OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-29) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (15-35)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing three in a row...are 4-7 over the last 11 games and 9-8 over the last 17 contests...are 23-29 (.442) for the season, which is tied with Houston for the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 15-35)...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and are 7½ games behind first place Texas...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and eight days tied for fourth.

IN MAY: The A's are 10-17 (.370) in May, which is tied with Chicago for the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 8-18)...with a loss today, the A's would have the sixth worst May in Oakland history and the worst since going 7-20 in 2005...have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...have a 5.77 ERA (151 er in 235.2 ip), which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 5.89)...it is currently the second highest May ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997, 5.70 in 1982, 5.69 in 2002, 5.43 in 2005)...have allowed 40 home runs, which is second most in the majors (Minnesota, 42) and one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...this marks just the second time in the last 18 years the A's have allowed at least 40 home runs in a month (48, Sept. 2015)...the offense has 55 walks, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest walks in May is 66 in 1968...the only time in Oakland history the A's walked fewer than 60 times in a month of 20 or more games was in July, 2015 when they had 43 walks in 24 games.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.91 ERA (120 er in 182.2 ip), .287 (210-for-731) opponents batting average and 32 home runs allowed over the last 21 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.71 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to Minnesota (4.96)...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.436) and third highest batting average (.267)...have issued the third most walks (167) and allowed the fourth most home runs (64).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-20 with a 6.30 ERA (129 er in 184.1 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 4-19 with a 7.75 ERA (120 er in 139.1 ip) in 28 starts by everyone else...starters are 16-25 with a 5.12 ERA (160 er in 281.1 ip) overall...the losses are tied with San Diego for the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.25) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.61).

OFFENSE: Over the last seven games, the A's have scored 24 of their 33 runs in the sixth inning or later...are batting .211 (27-for-128) in innings one through five over that stretch and .346 (37-for-106) in the sixth inning or later...are hitting .264 (217-for-823) and are averaging 4.6 runs per game (110 runs) over the last 24 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have walked three times or fewer in each of the last 11 games (18 walks total)...rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.296) and second to last in walks (117)...have the third fewest doubles (73), are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (136) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (356).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in six of their last seven games...however, have 37 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (56).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last three home games, which is one short of the longest home winning streak of the season (4, April 16-30)...are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (1-0)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 11-16 (.407) at home...are tied with Los Angeles for the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 8-15)...it is tied for the third worst record after 27 home games in Oakland history...begin an eight-game road trip to Houston (three games), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games) on Friday...went 1-2

on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .232 (204-for-878) with an average of 3.59 runs per game (97 runs in 27 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and are averaging the fourth fewest runs per game...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 (101 er in 243.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League...both extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 46 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...are 7-8 in one-run games and have dropped five of their last seven one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (6), tied for second in hits (9) and rank third in plate appearances (40)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:55)...have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are 6-5 (.545) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 17-24 (.415) against righties...are hitting .237 against lefties, .251 against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 444 games (31.7 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's won the first meeting of 2016 yesterday after losing the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...won two of three in Oakland and lost three of four in Minnesota...have won 14 of the last 17 games in the Coliseum...are 21-10 (.677) against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 294-295 against Minnesota...that includes 164-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 351-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 998-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp hit his 14th leadoff home run as an Athletic yesterday, which is second most in Oakland history (43, Rickey Henderson) and third most in Athletics history (19, Eddie Joost)...it was his 12th career home run against Minnesota, which is his most against any team...**Khris Davis** is tied for the Major League lead in May home runs (11) and ranks second in May RBI (26)...**Sean Doolittle** has not yielded a run in nine of his last 10 games (1 er in 9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)...has struck out 15 and walked just one over that span...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 20 of his inherited runners...opponents are 0-for-27 with runners in scoring position and first batters faced are 0-for-20 with two walks...**Danny Valencia** is 7-for-10 (.700) over his last three games and is now batting .351 (26-for-74) with 16 runs, seven home runs and 16 RBI in 20 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

TODAY’S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-3, 6.55 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his third stint with the A's this year...will be making his sixth start...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...returned for a second time May 11 and started and lost that day at Boston, allowing four runs on four hits in 2.2 innings...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (Sept. 24, 2011-July 23, 2013)...was optioned back to Nashville May 17.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked 14 batters while striking out just 12 in 22.0 innings (5.73 walks per nine innings)...now has 45 career walks against 49 strikeouts in 79.0 innings (5.13 walks per nine innings)...has tossed fewer than five innings in four of his five starts this year and eight of 12 starts in his career...this will be his 13th career start...his only career win as a starter came on Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego while pitching for San Francisco...has allowed a .378 (17-for-45) batting average with the bases empty compared to .245 (12-for-49) with runners on base...has yielded a .237 (9-for-38) average the first time through the lineup, .357 (20-for-56) after that.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle April 8...it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 13...allowed at least two base runners in every inning except the fourth when he retired the side in order...yielded two runs on RBI singles by Calhoun in the third and fifth innings...left trailing 2-0.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win at New York (AL) on April 19...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez in the bottom of the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...then yielded a Beltran sacrifice fly in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the sixth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the sixth inning and the scored tied 2-2.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Toronto April 24...allowed a career-high tying nine hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on a Carrera home run and three straight RBI singles by Smoak, Pillar and Barney...also surrendered a two-run home run to Bautista in the fourth and left after 4.2 innings with the A's trailing 6-1.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Boston on May 11...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the bottom of the second...Oakland tied the game with a two-run third inning but he allowed a RBI double to Young in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the third and runners on second and third, but Dull got the final out of the inning.

SURKAMP vs. MINNESOTA: Is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, all in relief in 2014...last faced the Twins on Sept. 13 at Chicago (AL)...entered the game with one out in the seventh inning and the White Sox trailing 5-4...retired the final two batters in the seventh and struck out the side in the eighth inning before allowing a leadoff single to Arcia in the ninth...was relived by Petricka, who allowed the run to score.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 Nashville win at Las Vegas a week ago today...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the second inning on a Kyle Johnson RBI single and a Dilson Herrera sacrifice fly...allowed a Gavin Cecchini RBI double in the third but the Sounds scored four times in the fourth and five times in the fifth for the win...allowed his final run on a Marc Krauss solo home run in the sixth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring...was optioned to Nashville following the game but returned to Oakland April 8 when Doubront went on the DL.

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day.

MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 (73-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (43-for-141) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs.

SPLITS: Was 7-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 18 games before the Triple-A All-Star Break, 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts after the break...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in his 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...stranded both of his inherited runners.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-for-16 (.188) with a double, three RBI, three walks and seven strikeouts as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in each of his 11 relief appearances, including two or more eight times...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

RHP Sean Manaea (1-3, 7.03 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...six of those have come at home...the seven starts will be tied for second among American League rookies...has a 7.03 ERA, which is the highest in the AL and fifth highest in the majors among all pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched...is 1-2 with a 4.19 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .130 batting average...right-handers are batting .349 with all five of his home runs and eight of his 10 walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit last Friday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville.

- The A's bullpen has a 5.90 ERA (54 er in 82.1 ip) and .272 (90-for-331) opponents batting average over its last 24 games dating back to May 4...posted a 2.46 ERA and .226 opponents average over its first 28 con-tests...now has a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-86 (17.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Has tossed 177.1 innings, which are second most in the AL (Houston, 178.0) and fifth most in the majors.
- Is 15-for-20 (75.0%) in save opportunities...the save percentage is tied for second in the AL and the saves are tied for third.
