

# 2006 A's TEAM NOTES

**A's IN POST SEASON PLAY:** The A's return to post season play for the fifth time in the last seven years...this is the fourth American League West Championship over that span (2000, 02, 03, 06) and the A's also reached the postseason as the AL Wild Card (2001)...this is the A's 14th AL West Championship, which is the third most division championships in baseball behind Atlanta (16) and the New York Yankees (15)...the A's will be making their 23rd post season appearance which includes 15 with Oakland and eight with Philadelphia...only the Yankees (46) and the Dodgers (24) have made more appearances in postseason play...the A's have an all-time record of 75-65 (.536) in the postseason...this will be the A's sixth appearance in the American League Division Series as Oakland swept Kansas City 3-0 in 1981 and lost 3-2 in 2000 and 2001 to New York, 2002 to Minnesota and 2003 to Boston...the A's have lost each of their last nine potential postseason clinching games...that includes three games in 2003 against Boston, two against Minnesota in 2002, three against New York in 2001 and one against the Yankees in 2000...the A's have lost each of their last six post season series which includes the four Division Series from 2000-03, the 1992 ALCS against Toronto and the 1990 World Series against Cincinnati...last won a post season series against Boston in the 1990 ALCS...the A's have won 14 American League West Division Titles, 6 American League Pennants and 4 World Championships in the first 39 seasons in Oakland...have won nine World Championships (five in Philadelphia, four in Oakland), a total surpassed only by the Yankees 26...the A's also have 15 American League Championships (nine in Philadelphia, six in Oakland).

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have nine players under contract for the 2007 season as of October 1...the players and the years they are signed through are: Eric Chavez (2010, club option 2011), Bobby Crosby (2009), Mark Ellis (2007, club option 2008), Rich Harden (2008, club option 2009), Dan Haren (2009, club option 2010), Jason Kendall (2007), Mark Kotsay (2008), Esteban Loaiza (2008, club option 2009) and Jay Witasick (2007, club option 2008)...four players on the current roster will be eligible for free agency following the season (Payton, Sauerbeck, Thomas and Zito), 10 will be eligible for arbitration (Bocachica, Bradley, Calero, Duchscherer, Jimenez, Kennedy, Kieley, Melhuse, Saarloos, Scutaro) and one other may be arbitration eligible (Perez, 2 years, 130 days).

**2006 RECAP:** The A's went 93-69 in 2006 and won their fourth American League West Division Championship in the last seven years...finished four games ahead of second place Los Angeles and each of the A's last four division titles have been won by four games or less...had the fourth best record in the AL and the fifth best mark in the Majors...won 90 games for the sixth

time in the last seven years and the 15<sup>th</sup> time in Oakland history...now have eight consecutive seasons with a winning record...only the New York Yankees (14) and Boston (9) have longer active streaks with a winning record...this is the third time in franchise history the A's have put together at least eight straight winning seasons...the Philadelphia A's had nine straight winning seasons from 1925-33 and the Oakland A's finished with a winning record in each of their first nine seasons in Oakland (1968-76)...the A's are now 751-544 (.580) over the last eight years, which is the second best record in the American League to New York (777-515, .601) and third best in the Majors behind Atlanta (751-544, .580)...the 751 wins are the A's third most over an eight-year span...the Philadelphia A's won 767 games from 1925-32 and 758 games from 1926-33...the A's spent 128 days in first place in 2006 (102 alone in first, 26 tied for first), which were the A's most days in first place since 1992 when they had 136...spent 108 of the final 109 days of the season in first starting on June 15...the one exception was on July 28 when they trailed Los Angeles by ½ game...then spent each of the final 65 days in sole possession of first, which were the A's most consecutive days in first since the final 88 days of the 1990 season...also spent 40 days in second, seven days tied for second and seven days in third...hovered between three games over .500 and three-game under .500 over the first month and a half of the season and had a one-game lead in the West with a 22-19 record on May 19...then lost a season high seven consecutive games from May 20-26 and lost 10 of 11 through May 30...that dropped the A's a season low six games under .500 at 23-29 and they were a season high five games out of first place...on May 31, Joe Blanton tossed a five-hit shutout and Jason Kendall hit his first home run since 2004 as the A's defeated Kansas City, 7-0...that started a season ending stretch where the A's went 70-40 (.636)...only Minnesota (73-38, .658) had a better record over that span...had a season best 10-game winning streak from June 8 to 18 and took over first place during the streak with a 9-6 win over Seattle on June 15...were 38-31 entering play on June 19 and had a ½ game lead over Texas...then went 7-12 over the final 19 games before the All-Star Break but lost just ½ game in the standings as the Rangers went 7-11, putting the A's and Rangers in a first place tie at the break with 45-43 records...went 6-6 over the first 12 games after the break, which put the A's at 51-49 on July 25 and in a tie for first in the West with Los Angeles...then went 42-20 (.677) over their final 62 games beginning on July 26, which was the best record in the Majors over that span (Los Angeles-NL, 41-20, .672)...had their largest lead of the season on September 1 when they led by 8½ games...that was the A's largest lead since September 25, 1992 when they also led by 8½ games...clinched the West on September 26 at Seattle in game number 157 when they defeated the Mariners 12-3 as the Angels lost to Texas, 5-2...that marked the earliest the A's clinched a division title since 1992 when they clinched it on an off day between games 156 and 157.

**AFTER THE BREAK:** The A's had the best record in the Majors after the All-Star Break as they posted a 48-26 (.649) record...Minnesota was second best with a mark of 49-27 (.645)...this marked the third time in the last six years the A's had the best post-break record in the Majors (also 2001 and 2002)...it was Oakland's fifth best record ever after the break...the A's are now 376-217 (.634) after the break since 1999, which is the best record in the Majors ahead of the Yankees (365-234, .609)...have not finished worse than ninth in record after the break since 1999...the A's batted .279 and averaged 5.3 runs per game after the break after hitting .243 while averaging 4.3 runs before the break...were last in the Majors in batting before the break and had the second fewest runs scored (380)...ranked fifth in the ML in runs scored (391) and in batting after the break...went into the break with a winning record (45-43) for the seventh consecutive year...that tied for first in the West with Texas, marking the first time the A's were in first place at the break since 1990.

**SLOW STARTS:** The A's continued their recent trend of getting off to a slow start before coming back to finish the season strong...this year, the A's posted a combined record of 24-29 (.453) in April and May but went 69-40 (.633) from June 1 until the end of the season...had the second best record in the Majors beginning on June 1 to Minnesota (72-38, .655)...since 1999, the A's have a combined record of 205-211 (.493) in April and May but are 546-333 (.621) from June 1 until the end of the season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's used the Disabled List 15 times this year, which was the most times they have used the DL since 1997 when they used it 21 times...the players on the DL combined to missed 561 games, which are the most games missed by A's players on the DL since 1999 when 12 players combined to miss 566 games...had seven players on the DL at once from May 31 to June 3 and on June 5...four players had two stints on the DL (Bradley, Crosby, Harden and Witasick)...Rich Harden spent the most time on the DL, missing 128 games in his two stints...had two members of the starting rotation on the DL from April 29 to June 3 and June 5 to 7 (Harden and Loaiza) and three members of the Opening Day bullpen on the DL from May 11 to June 5 (Duchscherer, Kennedy and Witasick)...two members of the Opening Day bullpen (Halsey and Saarloos) temporarily moved into the starting rotation, leaving the A's with just two of their original relievers (Calero and Street) from May 11 to June 5.

**DEPTH AND VERSATILITY:** With injuries at nearly every position, many A's players appeared at several positions...with Milton Bradley on the DL twice and Mark Kotsay missing games late in the season with back problems, the A's had five different players start at least 60 games in outfield for the first time in Oakland history (Payton 136, Kotsay 116, Bradley 94, Swisher 71, Kielty 67)...Jay Payton started at least 40 games at all three outfield positions (51 in left, 44 in center, 41 in right) and is the only Major Leaguer since 1957 to start at least 40 games at all three outfield positions (source: Dave Smith, Retrosheet)...only two other players over that span started at least 40 games at any three positions: Joe Carter for Toronto in 1997 (64 at DH, 42 at first, 41 in left) and Richie Zisk for Texas in 1978 (49 at DH, 47 in left, 42 in right)...Nick Swisher started 80 games at first base and 71 in left field to become the first player in Oakland history to start at least 70 games at two different positions...he is the first Major Leaguer to do that since Carlos Baerga started 77 games at third base and 73 at second base for Cleveland in 1991...Dan Johnson made most of the A's other starts at first base (77), giving the A's two first basemen with 70 or more starts for the first time in Oakland history...the A's had nine relievers appear in 20 or more games to set an Oakland record (Calero 70, Street 69, Gaudin 55, Duchscherer 53, Halsey 45, Kennedy 39, Flores 25, Sauerbeck 22, Witasick 20)...the A's used nine starting pitchers for the first time since 2003...Kirk Saarloos made 16 starts and 19 relief appearances and is just the second Oakland pitcher since 1985 make at least 15 starts and 15 relief appearances in one season, joining Doug Johns in 1996 (23 starts, 17 relief appearances).

**OFFENSE:** The A's ranked second to last in the American League with a .260 batting average, a .412 slugging percentage and a .243 average with runners in scoring position...scored 771 runs, which ranked ninth in the AL...ranked second in the AL and in the Majors with 650 walks (Boston, 672)...tied the all-time Athletics record and led the Major Leagues with 170 grounded into double plays...broke the previous Oakland record of 163 set in 1989 and tied the mark set by the Philadelphia A's in 1950...it tied for the fifth highest GDP total in the Majors since 1939...had 266 doubles, which tied Seattle for the fewest in the Majors and were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1993 (260)...ranked second to last in the AL with 463 extra base hits...stole 61 bases, marking just the second time over the last seven years the A's swiped 50 or more bases (68 in 2001)...were shutout 11 times, which tied for third most in the AL...were held to one-hit three times, marking the second time in Oakland history the A's have been one-hit three times in a season (1979)...prior to this year, the A's had not been one-hit since 1998...were second in the AL in pitches per plate appearance (3.87).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's set a franchise record for fewest errors in a non-strike season as they committed just 84 errors...that broke the previous mark of 87 set in 1990...tied for the second fewest errors in the American League and tied for the third fewest in the Majors...ranked second in the AL with a .986 fielding percentage, tying the franchise record set in 1990 and matched in 2004 and 2005...ranked fourth in the AL with 173 double plays, which was the A's most in a season since 1996 (195)...had just 1626 assists, which was the fewest in a non-strike season since 1993 when they had 1625...had a season best seven game errorless streak from May 31 to June 7...had a 64-37 record when going errorless and were 29-32 when making one or more errors.

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 4.21 ERA, which ranked fourth in the American League for the second consecutive season...that was the highest ERA by an A's pitching staff since 2000 (4.58)...the A's have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in each of the last eight seasons...now have a 3.83 ERA since 2001, which is the lowest in the Majors over that span (Atlanta, 3.86)...allowed a .272 opponents batting average, which was eighth in the AL and the highest by an A's staff since 2000 (.274)...allowed 162 home runs, which tied for third fewest in the AL...tied for fourth in the AL with five complete games but that was the second lowest total in franchise history (2 in 1997)...had 1003 strikeouts, which tied for ninth in the AL, but marked the sixth consecutive season A's pitchers fanned at least 1000...tied for third in the AL with 13 pickoffs...had the fewest unearned runs in the AL (48).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers were 68-54 with a 4.50 ERA...ranked fourth in the American League in ERA and allowed a .279 opponents batting average, which ranked eighth...had the fourth most walks in the AL (340) and the second most intentional walks (22)...allowed 125 home runs, which was eighth most in the AL and the most by A's starters since 1998 (136)...had the second highest average of pitches per game in the AL (98.6)...used nine starting pitchers for the first time since 2003.

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen had a Major League leading 54 saves...those were the fifth most saves in Oakland history and were the most since 1992 when they had 58...was 25-15 with a 3.60 ERA and a .255 opponents batting average...ranked third in the American League in ERA and were eighth in opponents batting...converted 54 of 74 (73.0%)

save opportunities, which was the fifth best percentage in the AL...the A's were 9-10 in games in which the bullpen blew a save...allowed just 37 home runs, which was the fewest in the Majors...first batters faced hit .224 (92 for 410) with 29 walks for a .279 on-base percentage...the batting average and on-base percentage were the lowest marks in the Majors...allowed 74 of 259 (28.6%) inherited runners to score, which was the third lowest percentage in the AL...had five relievers save at least two games, which was the most since 1997 when they had six...had nine relievers appear in 20 or more games, which sets an Oakland record.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's went 12-12 in April for the second consecutive season...it was the fourth time in the last five years the A's have finished .500 or better in April...hit just .232 in April, the lowest A's batting average in a full month since batting .216 in June, 1982...then went 12-17 in May...were 18-8 in June, tying for the fourth best record in the American League in the month...it was the A's fifth straight season with a winning record in June and the A's are 90-45 (.667) in June since 2002, which is the best record in the Majors...ranked last in the AL with a .254 average in June...went 14-13 in July, the sixth consecutive season with a winning record in that month...were second to last in batting in July (.247)...went 21-6 (.778) in August, which was the best record in the Majors...since 1957, it was the second best record in August by any ML team to the A's 24-4 (.857) in 2002...it marked the fifth time in the last six years the A's have won 20 games in August...the exception was last year when they went 17-11...have a 124-45 (.734) record in August since 2001, which is 21 games better than any other team...it marked the 14<sup>th</sup> time in Oakland history the A's have won 20 games in a month and eight of those months have come since September of 2000...the A's led the Majors with a 3.25 ERA this August...then went 15-13 in September after going 23-33 (.411) in September over the previous two seasons.

**AT HOME:** The A's went 49-32 (.605) at home, which tied for the fourth best home record in the American League...finished with a winning record at home for the eighth consecutive season...started the season by going 24-24 at home but then went 25-8 (.758) from July 26 until the end of the season...are now 409-239 (.631) at home since 1999, which is the best home record in the Majors...won 14 home series, lost 11 and split two...went 6-0 on the homestand against Seattle and the Los Angeles Dodgers from June 13 to 18...it was the ninth undefeated homestand of six or more games in Oakland history, the seventh in the last six years...had a 10-game home winning streak from August 11 to September 1, which tied for the third longest home winning streak in Oakland history...hit .259 at home and .261 on the road...compiled a 3.96 ERA in Oakland compared to 4.47 on the road.

**ON THE ROAD:** The A's went 44-37 (.543) on the road, which tied for the third best road record in the American League...it was the A's best road record since they went 49-32 in 2002...started the year 13-16 on the road and then went 31-21 beginning on June 8...won 15 road series, lost 10 and split one...had a season best six-game road winning streak from April 26 to May 9...followed that by losing nine of the next 10 road games from May 10 to 26, including a season long five-game losing streak from May 22 to 26.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's were 32-22 in one-run games...led the Major League in one-run wins and the 54 one-run games tied for second most to Pittsburgh (55)...the 32 one-run wins tied for second most in Athletics history...the record of 33 was set in 2004...the 54 one-run decisions were the most by an A's team since 1976 when they went 27-32...won 24 of their last 32 one-run games after los-

ing 14 of the first 22...had 48 come from behind victories, which was third most in the Major Leagues behind Minnesota (52) and the New York Yankees (49)...tied an Oakland record on August 21 at Toronto for the biggest come-from-behind victory...trailing 8-0 entering the third inning and won 12-10...also came back from an 8-0 deficit on June 18, 1993 to defeat Kansas City, 10-9...overcame a deficit of three or more runs 15 times and were 10-5 in those games...lost a lead of three or more runs 12 times and were 5-7 in those games...had a 7-0 lead at Texas on May 25 going into the bottom of the sixth inning and lost 8-7...that equaled the second largest lead surrendered in an Oakland loss...went 9-4 in extra inning games and had the second most extra inning wins in the American League...are now 41-19 (.683) in extra inning affairs since 2003, including 25-8 (.758) in Oakland...were 30-20 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, 16-14 in games decided in the last at bat and had seven "walk-off" wins.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters were 8 for 52 (.154) with a home run, eight RBI, seven walks and 15 strikeouts...the batting average was the third lowest mark in the American League and it was the third lowest in Oakland history (.141 in 1994, .153 in 1973)...the eight pinch hits were the A's fewest ever in a season, breaking the previous mark of 11 in 2005 and 1994...the eight pinch RBI matched the A's fewest in a non-strike season (2005)...the lone pinch hit home run came on August 28 against Boston by Adam Melhuse...it was the A's first pinch homer since July 21, 2004 by Scott Hatteberg at Seattle...had just 62 pinch plate appearances which was second fewest in Oakland history (55 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters started the season 0 for 23 and then went 8 for their last 29 (.276)...Doug Clark's pinch hit single on June 28 at San Diego snapped a 0 for 33 streak by A's pinch hitters dating back to September 19, 2005 against Minnesota (Marco Scutaro)...the A's now have a .169 (39 for 231) batting average in the pinch over the last three seasons.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters batted .259 (145 for 559) with 41 home runs and 123 RBI...the home runs were fourth most in the American League and set an Oakland record, breaking the mark of 40 set in 1999...the RBI ranked third in the AL and was second most in Oakland history (125 in 1999)...ranked eighth in the AL in batting and had the fewest doubles (15).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's finished interleague play with an 8-10 record, marking just the second time in 10 interleague seasons that they finished under .500...went 7-9 in the first year of interleague play in 1997...the A's batted just .213 against the National League this year, which was the second lowest mark ever in interleague play to Toronto's .208 in 1997...hit six home runs, which tied for second fewest ever to the Yankees four in 1997...scored 58 runs, which tied for second fewest this year...the A's have the second best all-time record in interleague play with a mark of 103-73 (.585), trailing the Yankees who are 103-71 (.592)...are 29-27 against San Francisco and 74-46 (.617) against the rest of the National League.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's were 40-21 (.656) in day games compared to 53-48 (.525) at night...had the best record during day games in the American League and the second best in the Majors to St. Louis (37-19, .661)...were 79-24 when scoring four or more runs and 14-45 when scoring less than four...were 64-37 when committing no errors and 29-32 when making one or more...were 46-12 when the starter pitched seven or more innings and 47-57 in other games...went 34-23 (.596) against AL West teams, the best record against the West in the AL...it was the A's best winning percentage against the West in a non-strike season since 1992 (54-24, .692)...went 29-15 (.659) against the AL East, which was the best record against the East among AL Teams...were 17-2 against Seattle, setting an Oakland record for most wins against one team in a season...topped the previous mark of 16-2 against Chicago in 1970...it was the most wins by the A's against one team since the Philadelphia A's went 17-5 against Detroit in 1952...had their worst record against Minnesota (4-6)...the A's were 23-18 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the 41 games against left-handed starters were the fewest in the AL (Seattle, 43).

**STREAKING:** The A's had a 10-game winning streak from June 8 to 18, which matched the fifth longest winning streak in Oakland history...this marks the seventh consecutive season the A's have had a winning streak of eight or more games...there have been 22 winning streaks of eight or more games in Oakland history, including 12 in the last seven years...had a 15-game winning streak against Seattle from April 7 to August 16, which tied for the second longest winning streak against one team in Athletics history...the record is 16 against New York from September 9, 1989 to May 1, 1991...had a 12-game winning streak at Kansas City's Kauffman Stadium from May 31, 2003 to April 30, 2006...it was the longest winning streak at a road ballpark in franchise history, topping the 10-game streak at the original Comiskey Park from May 22, 1970 to April 16, 1971...had a 10-game home winning streak from August 11 to September 1, which tied for the third longest home winning streak in Oakland history.

**ATTENDANCE:** The A's drew 1,976,625 fans to McAfee Coliseum in 2006, snapping a streak of five consecutive seasons over two million...it was the A's lowest attendance since 2000 (1,728,886)...ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the American League in attendance...had 13 sellouts.

**POST SEASON EXPERIENCE:** The A's roster at the end of the regular season included just two players who played for the A's in each of their four post season appearances from 2000-03 (Chavez and Zito)...only three other players have appeared in a post season game in an Oakland uniform (Ellis, 2002-03; Harden, 2003; Melhuse 2003)...a total of 14 of the 33 players on the A's roster have post season experience...two have made four post season appearances (Chavez, Zito), four have two years of experience (Ellis, Loaiza, Thomas, Witasick) and eight have made one post season appearance (Bradley, Calero, Harden, Haren, Kielty, Melhuse, Payton, Sauerbeck)...eight of those 14 players have appeared in the League Championship Series (Calero, Haren, Kielty, Loaiza, Payton, Sauerbeck, Thomas, Witasick)...four have appeared in the World Series, including Kiko Calero and Dan Haren with St. Louis in 2004, Jay Payton with the Mets in 2000 and Jay Witasick with the Yankees in 2001 and San Francisco in 2002...19 of the 33 players have never appeared in a post season game (Blanton, Bocachica, Brown, Crosby, Duchscherer, Flores, Gaudin, Halsey, Jimenez, Johnson, Kendall, Kennedy, Kotsay, Perez, Saarloos, Scutaro, Sweet, Swisher, Windsor)...Jason Kendall ended the 2006 season with 1545 career games played, which were third most among active players who had never appeared in a post season game...Mark Kotsay had 1284 games, which were seventh most.

# 2006 A's CHRONOLOGY

## April 3

New York 15 @ A's 2  
(0-1, t-2nd, -1)

The A's set a franchise record for runs allowed and margin of defeat on Opening Day in a 15-2 loss to New York. Barry Zito makes his second consecutive Opening Day start for the A's and allows seven runs in the second inning to take the loss. Zito allows four hits and walks four and pitches just 1.1 innings, the shortest outing of his career. Frank Thomas homers in his first at bat as an Athletic in the bottom of the second inning and Jason Kendall adds a sacrifice fly in the ninth inning for the A's scoring. Kirk Saarloos follows Zito and allows five runs on seven hits in 3.1 innings, Brad Halsey allows a run in 1.1 innings and Jay Witasick allows two runs in two innings before Kiko Calero pitches a scoreless ninth inning.

## April 4

New York 3 @ A's 4  
(1-1, t-1st, —)

Marco Scutaro has his seventh game-ending plate appearance in three seasons with the A's as his RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning gives the A's a 4-3 win over New York. The Yankees score a run in the third inning off Rich Harden but Nick Swisher homers in the bottom of the third to tie the game. Mark Kotsay adds a RBI single later in the inning to put the A's ahead but Harden allows another run in the fourth inning and one in the sixth to make the score 3-2. Eric Chavez homers in the bottom of the sixth to tie the game and Justin Duchscherec (1.1 ip), Joe Kennedy (1.0 ip) and Huston Street (1.0 ip) pitch scoreless relief. Milton Bradley leads off the ninth inning with a walk and after a Jason Kendall sacrifice and an intentional walk to Swisher, he scores on Scutaro's single.

## April 5

New York 4 @ A's 9  
(2-1, t-1st, —)

The A's overcome a four-run deficit to defeat New York, 9-4. The Yankees score once in the second and three times in the third off Dan Haren to take a 4-0 lead but the A's start their comeback with a three-run fourth inning. Milton Bradley opens the scoring with a two-run single and Dan Johnson scores on a Jason Kendall fielders choice. Bradley then walks with the bases loaded in the fifth inning to tie the game. The A's put the game away with a five-run eighth inning and Bradley scores the winning run after tripling to start the inning and then scoring on an error. Marco Scutaro adds a RBI single and Frank Thomas hits a three-run double to complete the A's scoring. Joe Kennedy retires all four hitters that he faces in relief to pick up the win.

## April 6

A's 2 @ Seattle 6  
(2-2, 2nd, -1)

The A's lose their first road game of the season, 6-2 at Seattle. Marco Scutaro triples to lead off the game and scores on a Mark Kotsay ground out as the A's score first for the first time in 2006. Esteban Loaiza then allows three runs in the second, another in the third and one more in the fifth. He takes the loss, the 100<sup>th</sup> of his career, allowing five runs on nine hits and three walks in 4.2 innings. Brad Halsey allows a run in the sixth inning but Kiko Calero (1.1 ip) and Jay Witasick (1.0 ip) shutout the Mariners the rest of the way. Eric Chavez homers in the sixth inning to complete the A's scoring. It is his 192<sup>nd</sup> home run, which ties him with Sal Bando for fourth most in Oakland history.

## April 7

A's 5 @ Seattle 0  
(3-2, t-1st, —)

Joe Blanton tosses eight shutout innings and allows just two hits as the A's record their first shutout of the season with a 5-0 win at Seattle. Blanton allows a third inning single to Jeremy Reed, a fourth inning single to Raul Ibanez and an eighth inning walk to Esteban Beltre but two are erased on a double play and Blanton faces just one batter over the minimum. Blanton strikes out six and Justin Duchscherec retires the side in order in the ninth inning to preserve the two-hit shutout. Mark Kotsay has a RBI double in the fifth inning to give the A's the lead and Nick Swisher adds a RBI single in the sixth to make the score 2-0. The A's add three more runs in the eighth inning on a two-run triple by Marco Scutaro and a RBI single by Kotsay.

## April 8

A's 3 @ Seattle 0  
(4-2, 1st, +1/2)

Barry Zito combines with three A's relievers on a one-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle. The one-hit shutout comes after a two-hit shutout the night before as the A's set an Oakland record for fewest hits allowed in consecutive games. Zito retires the side in order in the first inning before Richie Sexson doubles to lead off the second for the Mariners only hit. He then retires 11 in a row and 15 of the last 17 hitters he faces with the only exception being back-to-back hit by pitches in the fifth inning. Mark Kotsay homers to lead off the fourth inning to give the A's the lead and Eric Chavez adds a RBI single later in the inning. Kotsay triples and scores on a Marco Scutaro ground out in the sixth inning for the A's other run. Kiko Calero (1.1 ip), Joe Kennedy (0.2 ip) and Huston Street (1.0 ip) complete the shutout and Street picks up the A's first save of the season.

## April 9

A's 6 @ Seattle 4  
(5-2, 1st, +1 1/2)

Rich Harden retires each of the first 14 hitters and the A's pitching staff extends their scoreless streak to 27 innings as the A's take three of four from Seattle with a 6-4 victory. Harden has a perfect game before Adrian Beltre singles with two outs in the fifth inning and he takes a two-hit shutout into the eighth inning. He picks up the win, allowing one run on three hits and a walk while striking out eight in seven-plus innings. Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the third inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead and Oakland adds three more in the fifth inning on an Ellis RBI double, an error and an Eric Chavez sacrifice fly. Chavez completes the scoring with a two-run home run in the seventh. Kirk Saarloos allows three runs in the ninth inning before Huston Street gets the final out for his second save in as many days.

## April 11

A's 6 @ Minnesota 7  
(5-3, t-1st, —)

The A's take a 4-0 lead in the Twins home opener but Dan Haren allows six runs in the bottom of the third inning in a 7-6 loss to Minnesota. Haren pitches six innings and allows seven runs on nine hits and a walk for the loss. Eric Chavez homers to lead off the second inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead and Nick Swisher has a two-run double later in the inning. Bobby Crosby homers to start the third to make the score 4-0 but the Twins build a 7-4 lead after five innings. Chavez hits

his second home run of the game in the eighth inning, a two-run shot to make the score 7-6. It is Chavez' 15<sup>th</sup> career multi-homer game. Brad Halsey (0.1 ip), Kirk Saarloos (1.1 ip) and Kiko Calero (0.1 ip) pitch scoreless relief.

## April 12

A's 5 @ Minnesota 6  
(5-4, t-1st, —)

Nick Swisher has the A's second consecutive two-homer games but the A's lose to Minnesota, 6-5. Swisher has a two-run double in the second inning and Adam Melhuse adds a RBI single later in the inning to give the A's a 3-0 lead but the Twins come back with a run in the bottom of the second and three in the third to take a 4-3 lead. Swisher leads off the fourth inning with a home run to tie the game but the Twins come back with a run in the bottom of the fourth and one more in the fifth to take the lead for good. Swisher homers again in the sixth inning and finishes with three hits and four RBI. Esteban Loaiza starts for the A's and takes the loss, allowing six runs on eight hits and four walks in four innings. Brad Halsey (1.2 ip), Kiko Calero (0.2 ip), Joe Kennedy (0. ip) and Justin Duchscherec (1.0 ip) pitch scoreless relief.

## April 13

A's 2 @ Minnesota 8  
(5-5, t-2nd, -1/2)

The A's are swept in the three-game series at Minnesota as Oakland takes a 2-0 lead before losing 8-2. Frank Thomas has a two-run double in the first inning but the A's are shutout on five hits and a walk over the final eight innings by Kyle Lohse, Francisco Liriano and Matt Guerrier. Joe Blanton allows three runs in both the first and fifth innings and another run in the sixth inning and takes the loss. He allows seven runs on a career high 11 hits and two walks in six innings. Jay Witasick pitches the final two innings and allows one run.

## April 14

Texas 6 @ A's 3  
(5-6, t-2nd, -1/2)

The A's lose their fourth straight as they open the homestand with a 6-3 loss to Texas. Barry Zito allows two runs in the second inning and three more in the fourth to give the Rangers a 5-0 lead. He takes the loss, allowing five runs on six hits and two walks in seven innings. Frank Thomas hits his 450<sup>th</sup> career home run to lead off the fifth inning for the A's first run of the game and Dan Johnson snaps a season opening 0 for 27 streak with a RBI single later in the inning to make the score 5-2. Brad Halsey pitches a scoreless eighth inning before Huston Street allows a run in the ninth inning. Milton Bradley hits his first home run as an Athletic, a solo shot in the bottom of the ninth inning, to complete the A's scoring.

## April 15

Texas 4 @ A's 5  
(6-6, t-1st, —)

The A's hit three consecutive home runs on three pitches in the sixth inning to defeat Texas, 5-4. Rich Harden allows a run in the second inning but Nick Swisher hits a two-run home run in the fifth inning to give the A's a 2-0 lead. Zito allows his only run in the bottom of the fifth and allows just one run on four hits in six innings. After Kiko Calero pitches a scoreless seventh inning, the White Sox score three times in the eighth inning to tie the game. Huston Street allows a pinch hit two-run game-tying home run to Rob Mackowiak for the blown save. Eric Chavez then hits a three-run home run in the third inning and the A's load the bases with two outs before Dan Johnson grounds out to end the inning. The A's are then shutout on four hits and three walks over the final six innings. Saarloos takes the loss, allowing six runs on eight hits and five walks in 4.1 innings. Santiago Casilla allows three runs in 1.1 innings of relief before Randy Keisler (0.1 ip), Ron Flores (1.0 ip) and Steve Karsay (1.0) shut down the White Sox the rest of the way.

**May 24**  
A's 2 @ Chicago 3  
(22-24, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1)

The A's are swept in the three-game series at Chicago as they lose the finale, 3-2. The A's score first as Eric

Chavez has a RBI single in the third inning and Dan Haren shuts out the White Sox on two hits over the first four innings. He then allows two runs in the fifth inning on a RBI double by Scott Podsednik and a RBI single by Jim Thome. Rob Mackowiak adds a RBI single in the sixth inning and Haren takes the loss, allowing three runs on six hits in six innings. Nick Swisher has a sacrifice fly in the eighth inning to make the score 3-2 but the A's leave runners on second and third and are retired in order in the ninth inning.

Dan Johnson adds a RBI single in the fourth inning and the A's score two more in the fifth in a solo home run by Mark Kotsay and a two-run home run by Nick Swisher. Brad Halsey takes a 7-0 lead into the sixth inning before allowing a grand slam to Rod Barajas. Steve Karsay allows two home runs to make the score 7-6, Kiko Calero allows a solo home run to Ian Kinsler in the eighth inning to tie the game and Huston Street allows a "walk-off" home run to Phil Nevin for the loss.

Oakland scores twice in the first inning on a Frank Thomas RBI single and a Bobby Crosby sacrifice fly and they add two earned runs in the second inning on a Hank Blalock error. Nick Swisher has a two-run triple in the sixth inning to make the score 6-0. Zito allows a three-run home run to Phil Nevin in the bottom of the sixth, but those are the only runs he would allow in 7.1 innings. He allows four hits and walks five while striking out seven. Huston Street gets the final five outs, allowing one hit, for the save.

**May 28**  
A's 3 @ Texas 4  
(23-27, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -3)

The A's finish their road trip with a 1-6 record as they lose to take, 4-3. Dan Johnson has a RBI ground out in the second inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead but Kirk Saarloos allows three runs in the second inning. Chad Gaudin pitches 2.1 scoreless innings of relief and Kiko Calero pitches a scoreless eighth before Huston Street allows a pinch hit RBI single to Matt Stairs in the ninth inning for the blown save. #### May 31

(24-29, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4)

Joe Blanton tosses a five-hit shutout and Jason Kendall hits his first home run in nearly two years as the A's defeat Kansas City, 7-0. Blanton walks two and strikes out five in his third career complete game, but his first victory. The Royals put runners into score position in just three of the innings with the biggest threat coming in the third inning when there are runners on first and second with one out before he retires the next two hitters. Frank Thomas hits a two-run home run in the first inning and Bobby Crosby leads off the fourth inning with a home run, the 6000<sup>th</sup> in Oakland history. Eric Chavez adds a two-run triple in the seventh inning and Kendall hits a two-run home run in the eighth, snapping a 247-game, 961-at bat homerless streak dating back to July 27, 2004.

#### June 1

Minnesota 0 @ A's 4  
(25-29, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -3½)

The A's toss back-to-back shutouts for the second time in 2006 as Barry Zito, Kiko Calero and Huston Street combine to blank the Twins on five hits and no walks. Zito tosses seven of the innings and allows four of the hits and allows just two runners as far as second base. He strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning for his 1000<sup>th</sup> career strikeout. Calero retires the side in order in the eighth inning and Street allows one hit in the ninth inning. The A's score all four of their runs on home runs, beginning with a leadoff home run by Frank Thomas in the second inning. Mark Kotsay hits a two-run home run in the sixth inning for his 100<sup>th</sup> career home run and Dan Johnson adds a solo shot in the seventh inning to complete the A's scoring.

#### June 2

Minnesota 2 @ A's 1  
(25-30, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4½)

Kirk Saarloos shuts out the Twins on two hits over the first seven innings before allowing two runs in the eighth inning for a 2-1 A's loss. Dan Johnson adds a solo home run in the fourth inning and Jason Kendall has a RBI single in the eighth to complete the A's scoring.

The A's put runners in scoring position in five of the nine innings, including back-to-back walks to start the second inning and a leadoff double in the third. Barry Zito starts for the A's and allows three runs on eight hits and four walks in five innings and takes the loss. Chad Gaudin tosses a scoreless sixth inning and Brad Halsey adds two scoreless innings. The A's have one final threat in the seventh inning when Jason Kendall singles and Marco Scutaro doubles with one out but pinch hitter Bobby Kielty grounds out and Mark Kotsay grounds out to end the threat.

#### June 28

The A's lose their second straight at San Diego, scoring just one run after they were shutout the night before. Eric Chavez and Bobby Crosby start the fourth inning with back-to-back singles but Clay Hensley and the Padres bullpen retire 18 of the final 20 hitters, including Jay Payton who hits into a fielders choice to drive in Chavez with the A's only run. Joe Blanton takes the loss for the A's, allowing five runs, four earned, on six hits and two walks in four innings. Ron Flores allows a run in two innings of relief and Justin Duchscherec and allows two runs in the seventh inning before Chad Gaudin and Scott Sauerbeck combine for a scoreless eighth inning.

(42-36, 1<sup>st</sup>, +2)

Dan Johnson and Mark Ellis have back-to-back singles in the eighth inning for the A's only other base runners of the game but Marco Scutaro grounds into a double play to end that threat. Esteban Loaiza takes the loss, allowing five runs on nine hits in 6 2/3 innings. Scott Sauerbeck allows a run in 1 1/3 innings and Justin Duchscherec allows a run in the ninth.

#### July 2

Haren then allows two runs in the sixth inning and takes the loss. He allows four runs on eight hits and a walk in six innings. Justin Duchschereh tosses two scoreless innings and Huston Street pitches a scoreless ninth.

#### July 13

A's 5 @ Boston 4 (11)  
(46-43, t-1<sup>st</sup>, —)

Boston comes back with two in the bottom of the third before the A's tie the game with a two-run seventh inning, scoring both runs on a Mark Loretta error. Esteban Loaiza allows three runs on six hits in five innings before the A's bullpen shuts out the Red Sox from the sixth through 10<sup>th</sup> innings. The A's take the lead for good with a two-run fourth inning as Marco Scutaro breaks the tie with a RBI double and Bobby Kielty scores when Jason Kendall grounds into a double play with the bases loaded. Frank Thomas adds a RBI single in the seventh inning and Marco Scutaro hits a solo home run in the eighth inning, giving him a career high tying three hits. Eric Chavez scores on an error later in the inning and the A's add two more runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Thomas and Nick Swisher. Joe Blanton allows three runs on 10 hits and a walk in 6.0 innings for the win and the A's bullpen allows six hits as Oakland allows 16 total in the victory. Hudson Street pitches the final 1.2 innings for the save. Nick Swisher homers in the eighth inning, his 23<sup>rd</sup> home run of the season which ties the Athletics record for home runs by a switch-hitter.

The A's win their fifth consecutive game with a 7-4 victory over Texas. Jason Kendall scores on a Milton Bradley ground out in the first inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead but Esteban Loaiza allows two runs in the second inning. Mark Ellis then hits a two-run home run in the third inning to give the A's the lead for good. Nick Swisher has a RBI single in the fourth and Ellis adds a two-run double in the sixth to give him four RBI. Bradley hits a solo home run in the seventh inning to complete the A's scoring. Loaiza picks up the win, allowing four runs on 10 hits and a walk in 6 2/3 innings. Chad Gaudin gets the final out in the seventh, Brad Halsey pitches a scoreless eighth and Kiko Calero retires the side in order in the ninth for his second save.

The Rangers then scored seven times in the sixth inning, including six runs off Brad Halsey in one-third of an inning. Jay Witasick allowed two runs in one inning of work before Ron Flores shutout the Rangers over the final 2 2/3 innings. Vicente Padilla blanked the A's on six hits over the first seven innings and Ron Mahay allowed one hit over the final two innings to complete the shutout.

Marco Scutaro has a RBI double and Mark Ellis adds a sacrifice fly in the eighth inning to complete the A's scoring. Haren allows two runs, one earned, on five hits and a walk while striking out seven in seven innings for the win. Justin Duchscherec retires the side in order in the eighth inning and Huston Streets pitches a scoreless ninth for the save.

The A's collect just nine hits in the doubleheader, including six in the first game. Milton Bradley has a RBI single in the first inning of Game 1 but that would be the A's only run of the game. Joe Blanton allows two runs on eight hits in six innings and takes the loss and the A's bullpen allows five runs over the final two innings. In the second game, Esteban Loaiza and Kansas City starter Jorge De La Rosa pitch shutout baseball over the first five innings before Jay Payton has a sacrifice fly in the sixth inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead. He sets an Oakland record for most runs allowed in a game while picking up the win and he becomes the first pitcher in American League history to allow eight runs in the first two innings and end up with the win. He retires each of the final three hitters in the eighth inning and the A's score six times in the ninth before Zito comes out to pitch the bottom of the ninth. He allows three runs, one earned, on two hits and two walks in 8 1/3 innings to pick up the win. Chad Gaudin records the final two outs. Mark Kotsay has a RBI fielders choice in the third inning and the A's add two more runs in the fourth on a Mark Ellis bases loaded walk and a Jason Kendall RBI single. Milton Bradley has a two-run double and Nick Swisher a three-run double to highlight the A's scoring in the ninth inning.

Esteban Loaiza combines with Joe Kennedy and Chad Gaudin on a six-hit shutout as the A's defeat Boston, 9-0. Loaiza allows five hits, one walk and hits a batter in seven innings to extend his scoreless streak to 16 innings and his streak of not allowing an earned run to 28.2 innings. The A's score twice in the third inning on RBI doubles by Bobby Kielty and Jay Payton and add three more runs in the fourth inning. Kielty has a RBI single, Frank Thomas walks with the bases loaded and Payton follows with a sacrifice fly.
