** the A's defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-1 in the first game of a double header at the Coliseum to run their record to 11-0, a Major League record at the time...the Mariners won the second game of the twinbill to end the A's streak but Oakland won the next six to improve to 17-1...in **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out an Oakland record 16 batters in the A's 7-2 win at Seattle...Bill Mooneyham adds two in an inning of relief for a club record 18 for a nine inning game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 0.69 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has won each of his first two starts for the second consecutive season and third time in his career (2009)...has never won his first three starts...allowed one hit in his first start and three in his last start...joins Mike Norris (1975) as the only Athletics pitchers on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to allow three or fewer hits while tossing six or more innings in each of his first two starts of the season.

IN APRIL: Is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA over his first two starts this year after going 2-0 with a 2.03 ERA over his first two starts last year (2-0, 1.40 ERA after three starts in 2014)...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April last year and is now 6-0 with a 1.75 ERA (10 er in 51.1 ip) in eight starts in April over the last two seasons.

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out eight batters in his last start after fanning 10 in his first start...is the only Athletics pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season...has 18 strikeouts, which is tied for eighth most in the American League.

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston on Monday...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

KAZMIR vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 4-7

with a 5.11 ERA (91.2 ip, 105 h, 54 r, 52 er, 35 bb, 75 so, 5 hr) in 17 career starts...is 4-2 with a 4.68 ERA (22 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks and 1-4 with a 5.47 ERA (30 er in 49.1 ip) in 10 starts at Kauffman Stadium...went 0-2 with a 4.85 ERA (13.0 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 5 so) in two starts last year and has now lost each of his last four starts against the Royals (14 er in 22.0 ip, 5.73 ERA)...his first loss last year came in a 4-2 decision in Oakland on Aug. 3...allowed five hits over the first four innings but was aided by two double plays and did not allow a run...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Aoki, a two-run double by Infante and a RBI single by Perez...Shields retired the first 15 A's batters and the Royals held the A's two runs on four hits...then took the loss in a 3-0 decision in Kansas City Aug. 13...surrendered three runs in seven innings of work on a two-run home run by Infante in the third inning and a Perez sacrifice fly in the fifth...Vargas shut out the A's on three hits and no walks.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (0-1, 7.27 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston last Tuesday (5.1 ip, 4 h, 4 bb, 3 so)...it was his first Major League win...has never faced the Angels in his career...went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then posted a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances with Toronto in his Major League debut in September.

2014 RECAP: Won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts... had career highs in winning percentage (.625) and opponents grounded into double plays (19) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36)...had two complete games after tallying just one in 208 starts over his first nine seasons...his starts and innings pitched (190.1) were second most in his career to his 34 starts and 206.2 innings with Tampa Bay in 2007.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for eighth in the AL in wins...also had the sixth highest run support (5.58), tied for sixth in complete games, ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.357) and tied for 10th in games started.

FIRST 15 STARTS/LAST 17 STARTS: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts and was leading the AL in ERA entering play June 24...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and went 6-7 with a 5.00 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over his final 17 starts...his ERA from June 24 through the end of the season was fourth highest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, including .227 (123-for-541) against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (48-for-176) against left-handers...yielded 14 of his 16 home runs to righties...has surrendered 31 of his 36 home runs over the last three years to righties...held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...ranked sixth in the AL among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...rank second in the AL with a .123 opponents average against the number eight hitter and a .169 average against the number two hitter...walked just seven batters to lead off an inning...yielded a .188 batting average with two outs, .261 with no or one outs...allowed a .239 batting average the first time through the lineup, .236 the second time and .240 after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 12 starts during the day compared to 10-6 with a 3.91 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 20 starts at night...surrendered just two home runs in 75.1 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 3.11 ERA (45 er in 130.1 ip) in 22 starts in day games over the last two years compared to 17-13 with a 3.97 ERA (102 er in 231.0 ip) in 41 starts in night games.

AGAINST THE WEST: Compiled a 4-4 record and a 4.71 ERA in 12 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA in 20 starts against everyone else...over the last three years, he is 9-7 with a 4.61 ERA (61 er in 119.1 ip) in 22 starts against the AL West, 18-11 with a 3.20 ERA (86 er in 242.0 ip) in 41 starts against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Posted a 1.97 ERA in the first inning, which ranked fourth in the AL...was 3-1 with a 4.45 ERA in five interleague starts...tied for fifth in interleague wins...is now 14-6 with a 4.52 ERA (75 er in 149.1 ip) in 27 career interleague starts...went 11-5 with a 4.09 ERA in 17 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 2.90 ERA in 15 starts on five days rest or more...opponents were successful in 18-of-20 (90.0%) stolen bases off him and he had just one pickoff...the stolen base percentage was second highest in the AL (Hughes, MIN 93.3%) and the stolen bases tied for seventh most...ranked sixth in the AL in fewest pitches per game (93.2) and tied for sixth in sacrifice hits allowed (5)...the A's were 21-11 (.656) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 25 of his 32 starts.

- 11 of 13 runs allowed this year have come via the home run (five solo homers, two three-run homers)...Fernando Abad and Jesse Chavez are the lone A's relievers to have not given up a home run this season.
- The seven home runs allowed by A's relievers are the most in the Majors.
- Converted their first save of the season last night after converting 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities in 2014...were the last American League team to record a save this season...the A's 31 saves in 2014 were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Have walked just eight batters this season (1.95 bb/9 ip)...walked 122 batters last season, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).

- Is on his fourth career Opening Day roster (2011-12 with Houston, 2014 with Oakland).
- Four of his first five outings this year have been scoreless.
- Was 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA in nine appearances during the spring...opponents hit .188.
- Has faced the Royals four times in his career...all four outings have been scoreless (2.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Did not allow a run in April last year (10.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 11 so).
- Appeared in his 200th career game last Friday vs. Seattle.
