

# 2007 A's TEAM NOTES

**2007 RECAP:** The A's had their streak of eight consecutive seasons with a winning record come to an end in 2007 as they finished with a 76-86 record...it was the first time Oakland finished with a losing record since going 74-88 in 1998...finished in third place in the American League West, 18 games behind Los Angeles, and were sixth in the AL Wild Card, 18 games behind New York...it marked the first time the A's finished more than 14 games out of a playoff spot since 1997 when they were 25 games behind Seattle in the West...it was the first time the A's did not finish first or second in the West since 1998 when they finished fourth...the A's .469 winning percentage equaled the 11<sup>th</sup> lowest in the A's 40 seasons in Oakland...spent most of the season in third place in the West although the A's spent at least one day in every spot in the standings...had six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, 21 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 127 days in third, seven days tied for third and seven days in fourth...the A's continued their recent trend of slow starts as they were never more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 over the first two months of the season...put together more than two consecutive wins just once over the first 53 games, a four-game streak from April 15-20, and had just two losing streaks longer than two games over that stretch, a pair of three-game streaks...went 26-27 over that season opening stretch, which put the A's in third place in the West, 6½ games behind Los Angeles at the conclusion of play on June 1...then won a season high five consecutive games from June 2 to 6 and went 11-2 over a 13-game span from June 2 to 15...that gave the A's a 37-29 (.561) record on June 15, which was good for second place in the West, four games behind Los Angeles...had the eighth best record in baseball at the time...however, the eight games over .500 would be a season high as the A's went 39-57 (.406) over the final 96 games...had the second worst record in baseball from June 16 until the end of the season...only Tampa Bay, at 37-60 (.381), had a lower winning percentage...the A's pitching staff had a 3.13 ERA through games of June 15, which was the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the Majors...then compiled a 5.10 ERA from June 16 until the end of the season, which was third highest in the AL and sixth highest in the Majors...A's starting pitchers were 25-17 with a 2.99 ERA and .234 opponents batting average through June 15 and 27-43 with a 5.30 ERA and .297 opponents batting average after that...went 7-21 over a 28-game stretch from June 16 to July 17...capped that with a season high nine-game losing streak from July 6 to 17...the losing streak equaled the fifth longest in Oakland history and it was the A's longest since July 21-29, 1998 when they also lost nine straight...it equaled the second longest losing streak in the AL in 2007...went 12-12 over the next 24 games through August 12 to put the A's season record at 56-62...made a push for a .500 record by winning nine of 11 games from August 13 to 23...that move the A's one game over .500 at 65-64 on August 23 but that would be their final day over .500...lost the next day to put the season record at exactly .500 for the 19<sup>th</sup> time in 2007...the only season in Oakland history in which the A's had more days at .500 was in 1968 when they did it 20 times...went 11-22 over the final 33 games beginning on August 24 and lost 10 of the final 12 games...were officially eliminated from the AL West on September 15 and were eliminated from the Wild Card on September 17 in game 152...that was the earliest the A's have been knocked out of the playoff race since 1998 when they were eliminated in game 151 on September 16.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's used the disabled list 22 times in 2007, tying the Oakland record set in 1992...A's players combined to miss an Oakland record 1259 games while on the DL, an average of 57.2 games per DL stint...11 of the 22 DL stints included time on the 60-day DL...the A's began the season with three players on the DL and did not drop below that number all year...had at least five players on the DL every day beginning on April 27 and had 110 days with at least eight players on the DL...including a season high 11 from May 22-29 and on June 19...four

players had multiple stints on the DL including three times by Milton Bradley and two times each by Travis Buck, Rich Harden and Mark Kotsay...Chris Denorfia, who was acquired from Cincinnati on April 27, missed the most games with 140 and Harden (133), Chris Snelling (129), Esteban Loaiza (127) and Justin Duchschere (125) also missed at least 100 games...the injuries led to roster moves nearly every week of the season...the A's did not make their first 25-man roster move until April 23 when Bradley and Harden went on the DL and Dallas Braden and Danny Putnam were promoted...that was a streak of 21 days...after that, the A's did not go more than eight days without a move the rest of the season...from May 11 to July 25, the A's did not go more than three days without a 40-man roster move.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's set an Oakland record by using a Major League leading 54 players in 2007...broke the previous mark of 49 set in 1997...it was the second highest total in franchise history to the 56 players used by the Philadelphia A's in 1915...also set Oakland record records with 12 center fielders and 18 outfielders and tied the mark with 13 left fielders...used 24 different pitchers, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 26 set in 1997...that includes 20 relievers, which is one short of the record of 21 in 1997...10 different pitchers started a game for the A's, which was their most since using 12 in 1999...used 30 position players, which was third most in Oakland history and the most since 1978 when they had 31...the record is 32 in 1972...17 of the 54 players (31.5%) were rookies, the A's most rookies in a season since 1997 when they also had 17...only the Yankees (19) and Colorado (18) used more rookies in 2007...the A's nine rookie position players combined for 288 games and 891 at bats and the eight rookie pitchers combined for 167 appearances and 237.1 innings pitched...had at least one rookie in the starting lineup in 129 of the 162 games, including four on 10 different occasions...nine of the 17 rookies made their Major League debut...only nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were on the A's active 25-man roster the entire season (Blanton, DiNardo, Ellis, Embree, Gaudin, Haren, Marshall, Scutaro and Stewart)...nine of the 32 players on the A's active roster at the end of the season were not in the organization on Opening Day.

**OFFENSE:** The A's ranked second to last in the American League with a .256 batting average and a .246 average with runners in scoring position...finished ahead of Chicago (.246 overall, .243 with RISP)...however, ranked second in the AL with 664 walks (Boston, 689) and had the sixth best on-base percentage (.338)...the walks were fourth most in Oakland history...scored 741 runs, which was fourth fewest in the AL and the fewest by an Oakland team in a non-strike season since 1993 when they had 715...were shutout 10 times, which tied for fourth most in the AL...ranked last in the AL in triples (16), stolen bases (52) and sacrifice hits (18)...the sacrifice hits were the fewest in franchise history, breaking the previous record of 19 in 2005...the triples were fourth fewest in A's history...had the fourth lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.407)...had the fewest caught stealings in the AL (20) and did not have a baserunner picked off, the first time an Oakland team has gone an entire season without being picked off since the stat was tracked beginning in 1987...were third in the AL in pitches per plate appearance (3.91) and sacrifice flies (56).

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 4.28 ERA, which ranked sixth in the American League...it marked the first time the A's did not finish in the AL top four in ERA since 1998 when they were ninth...it was the A's highest ERA since posting a 4.58 mark in 2000...now have a 3.89 ERA since 2001, which is the lowest in the AL over that span and tied with Atlanta for the lowest in the Majors...allowed 138 home runs, which was the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the Majors...since 1996, the only AL team to allow fewer home runs in a season was the 2002 A's (135)...had the third lowest opponents batting average (.263) and slugging percentage (.404) in the AL and the sixth lowest on-base percentage (.329)...had four complete games, which tied for eighth in the AL but was second fewest in franchise history (2 in 1997)...tied for third in the AL in shutouts (9)...topped 1000 strikeouts for the seventh consecutive season and the eighth time in franchise history...the 1036 strikeouts is the fourth highest single season total in A's history...had the most intentional walks (60) and sacrifices flies (60) in the AL...allowed 45 triples, which was second most in the AL and second most in Oakland history to the record of 48 in 1983.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers were 52-60 with a 4.29 ERA...ranked fifth in the American League in ERA and had the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.270)...the wins were fifth fewest in the AL and the fewest by A's starters since 1998 when they also went 52-60...allowed just 95 home runs, which was second fewest in the AL, and had the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.411)...issued the fourth most walks (325) and ranked seventh in on-base percentage (.333)...had the fewest hit batters in the AL (21), which was the fewest by A's starters since 1990 (17)...led the AL in triples (28), which was the most by A's starters since 1982 (29)...had the second most unearned runs (54) in the AL and the third lowest run support (4.86).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen converted 36 of 61 (59.0%) save opportunities, which was the third lowest save percentage in the American League...tied for the fourth fewest saves in the AL...the 25 blown saves tied for the AL lead and were tied for third most in Oakland history...however, the A's were 11-15 in games in which the pen blew the save...Alan Embree led the team with 17 saves and Huston Street added 16, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's had two pitchers with 15 or more saves...Dennis Eckersley and Jay Howell tied for the team lead with 16 each in 1987...the pen was 24-26 with a 4.27 ERA and .249 opponents batting average...the ERA ranked ninth in the AL and was the highest by the A's bullpen since 2000 (4.48)...were fifth in the AL in opponents batting and had the third most losses...allowed 73 of 252 (29.0%) inherited runners to score, which ranked sixth lowest in the AL, and first batters faced hit .247, which was ninth lowest...had 43 intentional walks, which was the most by an AL bullpen and second most in Oakland history (48 in 1979).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's finished fourth in the American League with a .985 fielding percentage, the first time they have not finished in the top two since 2003...committed 90 errors, which tied for third fewest in the AL and was fourth fewest in franchise history in a non-strike season...however, the errors led to 69 unearned runs, which was third most in the AL...turned 153 double plays, which was fourth fewest in the AL...had a season best 10-game errorless streak from August 28 to September 8 and that was third longest errorless streak in Oakland history...had a 53-47 record when going errorless and were 23-39 when making one or more errors.

**AT HOME:** The A's were 40-41 (.494) at home and finished with a losing record in Oakland for the first time since 1998 when they went 39-42...had the fifth worst home record in the American League...won 12 home series, lost 13 and split one...the A's batted .240 with 331 runs scored (4.1 per game) in Oakland compared to .271 with 410 runs scored (5.1 per game) on the road...had the lowest batting average and second fewest runs scored at home in the AL but had the third most runs and fifth best batting average on the road in the AL...the A's .240 batting average at home was their lowest mark in Oakland since 1982 when they hit .229...the 331 runs scored were their fewest in a non-strike season since 1990 when they had 321...the pitching staff compiled a 3.79 ERA in Oakland compared to 4.81 on the road...had the second lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth highest road ERA.

**ON THE ROAD:** The A's went 36-45 (.444) on the road, the third time in the last five years they have finished with a losing record away from Oakland...it was the A's worst record on the road since 1999 when they went 35-46...had the eighth best road record in the American League...went 18-14 (.563) over the first 32 road games through June 14 and then went 18-31 (.367) over the final 49 games beginning on June 22 at New York (NL)...won 10 road series, lost 13 and split 3...the A's .271 road batting average was fourth best in Oakland history...tied with New York for the AL lead in home runs on the road (94)...had just two triples, which were the fewest triples on the road by a Major League team in a non-strike season since 1957...the previous low was four by the 1998 A's.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** The A's were 44-44 at the All-Star Break this year, marking the first time they have not been over .500 at the break since 1999 when they were 43-44...then went 32-42 (.432) after the break, which was the fourth lowest winning percentage in the American League...it was the first time the A's had a losing record after the All-Star Break since 1998 (33-43, .434) and it was the A's worst post-break record since 1997 (28-45, .384)...had a 3.66 ERA at the break, which was the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the Majors...then posted a 5.04 ERA after the break, which was third highest in the AL and sixth highest in the Majors...it was just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's had an ERA over 5.00 after the break.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's went 12-13 in April, marking the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years that the A's have finished at or below .500 in the first month of the season...led the American League with a 3.16 ERA but hit just .230, their lowest mark in a month since June of 1982 when they hit .216...then went 14-13 in May and 15-13 in June...led the AL in ERA in both months with a 3.71 ERA in May and 3.63 in June...the A's batting average improved to .274 in May, the A's best one month average in 2007...went 9-18 in July, which ranked second worst in the AL and third worst in the Majors...it marked just the second time since 1998 that the A's lost more than 17 games in any month (7-20 in May, 2005)...hit .236 in July, which was the lowest average in the Majors and the A's lowest in July since hitting .235 in 1982...went 17-12 in August, which was fourth best in the AL...have a 141-57 (.712) record in August since 2001, which is the best record in the Majors over that span by 22½ games...the pitching staff set an Oakland record for strikeouts in a month with 223...broke the previous mark of 219 in August of 1968...went 9-17 in September, their worst record in the final

month of the season since 1985 when they went 8-20 (.286)...the pitching staff allowed a .301 batting average, the fifth highest one month average in Oakland history.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's were 11-5 in extra inning games and tied with Cleveland for the American League lead in extra inning wins...are now 52-24 (.685) in extra inning affairs since 2003, including 32-11 (.744) in Oakland...were 18-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the 18 last at bat wins tied for second most in the AL but the A's had just 27 come from behind wins, which was the fewest in the Majors...were 25-24 (.510) in one-run games, which was their worst record in one-run contests since going 16-19 (.457) in 1998...were fourth in the AL in one-run decisions...had a 27-24 record in games decided in the seventh inning or later...had 11 "walk-off" wins...trailing Detroit 7-0 entering the bottom of the fifth inning on September 2, but came back to win 8-7 in 10 innings...that equaled the third largest deficit overcome to win in Oakland history...overcame a deficit of three or more runs 13 times and were 9-4 in those games...the largest lead the A's blew in a losing effort came on June 17 against St. Louis when they lead 5-1 entering the second inning and lost, 10-6...blew a pair of seven run leads on August 6 at Texas and August 10 at Detroit but came back to win both games...lost a lead of three or more runs 15 times and were 8-7 in those games.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters were 10 for 57 (.175) with no extra base hits, 10 RBI, six walks and 15 strikeouts...had the fewest pinch hits in the American League, the third lowest batting average and tied for the fifth fewest RBI...the 10 pinch hits were second fewest in one season in Oakland history...had eight pinch hits in 2006...it was the fifth time since 1974 that a Major League team has gone an entire season without a pinch extra base hit, the first time the A's have done it...the A's last extra base hit from a pinch hitter was a double by Bobby Kielty on September 22, 2006...the A's .175 pinch slugging percentage was the lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history...had the fewest pinch plate appearances in the AL (64) and the third fewest in Oakland history...the A's are now 49 for 289 (.170) with eight doubles, four home runs and 43 RBI in the pinch over the last four seasons...have the fewest pinch extra base hits in the Majors over that span (12) and the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, .155).

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters batted .269 with 26 home runs and 111 RBI...ranked third in the American League in RBI, fourth in batting and tied for sixth in home runs...led the AL with 161 strikeouts, which tied for second most in Oakland history...the A's were the only AL team without an intentional walk by a designated hitter in 2007 and are just the third team in AL history to go an entire season without an intentional walk by a DH (Cleveland, 1986; Texas, 1982)...were one of two teams in the AL without a stolen base in 2007 and the A's have not had a stolen base by a designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo on May 4, 2005 against Texas.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's finished interleague play with a 10-8 record, which tied for the seventh best mark in the Majors...it marked the ninth time in 11 interleague seasons the A's finished with a .500 record or better and the seventh time they have finished with a winning record...Oakland batted .265 with 92 runs scored (5.1 per game) and 23 home runs in 18 interleague games...added 83 walks, which led the Majors...the pitching staff compiled a 4.02 ERA...the A's have the second best all-time record in interleague play with a mark of 113-81 (.582), trailing the Yankees who are 113-79 (.589)...are 34-28 (.548) against San Francisco and 79-53 (.598) against the rest of the National League.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's combined for a 22-21 (.512) record against teams that made the playoffs and were 54-65 (.454) against everyone else...went 5-14 against Seattle, tying an Oakland record for most losses against one team in a season...went 4-14 against Minnesota in 1973...the A's best record in 2007 was their 5-1 mark against San Francisco...had a 24-33 record against American League West teams and finished with a losing record in division games for the first time since 1999 when they were 15-21...were 21-20 against the East and finished with a winning record against the East for the eighth time in the last nine years...went 21-25 against the Central, marking the first time the A's have finished with a losing record against the Central since 1999 when they were 26-30...were 39-15 (.722) when the starting pitcher lasted seven or more innings and 37-71 (.343) when the starter tossed fewer than seven innings...had a 62-26 (.705) record when scoring four or more runs and were 14-60 (.189) when scoring three runs or less...were 54-28 (.659) when scoring first and 22-58 (.275) when the opponent scored first...had a 44-20 (.689) record when out-homer the opposition and were 9-39 (.188) when hitting fewer home runs...were 24-22 (.522) in games started by a left-hander and 52-64 (.448) against right-handers...had an 18-33 (.353) record on the weekend and 58-53 (.523) from Monday through Friday...were 27-25 in the first game of a series, 26-26 in the last game of a series and 23-35 in between.

**ATTENDANCE:** The A's drew 1,921,834 fans to McAfee Coliseum in 2007, which was the A's lowest attendance since 2000 when they drew 1,728,886...it was the fourth consecutive season the A's attendance decreased...ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the American League in attendance for the second consecutive season...had nine sellouts.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have eight players under contract for the 2008 season...the players and the years they are signed through are: Eric Chavez (2010, club option 2011), Bobby Crosby (2009), Mark Ellis (2008), Alan Embree (2008, club option 2009), Rich Harden (2008, club option 2009), Dan Haren (2009, club option 2010), Mark Kotsay (2008) and Nick Swisher (2011, club option 2012)...as of October 15, three players on the roster are eligible for free agency (DaVanon, Piazza and Stewart) and nine are eligible for arbitration (Blanton, Calero, DiNardo, Duchschere, Gaudin, Lewis, Scutaro, Snelling and Street)

# 2007 A's CHRONOLOGY

## April 2

A's 0 @ Seattle 4  
(0-1, t-3<sup>rd</sup>, -1)

The A's collect only four hits and are shutout in the 4-0 Opening Day loss to Seattle. Dan Haren makes his first Opening Day start of his career and surrenders four unearned runs on four hits and one walk to take the loss. Shannon Stewart connects for his first hit as an Athletic with a single to lead off the fourth inning. Travis Buck doubles to centerfield for his first Major League hit in the seventh. Jay Witasick follows Haren and contributes a hitless inning and two-thirds before Jay Marshall induces a ground ball to close the eighth. Milton Bradley doubles to lead off the ninth before the next three Athletics are retired in order to end the game.

## April 3

A's 4 @ Seattle 8  
(0-2, t-3<sup>rd</sup>, -2)

The A's hold an early 1-0 advantage before allowing four unanswered runs en route to the 8-4 loss to Seattle. Joe Blanton is credited with a no decision after tossing the first six innings and allowing four runs on five hits and striking out seven. Bobby Kielty walks before scoring the first Athletic run of the year on a Mark Ellis sacrifice fly. After Seattle plates two runs in the second and fifth innings, Oakland responds with one in the sixth on Milton Bradley's first home run of the year. Ellis and Jason Kendall contribute an RBI single and double, respectively, to even the score at four runs apiece in the seventh before Seattle explodes for four runs in the bottom of the frame. Kiko Calero, who earns his first loss of the season, relieves Blanton and records one out and allows three runs on three hits before Justin Duchschere gives up one run in the final two-thirds of the seventh. Alan Embree pitches a perfect eighth to finish the game on the hill for the A's.

## April 4

A's 9 @ Seattle 0  
(1-2, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2)

Bob Geren earns his first victory as Athletics' manager as the A's shutout Seattle 9-0 in the final game of a three-game series. Mark Ellis collects five RBI, three of which come on a bases-clearing double in the five-run second inning in which 10 batters come to the plate. Ellis finishes with two doubles in the game. Bobby Crosby contributes a perfect day at the plate, finishing with two hits and two runs scored. Rich Harden throws seven shutout innings, surrenders only three hits and strikes out seven to earn his first win of the season. Jay Marshall follows Harden and pitches a perfect eighth before Huston Street strikes out two of the three batters he faces in the ninth to seal the victory.

## April 5

A's 4 @ Anaheim 3  
(2-2, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -1)

Mike Piazza sends a Frankie Rodriguez fastball into the right centerfield bleachers for a 4-3 A's victory to open a four-game series at Angel Stadium. Piazza finishes with three hits including the home run and a double. He leads off the second inning with a double, and scores on a Bobby Kielty double later in the inning. Oakland adds another run in the third when Eric Chavez singles home Shannon Stewart. Chad Gaudin tosses the first five innings, allowing two solo-home runs and five hits while striking out three batters. Alan Embree pitches a scoreless inning before giving way to Kiko Calero. Justin Duchschere contributes an inning and two-thirds and is tagged with a blown save when he allows the tying run to score on a sacrifice fly in the seventh. With the game knotted at three runs apiece, Oakland plates the winning run on Piazza's first

home run as an Athletic. Huston Street pitches a scoreless ninth to earn his first save of the season.

## April 6

A's 2 @ Anaheim 5  
(2-3, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2)

Joe Kennedy has a strong start before Jay Witasick allows a three-run home run in the seventh inning in a 5-2 A's loss to the Angels. Kennedy tosses six innings and allows two runs (one earned) on six hits and two walks while striking out two before being tagged with his first loss of the season. Mike Piazza collects two hits, including a double and a walk. Adam Melhuse, Eric Chavez and Travis Buck each contribute a double in the loss. Nick Swisher singles home Melhuse in the sixth to cut the Angel lead to 2-1. Oakland's second run comes on a wild pitch in the eighth. After Witasick surrenders the home run, Jay Marshall adds a hitless inning and two-thirds with one strikeout to finish on the mound for Oakland.

## April 7

A's 1 @ Anaheim 2  
(2-4, 4<sup>th</sup>, -3)

Dan Haren contributes his second outstanding start of the season but falls to 0-2 with a 0.69 ERA over his first two outings. Haren lasts seven innings and allows two runs (one earned) on six hits and three walks while striking out two. Mike Piazza continues his hot hitting, batting two-for-four with a double. Eric Chavez adds a two-hit performance and a double of his own for Oakland. Jason Kendall connects for a two-out RBI single in the third to score Travis Buck and the only A's run of the game. Haren issues a lead-off walk to Gary Matthews before an Orlando Cabrera double and a Vladimir Guerrero sacrifice fly plate the lone run in the third inning. Oakland surrenders the winning run in the sixth after Garret Anderson doubles and scores on a throwing error by Marco Scutaro at shortstop. Alan Embree pitches a scoreless inning and allows two hits to close the game on the mound for Oakland.

## April 8

A's 2 @ Anaheim 1  
(3-4, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2)

Oakland plates single runs in the third and fourth innings to earn a 2-1 victory and a split of the four-game series in Anaheim. Joe Blanton pitches five and a third innings, allowing a run on five hits and two walks to record his first victory of the season. Mike Piazza contributes a three-for-four day at the plate and scores one of the two Oakland runs. Shannon Stewart and Nick Swisher each add an RBI double in the game. Stewart scores Jason Kendall in the third to give Oakland its first run. Swisher follows one frame later when he plates Piazza with a double into the right-center field gap. The A's bullpen tosses the final three and two-thirds innings, allowing only a single hit over the span. Huston Street finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, securing the lead and retiring the three batters he faces to record his second save of the year.

## April 9

A's 1 vs. Chicago 4  
(3-5, 4<sup>th</sup>, -2.5)

Oakland scores first in the second inning, but allows four unanswered runs to fall 4-1 in game one of a three-game series. Travis Buck connects for the only extra-base hit and RBI of the day for Oakland, both coming in the second when he plates Nick Swisher. Rich Harden pitches six innings, allowing two runs on five hits and two walks while striking out six before recording his first loss of the season. Jay Marshall relieves Harden to start the seventh and allows two runs on two

hits and a walk over the next inning and a third. Kiko Calero enters with one out in the eighth and allows a sacrifice fly before getting out of the inning. Lenny DiNardo finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, inducing and double play and a pop out in the ninth.

## April 10

A's 2 vs. Chicago 1  
(4-5, 4<sup>th</sup>, -1.5)

Todd Walker delivers a two-out single as a pinch hitter in the ninth to score Milton Bradley and even the score at one run apiece before Mark Ellis contributes the game-winning single off the left field wall to plate Marco Scutaro and give Oakland the 2-1 "walk-off" win. Chad Gaudin tosses the first five and two-thirds innings and surrenders a run on three hits and three walks while striking out six batters. Relievers Alan Embree and Justin Duchschere contribute the next two and a third scoreless innings before giving way to Huston Street. Street pitches a perfect ninth inning to set the table for the heroics in the bottom of the frame. Bradley leads off the ninth inning with a single before moving to second base on a Mike Piazza single through the left side. Walker follows with his single before Jenks intentionally walks Travis Buck to load the bases and bring Ellis to the plate. Ellis' single results in Jenks' first blown save and loss of the year.

## April 11

A's 3 vs. Chicago 6  
(4-6, 4<sup>th</sup>, -2.5)

Oakland plates three runs in the first inning, but is unable to hold the lead over the course of the game before falling 6-3 in the final game of a three-game series. Three of the four Oakland hits are doubles, and all three doubles come in the three-run first inning. Shannon Stewart leads off the inning with a double and Bobby Kielty is hit by a pitch before Mike Piazza clears the bases with a double into the left-centerfield gap to give Oakland the early 2-0 advantage. Eric Chavez follows suit on the next play, doubling home Piazza and the final run of the game for the A's. Joe Kennedy tosses the first five innings on the mound for the A's and allows a run on five hits and three walks. Kiko Calero and Jay Marshall combine to pitch the next two scoreless frames before giving way to Justin Duchschere. Duchschere allows a single and a home run off the bat of Jermaine Dye to record his second blown save of the year. Huston Street inherits a 3-3 tie and surrenders three runs on two hits and three walks to earn his first loss of the season.

## April 13

A's 5 vs. New York 4 (11)  
(5-6, 4<sup>th</sup>, -1)

Oakland erases a 4-1 deficit and earns its second "walk-off" win in the past three games when it plates a run in the bottom of the 11<sup>th</sup> to take a 5-4 victory in game one against the Yankees. Travis Buck triples and scores the winning run in the 11<sup>th</sup> when Bobby Kielty hits a slow-rolling ground ball that allows Buck to come home. Eric Chavez belts his first home run of the season in the sixth and Nick Swisher adds his first homer in the seventh. Chavez finishes the game with three of the five Oakland RBI. Chavez's home run in the sixth runs the score to 4-3 in favor of New York before Swisher knots the game at four runs apiece with his solo-shot in the seventh. Dan Haren is credited with a "no decision" after tossing the first five innings and allowing three runs on four hits and four walks while

striking out five batters. Alan Embree allows one run in the sixth before Jay Marshall, Justin Duchschere and Kiko Calero combine to throw the next four scoreless frames. Huston Street takes over on the hill for Oakland in the 11<sup>th</sup> and contributes a scoreless inning to earn his second victory in the last three games.

#### April 14

A's 3 vs. New York 4 (13)  
(5-7, 4<sup>th</sup>, -1.5)

The A's plate three runs in the first inning, but for the second time in three games, they are unable to hold the lead before falling 4-3 in 13 innings. With one out in the first, Nick Swisher doubles to left field and Mike Piazza reaches on a Derek Jeter error to put runners at the corners. An Eric Chavez sacrifice fly scores Swisher and the first Oakland run before a Bobby Crosby double and Travis Buck single plate the final two runs of the game for the A's. After neither team manages to plate a run after the seventh inning, the Yankees finally push one across in the top of the 13<sup>th</sup> on a Jason Giambi home run. Joe Blanton pitches the first six and two-thirds innings on the mound for Oakland, allowing three runs on five hits and three walks while striking out five hitters. Jay Marshall, Alan Embree and Huston Street combine to pitch the next three and a third scoreless frames before handing the ball over to Lenny DiNardo. DiNardo makes only one mistake in his three innings of work, surrendering the long ball to Giambi in the 13<sup>th</sup> to record the loss.

#### April 15

A's 5 vs. New York 4  
(6-7, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -1.5)

For the ninth time in his four years in Oakland, Marco Scutaro delivers a game-winning hit, blasting a three-run home run off the left field foul pole on a 0-2 pitch with two outs in the ninth inning to give the A's a 5-4 win over New York. Oakland posts two runs in the first inning and fails to score again until the homer in the bottom of the ninth. A Bobby Kielty sacrifice fly and a Mike Piazza RBI single gives the A's the early 2-0 advantage. Starters Rich Harden and Andy Pettitte each deliver outstanding starts while not factoring in the decision. Harden tosses six innings and allows one run on five hits while striking out seven batters. Joe Kennedy replaces Harden in the seventh inning and records the blown save after surrendering three runs on two hits. Kiko Calero and the game's eventual winning pitcher, Jay Marshall, combine to pitch the final two scoreless innings before Scutaro and the A's take the victory in the ninth. In that inning, Mariano Rivera takes the hill for New York in search of his first save of the season and retires the first two batters he faces. With nobody on and two out, a Todd Walker single and a Jason Kendall walk put runners at first and second for Scutaro's heroics.

#### April 16

OFF DAY  
(6-7, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.5)

#### April 17

A's 4 vs. Los Angeles 1  
(7-7, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -.5)

Oakland plates all four of its runs in the fourth inning and gets an outstanding effort from starter Chad Gaudin to take the 4-1 victory over the Angels in the first game of a two-game series. Gaudin throws seven and two-thirds innings and allows only the one run on four hits and two walks before handing the ball over to the A's bullpen. Four of Oakland's six hits go for extra bases, including three doubles and a home run off the bat of Bobby Crosby. Jason Kendall drives in the only other A's run when he singles home Travis Buck to cap the four-run fourth inning. Alan Embree retires the only batter he faces in the eighth inning before Huston Street pitches a perfect ninth inning, including two strikeouts, to earn his third save of the season.

#### April 18

A's 3 vs. Los Angeles 0  
(8-7, 1<sup>st</sup>, +.5)

The A's use two runs in the third inning, one in the fifth and a combined shutout from the pitching staff to earn a 3-0 victory and sweep the two-game series against the Angels, claiming possession of first place for the first time in 2007. Dan Haren gets the start for Oakland and tosses seven innings, does not walk a batter and strikes out three. Justin Duchschere follows suit and pitches a scoreless inning in which he does not walk a batter. Shannon Stewart bats two-for-three with a double and a run scored in the victory. Eric Chavez adds a two-for-four day with two RBI, including RBI singles in the third and fifth innings. Huston Street enters in the ninth and quickly puts the Angels down in order to earn his fourth save of the season while also collecting two strikeouts.

#### April 20

A's 16 @ Texas 4  
(9-7, 1<sup>st</sup>, +2)

The A's blast three home runs and get another strong pitching performance from their starter as Joe Blanton lasts six innings and gives up three runs on seven hits and one walk while striking out seven to improve to 2-0 on the season. Travis Buck hits his first Major League home run, a two-run shot, in the fourth and Shannon Stewart and Nick Swisher hit back-to-back home runs in the eighth. Mark Ellis and Bobby Crosby each finish with three hits and two doubles on the night, driving in three runs and two runs, respectively. Buck ends the game two-for-three with the home run, a double, three walks, two runs scored and five RBI. Kiko Calero, Jay Marshall and Jay Witasick combine to pitch two innings of scoreless relief after Blanton exits to start the seventh. Lenny DiNardo tosses the final inning and allows a run on two hits to seal the victory.

#### April 21

A's 0 @ Texas 7  
(9-8, 1<sup>st</sup>, +1)

Oakland is shutout and tallies only three hits after posting sixteen runs the game before. Nick Swisher collects one of the A's hits and draws two walks in the game. Eric Chavez and Mark Ellis collect the other two Oakland base hits. Oakland loads the bases in the sixth inning, but the next two batters strikeout to spoil the only Athletic rally. Joe Kennedy contributes a strong effort in a losing cause, pitching five innings and allowing only one run on three hits and three walks while striking out five batters. Jay Witasick pitches a perfect sixth, including two strikeouts before handing the ball over to Alan Embree to start the seventh. Embree lasts two-thirds of an inning and gives up a run on two hits and a walk before Kiko Calero records the final out of the frame. Jay Marshall is the final pitcher out of the bullpen, surrendering five runs (four earned) on five hits and a walk.

#### April 22

A's 3 @ Texas 4  
(9-9, t-1<sup>st</sup>, —)

Oakland carries a 3-1 lead into the eighth inning, but is unable to hold off a late Texas surge which results in three runs and a 4-3 loss. Mike Piazza collects two hits, including a double and an RBI in the fourth inning. Shannon Stewart gives Oakland the 3-1 advantage in the fifth inning when he hits his second home run of the season, a two-run shot. Eric Chavez and Bobby Crosby each contribute two hits and a run scored, with Chavez chipping in a double in the first inning. Chad Gaudin pitches six innings and allows a run on four hits and two walks and seven strikeouts before giving way to Alan Embree. Embree tosses two-thirds

of a scoreless inning and hands the ball over to Justin Duchschere, who finishes the seventh before running into trouble in the eighth. After allowing a bases-loaded walk to plate the first run of the inning, Duchschere exits and Huston Street gives up a single to score the tying and go-ahead runs, recording his first blown save of the season and leaving Duchschere with the loss.

#### April 23

A's 6 @ Baltimore 5  
(10-9, 1<sup>st</sup>, +1)

The A's use five runs in the fourth inning and one in the ninth to take the 6-5 victory over Baltimore in the first game of a two-game set. Nick Swisher blasts two home runs in the game, including what proves to be the game-winner in the ninth. Swisher finishes the game two-for-five with three RBI and two runs scored. Danny Putnam records his first Major League hit in his debut, a single in the top of the fifth inning. Oakland collects five hits in the five-run fourth inning, including Swisher's two-run shot and Jason Kendall's RBI single. Dan Haren continues to provide quality starts, lasting seven innings and giving up one run on five hits and a walk while striking out five. Kiko Calero and Alan Embree combine to pitch the eighth and allow two runs and one run, respectively, to push the score to 5-4. After Swisher puts Oakland ahead by two in the ninth, Huston Street enters and allows a RBI single before inducing a groundout with the bases loaded to preserve the lead and earn the save.

#### April 24

A's 4 @ Baltimore 2  
(11-9, 1<sup>st</sup>, +1)

Dallas Braden makes his Major League debut and Oakland uses two runs in the first and two in the sixth to earn the 4-2 victory and the two-game series sweep in Baltimore. After singling and moving to third on an Eric Chavez single, Nick Swisher is taken out of the game due to a strained left hamstring and replaced by Marco Scutaro. Oakland is handed its first run of the game when Mike Piazza reaches on an error that plates Scutaro and moves Chavez to third base. Todd Walker follows with a sacrifice fly that plates Chavez and gives the A's a 2-0 advantage. With two out and the bases loaded, Jason Kendall reaches on a fielder's choice that fails to record an out and scores Piazza. Danny Putnam walks one batter later to plate the fourth and final run of the game for Oakland. Braden tosses six innings and allows one run on three hits and a walk while striking out six to record his first Major League win. Jay Witasick and Jay Marshall combine to pitch the seventh before handing the ball over to Justin Duchschere in the eighth. After a scoreless inning of relief by Duchschere, Huston Street enters and retires the first three hitters he faces, including two strikeouts, to earn his sixth save.

#### April 25

A's 0 vs. Seattle 2  
(11-10, t-1<sup>st</sup>, —)

The A's are shutout for the second time by the Mariners in 2007, but receive an outstanding pitching performance before falling 2-0 in the game. Joe Blanton tosses a complete game and allows two runs on six hits and two walks while striking out six. Oakland manages just three hits, two coming off the bat of Shannon Stewart, who finishes two-for-four. Eric Chavez collects the only other Athletic hit, a single in the fourth inning. The first of the two Mariner runs comes in second inning when Jose Guillen homers down the left field line. Seattle extends its lead in the eighth on another home run, this one coming off the bat of Kenji Johjima. The two runs are more than enough support for Mariner starter, Jarrod Washburn, who turns in a complete game of his own and earns the victory.

**April 26**

A's 2 vs. Seattle 4  
(11-11, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1)

Oakland holds a 2-0 lead after three innings, but sees Seattle score four unanswered runs before falling 4-2 and being swept in the two-game series. Mark Ellis finishes two-for-four, including a RBI double to score Shannon Stewart in the third inning. Eric Chavez follows suit in the next at-bat, doubling home Ellis and giving Oakland its final run of the game. Joe Kennedy turns in another strong pitching performance, lasting five innings and giving up one run on seven hits and two walks and leaving the game with a one-run lead. Kiko Calero pitches the next frame and records his first blown save and second loss of the year when he allows a two-run homer to Jose Lopez. Jay Marshall contributes the seventh and allows an unearned run after a Chavez error allows Jose Vidro to reach. Jay Witasick and Lenny DiNardo combine to pitch the final two innings and allow only one hit in the effort.

**April 27**

A's 1 vs. Tampa Bay 4  
(11-12, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -1)

The A's plate their only run of the game in the second inning and fall 4-1 to Tampa Bay in game one of a two-game series. Bobby Crosby accounts for all of the A's offensive output, blasting his second home run of the season to lead off the second inning. Mike Piazza, Mark Ellis and Danny Putnam each contribute a base hit in the game, but starter Chad Gaudin lasts only four innings and gives up four runs (three earned) on four hits and four walks while striking out four. Lenny DiNardo pitches an outstanding four innings of relief, allowing only two hits and a walk while punching out four batters before giving way to Jay Marshall in the ninth inning. Marshall surrenders a two-out single, but retires the fourth batter in the inning to cap the stellar Athletic relief effort. Dan Johnson manages to draw a two-out walk in the ninth inning, but the A's are retired in the next at-bat to take the loss.

**April 28**

A's 12 vs. Tampa Bay 5  
(12-12, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1)

Oakland plates 12 runs, highlighted by three home runs, to take the 12-5 victory over Tampa Bay and even the series at one game apiece. Travis Buck is the first Athletic hitter to hit a long ball, blasting a three-run shot over to cap a six-run first inning for Oakland. Ellis hits his first home run of the season in the fifth before Eric Chavez adds the final round-tripper in the seventh. Chavez finishes two-for-five with the homer, two runs scored and three RBI. Bobby Crosby and Dan Johnson each contribute two RBI, while Dan Haren turns in another stellar performance on the hill. Haren tosses seven and a third innings and allows three runs (two earned) on seven hits and no walks while striking out seven batters. Justin Duchscherer inherits the ball in eighth and closes the frame after an unearned run ends Haren's day on the mound. Alan Embree enters with a 12-2 lead and allows two runs while striking out two in the ninth before Oakland earns the victory.

**April 29**

A's 3 vs. Tampa Bay 5  
(12-13, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2)

The A's score twice in the first inning, but eventually fall 5-3 in the rubber match of a three-game series against Tampa Bay. Mark Ellis and Eric Chavez hit back-to-back home runs in the first to give Oakland the early 2-0 lead. Mike Piazza finishes two-for-four, including a RBI single in the eighth to plate Marco Scutaro. Scutaro bats a perfect two-for-two with a walk in the game. Dallas Braden surrenders five runs on six hits and three walks in four and a third innings before recording his first career loss. Oakland's bullpen combines to pitch four and two-thirds scoreless innings of relief to keep the A's within striking distance. Kiko

Calero tosses a perfect inning and two-thirds before giving way to Jay Witasick. Witasick surrenders a hit and a walk in his one inning pitched before retiring the side and handing the ball over to Justin Duchscherer. The right-hander also allows a hit and a walk while striking out one batter, but is able to close the eighth inning without further damage. Huston Street finishes the game on the hill for Oakland and retires the Devil Rays in order in the ninth.

**April 30**

(12-13, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2.5)

**May 1**

A's 5 @ Boston 4 (10)  
(13-13, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2.5)

Oakland scores twice in the ninth inning to cap a comeback that erases a 4-0 deficit before taking the victory with a run in the tenth inning. A's starting pitcher Joe Blanton surrenders three runs in the bottom of the first inning and one in the third to put Oakland in an early 4-0 hole. Blanton settles down and gives up only one hit over the next four innings, leaving after the seventh and allowing only the four runs on six hits and two walks. Dan Johnson gets Oakland on the board in the fourth when he blasts a home run over the wall in right-center field. Todd Walker drives in the second Oakland run in the seventh with a sacrifice fly that plates Travis Buck, who had reached on a leadoff double and moved to third on a Jason Kendall single. After the game's eventual winning pitcher, Justin Duchscherer, turns in a scoreless ninth inning to leave the A's just two runs behind, Oakland evens the score at four runs apiece when Buck connects on a 0-2 pitch and homers to right field to plate Bobby Crosby. Carrying momentum, Oakland strings together back-to-back doubles by Mike Piazza and Johnson to plate what proves to be the winning run in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning. Huston Street enters in the bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup> and retires the heart of Boston's lineup to earn his seventh save of the year.

**May 2**

A's 4 @ Boston 6  
(13-14, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2.5)

Oakland overcomes a 2-0 deficit and takes a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the sixth, but Boston roars back to plate four runs in their next three frames to eventually take the game 6-4. Mike Piazza bats two-for-three with a run scored before leaving the game with a shoulder injury in the sixth. Dan Johnson also contributes two hits, including a double in the fifth and an RBI single in the sixth. Jason Kendall gets the A's on the board in the fifth when he singles home Piazza and Johnson. Chad Gaudin lasts five innings in the start and hands the ball over to Jay Marshall and the Oakland bullpen with a 3-2 lead and a runner at first base. Marshall allows the inherited runner to score and records his first blown save of the year before giving way to Kiko Calero. Calero tosses the next inning and allows a run on one hit and a walk. Alan Embree finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, pitching the final inning and a third and allowing a run on three hits and a walk. Oakland plates a run in the ninth on a Todd Walker single that scores Bobby Crosby, but is unable to do any further damage before recording the loss.

**May 3**

**May 4**

A's 5 @ Tampa Bay 2  
(14-14, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2.0)

Dan Haren pitches seven strong innings and the A's take game one of a three-game series, 5-2 in Tampa Bay. Haren allows two runs on four hits and no walks while striking out nine and does not factor in the decision. Oakland plates the first run of the game in the

first inning when Shannon Stewart singles to lead off the game and moves to second base on a Mark Ellis walk. Two batters later, Nick Swisher hits a fly ball to centerfield that proves deep enough to plate Stewart from third base. After Tampa Bay scores once in the fourth and sixth innings, the A's knot the game at two runs apiece with one of their own in the seventh. One-out walks to Chris Snelling and Stewart get the ball rolling for the Athletics, who plate the run on an Eric Chavez two-out single with runners at the corners. Justin Duchscherer relieves Haren to start the eighth inning and pitches a scoreless frame to keep the game tied. Swisher adds to his RBI total on the night in the ninth, blasting what proves to be the game-winning three-run home run with two out. Huston Street enters with a three-run advantage and quickly retires the three batters he faces to earn his eighth save of the season.

**May 5**

A's 2 @ Tampa Bay 3 (12)  
(14-15, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -2.0)

The A's carry a 2-1 advantage into the ninth inning, but Huston Street records his second blown save of the season in the ninth before Jay Marshall allows a run in the twelfth to hand Oakland the loss. Joe Kennedy turns in an outstanding pitching performance, tossing seven innings and allowing only one run on three hits and two walks before handing the ball over to Justin Duchscherer and Alan Embree in the eighth inning. Kiko Calero tosses two perfect innings in relief of Street before giving way to Marshall in the 12<sup>th</sup>. Nick Swisher leads the A's offensive effort, batting three-for-six with a double, a run scored and an RBI. Bobby Crosby and Chris Snelling each collect two hits in the game, with Crosby driving in the second Oakland run with a single in the eighth.

**May 6**

A's 5 @ Tampa Bay 3  
(15-15, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.0)

Dan Johnson singles home Chris Snelling in the first inning and Adam Melhuse plates two more with a bases-loaded single in the third as Oakland takes a 3-1 advantage into the fourth inning before taking the victory, 5-3. Tampa Bay answers back with two runs of its own in the fourth inning before Nick Swisher connects on his sixth home run of the season in the seventh and Jack Cust blasts his first home run as an Athletic in the eighth. Swisher finishes the game two-for-five with the homer. Joe Blanton turns in another fantastic start for the A's, pitching seven and a third innings and allowing three runs (two earned) and striking out six batters. Alan Embree takes the ball and tosses the final two-thirds of the eighth inning before Huston Street faces the minimum in the ninth and earns his ninth save of the year.

**May 7**

OFF DAY  
(15-15, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1.0)

**May 8**

A's 6 @ Kansas City 1  
(16-15, t-1<sup>st</sup>, —)

The A's score one run in the second and two in the third to take a lead they would not relinquish en route to a 6-1 victory over Kansas City in game one of a three-game series. Right-hander Chad Gaudin receives more than enough run support in the game, tossing eight innings and allowing the single run on five hits and one walk while punching out eight hitters. Oakland plates the first run of the game when Nick Swisher scampers home on a Jack Cust RBI groundout. Swisher switches roles in the third inning when he drives in Mark Ellis and Eric Chavez with a single to right field. Chavez and Bobby Crosby finish with two doubles apiece, including an RBI double for Crosby in the two-run fifth inning. Jay Witasick enters in the ninth inning and seals the victory for the A's.

**May 9**

A's 2 @ Kansas City 3  
(16-16, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -1.0)

Oakland pushes two runs across in the fourth inning, but that is all they muster before falling 3-2 to Kansas City. Dan Johnson sends a 1-0 pitch over the wall in right field to plate Nick Swisher and the only two A's runs in the game in the fourth. Dan Haren turns in another outstanding pitching performance, but does not factor in the decision after pitching six innings and leaving with the game tied at two runs apiece. Kiko Calero pitches a perfect seventh inning before handing the ball over to Justin Duchscherer in the eighth. Duchscherer surrenders what proves to be the game-winning home run to Mark Sweeney in the inning. Jason Kendall, who finishes the game with three hits, reaches with two out in the ninth, but Oakland is unable to muster any further offense.

**May 10**

A's 17 @ Kansas City 3  
(17-16, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.0)

Oakland explodes for seventeen runs on six home runs to rout Kansas City in the rubber game of a three-game series, 17-3. Dan Johnson and Jack Cust each blast two home runs in the game, and Johnson reaches safely in all six plate appearances on the day and finishes four-for-four with a double, a single, the two homers, two walks, four runs scored and four RBI. Eric Chavez, who connects for a three-run shot in the fourth inning, also collects four RBI in the game. Shannon Stewart notches his two RBI in the Oakland five-run second when he doubles home Mark Ellis and Marco Scutaro. Danny Putnam rounds out the Oakland home run clan, hitting his first career Major League round-tripper in the four-run seventh inning. Joe Kennedy gets the start and lasts six innings and allows three runs on four hits to record his first win of the season. Jay Witasick, Jay Marshall and Lenny DiNardo each pitch a perfect inning of relief to secure the lopsided victory.

**May 11**

A's 8 vs. Cleveland 2  
(18-16, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.0)

Oakland breaks a 1-1 stalemate with a five-run seventh inning before going on to defeat Cleveland 8-2 in game one of a three-game series. Oakland gets on the board for the first time in the fifth inning when Bobby Crosby hits his third home run of the season. The big blows in the seventh come when Jack Cust blasts a home run to plate Dan Johnson and Shannon Stewart doubles to right-centerfield to bring home Mark Ellis and Jason Kendall. On the ensuing play, Nick Swisher singles to score Stewart and cap the five-run inning. Cust knocks in the final two of his four RBI in the eighth when he singles to score Johnson and Crosby. Joe Blanton earns the win after tossing seven innings and allowing just two runs while striking out five hitters. Justin Duchscherer and Alan Embree each pitch a scoreless inning in relief to ensure the victory.

**May 12**

A's 3 vs. Cleveland 6  
(18-17, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -2.0)

The A's push three runs across in the bottom of the first inning, but are unable to plate any further offense over the final eight innings before falling 6-3 to Cleveland. After a Nick Swisher double scores Shannon Stewart, Jack Cust homers for the third consecutive day to cap the three-run first inning. Dallas Braden lasts only four innings and allows four runs (three earned) on six hits and a walk to record the loss. Kiko Calero and Lenny DiNardo combine to pitch the next two and two-thirds innings and surrender a run apiece before handing the ball over to Jay Witasick. Witasick finishes the seventh inning and contributes a scoreless eighth before Huston Street strikes out two of the three batters he faces in the ninth. Oakland is retired in order in the bottom of the ninth to even the series at 1-1.

**May 13**

A's 10 vs. Cleveland 7  
(19-17, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.0)

Jack Cust highlights a five-run Oakland rally with two out in the bottom of the ninth when he hits a game-winning "walk-off" three-run home run to give the A's the 10-7 victory in the rubber match of a three-game series against Cleveland. The home run marks the fourth consecutive game in which Cust homers. Bobby Crosby hits the first homer of the day for Oakland in the second to tie the game at one run apiece. After Cleveland posts four runs in the third, the A's answer back with two in the bottom half of the frame on one of Shannon Stewart's two hits and a Milton Bradley sacrifice fly. Eric Chavez makes it a two-run game in the seventh when he hits his fifth home run of the season with two out. After two quick outs in the ninth, Chavez singles to get the ball rolling for the A's. On the ensuing play, Milton Bradley ties the game with a home run to right field. Dan Johnson and Crosby keep the rally alive with back-to-back singles to bring up Cust for the fatal blow. Jay Witasick tosses a third of an inning and is credited with the win after relieving Alan Embree and recording the final out in the top of the ninth.

**May 14**

A's 1 vs. Kansas City 2  
(19-18, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -2.0)

Dan Haren and Gil Meche meet in a pitcher's dual that does not see a run until the ninth inning when Oakland falls to Kansas City, 2-1. Haren hands in another fantastic start for the A's, pitching eight scoreless innings and allowing just four hits while striking out eight batters. Meche is equally impressive when he pitches seven innings and holds the A's scoreless over the span. Justin Duchscherer inherits the ball from Haren in the ninth and allows a single and a home run to put the A's in a 2-0 hole. Oakland does not fall without a fight, plating a run in the bottom of the ninth but falling just short of the comeback. Bobby Crosby singles with one out in the inning and moves to second on a wild pitch. After the second out in the inning fails to move Crosby to third, pinch hitter Shannon Stewart singles home Crosby to cut the deficit to one run. Joakim Soria rebounds from the blow and manages to strike out Travis Buck for the final out of the game to earn his seventh save of the season.

**May 15**

A's 5 vs. Kansas City 4 (11)  
(20-18, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -1.0)

Oakland takes a 4-1 lead into the ninth inning but allows three runs in the frame that force extra innings before eventually taking another "walk-off" victory 5-4 in 11 innings. Nick Swisher finishes the game three-for-four with two walks and two runs scored, including the first run of the game in the two-run fourth inning. The A's score two more runs in the eighth inning, highlighted by an Eric Chavez RBI double and a Mark Ellis single that plates Chavez. Alan Embree takes over for the A's in the ninth inning and attempts to nail down the save. Embree lasts only a third of an inning and gives up two runs on two hits, including one of the two runs that score on Tony Pena's game-tying triple off Jay Witasick later in the inning. Jay Marshall replaces Witasick and stops the Kansas City rally. The A's combine back-to-back singles by Shannon Stewart and Swisher before Dan Johnson lofts a deep fly ball to centerfield that proves deep enough to plate Stewart from third base and give Oakland the victory. Lenny DiNardo records the win in the game after tossing a perfect top of the eleventh inning.

**May 16**

A's 3 vs. Kansas City 4  
(20-19, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -2.0)

The A's erase a 2-0 deficit with two runs in the seventh inning and one in the eighth, but Kansas City scores two in the top of the ninth to take the 4-3 victory. Oak-

land manages only five hits over the course of the game, including a two-for-three day with a double and two RBI from Jason Kendall. Both of Kendall's RBI come in the seventh inning when he singles home Mark Ellis and Marco Scutaro to knot the game at two runs apiece. Jack Cust gives Oakland its first and only lead of the game when he sends a 2-0 pitch over the left-centerfield wall for his seventh home run of the season. A's starter Joe Blanton leaves in the eighth inning with a 3-2 advantage, but Kiko Calero records his second blown save and third loss of the season when he allows two runs in two-thirds of an inning. Alan Embree retires the only batter faces to close the ninth and keep the A's just one run behind, but Oakland is unable to muster any offense in the inning and loses the one-run game.

**May 17**

A's 4 vs. Kansas City 7  
(20-20, t-3<sup>rd</sup>, -3.0)

Bobby Crosby hits his fifth home run of the season in the second inning and Mark Ellis bats three-for-four with a double and an RBI in a 7-4 loss to Kansas City. Crosby's solo homer in the second is the only Oakland run of the game until it plates three in the sixth. An Eric Chavez single and two walks load the bases and Crosby singles home the first of the runs in the inning. Travis Buck and Ellis drive in the final two A's runs of the game with a sacrifice fly and a single, respectively. Dallas Braden pitches the first five and a third innings and is tagged with the loss after allowing five runs on six hits. Connor Robertson makes his Major League debut in the fifth inning and throws the next inning and two-thirds and allows a run on three hits while striking out two batters. David Riske and Joakim Soria combine to pitch a perfect inning and two-thirds to close the game and give Soria his eighth save of the season.

**May 18**

A's 15 vs. San Francisco 3  
(21-20, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -3.0)

Oakland starts interleague play with a bang as it uses 14 hits to blow out cross-town rival San Francisco, 15-3, in game one of a three-game series. The A's plate at least one run in six of the eight offensive innings, including multiple runs in five of those six. Four Athletics finish with multiple hits in the game, led by Travis Buck's three-for-five day at the plate. Mark Ellis manages only one hit in the game, but it proves to be the loudest of all 14 when he hits a grand slam in the five-run eighth inning. Buck and Dan Johnson, who finishes two-for-three with four runs scored, also contribute a home run in the game. Chad Gaudin receives more than enough run support as he tosses six innings and gives up two runs before giving the ball to the Oakland bullpen. Jay Marshall, Kiko Calero and Ron Flores combine to pitch the final three innings to seal the victory.

**May 19**

A's 4 vs. San Francisco 2  
(22-20, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -3.0)

Oakland scores three first-inning runs and one in the eighth to take its second straight victory over San Francisco, 4-2. Jack Cust takes care of all the scoring in the first frame, blasting his eighth home run of the season to drive in all three A's runs. After a Cust walk starts the eighth inning, Bobby Crosby doubles to put runners at second and third to force the intentional walk of Travis Buck. Two batters later, Jason Kendall walks to drive in the final run of the game for Oakland. Shannon Stewart is the only Athletic to collect multiple hits in the game, finishing two-for-five. Dan Haren was excellent once again on the hill for Oakland, tossing seven innings and allowing two runs on three hits and two walks while striking out six batters. Jay Marshall and Kiko Calero combine to pitch a perfect eighth inning before Alan Embree converts his first save of the season with a perfect ninth.

**May 20**

A's 1 vs. San Francisco 4  
(22-21, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.0)

The A's are unable to record the series sweep of San Francisco as they collect only two hits and fall 4-1 in game three of the series. Giant starter Matt Morris baffles the Oakland bats as he tosses a complete game two-hitter and allows only the one run and strikes out nine. Both Athletic hits go for extra-bases as Dan Johnson doubles in the fourth inning and Travis Buck triples to centerfield before being brought home on a Johnson sacrifice fly. A's starter Joe Kennedy turns in an impressive start of his own, lasting seven and a third innings and surrendering only three runs. Lenny DiNardo closes the game on the hill for Oakland, pitching the final inning and two-thirds in the loss.

**May 21**

A's 5 @ Chicago 8  
(22-22, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.5)

Shannon Stewart and Nick Swisher each finish with three hits, but Oakland manages only three runs in the fifth and two in the eighth before falling 8-5 to Chicago. Swisher supplies all the run production for the A's, plating all five Oakland runs in the game, including a bases-loaded double that clears the bags in the fifth. The other two RBI come with two out in the eighth inning when he singles home Bobby Crosby and Mark Ellis. Joe Blanton gets the start and is tagged with the loss when he lasts only five and a third innings while allowing six runs (four earned) on eight hits and two walks before giving way to Jay Marshall and the Oakland bullpen. Marshall finishes the sixth inning and hands the ball over to Connor Robertson in the seventh. Robertson struggles and allows two runs on three hits after facing four batters. Ron Flores and Jay Witasick combine to pitch the final inning and two-thirds of scoreless relief.

**May 22**

A's 4 @ Chicago 10  
(22-23, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -5.5)

Oakland trails by six runs after two innings and never trails by less than five runs in the game before falling 10-4 in game two of a three-game series in Chicago. Colby Lewis makes his Oakland debut and allows all 10 runs on 12 hits in just three and a third innings pitched before being replaced by Lenny DiNardo. DiNardo baffles the Chicago bats from that point on, pitching four and two-thirds innings and allowing only one hit and a walk while striking out three batters. Marco Scutaro paces the Oakland offense, batting three-for-four with a home run in the third inning and three runs scored. Shannon Stewart supplies the other two RBI, plating Scutaro in both the fifth and ninth innings.

**May 23**

A's 4 @ Chicago 0  
(23-23, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.5)

A's pitching, led by starter Chad Gaudin, combine to toss a five-hit shutout and take a 4-0 victory over Chicago. Gaudin pitches seven and a third innings and allows all five hits while striking out four batters. Jay Marshall finishes the eighth inning before handing the ball over to Alan Embree in the ninth. Bobby Crosby gives Oakland the 1-0 advantage in the first when he singles home Shannon Stewart with two outs. Dan Johnson extends the A's lead to 2-0 with an RBI single in the fifth. Hiram Bocachica caps the Oakland scoring rally in the seventh, blasting a two-run shot in the frame. Embree's perfect ninth inning secures Oakland's third shutout of the season.

**May 24**

(23-23, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.0)

**May 25**

A's 3 @ Baltimore 2  
(24-23, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.0)

Nick Swisher hits a two-run home run in the third inning to guide Oakland past Baltimore, 4-2. Dan Haren records yet another stellar performance, pitching seven innings and allowing one run on two hits and a walk and leaving with a 3-1 lead. The third Athletic run comes on Hiram Bocachica's sacrifice fly in the fourth that scores Mark Ellis. Jay Marshall struggles in the eighth, surrendering a home run that shaves the lead to one. Kiko Calero enters with one out in the eighth and records the second out in the inning before Alan Embree contributes the final inning and a third to earn his second save of the season. Marco Scutaro is the only Oakland batter to collect multiple hits, finishing two-for-four in the game.

**May 26**

A's 3 @ Baltimore 8  
(24-24, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

Oakland trails by at least two runs throughout the game before eventually falling 8-3 to Baltimore. A's starter Joe Kennedy allows two runs in the first inning and seven runs over his four and two-thirds innings of work in the loss. Jay Witasick takes over and allows one more run in the fifth inning before recording the final out. From the fifth inning on, A's pitching allows no runs and only two hits. Nick Swisher's eighth home run of the season put Oakland on the board in the fourth inning. Travis Buck follows suit in the seventh, blasting a solo-shot to left-centerfield on a 3-2 pitch. Buck finishes the game as the only Athletic to collect multiple hits with a two-for-three day at the plate. Oakland's final run comes with two out in the ninth inning when Shannon Stewart singles home Buck.

**May 27**

A's 4 @ Baltimore 8  
(24-25, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

Nick Swisher homers for the third straight day and fifth time in five games in Baltimore, but the A's fall 8-4 in the rubber game of a three-game series. After Swisher scores on a Dan Johnson double in the fourth inning, his three-run home run cuts the Baltimore advantage to 5-4 and also caps the Oakland scoring for the day. A's starter Joe Blanton pitches six innings and allows eight runs on ten hits, including three home runs, before taking the loss. Ron Flores and Erasmo Ramirez each contribute perfect innings of relief out of the Athletics bullpen, with Flores striking out two of the three batters he faces. Oakland manages just two base runners in the final four innings of play before recording the loss.

**May 28**

A's 5 vs. Texas 3  
(25-25, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

The A's score all five of their runs in the first three innings and hold on to defeat Texas 5-3 in the first game of a ten-game homestand. Travis Buck gets the scoring started for Oakland when he homers in the first inning and gives the A's a 1-0 advantage. Bobby Crosby laces one of his two hits on the day, a double, into left field in the second inning before Jack Cust doubles off the base of the wall in left centerfield to extend the lead to 2-0 after two innings. Eric Chavez contributes the rest of the Athletic run support, pelting a three-run home run that scores Shannon Stewart and Buck in the third inning. Chad Gaudin turns in a fantastic outing on the hill for Oakland, pitching six and two-thirds innings and allowing an unearned run on four hits before giving way to the Athletics bullpen. Jay Marshall and Kiko Calero each surrender a run in relief, but Colby Lewis pitches a scoreless eighth to get the ball to Alan Embree for the save opportunity. Embree makes short work of the Ranger hitters in the inning, tossing nine pitches to earn his third save of the season.

**May 29**

A's 0 vs. Texas 4  
(25-26, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

The A's are shutout for the fourth time in the season despite collecting nine hits and leaving 12 runners on base against Texas. Shannon Stewart, Travis Buck and Marco Scutaro each collect two hits in the game, but a team of four Ranger pitchers are able to minimize the damage and secure the 4-0 win. Lenny DiNardo records the loss for the Athletics, pitching five and a third innings and allowing all four Texas runs. Colby Lewis contributes the final two-thirds of the sixth inning before handing the ball over to Ron Flores and Jay Witasick. The duo of relievers pitches the final three innings and allows only one hit over the span. Oakland struggles to get the timely two-out hit throughout the game, loading the bases in the first, putting runners at the corners in the second and runners at first and second in both the fourth and fifth innings without pushing a single run across. The A's load the bases once again in the ninth with one out, but a double play erases all hope for an Athletic comeback and ends the game.

**May 30**

A's 6 vs. Texas 1  
(26-26, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

Dan Haren gives yet another outstanding effort, and earns his sixth victory, when he tosses eight innings and allows one run on four hits and three walks to guide the A's to a 6-1 victory over Texas. The A's score two runs in the first to give Haren a lead he would not relinquish when Dan Johnson triples home Shannon Stewart and Nick Swisher with two out in the frame. Back-to-back doubles by Swisher and Milton Bradley put the A's up by a count of 3-1 in the third inning. Dan Johnson drives in the fourth Oakland run with a sacrifice fly in the fifth. Oakland plates the final two runs of the game in the sixth inning when Jason Kendall singles home Bobby Crosby and Travis Buck pushes Kendall home on a sacrifice fly. Kiko Calero replaces Haren in the ninth and retires Texas 1-2-3 to seal the victory.

**May 31**

OFF DAY  
(26-26, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.5)

**June 1**

A's 2 vs. Minnesota 3 (10)  
(26-27, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.5)

Joe Kennedy last eight innings and surrenders only one run, but does not factor in the decision as the A's fall 3-2 in 10 innings against Minnesota. After trailing 1-0 through the fifth, Oakland plates their first and game-tying run in the sixth when Eric Chavez hits his seventh home run. Alan Embree enters in the ninth inning and contributes a perfect inning of relief before handing the ball over to Kiko Calero in the 10<sup>th</sup>. The right-hander ran into trouble immediately when a leadoff double and an RBI-single quickly put the Twins ahead. Jay Marshall takes over after a walk put runners at first and second and he exits with the bases loaded two batters later. Colby Lewis takes the hill and allows a bases-loaded single that plates the eventual game-winning run. Oakland puts up a fight in the bottom half of the tenth, scoring one run when Dan Johnson lifts a sacrifice fly to right field to plate Travis Buck. Two batters later, and with runners at first and second, Joe Nathan strikes out Bobby Crosby to end the game.

**June 2**

A's 1 vs. Minnesota 0  
(27-27, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.5)

Joe Blanton tosses his second complete game of the season and shuts out the Twins, 1-0 in game two of a three-game series. Blanton is stellar in the performance, tossing only 108 pitches and allowing only three hits and no walks while striking out six. Minnesota's Carlos Silva was nearly as impressive, tossing a complete game and giving up only one run on five hits. Mark Ellis

leads off the sixth with a double before moving to third base on a Jason Kendall single. Without the benefit of an RBI, Oakland scores what proves to be the only run and game-winning tally in the game when Shannon Stewart grounds into a double play to score Ellis. For the A's, it is their fourth shutout of the season.

### June 3

A's 4 vs. Minnesota 2  
(28-27, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.5)

The A's score one run in the first and three in the third en route to a 4-2 victory over Minnesota. Mark Ellis collects another multi-hit game, finishing two-for-four with a double and a run scored that gives Oakland a 1-0 advantage after the first inning. Oakland puts pressure on Twins ace, Johan Santana, in the third inning. Shannon Stewart leads off with a single and moves to third base on back-to-back walks to Nick Swisher and Dan Johnson to load the bases. With one out, Eric Chavez plates the first run of the inning on a sacrifice fly that leaves runners at the corners. Bobby Crosby follows with a single to shortstop, but reaches third and pushes two runs across when the errant throw to first skips by the Minnesota first baseman. Chad Gaudin pitches the first five innings and allows only two runs to earn his sixth win of the season. The Oakland bullpen is stellar on the day, contributing four scoreless innings while not allowing a single hit over the span. Alan Embree enters in the eighth inning and pitches the final inning and a third to earn his fourth save.

### June 4

A's 5 vs. Boston 4 (11)  
(29-27, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.5)

Mark Ellis hits for the cycle and Dan Haren lasts seven and two-thirds inning and leaves with a 3-2 lead, but eventually earns a no decision when Alan Embree surrenders two Boston runs in the ninth before the A's take the 5-4 extra-inning victory on an Eric Chavez "walk-off" home run in the 11<sup>th</sup>. Ellis finishes four-for-five with a triple in the second, a home run in the fourth, a double in the sixth and a single in the 10<sup>th</sup>. Jay Marshall finishes the eighth inning in relief of Haren before Embree allows a two-out pinch hit single that plates the first run of the frame. The second comes when a single to right-centerfield allows pinch runner Coco Crisp to score from first base to tie the game. With two out in the 11<sup>th</sup>, Chavez connects on a 1-1 pitch and sends it over the wall in right field to give Oakland the victory. Santiago Casilla earns his first Major League win after tossing a scoreless inning of relief.

### June 5

A's 2 vs. Boston 0  
(30-27, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.5)

Lenny DiNardo, along with a team of four relievers, shut out the Boston Red Sox, 2-0, in game two of a four-game series in Oakland. DiNardo lasts six innings and allows only two hits before handing the ball over to Kiko Calero and the Oakland bullpen. Calero, Jay Marshall and Colby Lewis combine to pitch two innings of scoreless relief before Alan Embree tosses a perfect ninth to earn his fifth save of the season. Eric Chavez gives Oakland all the run support it would need when he homers to left-centerfield to lead off the fourth. The A's add an insurance run in the fifth when Jason Kendall scores on a two-out Nick Swisher double.

### June 6

A's 3 vs. Boston 2  
(31-27, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -5.5)

Eric Chavez, Jack Cust and Nick Swisher each double and Bobby Crosby drives in two runs en route to a 3-2 Oakland victory over Boston in game three of the four-game series. All three A's runs score in the fourth inning, including two on Crosby's single that plates Shannon Stewart and Cust. Joe Kennedy tosses a scoreless six inning before allowing two runs in the seventh. The left-hander allows two runs on seven hits and two

walks while striking out six over the seven innings of work. Colby Lewis inherits the ball in the eighth and retires the only two hitters he faces in the frame before giving way to Jay Marshall and Santiago Casilla, who contributes the final inning and a third to earn his first career save.

### June 7

A's 0 vs. Boston 1  
(31-28, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

Curt Schilling tosses a complete-game one-hitter and shuts out the A's in a 1-0 Boston win in the final game of a four-game series in Oakland. Schilling carries a no-hitter into the ninth with two out before Shannon Stewart drives a pitch past a diving second baseman and into right field. The only other Oakland base runner comes in the fourth inning when Dan Johnson reaches on a Julio Lugo error. Boston plates the only run it would need in the game in the first inning when David Ortiz connects on his 11<sup>th</sup> home run of the season off Oakland starter, Joe Blanton. Blanton is outstanding in the game, allowing only the one run on four hits and three walks in seven and a third innings of work. Ron Flores and Colby Lewis combine to pitch a perfect inning and two-thirds of relief for Oakland.

### June 8

A's 5 @ San Francisco 3 (10)  
(32-28, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

Travis Buck has four hits to guide Oakland offensively past cross-town rival San Francisco, 5-3 in game one of the series. Dan Johnson and Jason Kendall each pitch in two hits in the offensive effort for the A's, with Kendall also contributing two runs scored. Chad Gaudin turns in a strong effort, but does not factor in the decision. The right-hander lasts six and two-thirds innings and gives up two runs on six hits and four walks before giving way to Jay Marshall and the Oakland bullpen. Marshall surrenders the third and game-tying run and does not record an out in the seventh before handing the ball over to Santiago Casilla. Casilla finishes the frame and tosses a scoreless eighth inning to keep the game tied. Oakland finally breaks the stalemate in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning when Shannon Stewart lines a two-run single into left field that plates Mark Kotsay and Kendall. Alan Embree pitches a perfect 10<sup>th</sup> inning to earn his sixth save of the year.

### June 9

A's 6 @ San Francisco 0  
(33-28, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -6.0)

Dan Haren, Ron Flores and Colby Lewis combine to pitch Oakland's sixth shutout of the year as the A's defeat the Giants, 6-0 in game two of a three-game series. Haren tosses seven innings and surrenders five hits while striking out six before leaving the work for Flores and Lewis. The duo allows only two runners over the next two innings and secures the shutout victory. Three Oakland hitters connect for three hits in the game, and two others contribute two in the 16-hit offensive effort. Bobby Crosby and Mark Ellis add solo-home runs in the game, with Crosby hitting his sixth of the season in the third inning and Ellis belting his fifth in the eighth. Oakland scores three runs in the fifth inning on a fielding error off the bat of Dan Johnson, a Mark Kotsay single and a Jason Kendall sacrifice fly.

### June 10

A's 2 @ San Francisco 0  
(34-28, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

The A's score once in the eighth and ninth before shutting out the Giants for the second consecutive game. Marco Scutaro hits his third home run of the season to start the scoring in the eighth inning, and Shannon Stewart singles home Mark Kotsay in the ninth to cap the Oakland scoring. Lenny DiNardo pitches six innings and allows four hits and two walks while striking out five batters before recording a no decision. Matt Cain is nearly as impressive, throwing eight innings

and allowing only the home run to Scutaro while striking out eight batters. Santiago Casilla tosses two perfect innings of relief en route to his second victory of the season. Holding a two-run lead, Alan Embree retires the side in the ninth inning to record his seventh save of the year.

### June 11

(34-28, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

### June 12

A's 4 @ Houston 5 (11)  
(34-29, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

Oakland scores three runs in the second and one in the ninth before falling 5-4 in 11 innings to Houston in game one of a three-game series. A's starter Joe Kennedy helps himself offensively with a two-RBI double to plate Dan Johnson and Jason Kendall in the three-run third. The final run in the frame scores on a Mark Ellis single that pushes Kennedy home with two out. Kotsay, who finishes four-for-five on the day, adds the fourth and final Oakland run of the game in the ninth inning when he connects for his first home run of the season. On the hill, Kennedy tosses five innings and allows four runs on six hits and two walks while striking out two. Colby Lewis, Kiko Calero and Santiago Casilla each turn in perfect innings of relief, with Lewis pitching two in the game. Ron Flores hands in an inning and a third of work, allowing the winning run in the 11<sup>th</sup> on an Adam Everett double and a Brad Ausmus single to fall to 0-1 on the year.

### June 13

A's 7 @ Houston 3  
(35-29, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -5.0)

Jason Kendall connects on his first home run since May 31, 2006 to snap a 157-game drought and guide the A's past Houston, 7-3, in game two of the three-game series. Kendall finishes three-for-four with two runs scored in the game. Eric Chavez also homers, blasting his 10<sup>th</sup> of the season in the fifth inning. The A's explode for five runs in the eighth, with run producing doubles by Mark Kotsay and Mark Ellis, and a two-RBI single by Chavez. Joe Blanton gets the start and lasts seven innings and allows three runs en route to earning his sixth win of the season. Santiago Casilla and Alan Embree contribute scoreless innings in relief of Blanton to preserve victory.

### June 14

A's 6 @ Houston 5 (11)  
(36-29, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -5.0)

Oakland jumps out to an early 3-0 lead with three runs in the first inning, but uses a run in the top of the 11<sup>th</sup> to finally defeat Houston in game three of the three-game interleague series. Eric Chavez caps the three-run first inning with his 11<sup>th</sup> home run of the season and Jason Kendall finishes three-for-five with two doubles, but it is his game-winning RBI-single in the 11<sup>th</sup> to score Bobby Crosby that proves most significant. Dan Johnson also finishes the game with two doubles, and Marco Scutaro contributes his fourth homer of the year in the sixth inning. Chad Gaudin starts the game on the hill for the Athletics and allows all five Astros runs while lasting only four and a third innings before handing the ball over to the Oakland bullpen. A team of six relievers combine to pitch the final six and two-thirds scoreless innings, with Alan Embree tossing two innings to earn the victory. Santiago Casilla converts his second save after retiring the side in order in the 11<sup>th</sup>.

### June 15

A's 14 vs. St. Louis 3  
(37-29, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -4.0)

The A's explode for six runs in the third and seventh innings en route to crushing St. Louis 14-3 in the first game of a three-game series. Jack Cust finishes three-for-four with a double and three runs scored. Dan

Johnson connects for a three-run home run in the seventh inning and Eric Chavez hits his 12<sup>th</sup> home run in the fifth. Mark Kotsay drives in three runs on the night, singling home a run in the third inning and two more in the seventh. Dan Haren receives more than enough run support in the victory, allowing only three runs (two earned) in seven innings of work while striking out eight batters. Ruddy Lugo tosses a perfect inning in relief of Haren before Erasmo Ramirez records the final three outs of the game in the ninth.

#### June 16

A's 6 vs. St. Louis 15  
(37-30, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -5.0)

Oakland pitching allows more than 10 runs for the first time in the season as the A's fall 15-6 in game two of the series against the Cardinals. St. Louis blows the game wide open when it posts 10 runs in the fifth inning. Chris Duncan's pinch-hit grand slam highlights the Cardinal double-digit frame. Mark Ellis and Nick Swisher each hit a home run in the game for Oakland, with Ellis blasting a three-run shot in the fifth and Swisher launching a solo-home run in the third. Jack Cust continues his outstanding series against the Cardinals, batting three-for-three with a double, two walks and two runs scored. Oakland starter Lenny DiNardo lasts only three and two-thirds innings and allows five runs before giving way to the bullpen. Ron Flores provides a bright spot out of the A's bullpen, tossing three scoreless innings and allowing only a hit and a walk while striking out five batters.

#### June 17

A's 6 vs. St. Louis 10  
(37-31, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -6.0)

Oakland scores five runs in the first inning, but is unable to hold the lead over the course of the game before falling 10-6 to St. Louis in game three of the three-game series. Jack Cust concludes his torrid series against the Cardinals, batting three-for-five with a double, a three-run home run, three RBI and two runs scored. Cust finishes the series batting .750 (9 for 12) with three doubles, a home run, three RBI, three walks and seven runs scored. Bobby Crosby finishes two-for-three with two doubles and two RBI in the game. Joe Kennedy tosses five innings and allows four runs (three earned) on seven hits and four walks before handing the ball over to the Oakland bullpen with a one-run advantage. Colby Lewis pitches the next inning of work while surrendering four runs and the Oakland lead to earn his second loss of the season. Santiago Casilla turns in another fantastic effort, tossing a scoreless inning and striking out two batters.

#### June 18

A's 6 vs. Cincinnati 1  
(38-31, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -6.0)

The A's score once in the first inning and five times in the fifth to take a 6-1 victory over Cincinnati in game one of a three-game series. Mark Ellis provides three of the five runs in the fifth when he blasts his seventh home run of the season over the left field wall. Nick Swisher collects three hits in the game, finishing three-for-four with a RBI. Joe Blanton turns in an outstanding start for the A's, lasting eight innings and allowing only one run and no walks while striking out five batters. Alan Embree finishes the game on the mound for Oakland after facing four batters in the ninth.

#### June 19

A's 2 vs. Cincinnati 5  
(38-32, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -6.0)

Oakland trails 4-0 after three innings before falling 5-2 to Cincinnati in game two of the three-game series. The A's manage just four hits over the course of the game, including two off the bat of Mark Ellis. Kurt Suzuki connects for his first Major League home run in the eighth to cut the Cincinnati lead to 5-2. The first A's run comes in the sixth inning when Mark Kotsay plates

Travis Buck with an RBI-double into the right-centerfield gap. Chad Gaudin gets the start for the A's and lasts six and two-thirds innings while allowing four runs before giving way to Jay Marshall and the bullpen. Colby Lewis starts the eighth inning and surrenders one run on two hits in two-thirds of the inning. Right-hander Santiago Casilla tosses a scoreless inning and a third to close the game on the hill for Oakland.

#### June 20

A's 5 vs. Cincinnati 3  
(39-32, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -6.0)

The A's overcome a 3-0 advantage to take a 5-3 victory over Cincinnati, ensuring the series win over the Reds. Fourth inning home runs off A's starter Dan Haren by Adam Dunn and Josh Hamilton provide the three-run cushion for Cincinnati. Jack Cust answers back for the Athletics in the bottom of the frame when he hits a two-run shot over the wall in left-centerfield. Mark Kotsay connects for two doubles in the game and Shannon Stewart hits his third homer of the year in the eighth. The A's take the lead in the seventh on a bases-loaded walk to Nick Swisher and a sacrifice fly by Eric Chavez. Dan Haren turns in an outstanding start, tossing seven innings and allowing three runs while striking out five before giving way to Alan Embree. Embree retires six straight hitters, including three via strikeout, to earn his eighth save of the year.

#### June 22

A's 1 @ New York Mets 9  
(39-33, 2<sup>nd</sup>, -7.0)

Oakland trails 1-0 after one inning and does not hold a lead over the course of the game before falling 9-1 to New York in game one of a three-game series. The A's plate their only run of the game in the second when Shannon Stewart connects for his fourth home run of the season. (39-34, t-2<sup>nd</sup>, -8.0)

Joe Blanton turns in an outstanding effort on the hill for Oakland but receives a no decision as the A's are shutout for the sixth time in 2007. Blanton tosses eight innings and allows no runs on five hits while striking out six batters before giving way to Santiago Casilla in the ninth. Casilla finds himself in trouble from the beginning when he allows a double and an intentional walk before David Wright connects on a "walk-off" double to plate the game's only run. Mark Ellis and Bobby Crosby each collect two hits in the game, but Oakland manages to put a runner at second base only twice before taking the loss.

#### June 24

A's 2 @ New York Mets 10  
(39-35, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

Oakland has a streak of 46 series of three games or more without being swept snapped when the Mets complete the three-game sweep of the A's with a 10-2 victory in game three of the series. Jack Cust ends a 21-inning Athletic scoring drought when he blasts his 11<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the fifth inning. Oakland plates their final run of the game in the sixth when Mark Kotsay doubles and Eric Chavez singles him home two

batters later. Joe Kennedy takes the loss after pitching four innings and allowing five runs. Colby Lewis tosses two and two-thirds innings and gives up one run on two hits and two walks in relief of Kennedy. Jay Marshall and Ron Flores each surrender two runs over the final inning and a third.

#### June 25

A's 2 @ Cleveland 5  
(39-36, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

The A's plate two runs in the second inning to take the early 2-0 lead, but surrender a run in the bottom of the frame and two in the fourth and eighth innings in the 5-2 loss to Cleveland in game one of a four-game series. Cleveland's C.C. Sabathia tosses a complete game and strikes out eight batters to earn his 11<sup>th</sup> victory of the season. Shannon Stewart, who embarks on what will be a 15-game hitting streak, and Dan Johnson each finish with two hits to lead Oakland offensively. Johnson drives in the first run of the game when he plates Jack Cust with a RBI-groundout. Mark Kotsay follows one batter later when he singles home Bobby Crosby for the final run of the game for Oakland. Chad Gaudin lasts six innings and allows only three runs, but is left with his third loss of the season. Rich Harden pitches a perfect inning of relief and strikes out two of the three batters he faces. Alan Embree finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, tossing an inning and allowing two runs on three hits and a walk.

#### June 26

A's 5 @ Cleveland 8  
(39-37, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

Oakland takes a 5-3 lead into the bottom of the ninth before Kelly Shoppach connects on a "walk-off" three-run homer over the left field wall to give the Indians the 8-5 victory in game two of the four-game series. Mark Ellis and Shannon Stewart account for seven of the 10 Oakland hits in the game. Ellis finishes four-for-five with a double, a home run, a run scored and three RBI. Stewart collects three hits and two runs scored, including blasting his fifth home run of the season in the ninth inning. Jack Cust also homers in the game, sending his 12<sup>th</sup> of the year over the wall in the second inning. Dan Haren allows three runs in six and two-thirds innings of work before handing the ball over to Santiago Casilla. Casilla tosses a scoreless inning and a third before Alan Embree enters in the ninth. The left-hander allows five runs and walks three batters in two-thirds of the inning to record his second blown save and first loss of the year.

(40-37, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.0)

The A's explode for nine runs over the first two frames and hold on to take the 13-7 victory over the Indians in game three of the series in Cleveland. Jack Cust provides all the offense in the first inning, blasting a three-run shot over the wall in centerfield. Kurt Suzuki contributes his second homer of the year in the six-run second, connecting on a 2-2 pitch with Marco Scutaro on first base. RBI-doubles by Nick Swisher and Eric Chavez plate two more runs in the inning before a Dan Johnson single caps the Oakland scoring run. Chavez collects three hits total in the game, while Shannon Stewart finishes with four hits and three runs scored. Lenny DiNardo tosses the first five innings and allows only two runs before handing the game over to the Oakland bullpen. Colby Lewis and Dallas Braden combine to allow five runs over the next two frames, but Santiago Casilla seals the A's victory with two scoreless innings of relief.

(40-38, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.5)

Oakland scores a run in the first and two in the second to take an early 3-0 advantage before allowing a run in

the fifth and three in the seventh to take the 4-3 loss to Cleveland in game four of the four-game series. Dan Johnson finishes four-for-four with a double, a home run in the second inning, a run scored and an RBI. Jack Cust collects three hits and a run scored, while Eric Chavez and Mark Kotsay each contribute RBI-singles. Joe Blanton gets the start and lasts six and a third innings while allowing three runs before giving way to the A's bullpen. Ron Flores records his first blown save and second loss of the season after tossing only a third of an inning and surrendering one run on two hits. Ruddy Lugo pitches a scoreless inning and a third to close the game on the hill for Oakland.

### June 29

A's 1 @ New York Yankees 2  
(40-39, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.5)

Shannon Stewart finishes a perfect three-for-three at the plate, but the A's manage only one run in the game before falling 2-1 to New York in game one of a three-game series. Oakland plates its only run of the game in the seventh inning when Eric Chavez doubles and moves to third on a Mark Ellis single. Dan Johnson fails to record the RBI, but does plate Chavez when he grounds into a double play. Joe Kennedy turns in a fantastic performance on the mound for the A's, pitching six innings and allowing two runs on seven hits and three walks while striking out five batters. Dallas Braden tosses the final two scoreless innings on the mound for Oakland in the loss.

### June 30

A's 7 @ New York Yankees 0  
(41-39, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.5)

Chad Gaudin and Rich Harden combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in game two of the three-game series in New York. The shutout is the eighth of the season for Oakland. Gaudin gets the start and tosses seven innings and allows only one hit, a Johnny Damon single in the sixth inning, while striking out four batters. Harden takes over in the eighth and pitches two scoreless innings with two strikeouts. Oakland blasts three home runs in the game, with the first coming off the bat of Jason Kendall in the third inning. Shannon Stewart makes it back-to-back shots when he connects on his seventh homer of the season one batter later. Dan Johnson provides all the run support in the sixth inning when he sends a 1-2 pitch over the wall for a two-run homer. Nick Swisher adds to his RBI total for the year and to the Oakland advantage when he plates two runs with a double in the three-run Athletic seventh.

### July 1

A's 11 @ New York Yankees 5  
(42-39, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.5)

Oakland explodes for a seven-run second inning to take the 11-5 victory and the three-game series against the Yankees. Four straight A's singles plate the first run of the frame, but it is Jack Cust and Dan Johnson who do the majority of the damage when Cust sends an Andy Pettitte pitch over the wall for a three-run homer. After an Eric Chavez double, Johnson plates Chavez with a two-run shot over the right field wall to cap the scoring run and chase the veteran Pettitte. Dan Haren earns the victory after tossing five and a third innings and allowing five runs on eight hits and two walks while striking out five batters. Dallas Braden finishes the sixth inning on the hill before giving way to Santiago Casilla for the next two scoreless frames. Alan Embree closes the door on the Yankees when he tosses a scoreless ninth inning to seal the victory.

### July 2

A's 7 vs. Toronto 11  
(42-40, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

Oakland surrenders six runs in the third inning en route to taking an 11-7 loss to Toronto in game one of a three-game series. Lenny DiNardo lasts only two and a third

innings and allows six runs (four earned) on eight hits and a walk before handing the ball over to Colby Lewis and the A's bullpen. Lewis tosses the next three and two-thirds innings while surrendering two runs and striking out three batters. Ron Flores gives up three more runs over the next two and a third innings before Jay Marshall finishes the game on the hill for Oakland. Dan Johnson launches his 10<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the fourth inning as part of his three-hit and three-RBI day. Shannon Stewart also finishes with three hits on the day, while Marco Scutaro, Mark Ellis and Nick Swisher each collect a double in the game.

(43-40, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.0)

Joe Blanton pitches his third complete game of the year, and the A's score runs in the first and second innings and one in the eighth to earn a 3-1 victory over Toronto in game two of the three-game series. Blanton allows a single run on two hits in the first inning before allowing no runs and only two hits and a walk over the final eight frames. Mark Kotsay drives in the first and second Athletic runs of the game with a groundout in the bottom of the first inning and a RBI-single in the second. Jack Cust extends the Oakland lead to 3-1 in the eighth when he blasts his 15<sup>th</sup> home run of the season, a solo-shot over the wall in left-centerfield.

### July 4

A's 3 vs. Toronto 10  
(43-41, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.0)

The A's allow four runs in the first inning and trail 10-0 headed into the bottom of the eighth before falling 10-3 in the final game of a three-game series against the Blue Jays. Joe Kennedy lasts only two-thirds of an inning, allowing four runs on four walks and two hits before giving way to the Oakland bullpen. Shane Komine pitches the next six and a third innings and surrenders four runs on six hits and a walk while striking out one batter. Jay Marshall tosses the final two innings on the hill for Oakland and allows the final two runs of the game for Toronto. After a Shannon Stewart single, back-to-back doubles by Nick Swisher and Jack Cust result in the first two Oakland runs of the game. Oakland scores twice in the bottom of the sixth inning, and holds on to take the 3-2 victory over Seattle in game one of the four-game American League West series. Chad Gaudin throws seven and two-thirds innings and allows only two runs to earn his eighth victory of the season. Santiago Casilla retires the only batter he faces in the eighth inning before Alan Embree tosses a scoreless ninth to convert his ninth save of the year. Jack Cust plates Shannon Stewart with a RBI-single in the third inning to even the game at one run apiece. The A's make use of the long ball to take the lead and victory in the sixth inning when Nick Swisher and Bobby Crosby each connect for solo-homers.

### July 6

A's 1 vs. Seattle 7  
(44-42, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -8.0)

The A's manage only five hits and one run before falling 7-1 in game two of the four-game series against the Mariners. Dan Haren is tagged with only his third loss of the season after tossing six and a third innings and allowing four runs (three earned) on seven hits and one walk. Joe Kennedy pitches two-thirds of an inning and surrenders two runs before giving way to Colby Lewis for the final two innings on the hill for Oakland. A Dan Johnson RBI-double in the fourth inning provides the only run of the game for Oakland.

### July 7

A's 0 vs. Seattle 4  
(44-43, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

The A's are shutout for the seventh time on the season, and second time by the Mariners, in the 4-0 loss to Seattle in game three of the four-game series in Oakland. Mariner starter Felix Hernandez lasts eight innings and allows only two hits over that span, singles to Shannon Stewart and Mark Ellis. For Stewart, the single in the sixth inning extends his hitting streak to 13 games. Rich Harden takes the loss after pitching two and two-thirds innings and allowing four runs on five hits and three walks. Lenny DiNardo supplies an outstanding effort out of the Oakland bullpen, pitching six and a third scoreless innings and striking out five in the loss.

### July 8

A's 3 vs. Seattle 7  
(44-44, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.0)

Oakland holds a 3-2 advantage after five innings, but is unable to maintain the lead before falling 7-3 to Seattle in the final game of the first half of the season. Joe Blanton pitches six innings and allows six runs (five earned) on 12 hits before being ejected in the seventh inning for his actions in a physical altercation between the two squads. Santiago Casilla tosses the next two scoreless innings before Alan Embree contributes the final inning in relief and allows one run in the frame. Eric Chavez puts the A's on the board in the second inning when he connects on a solo-homer over the right field wall. ### July 12

A's 2 @ Minnesota 6  
(44-45, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -9.5)

Shannon Stewart finishes with two hits, including a RBI-double in the fifth inning before Oakland drops the first game of a four-game series at Minnesota, 6-2. Nick Swisher and Bobby Crosby each contribute a double in the game, but the A's plate only two runs in the fifth inning in the loss. Following the Stewart double in the inning, Mark Kotsay plates the final A's run of the game with a single into center field. Chad Gaudin pitches the first four innings and allows five runs on six hits and five walks before giving way to the Oakland bullpen. Joe Kennedy tosses the next two and a third innings, surrendering a run on two hits while striking out two batters. The trio of Kiko Calero, Jay Marshall and Andrew Brown combine to throw the final scoreless inning and two-thirds for Oakland.

### July 13

A's 3 @ Minnesota 5  
(44-46, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -10.5)

The A's are shutout over the first eight innings of play before plating three runs in the top of the ninth and falling just short of the come-from-behind victory in a 5-3 loss to Minnesota. After a Nick Swisher hit-by-pitch, Eric Chavez uncorks his 14<sup>th</sup> homer of the season to cut the Twins advantage to 5-2 with no outs in the ninth. With Minnesota's closer, Joe Nathan, on the mound, Oakland plates its final run with two out in the frame when Jason Kendall doubles home Bobby Crosby. Lenny DiNardo pitches the first five innings, allowing three runs (two earned) on eight hits and two walks before handing the ball over to Kiko Calero and the Oakland relievers. Calero surrenders two runs in one inning of work before being replaced by Santiago Casilla. Casilla and Colby Lewis team to pitch the final two scoreless frames on the mound for the A's, highlighted by Lewis' two strikeouts over his one inning of work.

A's 3 @ Minnesota 4  
(44-47, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -11.5)

The A's manage only three runs on three hits in the game before falling 4-3 and losing the four-game series against the Twins. Mark Kotsay contributes all the offensive output for the A's, driving in all three Oakland runs. Kotsay makes use of an RBI-groundout to give Oakland an early 1-0 advantage in the second inning and connects on a two-RBI double to right-center field in the seventh inning that scores Jack Cust and Dan Johnson. Joe Blanton once again pitches deep into a game before taking a loss, this time pitching seven and two-thirds innings and allowing four runs on 10 hits and walking only one batter. Alan Embree relieves Blanton and records the final out on four pitches to close the game on the hill for Oakland.

Jack Cust drives in three of the Oakland four runs in the game, but the A's pitching staff allows 11 runs on 15 hits to hand the Athletics their ninth straight loss, an 11-5 decision against Texas. Cust hits his 16<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the fifth, a towering two-run shot to left-center field. Cust and Kurt Suzuki each collect a sacrifice fly to drive in the other two Oakland runs in the game. Shannon Stewart and Mark Ellis finish with two hits in the game, including Stewart's double in the eighth inning. Chad Gaudin surrenders five runs in six innings of work and a trio of Oakland relievers, Andrew Brown, Joe Kennedy and Jay Marshall, allows six more runs over the next one and two-thirds innings. Shane Komine proves to be a bright spot out of the bullpen, tossing a perfect inning and a third to close the game on the hill for Oakland.

(45-50, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -11.0)

Lenny DiNardo and Santiago Casilla combine to pitch the ninth shutout of the season for Oakland, a 6-0 vic-

tory over Texas to end a nine-game losing streak. DiNardo pitches a career-high seven innings and allows only three hits while striking out three batters. In addition, DiNardo retires 13 of the first 14 Texas batters in the game, including the first eight in a row to start the game. Casilla faces only seven batters over his two innings pitched and strikes out one to seal the shutout victory. Mark Ellis connects on his ninth home run of the season in the sixth inning to plate the only Oakland run of the game. Oriole starter Erik Bedard allows only the one hit in seven innings pitched en route to the victory. Joe Blanton gets the start and lasts five and two-thirds innings while allowing six runs (five earned) on 10 hits and a walk. Jay Marshall, Andrew Brown and Joe Kennedy combine to pitch the final three and a third scoreless innings, including two perfect innings of relief by Brown and one by Kennedy.

**July 21**

A's 4 vs. Baltimore 3  
(46-51, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -10.5)

Dan Haren and the A's even the three-game series against Baltimore after taking game two by a count of 4-3. Haren tosses six and two-thirds innings and allows three runs on seven hits and two walks while striking out seven batters en route to his 11<sup>th</sup> victory of the season. Santiago Casilla pitches the next scoreless inning and a third before giving way to Alan Embree for the save opportunity. Embree walks a batter in the ninth, but is able to convert his 10<sup>th</sup> save of the season while recording one strikeout. Shannon Stewart singles in the first and Travis Buck singles in the third to collect the only two Oakland hits in the game. Dallas Braden is the tough-luck loser, pitching seven innings and allowing one run on four hits and four walks before giving way to Andrew Brown in the eighth. Brown surrenders one run in an inning and two-thirds of work before Kiko Calero records the final out on the hill for the A's.

**July 23**

A's 12 @ Los Angeles 6  
(47-52, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -10.5)

Oakland scores four times in the first inning en route to routing Los Angeles 12-6 in game one of a three-game series. Mark Ellis homers twice in the game and doubles home a run in the first inning and Mike Piazza contributes a three-run shot in the fourth. Kurt Suzuki fin-

ishes with two hits including a double and two runs scored, and Shannon Stewart and Marco Scutaro also collect a pair of hits in the game. A's starter Chad Gaudin surrenders five runs on six hits and six walks in three and two-thirds innings of work before giving way to the bullpen. Travis Buck has a hand in all of Oakland's run production, finishing with four hits and three-RBI, including a RBI-double in the second inning and his seventh home run of the season in the seventh. Mike Piazza gets the A's on the board in the first when he plates Buck on a sacrifice fly and Buck drives in the final Oakland run of the game in the eighth with a RBI-single to bring home Eric Chavez. Alan Embree pitches the final inning and a third to preserve the one-run advantage and earn his 11<sup>th</sup> save of the season.

**July 25**

A's 6 @ Los Angeles 7  
(48-53, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -10.5)

The A's score three runs in the top of the ninth before Los Angeles plates the game-winner in the bottom half of the frame to hand Oakland the 7-6 loss in game three of the three-game series. Mike Piazza finishes three-for-five with his third home run of the year and two runs scored while Mark Kotsay contributes three hits, including a double, in the loss. A's starter Joe Blanton allows five runs on 11 hits before handing the ball over to Andrew Brown and the bullpen. Brown tosses a scoreless inning before Kiko Calero surrenders a run on one hit and two walks in the eighth. Joe Kennedy records his ninth loss of the season after entering in the ninth inning and allowing the game-winning unearned run on a Maicer Izturis single into left field.

Seattle makes use of five relievers to ensure Horacio Ramirez' sixth win of the year. Closer J.J. Putz finishes the game on the hill for the Mariners, pitching the final inning and a third to convert his 30<sup>th</sup> save of the season.

### July 29

A's 10 @ Seattle 14  
(49-56, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

Oakland drops the series against Seattle after losing a 14-10 slugfest in the final game of the four-game series against the Mariners. Mike Piazza finishes three-for-five with three RBI and Nick Swisher contributes three RBI of his own in the four-run sixth when he doubles into the left-centerfield gap to unload the bases. Shannon Stewart connects on his eighth home run of the season in the fifth inning before adding a RBI-single in the seventh inning to score Kurt Suzuki. Lenny DiNardo lasts three innings and allows seven runs on seven hits and two walks before giving way to the bullpen. Andrew Brown and Kiko Calero combine to pitch the next three perfect innings of relief before Santiago Casilla is charged with his second blown save of the year when he allows three runs over an inning of work. Huston Street follows by surrendering four runs (two earned) over the next two-thirds of an inning before Joe Kennedy records the final out on the hill for Oakland.

### July 30

A's 2 vs. Detroit 5  
(49-57, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

The A's manage just two runs in the fourth inning before falling 5-2 against Detroit in game one of a three-game series against the Tigers. Mark Kotsay doubles home Marco Scutaro in the frame and Kurt Suzuki follows suit when he plates Kotsay with two out in the inning. For Kotsay, the double is part of a two-for-two day at the plate including two walks. Joe Blanton, who is tagged with his eighth loss of the year, pitches the first six and two-thirds innings and allows five runs before giving way to Kiko Calero and the Oakland bullpen. Calero pitches the next scoreless inning and a third before Alan Embree turns in a perfect ninth inning to finish the game on the mound for the A's.

### July 31

A's 7 vs. Detroit 3  
(50-57, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

Oakland explodes for four runs in the sixth and two in the seventh to earn a 7-3 victory over Detroit in game two of the three-game series. Kurt Suzuki and Jack Cust each record a two-RBI single in the sixth inning to give the A's a two-run advantage. The Athletics extend their lead in the seventh when Suzuki singles home Marco Scutaro and Travis Buck plates Donnie Murphy on a sacrifice fly. Dan Haren records his 13<sup>th</sup> victory of the season after pitching six innings and allowing three runs (two earned) on six hits and a walk while striking out three batters. Huston Street, Santiago Casilla and Alan Embree each contribute an inning of scoreless relief to ensure the win.

### August 1

A's 3 vs. Detroit 2  
(51-57, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Mark Ellis hits his 13<sup>th</sup> home run of the season as the A's earn a one-run victory over Detroit by a count of 3-2 in the final game of the three-game series. Ellis' sixth-inning blast proves to be the game-winner as it breaks a 2-2 tie. Travis Buck doubles twice in the game and scores once to help pace the Oakland offense. A Shannon Stewart RBI-double and a Mike Piazza single plate the first two A's runs in the second inning. Dallas Braden lasts five and a third innings and surrenders two runs on four hits and two walks while striking out three in a no decision. Andrew Brown is charged with his first blown save of the year before eventually earning his first victory. The right-hander works an inning and a third before Santiago Casilla contributes two-thirds of an inning in relief. Alan Embree pitches a perfect inning and two-thirds to seal the victory and claim his 12<sup>th</sup> save of the season.

### August 2

A's 4 vs. Los Angeles 6  
(51-58, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

The A's score two runs in the bottom of the ninth before eventually falling short 6-4 in the first game of a four-game series against Los Angeles. Mark Ellis hits a home run for the second consecutive game, running his season total to 14, and Donnie Murphy hits a two-run shot, his first of the year, with two outs in the ninth. Nick Swisher plates the only other Oakland run in the game when he singles home Murphy in the fifth. Chad Gaudin pitches six innings and allows five runs on seven hits and three walks while striking out three batters before being handed his seventh loss of the year. Andrew Brown pitches a scoreless inning of relief and Joe Kennedy allows a run in one inning of his own. Kiko Calero closes the game on the hill for Oakland, pitching the final perfect inning of relief with one strikeout.

### August 3

A's 8 vs. Los Angeles 4  
(52-58, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

The A's score five runs in the bottom of the eighth to erase a 4-3 deficit and take the 8-4 victory in game two of the four-game series against the Angels. Mark Kotsay and Dan Johnson each collect RBI-doubles in the game and Travis Buck caps the five-run eighth inning with a two-RBI double to plate Kurt Suzuki and Donnie Murphy. Lenny DiNardo turns in a strong performance in a no decision, lasting six innings and allowing three runs on five hits and two walks with two strikeouts. Huston Street pitches a scoreless seventh before Santiago Casilla allows a run in the top of the eighth and earns his third win of the year with the Oakland offensive explosion in the bottom of the frame. Alan Embree finishes the game on the mound for the A's, pitching a 1-2-3 ninth inning to seal the victory.

### August 4

A's 2 vs. Los Angeles 1  
(53-58, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -11.0)

The A's manage only two hits in the game before earning a 2-1 victory in a pitcher's duel that features Joe Blanton and Kelvim Escobar. Blanton pitches seven innings and allows one run en route to his ninth victory of the season while Escobar allows both Oakland runs in seven innings of his own. Huston Street and Alan Embree each pitch perfect innings of relief on the mound for Oakland, with Embree converting his 13<sup>th</sup> save of the season in the ninth. Travis Buck collects the only Oakland RBI in the game when he singles home Mark Ellis in the seventh. Jack Cust is the only other Athletic batter to record a hit in the game, singling in the fourth inning.

### August 5

A's 3 vs. Los Angeles 4  
(53-59, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Oakland holds a 3-2 advantage after six innings before Los Angeles plates two runs in the seventh to hand the A's a 4-3 loss in the final game of the four-game series. Dan Johnson connects on his 11<sup>th</sup> home run of the year, a two-run shot, in sixth inning and Jack Cust and Shannon Stewart each contribute two hits in the game. Dan Haren turns in another fantastic start, pitching the first six innings and allowing two runs while striking out six batters. Kiko Calero is charged with his third blown save and fifth loss of the season when he surrenders two runs on three hits in two-thirds of an inning of work. Andrew Brown does an outstanding job closing the game for Oakland, retiring the final seven batters he faces in order over the last two and a third innings.

### August 6

A's 9 @ Texas 7 (13)  
(54-59, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Despite scoring six runs in the first inning, Oakland needs extra frames before recording the 9-7 victory over Texas in game one of the three-game series against the Rangers. After succumbing to two quick outs in the first inning, the A's manage to plate one run on a Mark Ellis RBI-single and four more on a Marco Scutaro grand slam. Donnie Murphy caps the six-run inning when he makes it back-to-back home runs with his second round-tripper of the year. The A's use seven different pitchers in the game, including Dallas Braden who pitches the first five innings and allows three runs (two earned) while striking out seven batters. Alan Embree is charged with his third blown save of the year when he allows a run on two hits in two innings of work. Andrew Brown works the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> innings on the mound for Oakland before earning his second win. After Mike Piazza plates what proves to be the game-winning run in the top of the 13<sup>th</sup>, Kiko Calero secures the victory and earns his first save of the season.

### August 7

A's 6 @ Texas 8  
(54-60, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

Mark Ellis and Shannon Stewart each connect on two-run home runs in an 8-6 Oakland loss to Texas in game two of the three-game series. Ellis paces the A's offensively, finishing with three hits, including the homer, a double, two RBI and two runs scored. Stewart, Donnie Murphy and Kurt Suzuki each collect two hits and a run scored in the loss. Chad Gaudin gets the start for Oakland and pitches the first five innings, surrendering seven runs on eight hits and three walks while striking out seven batters en route to his eighth loss of the year. Ruddy Lugo tosses the sixth and seventh innings on the mound for Oakland before Santiago Casilla allows one run on no hits and three walks in the eighth.

### August 8

A's 6 @ Texas 3  
(55-60, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Rob Bowen blasts two home runs to guide Oakland to the 6-3 victory over Texas and the 2-1 series victory over the Rangers in the final game of the three-game series. Bowen records his first home run, a solo-shot, in the seventh inning before touching up Wes Littleton for a two-run homer in the eighth. For Bowen, the round-trippers are his first in an Oakland uniform. Marco Scutaro supplies a RBI-single in the second before Jack Cust contributes one of his own in the two-run third. Lenny DiNardo earns his sixth victory of the season after pitching six innings and allowing three runs on eight hits and three walks while striking out four batters. Huston Street and Santiago Casilla each pitch scoreless innings of relief before Alan Embree converts his 14<sup>th</sup> save of the season in the bottom half of the ninth.

**August 10**  
A's 16 @ Detroit 10  
(56-60, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Jack Cust collects seven RBI, including a grand slam in the eight-run sixth inning, as the A's crush the Tigers 16-10 in game one of a four-game series in Detroit. Cust's only other hit in the game is a bases-loaded double that clears the bases in the four-run Oakland third. Travis Buck has an outstanding day at the plate, finishing with four hits, including a double, a triple, three RBI and three runs scored. Donnie Murphy collects two of his three RBI on the day in the second inning when he connects on his third home run of the year. Joe Blanton surrenders nine runs in four innings of work before Ruddy Lugo earns his third victory of the season in two innings of relief. Andrew Brown and Huston Street combine to pitch the final three perfect innings out of the Oakland bullpen to secure the lopsided victory.

**August 11**  
A's 2 @ Detroit 5  
(56-61, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.0)

The A's push across a run in the third inning and one in the fifth before falling 5-2 to Detroit in game two of the series against the Tigers. Shannon Stewart collects two hits and a RBI in the game, while Donnie Murphy and Kurt Suzuki each record a double in the loss. Dan Haren loses for only the fourth time in the season after pitching six and a third innings and allowing three runs on nine hits (two home runs) and a walk. Santiago Casilla takes over and pitches the next inning and a third, surrendering two runs before Jay Marshall records the final out on the hill for Oakland.

**August 12**  
A's 6 @ Detroit 11  
(56-62, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -14.0)

A's starter Dallas Braden allows eight runs in only an inning and two-thirds of work en route to Oakland's 11-6 loss to Detroit in game three of the four-game series. Magglio Ordonez hits two home runs in the second inning to guide the Tiger offense. Ruddy Lugo does a fine job stopping the bleeding, tossing two and a third innings of scoreless relief before handing the ball over to Kiko Calero in the fifth. Calero lasts an inning and a third and allows two runs on three hits and two walks to give way to Jay Marshall. Marshall finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, pitching the final two and two-thirds innings, giving up one run on one hit and two walks over that span. Marco Scutaro has a standout game at the plate, collecting his sixth home run of the season, two doubles, four RBI and two runs scored.

**August 13**  
A's 7 @ Detroit 2  
(57-62, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -13.5)

The A's earn a split of the four-game series against Detroit after taking a 7-2 victory in the final game of the series against the Tigers. Mark Ellis gets Oakland on the board with two runs in the first inning when he blasts his 16<sup>th</sup> home run of the year. Shannon Stewart finishes four-for-five with three runs scored. Marco Scutaro produces three RBI in the game, including a two-RBI single in the fifth. Jack Cust and Kurt Suzuki collect three and two hits in the game, respectively. Chad Gaudin lasts six and two-thirds innings and allows only two runs to earn his ninth victory of the year. Andrew Brown tosses the next inning and a third, striking out three batters over that span before giving way to Huston Street. Street has no problem closing the door on the Tigers, punching out two of the three batters he faces in the inning to secure the Oakland victory.

**August 14**

(58-62, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.5)

Jack Cust hits two home runs and Donnie Murphy adds one of his own as the A's take game one of a three-game series against Chicago by a count of 4-3. Cust connects on solo-homers in the first and fourth innings and Murphy's solo-blast comes in the fifth. Cust drives in a third RBI in the sixth when he hits a sacrifice fly to plate Nick Swisher. Lenny DiNardo improves to 7-6 on the season after pitching five innings and allowing two runs on six hits and three walks. Santiago Casilla, Jay Marshall, Andrew Brown and Huston Street combine to pitch three scoreless innings of relief and allow only one hit and two walks over that span. Alan Embree records his 15<sup>th</sup> save of the season after pitching one inning and allowing a run on two hits while striking out one batter.

Kurt Suzuki hits a "walk-off" three-run home run in the bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup> inning to give Oakland an 8-5 victory and a series sweep over the White Sox in the final game of a three-game series against Chicago. Mike Piazza falls a double short of the cycle, tripling in the second inning, singling in the fourth and blasting his fourth home run of the season in the fifth. Mark Ellis contributes the second triple of the game in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning before Suzuki's heroics. Dan Haren is credited with a no-decision after pitching six innings and allowing four runs (two earned) on nine hits and two walks while striking out seven hitters. Andrew Brown allows a run over the next two innings before Alan Embree and Ruddy Lugo combine to pitch two scoreless innings, including a perfect inning of work by Lugo en route to his fourth victory of the season.

Dan Meyer is charged with his first loss of the season after pitching four innings and allowing six runs (three earned) on five hits and two walks. Kiko Calero pitches the next two scoreless frames before Santiago Casilla allows two runs on three hits in two innings of work. Jay Marshall finishes the game on the hill for Oakland, pitching the final inning and surrendering one run on three hits and a walk while striking out one batter.

**August 18**  
A's 3 vs. Kansas City 7  
(60-64, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

Jack Cust and Jeff DaVanon each collect two hits and a triple in the game before the A's fall 7-3 to Kansas City in game two of the three-game series against the Royals. Cust's triple results in the first of three Oakland runs in the sixth inning when Mike Piazza plates Cust with a double on the ensuing play. DaVanon's triple plates Piazza later in the inning before Donnie Murphy connects for a sacrifice fly to score DaVanon and cap the frame. Chad Gaudin gets the start for Oakland and lasts six innings while surrendering five runs on 10 hits and three walks. Jay Marshall and Ruddy Lugo each give up a run in relief, with Marshall contributing one inning and Lugo tossing two of his own while surrendering three hits.

**August 19**

Andrew Brown and Alan Embree each pitch scoreless innings of relief with one strikeout before Huston Street tosses an inning and strikes out two batters to convert his 12<sup>th</sup> save of the season.

(64-64, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -11.0)

Oakland scores all four of its runs in the seventh inning to earn a 4-1 victory over Toronto and sweep the three-game series against the Blue Jays. Jack Cust hits his

21<sup>st</sup> home run of the season, a two-run shot, in the frame and Mark Ellis adds a RBI-double to plate the third run of the frame. Esteban Loaiza shines in his first start off the DL in 2007, pitching seven and two-thirds innings and allowing a run on three hits and two walks while striking out four batters. Alan Embree finishes the eighth inning and tosses the ninth to convert his 16<sup>th</sup> save of the season.

#### August 23

A's 12 @ Tampa Bay 2  
(65-64, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -10.0)

Oakland explodes for 12 runs on 16 hits to demolish Tampa Bay 12-2 in game one of a four-game series against the Devil Rays. Mike Piazza finishes four-for-five with his fifth home run of the season, two doubles, five RBI and a run scored to pace the Oakland offense. Jack Cust also homers in the game, blasting his 22<sup>nd</sup> round-tripper in the second. The two-run homer accounts for two of Cust's three RBI on the day. Nick Swisher records three hits, including a RBI double in the five-run second inning. Chad Gaudin pitches the first seven innings and allows a single run over that span to improve to 10-9 on the season. Kiko Calero allows one run over one inning of work before Ruddy Lugo pitches a scoreless ninth to finish the game on the hill for Oakland.

Jack Hannahan provides all the scoring in the ninth, blasting his second home run of the season off Devil Rays starter Scott Kazmir. Joe Blanton gets the start for the A's and tosses the first five innings while allowing four runs. Andrew Brown contributes the next inning and allows two runs before Santiago Casilla gives up three runs in the seventh. Jay Marshall turns in a third of an inning while allowing five runs on four hits before Kiko Calero retires the final two Devil Rays in the eighth to finish the game on the hill for Oakland.

#### August 26

A's 4 @ Tampa Bay 7  
(65-67, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -12.0)

The A's score twice in the second and seventh innings before falling 7-4 to lose game four and the four-game series against Tampa Bay. Kurt Suzuki and Nick Swisher each collect three hits in the game, including Suzuki's solo-home run in the seventh. Both Swisher and Suzuki, along with Jack Hannahan, record doubles in the loss. Dan Haren is tagged with his fifth loss of the season after pitching six innings and giving up five runs (three earned) on four hits while striking out 10 batters. Alan Embree pitches a scoreless seventh in-

ning of relief before Huston Street finishes the game on the mound for the A's, allowing two runs on two hits while striking out two batters in an inning of work out of the bullpen.

(66-69, 3<sup>rd</sup>, -14.0)

Jack Hannahan records the first of his two "walk-off" wins on the homestand as he plates Marco Scutaro with a RBI-single in the bottom of the 11<sup>th</sup> to give Oakland the 5-4 extra-inning victory over Toronto in game three of the three-game series against the Blue Jays.
