OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-46) VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a three-game losing streak after winning six of the previous seven contests...are now 7-5 over the first 12 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 22-34 (.393) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 35-46 (.432) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the All-Star Break (1979, 1986 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 24 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

THE HALFWAY POINT: The A's played their 81st game of the season last night, which marked the halfway point of the season...the A's 35-46 record matches the sixth worst mark in Oakland history after 81 games and is the worst since the 2009 club also started the year 35-46...the offense has walked 200 times and are on pace for 400, which would be the fewest in Athletics history in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .306 on-base percentage, which would be the lowest by an A's team since 1979 (.302)...have a 4.73 ERA, which would be the A's highest since 1998 (4.81)...have 39 wild pitches and are more than halfway to the Oakland record of 72 set in 1979...have allowed 99 home runs and are on pace for 198, which would be the second highest total in Oakland history (205 in 1996)...the pitching staff has 605 strikeouts and are on pace for 1210, which would be the second highest total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014)...the defense has turned 88 double plays and is on pace for 176, which would be the second highest total in Oakland history (195 in 1996).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-8 (.385) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-2 vs. Pittsburgh)...after this three game series with the Pirates the A's will host Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 196-161 (.549) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's had their season-best streak of 10 consecutive games with a home run end last night...now have 15 home runs in the last 11 games...nine of the A's last 12 home runs and 16 of the last 25 have come with runners on base...are batting .271 (188-for-693) with 107 runs scored over the last 20 games (5.4 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.306), rank second in fewest walks (200) and fewest strikeouts (543) and fourth in fewest doubles (129).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 17 runs in 15.0 innings over the last three games (10.20 ERA) after yielding 28 runs in 74.2 innings over the previous 13 contests (2.89 ERA)...are 21-36 with a 5.12 ERA (246 er in 432.1 ip) for the season...are tied with Kansas City for the fewest innings pitched in the American League, rank second in most losses and highest ERA and tied for third in fewest wins.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.09 ERA (97 er in 171.2 ip) over the last 19 games and have a 4.73 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.273) and on-base percentage (.337) and third highest slugging percentage (.439).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone eight consecutive games without an error, which is their longest errorless streak since June 15-24, 2008 when they also had an eight-game streak...have not had a longer streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 28-Sept. 8, 2007...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (88)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco for second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 8).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this five-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-2)...went 3-6 on the last homestand and are 17-25 (.405) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game today for a seven-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Houston (four games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0) and are 18-21 (.462) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are batting .240 (331-for-1382) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and the fourth highest road batting average...have a 4.11 ERA (173 er in 379.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road.

EXTRA INNINGS AND ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's fell to 2-2 in extra inning games with the loss last night...it was their first extra inning game at home since Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL), snapping a streak of 60 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history (74, May 29, 1970-May 2, 1971)...have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-10 (.474) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-36 (.419) against righties...the 19 games against left-handed starters are fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .261 against left-handed pitchers, .251 against right-handers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played two of their three longest nine-inning games of the season in the last five days (3:53 on Tuesday, 3:43 last night) and are averaging 3:16 over the last nine games...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for the fastest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11) and rank second in hits (14) and plate appearances (63)...today's game concludes a 20-game stretch in which the A's played all of their games in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Josh Phegley on the 15-day disabled list today and now have nine players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Phegley, Sogard)...have used the disabled list 18 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 751 games (41.7 games per stint)...factoring in retroactive placements, the A's have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PIRATES: The A's have lost the first two games of 2016 and have now lost each of their last three games against the Pirates after winning each of the first 11...are 11-3 all-time against Pittsburgh, including 6-2 in Oakland and 5-1 in Pittsburgh...this is the first meeting between the two clubs since 2013 in Pittsburgh and the first meeting in Oakland since 2010.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .324 (23-for-71) with five home runs, 17 RBI and 13 runs scored over his last 18 games...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has five home runs in his last 10 games and 17 for the season, which is a career high, the most among American League shortstops and tied for second among Major League shortstops...**Danny Valencia** is batting .313, which ranks ninth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1983** Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits three home runs but its Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in **1994** Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston.

TODAY’S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-3, 2.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...this will be his fourth start in an interleague game and his fourth start during the day...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Overton became the 47th)...is the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...took the loss in each of his first three starts to become just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays).

STRIKEOUTS: Has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched in two of his first four starts and has 26 strikeouts in 25.2 innings...since 1913, his 26 strikeouts are second most by an A's pitcher over the first four games of his career to Tim Hudson (28 in 1999)...Hudson has the most after five games with 33.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued seven of his nine walks to left-handed hitters...opponents are 5-for-26 (.192) with one walk (.222 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .167 (11-for-66) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .345 (10-for-29) after that...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-12 (.083).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-2 with a 3.26 ERA (7 er in 19.1 ip) in three interleague starts...took the loss in his only start against an American League team, allowing one run in 6.1 innings (1.42 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Received eight runs of support in his last start after receiving two total runs of support over his first three starts...has not allowed a run in the first, second, fourth or sixth innings...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which at the time tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas June 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth.

THIRD START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22 in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...Flores scored on a Rivera sacrifice and Gennett added a two-run home run...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-1.

LAST START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco last Monday...retired each of the first 13 batters before allowing a one-out single to Pagan in the fifth inning...shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...loaded the bases with no outs before Stratton grounded into a double play to score a run...was relieved by Rodriguez who allowed a run to score on a wild pitch.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 against right-handed hitters compared to .182 against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .077 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: The RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...tossed at least five innings in each of his 11 starts, including seven or more four times...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...did not allow a run in the first or second inning...had a 0.41 ERA over the first four innings of a game and a 2.59 ERA from the fifth inning on.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters allowed just two hits in 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start April 9 at Arkansas...ended up with a no decision in a 4-1 win...posted an identical line in his next start April 15 against Arkansas but had another no decision in a 1-0 win...matched his season high in strikeouts in his final Double-A start, a 2-0 win at Corpus Christi April 26...did not allow a run in either of his first two starts at Nashville after not allowing a run in three of his four starts with Midland...was 3-0 over that season-opening six-start stretch and allowed just two earned runs in 36.0 ip for a 0.50 ERA...capped that streak by fanning a season-high tying eight in a season-high 7.0 innings May 8 against Memphis, but had a no decision in a 3-2 win...extended his scoreless streak to 24.0 innings before allowing a run in the seventh inning May 13 at Iowa...was charged with his only loss in his final start on June 5 at Omaha, a 6-4 Sounds loss.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-6, 4.84 ERA): Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his last eight starts and is 2-1 with a 3.98 ERA over that span...went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA in four starts in between...has won each of his last two decisions, which marks just the third time he has put together back-to-back wins in his career...his longest winning streak is three games... has allowed two home runs over his last eight starts (43.0 ip) after surrendering 10 long balls over his first seven starts (37.0 ip)...his season run support average of 3.83 is ninth lowest in the AL among pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...had a no decision in his last start, a 13-11 A's win at San Francisco on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Minnesota, a start earlier this year in the A's 3-2 win in Oakland on May 30 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so).

- Has tossed 284.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 29-of-135 (21.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.1%).
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (30), fourth in walks per nine innings (2.88) and tied for fourth in fewest losses (10)...is tied for fourth in most home runs allowed (35).
