OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-3) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (2-4)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series in Seattle over the weekend to take over sole possession of first place in the American League West... last year, the A's had just two sweeps of a series of three or more games all year (June 2-4 at Detroit, June 23-25 at Texas)...last year, the A's had six days all alone in first, all over the first 12 games of the season...have not won more than three consecutive games since June 20-25 of last year when they won five straight...are 3-2 after five games for the second consecutive season and third time in the last four years...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

ONE-RUN GAMES: Five of the A's first seven games have been decided by one run and the A's are 3-2 in those games...lead the majors in one-run decisions and are tied with Kansas City for the most one-run wins...last year, the A's started the season 1-13 in one-run games and did not win their third one-run decision until May 28...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...lost three of four to Chicago (AL) on the first homestand and are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home...following Sunday's game against the Royals, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 contests on the road...have played 36 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...went 3-0 on the first road trip of the season to Seattle, marking the third time in the last four years the A's have swept their first road series of the season (2013 at Houston, 2014 at Minnesota).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have three two-error games this year and have committed seven errors overall, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors...the errors have led to three unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the AL...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

THIS AND THAT: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in each of the last five games (6 er in 29.2 ip, 1.82 ERA) and rank third in the American League with a 2.87 ERA (12 er in 37.2 ip) for the season...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively in three of the first seven games...A's pinch hitters are 0-for-9 with three strikeouts to start the season...the nine plate appearances are tied for second in the American League (Houston, 11).

ROSTER NOTES: Only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...Doolittle and Reddick made their Oakland debuts in 2012...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's did not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Coco Crisp was the oldest player on the A's Opening Day roster at 36 years, 155 days...the A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than

2014...eight players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt), eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth a week ago today (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpassing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 8-11 against the Angels...were 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...it marked the second consecutive season the A's lost the season series after winning each of the previous three...Oakland is 49-46 against Los Angeles since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-10 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 414-342 against the Angels...that includes 215-161 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 463-419 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chris Coghlan has started each of the A's last four games at four different positions (second base, right field, left field, third base)...last year, the A's did not have any players start at least one game at four different defensive positions the entire season...**Ryan Dull** has retired all 12 batters he's faced this season, including five via strikeout...**Sonny Gray** is 8-1 with a 1.95 ERA (17 er in 78.1 ip) in 11 career starts in the month of April...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his first four games (4.0 ip) and now has a 16-game, 15.0-inning regular season scoreless streak dating back to last year.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1993** Rickey Henderson's eighth inning home run was the 200th of his career...in **1994** Henderson collects his 231st double in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 289 doubles...in **2012** Jonny Gomes is hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning to force in the winning run in a 5-4 win over Kansas City...it is the first of 14 "walk-off" wins for the A's in 2012.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-0, 1.29 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...started the A's third game of the season last Wednesday after being scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start a week ago today due to food poisoning...tossed seven innings in his first start and now has 498.0 in his career...needs 2.0 more innings for 500...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 8-1 with a 1.95 ERA (17 er in 78.1 ip) in 11 career starts in the month...the eight wins are his most in any month and the ERA is second lowest to his 1.64 ERA in July.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 8-3 against American League West competition last year, 6-4 against everyone else...is now 20-8 with a 2.46 ERA (68 er in 248.1 ip) in 37 career games against the West compared to 14-12 with a 3.24 ERA (90 er in 249.2 ip) in 40 games against all other teams.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 24...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .311 (73-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...surrendered nine runs in his last two starts (8 er in 10.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding three in his first two (7.2 ip, 3.52 ERA)...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA and a .354 opponents batting average last spring.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-2 with a 3.18 ERA (70.2 ip, 54 h, 28 r, 25 er, 20 bb, 62 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts... is 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA (21 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) in four games at Anaheim...went 3-1 with a 3.74 ERA (33.2 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 14 er, 7 bb, 26 so) in five starts this year...the first win came in a 9-2 win at Anaheim April 22...allowed a run in the second and loaded the bases with one out in the third before retiring each of the final 14 batters he faced...also picked up the win in a 6-2 victory in Oakland April 28...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese but then blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...win number three came in an 8-1 victory at Los Angeles June 14...allowed an unearned run in the fourth inning on a Pujols RBI single...had a no decision in the A's 12-7 loss in Oakland June 19...had a 7-2 lead after six innings and allowed a RBI single to Joyce in the seventh...left with the bases loaded and no outs and the bullpen allowed all three inherited runners to score plus four more runs for the blown save and loss...then took the loss in a 9-4 decision in Oakland on Sept. 2...allowed four runs in the first inning on wild pitch, a ground out and RBI singles by Murphy and Freese...the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first inning but he allowed a two-run home run to Pujols in the second.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...the batting average and on-base percentage were seventh lowest in Oakland history and the OPS ranked eighth...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts (169), complete games (3) and walks (59).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 21-6 with a 2.37 ERA (68 er in 258.1 ip) in 39 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts were the most by a pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history (Langford, 62 in 1979) among pitchers with no errors...they were the most errorless chances by an AL pitcher since Josh Towers had 60 for Toronto in 2005...had the second most total chances among AL pitchers.

RANKINGS: Also tied for first in the AL in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games, ranked fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8), tied for fourth in wild pitches (13), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667), seventh in home runs per nine innings (0.74), tied for eighth in opponents grounded into double plays (19) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching on an error (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .217 opponents batting average included a mark of .208 (81-for-389) against left-handed hitters compared to .226 (85-for-376) against right-handers...it increased to .256 with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .146 with two strikes and .194 the first time through the lineup...held the number eight hitter in the batting order to a .139 batting average, which was the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title...yielded a .326 average to the clean-up hitter, .203 against all other spots in the order.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 14-6 with a 2.57 ERA (59 er in 206.2 ip) in 31 starts on the road over the last two years compared to 15-11 with a 3.17 ERA (80 er in 227.1 ip) in 34 starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 22 starts at night...his day ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings and is the lowest since Tim Hudson had a 1.39 ERA in 2003.

THIS AND THAT: Logged a 2-1 record and a 1.69 ERA in three interleague starts...ranked sixth in the majors in interleague ERA...was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 29-2 in 43 career starts with run support of three or more...the A's bullpen blew a save in six of his starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (0-1, 3.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 23rd of his career, all of which have come with the A's...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 6-1 A's loss to Chicago (AL) last Thursday here in Oakland (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...now has a six-game losing streak dating back to last year, which is an on-going career high...has a 5.52 ERA (27 er in 44.0 ip) and .276 (50-for-181) opponents batting average over that nine start stretch...the losing streak is the longest by an Athletic since Tyson Ross had an eight-game losing streak from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA in two career starts against Los Angeles (AL)...went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, this spring...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2).

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in six of its seven games (5 er in 26.1 ip, 1.71 ERA)...that includes five games where it has not yielded a run.
- Has walked two batters in 26.1 innings (0.68 per nine innings) and has struck out 21.
- Had a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
- Ranked last in the majors in saves (28) and save percentage (52.8%)...placed second in the AL in blown saves (25)...the save percentage was third lowest in Oakland history, the saves tied for fifth fewest in a non-strike season and were the fewest since 1982 (22) and the blown saves tied for third.
- Allowed 74 home runs, which was second most in the majors to Boston (76) and second most in Athletics history (92, 1964 Kansas City A's)...had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.428).
- Allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage in the majors.

- Appeared in four games this spring and was 0-1 with 14.73 ERA in four relief appearances.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 retroactive to March 25 after undergoing surgery on his right elbow March 29...the surgery included a debridement of the right elbow and the removal of loose bodies...was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 8.

Last Year: Had four stints with the A's and posted a 9.90 ERA in 21 relief appearances...struck out 23 in 20.0 innings but also walked 13 and allowed seven home runs...also went 3-3 with five saves and a 4.11 ERA in 31 games with Nashville.

- Has not allowed a run in his four games and 4.0 innings (5 h, 1 so).
- Had a loss in two games against the Angels in 2015 (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 ibb, 1 so)...is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in four appearances in his career.
- Did not allow a run in nine outings and 8.1 innings during the spring...opponents were 1-for-26 (.038)...however, issued six walks.
- Is in his eighth season in the majors with his sixth team (Milwaukee, St. Louis, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Colorado).
- Signed as a free agent to a two-year contract, Dec. 11, 2015.
