After beginning the season in Triple-A, Jack Cust finished the 2007 season as the A's team leader in home runs (26) and RBI (82).

2007 Season In Review

2007 RECAP: The A's had their streak of eight consecutive seasons with a winning record come to an end in 2007 as they finished with a 76-86 record...it was the first time Oakland finished with a losing record since going 74-88 in 1998...finished in third place in the American League West, 18 games behind Los Angeles, and were sixth in the AL Wild Card, 18 games behind New York...it marked the first time the A's finished more than 14 games out of a playoff spot since 1997 when they were 25 games behind Seattle in the West...it was the first time the A's did not finish first or second in the West since 1998 when they finished fourth...the A's .469 winning percentage equaled the 11th lowest in the A's 40 seasons in Oakland...spent most of the season in third place in the West although the A's spent at least one day in every spot in the standings...had six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, 21 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 127 days in third, seven days tied for third and seven days in fourth...the A's continued their recent trend of slow starts as they were never more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 over the first two months of the season...put together more than two consecutive wins just once over the first 53 games, a four-game streak from April 15-20, and had just two losing streaks longer than two games over that stretch, a pair of three-game streaks...went 26-27 over that season opening stretch, which put the A's in third place in the West, 6½ games behind Los Angeles at the conclusion of play on June 1...then won a season high five consecutive games from June 2 to 6 and went 11-2 over a 13-game span from June 2 to 15...that gave the A's a 37-29 (.561) record at the conclusion of play on June 15, which was good for second place in the West, four games behind Los Angeles...had the eighth best record in baseball at the time...however, the eight games over .500 would be a season high as the A's went 39-57 (.406) over the final 96 games...had the second worst record in baseball from June 16 until the end of the season...only Tampa Bay, at 37-60 (.381), had a lower winning percentage...the A's pitching staff had a 3.13 ERA through games of June 15, which was the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the Majors...then compiled a 5.10 ERA from June 16 until the end of the season, which was third highest in the AL and sixth highest in the Majors...A's starting pitchers were 25-17 with a 2.99 ERA and .234 opponents batting average through June 15 and 27-43 with a 5.30 ERA and .297 opponents batting average after that...went 7-21 over a 28-game stretch from June 16 to July 17...capped that with a season high nine-game losing streak from July 6 to 17...the losing streak equaled the fifth longest in Oakland history and it was the A's longest since July 21-29, 1998 when they also lost nine straight...it equaled the second longest losing streak in the AL in 2007...went 12-12 over the next 24 games through August 12 to put the A's season record at 56-62...made a push for a .500 record by winning nine of 11 games from August 13 to 23...that moved the A's one game over .500 at 65-64 on August 23 but that would be their final day over .500...lost the next day to put the season record at exactly .500 for the 19th time in 2007...the only season in Oakland history in which the A's had more days at .500 was in 1968 when they did it 20 times...went 11-22 over the final 33 games beginning on August 24 and lost 10 of the final 12 games...were officially eliminated from the AL West on September 15 and were eliminated from the Wild Card on September 17 in game 152...that was the earliest the A's have been knocked out of the playoff race since 1998 when they were eliminated in game 151 on September 16.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's used the disabled list 22 times in 2007, tying the Oakland record set in 1992...A's players combined to miss an Oakland record 1259 games while on the DL, an average of 57.2 games per DL stint...11 of the 22 DL stints included time on the 60-day DL...the A's began the season with three players on the DL and did not drop below

that number all year...had at least five players on the DL every day beginning on April 27 and had 110 days with at least eight players on the DL...including a season high 11 from May 22-29 and on June 19...four players had multiple stints on the DL including three times by Milton Bradley and two times each by Travis Buck, Rich Harden and Mark Kotsay...Chris Denorfia, who was acquired from Cincinnati on April 27, missed the most games with 140 and Harden (133), Chris Snelling (129), Esteban Loaiza (127) and Justin Duchscherer (125) also missed at least 100 games...the injuries led to roster moves nearly every week of the season...the A's did not make their first 25-man roster move until April 23 when Bradley and Harden went on the DL and Dallas Braden and Danny Putnam were promoted...that was a streak of 21 days...after that, the A's did not go more than eight days without a move the rest of the season...from May 11 to July 25, the A's did not go more than three days without a 40-man roster move.

PLAYERS USED: The A's set an Oakland record by using a Major League leading 54 players in 2007...broke the previous mark of 49 set in 1997...it was the second highest total in franchise history to the 56 players used by the Philadelphia A's in 1915...also set Oakland record records with 12 center fielders and 18 outfielders and tied the mark with 13 left fielders...used 24 different pitchers, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 26 set in 1997...that includes 20 relievers, which was one short of the record of 21 in 1997...10 different pitchers started a game for the A's, which was their most since using 12 in 1999...used 30 position players, which was third most in Oakland history and the most since 1978 when they had 31...the record is 32 in 1972...17 of the 54 players (31.5%) were rookies, the A's most rookies in a season since 1997 when they also had 17...only the Yankees (19) and Colorado (18) used more rookies in 2007...the A's nine rookie position players combined for 288 games and 891 at bats and the eight rookie pitchers combined for 167 appearances and 237.1 innings pitched...had at least one rookie in the starting lineup in 129 of the 162 games, including four on 10 different occasions...nine of the 17 rookies made their Major League debut...only nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were on the A's active 25-man roster the entire season (Blanton, DiNardo, Ellis, Embree, Gaudin, Haren, Marshall, Scutaro and Stewart)...nine of the 32 players on the A's active roster at the end of the season were not in the organization on Opening Day.

OFFENSE: The A's ranked second to last in the American League with a .256 batting average and a .246 average with runners in scoring position...finished ahead of Chicago (.246 overall, .243 with RISP)...however, ranked second in the AL with 664 walks (Boston, 689) and had the sixth best on-base percentage (.338)...the walks were fourth most in Oakland history...scored 741 runs, which was fourth fewest in the AL and the fewest by an Oakland team in a non-strike season since 1993 when they had 715...were shutout 10 times, which was fourth most in the AL...ranked last in the AL in triples (16), stolen bases (52) and sacrifice hits (18)...the sacrifice hits were the fewest in franchise history, breaking the previous record of 19 in 2005...the triples were fourth fewest in A's history...had the fourth lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.407)...had the fewest caught stealings in the AL (20) and did not have a base runner picked off, the first time an Oakland team has gone an entire season without being picked off since the stat was tracked beginning in 1987...were third in the AL in pitches per plate appearance (3.91) and sacrifice flies (56).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 4.28 ERA, which ranked sixth in the American League...it marked the first time the A's did not finish in the AL top four in ERA since 1998 when they were ninth...it was the A's highest ERA since posting a 4.58 mark in 2000...now have a 3.89 ERA since 2001, which is the lowest in the AL over that span and tied with Atlanta for the lowest in the Majors...allowed 138 home runs, which was the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the Majors...since 1996, the only AL team to allow fewer home runs in a season was the 2002 A's (135)...had the third lowest opponents batting average (.263) and slugging percentage (.404) in the AL and the sixth lowest on-base percentage (.329)...had four complete games, which tied for eighth in the AL but was second fewest in franchise history (2 in 1997)...tied for third in the AL in shutouts (9)...topped 1000 strikeouts for the seventh consecutive season and the eighth time in franchise history...the 1036 strikeouts is the fourth highest single season total in A's history...had the most intentional walks (60) and sacrifices flies (60) in the AL...allowed 45 triples, which was second most in the AL and second most in Oakland history to the record of 48 in 1983.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers were 52-60 with a 4.29 ERA...ranked fifth in the American League in ERA and had the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.270)...the wins were fifth fewest in the AL and the fewest by A's starters since 1998 when they also went 52-60...allowed just 95 home runs, which was second fewest in the AL, and had the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.411)...issued the fourth most walks (325) and ranked sixth in on-base percentage (.330)...had the fewest hit batters in the AL (21), which was the fewest by A's starters since 1990 (17)...led the AL in triples (28), had the second most unearned runs (54), and the third lowest run support (4.86).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 36 of 61 (59.0%) save opportunities, which was the third lowest save percentage in the American League...tied for the fourth fewest saves in the AL...the 25 blown saves tied for the AL lead and were tied for third most in Oakland history...however, the A's were 11-14 in games in which the pen blew the save...Alan Embree led the team with 17 saves and Huston Street added 16, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's had two pitchers with 15 or more saves...Dennis Eckersley and Jay Howell tied for the team lead with 16 each in 1987...the pen was 24-26 with a 4.27 ERA and .249 opponents batting average...the ERA ranked ninth in the AL and was the highest by the A's bullpen since 2000 (4.48)...were fifth in the AL in opponents batting and had the third most losses...allowed 73 of 252 (29.0%) inherited runners to score, which ranked sixth lowest in the AL, and first batters faced hit .247, which was ninth lowest...had 43 intentional walks, which was the most by an AL bullpen and second most in Oakland history (48 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's finished fourth in the American League with a .985 fielding percentage, the first time they have not finished in the top two since 2003...committed 90 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the AL and was fourth fewest in franchise history in a non-strike season...however, the errors led to 69 unearned runs, which was third most in the AL...turned 153 double plays, which was fourth fewest in the AL...had a season best 10-game errorless streak from

August 28 to September 8 and that was the third longest errorless streak in Oakland history...had a 53-47 record when going errorless and were 23-39 when making one or more errors.

AT HOME: The A's were 40-41 (.494) at home and finished with a losing record in Oakland for the first time since 1998 when they went 39-42...had the fifth worst home record in the American League...won 12 home series, lost 13 and split one...batted .240 with 331 runs scored (4.1 per game) in Oakland compared to .271 with 410 runs scored (5.1 per game) on the road...had the lowest batting average and second fewest runs scored at home in the AL but had the third most runs and fifth best batting average on the road in the AL...the A's .240 batting average at home was their lowest mark in Oakland since 1982 when they hit .229...the 331 runs scored were their fewest in a non-strike season since 1990 when they had 321...the pitching staff compiled a 3.79 ERA in Oakland compared to 4.81 on the road...had the second lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth highest road ERA.

ON THE ROAD: The A's went 36-45 (.444) on the road, the third time in the last five years they have finished with a losing record away from Oakland...it was the A's worst record on the road since 1999 when they went 35-46...had the eighth best road record in the American League...went 18-14 (.563) over the first 32 road games through June 14 and then went 18-31 (.367) over the final 49 games beginning on June 22 at New York (NL)...won 10 road series, lost 13 and split 3...the A's .271 road batting average was fourth best in Oakland history...tied with New York for the AL lead in home runs on the road (94)...had just two triples, which were the fewest triples on the road by a Major League team in a non-strike season since 1957...the previous low was four by the 1998 A's.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: The A's were 44-44 at the All-Star Break, marking the first time they have not been over .500 at the break since 1999 when they were 43-44...then went 32-42 (.432) after the break, which was the fourth lowest winning percentage in the American League...it was the first time the A's had a losing record after the All-Star Break since 1998 (33-43, .434) and it was the A's worst post-break record since 1997 (28-45, .384)...had a 3.66 ERA at the break, which was the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the Majors...then posted a 5.04 ERA after the break, which was third highest in the AL and sixth highest in the Majors...it was just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's had an ERA over 5.00 after the break.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's went 12-13 in April, marking the fourth consecutive year and ninth time in the last 11 years that the A's have finished at or below .500 in the first month of the season...led the American League with a 3.16 ERA in April but hit just .230, their lowest mark in a month since June of 1982 when they hit .216...then went 14-13 in May and 15-13 in June...led the AL in ERA in both months with a 3.71 ERA in May and 3.63 in June...the A's batting average improved to .274 in May, their best one month average in 2007...went 9-18 in July, which ranked second worst in the AL and third worst in the Majors...it marked just the second time since 1998 that the A's lost more than 17 games in any month (7-20 in May, 2005)...hit .236 in July, which was the lowest average in the Majors and the A's lowest in July since hitting .235 in 1982...went 17-12 in August, which was fourth best in the AL...have a 141-57 (.712) record in August since 2001, which is the best record in the Majors over that span by 22½ games...the pitching staff set an Oakland record for strikeouts in a month with 223...broke the previous mark of 219 set in August of 1968...went 9-17 in September, their worst record in the final month of the season since 1985 when they went 8-20 (.286)...the pitching staff allowed a .301 batting average, the fifth highest one month average in Oakland history.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's were 11-5 in extra inning games and tied with Cleveland for the American League lead in extra inning wins...are now 52-24 (.685) in extra inning affairs since 2003, including 32-11 (.744) in Oakland...were 18-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the 18 last at bat wins tied for second most in the AL but the A's had just 27 come from behind wins, which was the fewest in the Majors...were 25-24 (.510) in one-run games, which was their worst record in one-run contests since going 16-19 (.457) in 1998...were fourth in the AL in one-run decisions...had a 27-24 record in

games decided in the seventh inning or later...had 11 "walk-off" wins...trailed Detroit 7-0 entering the bottom of the fifth inning on September 2, but came back to win 8-7 in 10 innings...that equaled the third largest deficit overcome to win in Oakland history...overcame a deficit of three or more runs

13 times and were 9-4 in those games...the largest lead the A's blew in a losing effort came on June 17 against St. Louis when they lead 5-1 entering the second inning and lost, 10-6...blew a pair of seven run leads on August 6 at Texas and August 10 at Detroit but came back to win both games...lost a lead of three or more runs 15 times and were 8-7 in those games.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters were 10 for 57 (.175) with no extra base hits, 10 RBI, six walks and 15 strikeouts...had the fewest pinch hits in the American League, the third lowest batting average and tied for the fifth fewest RBI...the 10 pinch hits were second fewest in one season in Oakland history...had eight pinch hits in 2006...it was the fifth time since 1974 that a Major League team has gone an entire season without a pinch extra base hit, the first time the A's

have done it...the A's last extra base hit from a pinch hitter was a double by Bobby Kielty on September 22, 2006...the A's .175 pinch slugging percentage was the lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history...had the fewest pinch plate appearances in the AL (64) and the third fewest in Oakland history...the A's are now 49 for 289 (.170) with eight doubles, four home runs and 43 RBI in the pinch over the last four seasons...have the fewest pinch extra base hits in the Majors over that span (12) and the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, .155).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters batted .269 with 26 home runs and 111 RBI...ranked third in the American League in RBI, fourth in batting and tied for sixth in home runs...led the AL with 161 strikeouts, which tied for second most in Oakland history...the A's were the only AL team without an intentional walk by a designated hitter and are just the third team in AL history to go an entire season without an intentional walk by a DH (Cleveland, 1986; Texas, 1982)...were one of two teams in the AL without a stolen base and the A's have not had a stolen base by a designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo on May 4, 2005 against Texas.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's finished interleague play with a 10-8 record, which tied for the seventh best mark in the Majors...it marked the ninth time in 11 interleague seasons the A's finished with a .500 record or better and the seventh time they have finished with a winning record...Oakland batted .265 with 92 runs scored (5.1 per game) and 23 home runs in 18 interleague games...added 83 walks, which led the Majors...the pitching staff compiled a 4.02 ERA...the A's have the second best all-time record in interleague play with a mark of 113-81 (.582), trailing the Yankees who are 113-79 (.589)...are 34-28 (.548) against San Francisco and 79-53 (.598) against the rest of the National League.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's combined for a 22-21 (.512) record against teams that made the playoffs and were 54-65 (.454) against everyone else...went 5-14 against Seattle, tying an Oakland record for most losses against one team in a season...went 4-14 against Minnesota in 1973...the A's best record in 2007 was their 5-1 mark against San Francisco...had a 24-33 record against American League West teams and finished with a losing record in division games for the first time since 1999 when they were 15-21...were 21-20 against the East and finished with a winning record against the East for the eighth time in the last nine years...went 21-25 against the Central, marking the first time the A's have finished with a losing record against the Central since 1999 when they were 26-30...were 39-15 (.722) when the starting pitcher lasted seven or more innings and 37-71 (.343) when the starter tossed fewer than seven innings...had a 62-26 (.705) record when scoring four or more runs and were 14-60 (.189) when scoring three runs or less...were 54-28 (.659) when scoring first and 22-58 (.275) when the opponent scored first...had a 45-20 (.692) record when out-homer the opposition and were 9-39 (.188) when hitting fewer home runs...were 24-22 (.522) in games started by a left-hander and 52-64 (.448) against right-handers...had an 19-33 (.365) record on the weekend and 57-53 (.518) from Monday through Friday...were 27-25 in the first game of a series, 26-26 in the last game of a series and 23-35 in between.

ATTENDANCE: The A's drew 1,921,834 fans to McAfee Coliseum in 2007, which was the A's lowest attendance since 2000 when they drew 1,728,886...it was the fourth consecutive season the A's attendance decreased...ranked 12th in the American League in attendance for the second consecutive season...had nine sellouts.
