OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-60) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (54-52)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games but have lost eight of the last 12 and are 7-10 since the All-Star Break...are 48-60 (.444) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, 47-60)...are in last place in the AL West and have spent 81 of the last 85 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8)...the 81 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 14-19 (.424) since then.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 40-41 (.494) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)...are batting .241 (232-for-961) against lefties compared to .253 (694-for-2739) off righties.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their 14th shutout of the season last night, which is the most in the American League and tied with San Francisco for second most in the majors (Los Angeles, 15)...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...have a 2.45 ERA (15 er in 55.0 ip) over the last six games and a 3.42 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 14 home runs in 17 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 51 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank second in innings pitched (655.2).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last five games (8 er in 31.2 ip, 2.27 ERA) and have a 3.12 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 14 home runs in 17 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 51 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank second in innings pitched (655.2).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .168 (31-for-184) with 16 runs scored over the first six games on the homestand (2.67 runs per game)...are hitting .223 (242-for-1083) with 105 runs scored over the last 33 games (3.18 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (61-for-80, 76.3%) and fewest home runs (85), third in fewest strikeouts (709) and fourth in triples (26)...rank second in the majors with 109 infield hits (Pittsburgh, 112)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games and have a Major League leading 92 for the season...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 52)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 3-3 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-1) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 24-32 (.429) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...have a 2.94 ERA (168 er in 514.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their fourth walk-off win of the season Sunday...have three walk-off wins in their last 11 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...improved to 4-6 (.400) in extra inning games with the win Sunday and have now won each of their last four extra inning games after losing each of their first six...the 10 extra

inning games are fourth most in the American League...are 11-25 (.306) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-37, .327)...are 6-12 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .333 (30-for-90) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 90) and tied for third in grand slams (NYY and SF, 6)...A's pinch hitters are batting .192 (15-for-78) but have 14 walks...lead the American League and are tied for seventh in the majors in pinch walks...are tied for second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (94)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

IN JULY: The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have split the first two games of 2015 after winning the season last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland...it was their sixth season series win in the last seven years and the A's are now 14-1-1 in season series dating back to 1999...are 89-47 (.654) over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-253 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-131 in Oakland and 128-122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 992-933 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in his past 11 games and 11.2 innings (5 h, 2 bb, 13 so)...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in hits (98) and total bases (126)...is batting .344 (56-for-163) in Oakland, which is the fifth best home batting average in the American League...**Eric Sogard** has a 52-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in **1992** Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings to break the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-7, 3.84 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with a 6.63 ERA (14 er in 19.0 ip), .313 (25-for-80) opponents batting average, four home runs and 11 walks in 19.0 innings over his last four starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average, four home runs and nine walks in 43.0 innings over his previous six starts from June 7 to July 4...the three-game losing streak is the first of his career...went 3-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first seven starts.

SECOND STINT: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-5 with a 2.94 ERA (26 er in 79.2 ip) and .261 (80-for-306) opponents batting average in 13 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and has 25 in 79.2 innings during his current stint (2.82 per nine innings).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in games started (17) and innings pitched (96.0, tied for second in wins (6) and fifth in strikeouts (63))...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-3 with a 2.97 ERA (19 er in 57.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (22 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered nine of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters...opponents are 6-for-33 (.182) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has yielded a .149 (7-for-47) batting average to the opponents number one hitter but the three hitter is batting .432 (19-for-44).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 4.63 ERA (24 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts at home...has surrendered three home runs in 49.1 innings on the road compared to nine in 46.2 innings in Oakland.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-3 with a 4.85 ERA in five starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June...ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in each of his last four starts (3 rs in 19.0 ip, 1.42 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 17 starts and is 1-7 in those games...is 5-0 in seven starts with support of three or more runs...the A's are 8-9 (.471) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 17 starts and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

STREAKS SNAPPED: Allowed four runs in 5.2 innings for the loss July 10 at Cleveland...the loss snapped the first three-game winning streak of his career (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA)...yielded a RBI double to Gomes in the fourth to snap his scoreless streak at a career and A's season high 19.0 in-nings...the game ended a six-game streak where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 10-1 A's loss to Texas **April 9** in Oakland...allowed the first two home runs of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career **April 14** at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...took the loss **April 25** against Houston to fall to 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts...was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled **May 23** and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay **May 23**...tossed six in-nings and allowed three of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston **June 7**...left the game with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed six runs in the eighth inning, with Clippard getting the blown save and loss...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth ML start, an eight-batter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 13**...did not walk a hitter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...

allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...became the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to lose a 1-0 complete game, the third in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...also took the loss in his next start **June 18** against San Diego for the first losing streak of his career...tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings for the win **June 29** against Colorado...combined with Pomeranz and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed five of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Cleveland **July 10**...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 19.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Toronto **July 21** in Oakland...allowed a career-high three home runs...extended his losing streak to a career-high three games in the A's 4-3 loss at San Francisco July 26...tossed just 1.1 innings, which is the shortest outing of his career as a starter.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss to Cleveland last Friday in Oakland...shutout the Indians on three hits and a walk over the first six innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh...retired the first two batters before Gomes single and Chisenhall doubled...Urshela then reached on a Semien error, allowing the tying run to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Aaron Brooks (1-0, 3.09 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the third of his career...was acquired from the Kansas City Royals with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland last Saturday...picked up his first Major League win in a start that night against Cleveland, a 5-1 A's victory (7.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...struck out 92 batters and ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts at the time of the trade on July 28...was also tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...has never faced the Astros in his career.

- The A's bullpen is 3-3 with three blown saves and a 3.62 ERA (22 er in 54.2 ip) in 16 games since the All-Star Break.
- Has the third highest ERA in the American League (4.11) and has yielded the fifth most home runs (36)...has the second fewest wins (11) and is tied for the third most losses (20).
- Is tied for the fewest saves in the AL (19), has the second most blown saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.9%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- Has allowed 54-of-170 (31.8%) of inherited runners to score, which is the sixth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 5-35 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 40-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in his past 11 games and 11.2 innings (5 h, 2 bb, 13 so)...has not yielded a run in 19 of his past 21 games (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .167 (8-for-48) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .242 (16-for-66) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.561 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
