OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-27) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (27-18)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 25, 2016 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP ZACH NEAL (0-0, 9.00) VS. RHP HISASHI IWAKUMA (2-4, 4.39) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games after winning five of the previous six games...are a season-high tying seven games under .500 for the fourth time this year at 20-27 (.426)...that is the third worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and are a season-high tying eight games behind first place Seattle...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 13 days in fourth and three days tied for fourth...were swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) to close out the last homestand...it marked the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series in Oakland since April 26-29, 1999 against Cleveland, a span of 78 four-game series at home without being swept...the four-game losing streak was the A's fourth of four or more games this year.

IN MAY: The A's fell to 7-15 (.318) in May with the loss last night and have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 in May last year...have the second worst record in the American League in May (Minnesota, 4-17)... have a 5.96 ERA (127 er in 191.2 ip), which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.38)...have the second fewest saves in the AL (3), the second most home runs (34) and third most walks (73).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Jed Lowrie from the disabled list today, the second time this year they have reinstated a player from the DL (Valencia)...have used the DL 14 times and currently have a Major League leading 12 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9, including a season-high 13 from May 21-24, which are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least six players on the DL all year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.88 ERA (46 er in 106.2 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 10.07 ERA over their previous eight contests...now have a 4.69 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.334), are tied for second in most hit batters (19), rank third in most extra base hits (149) and highest slugging percentage (.434) and fourth in highest batting average (.266) and most walks (153).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-18 with a 6.46 ERA (112 er in 156.0 ip) over the last 30 games dating back to April 23...that includes 5-1 with a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts by Rich Hill and 2-17 with an 8.05 ERA (105 er in 117.1 ip) in 24 starts by everyone else...starts are 13-23 with a 5.09 ERA (143 er in 253.0 ip) overall...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.34)...Hill tossed 8.0 innings Monday night, snapping an Athletics record streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher dating back to Aug. 23, 2015...the A's are now 6-1 when the starter pitches at least seven innings.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .165 (40-for-242) with 19 runs scored over the last six games (3.2 runs per game) after hitting .282 with 68 runs scored (5.2 runs per game) over the previous 13 contests...have a .294 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (109) but have the third most intentional walks (9)...are tied with the Mariners for the fewest doubles (63), have the third lowest slugging percentage (.383), third fewest extra base hits (119) and fourth fewest strikeouts (325).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone errorless in back-to-back games but have 36 for the season, which is seven more than any other American League team and third most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (50).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this three-game road trip to Seattle...these three games mark the A's only road games over a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 12-12 (.500) on the road...return home following the game tonight for a six-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-4 on

the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 8-15 (.348) at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 7-15)...it is the third worst record after 23 home games in Oakland history (7-16 in 1994 and 2015)...are batting .261 (223for-853) and are averaging 4.42 runs per game (106 runs in 24 games) on the road compared to .222 (166-for-749) with an average of 3.35 runs per game (77 runs in 23 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average...have a 5.46 ERA (126 er in 207.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.91 (90 er in 207.0 ip)...have the third highest road ERA in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their first walk-off loss of the season last night...dropped to 7-3 in games decided in the last at bats...are tied with Baltimore for the second most last at bats wins in the majors to Seattle (8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...fell to 6-8 in one-run games with the loss and have now dropped five of their last six one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 2-0 in extra inning games... are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League and tied for third in most wins.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers, faced righties in 32 of 34 games from April 7-May 14 and lefties in five of six games from May 15-20...have faced righties in each of the last four games...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-22 (.405) against righties...are hitting .235 against lefties, ..245 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for seventh fewest in the majors...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 58 minutes per game, which is tied for fourth fastest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 22 (.364) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (35)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at four games each...are 4-1 in Seattle and 0-3 in Oakland...have won six of the last eight games in Seattle but have lost seven straight in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...13 of the A's last 20 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 21 of the last 29 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 48-55 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 331-262 against Seattle...that includes 179-117 in Oakland, 151-144 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-80 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting .283 (28-for-99) with 16 RBI over his last 25 games after hitting .158 with one RBI over his first 12 contests...*Khris Davis* is batting .241 (19-for-79) with nine home runs and 21 RBI in 21 games in May...leads the majors in home runs in May and ranks second in RBI...*Ryan Dull* has stranded all 16 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...*Danny Valencia* was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 19-for-57 (.333) with 10 runs, six home runs and 15 RBI in 15 games since his return...has hit safely in each of his 12 road games this year (18-for-46, .391).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** the A's win their 17th consecutive game in a 4-2 win over the Yankees at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won an American League record 20 consecutive games...in **1975** Gene Tenace connects for the 6000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in **2015** Jesse Hahn tosses a four-hit shutout against Detroit to become the first Athletic with a Memorial Day shutout since 1947.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Neal (0-0, 9.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...will be making his first Major League start...was first selected from Nashville May 11 and made his ML debut that night at Boston...was originally drafted by Florida in the 17th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft but was released by the Marlins on March 26, 2013...signed a minor league deal with the A's two days later.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: He pitched three innings of relief in the A's 13-3 loss at Boston on May 11...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 10-3...fanned Bradley, Jr. with one out in the sixth inning for his first Major League strikeout...allowed a RBI single to Betts in the sixth, retired the side in order in the seventh and surrendered a two-run home run to Bradley, Jr. in the eighth.

NASHVILLE: Went 5-1 with a 2.53 ERA in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 42.2 innings, an average of 0.84 per nine innings...had four starts with no walks, two with one walk and one with two walks...took the loss in his first start but went 5-0 with a 2.63 ERA over his final six starts...was 2-1 with a 4.22 ERA and .284 opponents batting average in four starts in April...then posted a 3-0 record and a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...issued just one walk in 21.1 May innings...allowed nine of his 16 runs in the third inning for a 7.71 ERA...had a 1.29 ERA over the first two innings and a 1.66 ERA from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .225 opponents batting average, including .176 (13-for-74) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (23-for-86) against right-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs and issued three of his four walks to right-handed hitters...had a .360 OPS against lefties, .719 against right-handers...opponents were 6-for-44 (.136) with one walk (.156 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .182 batting average with the bases empty compared to .320 with runners on...opponents hit .346 with runners in scoring position.

START BY START: Took the loss in his first start *April 10* against Oklahoma City, despite allowing just one run in 5.0 innings...picked up his first win in his second start at Oklahoma City *April 15*...allowed three unearned runs in 5.0 innings...was 1-1 with a 0.90 ERA and no walks in 10.0 innings over his first two starts...then went 1-0 with a 7.15 ERA over his next two starts...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.1 innings in his third start at Colorado Springs on *April 21* but picked up the win in a 9-8 decision...had his only no decision *April 26* against New Orleans when he had season-highs in walks (2) and strikeouts (5)...combined with Coulombe and Triggs on a five-hit 3-0 shutout at Round Rock *May 1*...tossed 7.1 innings and allowed all five of the hits...it was his only scoreless outing...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings and allowed just one run in a 2-1 win over Memphis on *May 7*, his final start before his first promotion to Oakland.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He made his only start following his May 13 option on May 16 against Fresno...was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 4-1 win...retired each of the first 10 batters before Danny Worth singled with one out in the fourth...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a lead-off home run by Matt Duffy in the seventh.

2015 RECAP: Began the year at Double-A Midland where he went 3-3 with a 6.44 ERA in seven starts...also made 21 appearances, including 20 starts, at Triple-A Nashville where he was 7-10 with a 4.18 ERA...combined to go 10-13 with a 4.67 ERA in 28 games, 27 starts, overall...walked just 35 batters, an average of 1.88 per nine innings...the 10 wins matched his career high...had career highs in innings pitched (167.2), complete games (2), losses, hits (194) and runs (97)...the 194 hits tied for sixth most in all of minor league baseball and the 167.2 innings pitched tied for eighth...led the A's farm system in innings pitched, tied for third in wins, tied for fifth in strikeouts (100) and ranked 10th in ERA...allowed a .293 opponents batting average, including .265 (71-for-268) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (123-for-393) against right-handers...opponents hit .262 with the bases emtpy, .338 with runners on ... they were 4-for-8 (.500) with two grand slams and 12 RBI with the bases loaded...went 5-0 with a 1.60 ERA over his first five starts with Nashville, 2-3 with a 4.37 ERA over his next eight games and 0-7 with a 5.72 ERA over his final eight starts.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally selected by the Florida organization in the 17th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft and was 17-14 with a 3.24 ERA in 59 games, including 46 starts, in three seasons in the Marlins farm system...was released March 26, 2013 and signed with the Oakland organization two days later...is 33-33 with a 3.92 ERA (236 er in 542.0 ip) in 90 games, including 88 starts, in four seasons in the A's farm system...is 50-47 with a 3.70 ERA (331 er in 805.2 ip) in 149 games, 134 starts, in seven seasons in the minors overall...has issued just 161 walks in 805.2 innings, an average of 1.80 per nine innings.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (1-2, 7.62 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...has a 7.62 ERA, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched...is 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA and .204 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .130 batting average...right-handers are batting .346 with all four of his home runs and six of his eight walks...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to New York (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in three starts with Nashville...was 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three seasons in the minors.
