OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-81) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (74-66)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 2015 – GLOBE LIFE PARK – 7:05 P.M. CDT LHP SEAN NOLIN (0-1, 4.50) VS. RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (12-9, 3.16) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last eight games and are 9-19 (.321) over the last 28 contests...have a tragic number of six for elimination in the American League West and eight for elimination from the playoffs...are 60-81 (.426) for the season, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 141 games and is the worst since 1997 (55-86)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...have finished under .500 just four times over the previous 16 seasons...are in last place in the AL West for the 50th consecutive day...have spent 118 of the last 122 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fifth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 26-40 (.394) since then.

OFFENSE: The A's did not homer last night, snapping a season-high 15 consecutive games in which they homered (21 home runs total)...matched the longest streak in the majors this year (Colorado, May 21-June 3)... however, have just 119 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...have four triples in the last 11 games and 35 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL and tied for the fourth best single season total in Oakland history...they are the most since the 1980 club also had 35...the Oakland record is 40 set in 1968...lead the AL and are third in the majors in infield hits (144)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...are batting .270 (162-for-600) with 89 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.2 runs per game)...have the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (947) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.392)...have the fewest sacrifice hits (12) and hit by pitches (28) in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 61 runs over the first nine games in September and have a 6.41 ERA (57 er in 80.0 ip) this month, which is second highest in the American League (Detroit, 6.73)...now have a 3.81 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the AL...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest home runs (134), fewest extra base hits (370) and opponents slugging percentage (.383) and fourth in opponents batting average (.246)... opponents have been successful in just 69-of-108 (63.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-16 with a 5.54 ERA (89 er in 144.2 ip) over the last 28 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 13 of those 28 contests...now have a 3.48 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have allowed 73 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 37 errors in the last 68 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 109 errors for the season, which is three more than any other team (Pittsburgh, 106) and two short of the A's season total from last year (111)...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 16-31 (.340) in one-run games...the losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Oakland record of 32 set in 1976...the winning percentage is also the worst in the majors and is currently fourth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...are tied for fifth in the majors in one-run games (47)...are 24-48 (.333) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for losses by two runs or fewer is 49 in 1968...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in

extra inning games...the 15 extra inning games are tied for second in the AL and the losses rank third.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their current 10-game road trip to Texas (0-1), Chicago-AL (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1) and have lost 12 of the last 15 road games and 18 of the last 24...are 27-39 (.409) on the road for the season, which is tied for third worst in the American League... went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1)...are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and second worst in the majors (Colorado, 31-40)...the A's have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.36 (274 er in 566.0 ip) on the road

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12-for-16 (.750) over the last 13 games, which includes an Oakland record-tying streak of six consecutive hits from Sept. 4-6 (also July 18-26, 1996)...are batting .262 (28-for-107) with 15 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits, tied for second in plate appearances (125) and third in batting average...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 8-for-12 (.667) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 17 games...are batting .347 (41-for-118) with the bases loaded, which is the best mark in the American League, third best in the majors and second best in Oakland history (.375 in 2000)...are tied for second in the AL in plate appearances (136), tied for second in grand slams (6) and rank third in RBI (109).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-19 (.174) on Friday, which is the worst mark in the majors...have set an Athletics record for most pitchers used in a season (28) and have tied the Oakland record most relievers used (21)... currently have 36 players on the active roster...are 13-26 (.333) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-25)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 20 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep (including this series)...Stephen Vogt leads the A's with 18 home runs...there have been three seasons in Oakland history where the A's did not have a player with 20 home runs (1978, 1983, 2010)...Evan Scribner and Fernando Abad are tied for the team lead with 54 games pitched...the last time the A's did not have a pitcher appear in 60 or more games in a non-strike season was in 1987 when Dennis Eckersley and Gene Nelson led the club with 54 games.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's can clinch their third season series win in the last four years with one more win as they lead 9-5 with five games remaining...are 4-3 in Oakland and 5-2 in Texas...last night's loss snapped a five-game winning streak against the Rangers, which was the A's longest against Texas since a seven-game streak from July 17-Sept. 10, 2005... have won 15 of the last 20 games in Arlington dating back to Sept. 13, 2013...are 39-32 against Texas over the last four years...are 331-339 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-161 in Oakland and 158-178 in Texas...including 91-90 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 428-421 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1964 Bob Meyer tosses a one-hitter but the A's lose to Baltimore 1-0 as the Orioles Frank Bertaina also tosses a one-hitter...in 1980 Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in 1986 Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Nolin (0-1, 4.50 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and made his A's debut with a start last Sunday against Seattle...was one of four players acquired from Toronto for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season and began the season on the Oakland disabled list as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder...was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Marte, a sacrifice fly by Seager and a wild pitch...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 14 games, including 12 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 10 games in May and June, 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts in August... walked 17 batters in 33.2 innings in May and June (4.54 per nine innings), two in 13.2 innings in August (1.32 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a mark of .167 (7-for-42) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against right-handers...allowed one double and two walks to lefties for a .190 slugging percentage and .205 on-base percentage...surrendered all five of his home runs and nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...all five of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .319 average with the bases empty compared to .125 with runners on base...opponents were 4-for-35 (.114) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-13 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .396 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.83 ERA in 10 games at night compared to 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts during the day... logged a 0.75 ERA in the first inning...Nashville was 8-4 (.667) in his 12 starting assignments...did not toss more than 5.2 innings in any of his 14 outings...allowed one run or fewer 11 times and four hits or fewer 12 times.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Was sent to Nashville on a rehab assignment from Oakland on May 5...pitched scoreless relief in his first two outings May 5 against Iowa (1.0 ip) and May 9 against Round Rock (2.0 ip)... then started and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings May 14 at Iowa and was reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Nashville the next day. tossed 4.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Sacramento, giving him a 0.71 ERA over his first five games...issued four walks in 12.2 innings over that stretch but then walked a season-high four batters in 4.0 innings May 30 against Las Vegas...finished May with no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in six games, four starts...was placed on the disabled list June 1 with a strained left groin...was reinstated June 9 and went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in four starts in June...picked up his first win of the season June 16 against Memphis when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and three walks...then yielded a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings in his next start June 21 against Omaha for his first loss...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings June 27 against Oklahoma City for his second and final win of the season...also allowed a season-high eight hits and tossed a season-high 102 pitches in that game...was placed on the minor league DL a second time July 1 with a strained left shoulder...was reinstated Aug. 15 and went 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts following his return...tossed fewer than five innings in each of those starts as he increased his pitch count from 32 on Aug. 15 to 76 in his final start on Aug. 31...struck out a season-high six batters in his final start, a no decision in a 5-1 win over Round Rock

CAREER: Pitched in one game for Toronto in each of the previous two seasons and went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA in two games, one start...is 29-19 with a 3.02 ERA (163 er in 485.2 ip) in 106 games, including 98 starts, in six seasons in the minors...has 489 strikeouts in 485.2 innings...has allowed just 34 home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...was acquired by the A's from Toronto with infielder Brett Lawrie, pitcher Kendall Graveman and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for third baseman Josh Donaldson, Nov. 28, 2014...was named the A's seventh best prospect by Baseball America following the trade after being named the Blue Jays 10th best prospect following the 2013 season...combined for a perfect 10-0 record and a 2.04 ERA in 20 games, including 18 starts, in 2012 with Single-A Dunedin and Double-A New Hampshire...was drafted three times and signed with Toronto after being selected in the sixth round of the 2010 draft.
