LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels open a 10-game road trip to **Oakland (April 11-12)**, **Minnesota (April 15-17)** and **Chicago White Sox (April 18-21)**...Halos went 2-4 on season-opening home stand vs. **Chicago Cubs** (0-2) and **Texas Rangers** (2-2).

WEAVER WINS: With his victory over the Rangers yesterday, **Jered Weaver** passed **Nolan Ryan** for sole possession of second place on the Club's all-time wins list with 139...Franchise record for wins is 165 held by **Chuck Finley**.

FROM STATS LLC: In seven career starts against A.L. West foes, **Nick Tropeano** is 4-2 with a 2.95 ERA (39.2 IP – 13 ER)...**Craig Gentry's** .349 (30/86) career clip vs. Oakland leads all MLB actives (min. 75 AB).

MINOR FEAT: **Zach Houchins**, an Angels' third base prospect, homered for a fourth consecutive game yesterday to open the season with Inland Empire (A)...He also has seven RBI in the Club's first four games of the season.

HISTORY CLASS WITH ALBERT: **Albert Pujols** drove in career RBI #1,700 on Saturday, passing **Jim Thome** (1,699) for 24th all-time...He is one RBI shy of matching **Reggie Jackson** for 23rd - 1,702 RBI)...**Pujols** is also one run away from reaching 1,600 runs for his his career- would be just 49th player in MLB history to reach plateau.

COMINGS & GOINGS: Today, the Angels recalled LHP **Greg Mahle** (sounds like 'O'Malley') and optioned RHP **A.J. Achter**. First appearance for **Mahle** will mark MLB debut...Yesterday the Halos claimed RHP **Danny Reynolds** off waivers from Houston. **Reynolds**, who returns to the Angels organization, was optioned to double-A Arkansas.

HARDWARE EVERYWHERE: During the homestand, several Angels were honored with awards from the 2015 campaign...On Thursday, **Andrelton Simmons** was presented with his **Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award**...On Friday, **Mike Trout** received his 2015 **Silver Slugger Award**...He has won the award in each of the last four seasons and joins Hall-of-Famer Mike Piazza as the only players to win a Silver Slugger in each of their first four full Major League seasons...On Saturday, **Kole Calhoun** was presented with his 2015 **RAWLINGS Gold Glove Award**...He is the first Angels player to win a Gold Glove since shortstop **Erick Aybar** in 2011.

WALK-OFF FOR WIN #1: On Thursday, Halos tallied their first win of 2016 with a two-out walk-off RBI single by **Albert Pujols** in the 9th inning...**Pujols'** 19 career walk-offs are tied for most among MLB actives since 2000 (**David Ortiz**)...Marked first time the Angels' initial victory of a season came via walk-off hit since April 3, 1996 when the Halos plated the game-winner in the 11th frame vs. Milwaukee (Gary DiSarcina 2-out RBI single).

AT OAKLAND: Angels have won eight of last 11 games, including four of last five vs. A's...LAA claimed 2015 series 11-8 (5-4 on road)...Halos have won 17 of last 24 matchups...Since 2002, **Angels** (6) or **Athletics** (5) have won 11 of 14 A.L. West crowns.

HEANEY ON DL: On Wednesday, the Angels placed LHP **Andrew Heaney** on the 15-day disabled list as the result of a flexor muscle strain...In a corresponding roster move, the Angels recalled RHP **Nick Tropeano** from Triple-A Salt Lake.

HARDWARE EVERYWHERE: During the home stand, several Angels were honored with awards from the 2015 campaign...On Thursday, **Andrelton Simmons** was presented with his **Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award**...On Friday, **Mike Trout** received his 2015 **Silver Slugger Award**...He has won the award in each of the last four seasons and joins Hall-of-Famer Mike Piazza as the only players to win a Silver Slugger in each of their first four full Major League seasons...On Saturday, **Kole Calhoun** was presented with his 2015 **RAWLINGS Gold Glove Award**...He is the first Angels player to win a Gold Glove since shortstop **Erick Aybar** in 2011.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR: The Angels roster features players from eight different countries and territories this season: United States, Cuba, Curacao, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico, South Korea and Venezuela.

NOTABLE DEBUT: **Ji-Man Choi** made his Major League debut on Tuesday night vs. Cubs, as a defensive substitute in left field in the 9th inning...**He became the first Korean-born player in Angels history.**

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** enters 2016 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (17 straight years with Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia A's) (STATS LLC)...Scioscia's current .546 (1,418-1180) winning percentage and 1,418 wins are both tops in franchise history...He ranks 24th on the all-time win list (62 victories behind **Earl Weaver** for 23rd).

FAST FACT: Just three players in Major League history have started their career with 25+ HR and 100+ runs scored in each of their first four MLB seasons (STATS LLC):
Joe DiMaggio (1936-39)
Albert Pujols (2001-04)
Mike Trout (2012-15)

WHO'S ON THIRD: **Yunel Escobar** became the Angels ninth different Opening Day starting third baseman since 2004...Escobar was acquired from the Washington Nationals on Dec. 10 in exchange for RHP **Trevor Gott**...Escobar finished the Spring with an American League leading .450 (27/60) batting average and did not strike out in his 65 plate appearances.

Is 2-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 IP – 1 ER) in two career starts vs. A’s

- SEASON DEBUT:** Tonight marks first appearance of the regular season...Began season with Triple-A Salt Lake and was recalled by Angels on April 7, before making an appearance for the Bees.
- LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in final Spring Training appearance on April 2 vs. Dodgers at Angel Stadium after tossing four innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with two walks and two strikeouts.
- VS. OAKLAND:** Has made two career starts vs. A’s and earned the win in both contests...Is 2-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 IP – 1 ER) with 16 strikeouts and two walks...Only run allowed came on solo HR by **Max Muncy**.
- CAREER HIGH K’s vs. A’s:** Set new career-high with 11 strikeouts in final start of 2015 season on Sept. 29, 2015 vs. Oakland at Angel Stadium...The 11 strikeouts tied for the most by any Angels pitcher in a game last year (**Garrett Richards** had 11 SO twice).
- AT THE COLISEUM:** Tonight marks first career appearance at the Oakland Coliseum.
- ON THE ROAD:** Made three road appearances (two starts) last year and went 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA (10.1 IP – 2 ER)...In six career road games (five starts), is 2-2 with a 4.00 ERA (27 IP – 12 ER).
- VS. A.L. WEST:** Against A.L. West foes, is 4-2 with a 2.95 ERA (39.2 IP – 13 ER)...Against all other teams, is 0-3 with a 6.75 ERA (18.2 IP – 14 ER).
- 2016 SPRING TRAINING:** In five Spring starts, went 2-0 with a 6.48 ERA (16.2 IP – 12 ER) and eight strikeouts.
- 2015 REGULAR SEASON:** Appeared in eight games (seven starts) across four separate stints with Angels and pitched to a 3-2 record with a 3.82 ERA (37.2 IP - 16 ER)...Pitched in 16 games (all starts) with Triple-A Salt Lake and went 3-6 with a 4.81 ERA (88 IP – 47 ER), while striking out 96 and walking 36.
