OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-2) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (3-1)

TUESDAY, APRIL 12, 2022 — TROPICANA FIELD — 6:40 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing the first two games of the season...started the year 0-4 last year after going 3-1 over the first four games in 2020...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City...with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland last Friday in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 13 runs yesterday after tallying 11 runs in the three-game series at Philadelphia...rank third in the American League in runs scored (24)...hit four home runs last night after hitting three at Philadelphia and are tied for fourth in the AL in home runs (7)...had two three-run home runs and a grand slam last night...the only other time over the last 19 years the A's hit three home runs in a game with at least two runners on base was June 18, 2019 against Baltimore when they also had three...four of the A's seven home runs this year have come with runners on base, which is tied with St. Louis for the most in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (7).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed seven runs in the last three games (26.0 ip, 2.42 ERA) after allowing nine runs in the opener...A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last two games (10.0 ip) after yielding nine in the first two (10.1 ip, 7.84 ERA)...the A's are one of four American League teams with two wins from their starters (Astros, Angels, Twins) and one of three teams in the majors without a no decision from their starters (Braves, Reds)...A's relievers are tied for the fewest innings pitched in the AL with the White Sox (13.2)...the A's are one of three AL teams without a save opportunity (Guardians, Royals).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Tony Kemp committed an error in the second inning on Opening Day but Oakland has not made an error since then...are tied for the second fewest errors in the American League to the Royals, who have not made an error...the A's are one of two AL teams who have not had an opponent attempt a steal (Rangers).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (1-0) and Toronto (three games)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...begin in the home schedule on Monday with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).

ROOKIES: The A's had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...10 have appeared in a game and the other, Adam Oller, is scheduled to start today...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019...two of the players made their Major League debuts (Lemoine on Friday, Jackson on Saturday) and Oller is scheduled to become the third today.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history last Friday...seven other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,007...Adam Oller will become number 1,008 today.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played

for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days on Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest (37 years, 356 days on Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus (13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty (6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days)

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have four players on the injured list after adding Skye Bolt on Sunday...began the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outfield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2022 last night after winning the season series last year 4-3...won two of three in Oakland and split four games in Tampa Bay...also won the season series 4-3 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series from the Rays for the first time since 2011-12...are 33-31 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 114-79 (.591), which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-33 in Oakland and 52-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus has doubled in each of the last three games and is tied for the American League lead in doubles (3)...**Seth Brown** had his second three-RBI game of the season last night and is tied for second in the AL in RBI (7)...the seven RBI match Khris Davis (2019) and Yoenis Cespedes (2012) for the most by an Athletic over the first four games over the last 15 years...**Tony Kemp** has reached base safely in all four games (6-for-17, walk) after hitting safely in nine of his 11 games this spring.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuffy" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adam Oller (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday, was on the A's Opening Day roster and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 53rd pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Daulton Jefferies on Sept. 12, 2020 in the first game of a doubleheader at Texas...the last to win was Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...the last to strike out 10 or more batters was Aaron Harang on May 25, 2002 against Tampa Bay...the last to toss at least seven innings was Rich Harden on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 52 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 15-18 record and a 4.01 ERA.

2021 RECAP: Was named the New York Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year and a MiLB.com organizational All-Star after combining for a 9-4 record, a 3.45 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 23 starts with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...it was the first time he pitched above Single-A...struck out a career-high 138 batters in 120.0 innings, an average of 10.35 per nine innings...led the Mets farm system in strikeouts...95 of the strikeouts came with Binghamton, which ranked sixth in the Double-A Northeast...also had career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched (120.0) and walks (47) and matched his high in hit batters (8)...led the Mets farm system in starts and innings pitched (120.0) and tied for the lead in wins...was 4-3 with a 5.12 ERA, .260 opponents batting average and .740 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 15...then went 5-1 with a 1.89 ERA, .161 opponents average and .514 OPS over his final 11 starts beginning July 23.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .201 (42-for-209) with a .630 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .223 (51-for-229) with a .632 OPS against right-handers...surrendered six of his nine home runs to righties...seven of his eight hit batters came against lefties...opponents hit .190 with six home runs with the bases empty, .242 with three home runs with runners on...they were 1-for-10 (.100) with seven strikeouts with the bases loaded...held the seven, eight and nine hitters in the order to a combined .152 batting average...yielded a .141 batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Was a combined 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in 11 starts in his home ballparks, 6-2 with a 3.92 ERA and .230 opponent average in 12 starts on the road...his teams were 1-9 in his 10 no decisions and had a 10-13 (.435) record in his starting assignments...did not allow a run six times and allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts...allowed four hits or fewer 13 times.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Allowed a season-high five runs and a season-high four walks in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss in his first start on May 7 at Akron...it was his first of four starts with five runs and his first of six with four walks...yielded a season-high eight hits in a 5-4 loss at Erie on May 23...finished May 0-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts...picked up his first win of the season June 4 at New Hampshire (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...had a seven-game winning streak from June 30 to Sept. 4...compiled a 1.39 ERA and .180 opponents batting average during the streak...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in a 4-3 win at Altoona on July 15...logged 4.2 scoreless and hitless innings against Erie on July 23 to begin a seven-start stretch where he went 4-0 with a 0.44 ERA and .132 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of those starts...had three consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts from July 30 to Aug. 14 (35 so in 20.0 ip)...had 10 strikeouts in 6.1 innings on July 30 at Hartford and 12 in a career-high tying 7.0 scoreless innings against Portland on Aug. 5...was promoted to Syracuse on Aug. 9 and fanned a career-high 13 in 6.2 scoreless innings in his first Triple-A start at Worcester on Aug. 14...was 5-3 with a 4.03 ERA in 15 starts with Binghamton at the time of his promotion...finished the season by going 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA in eight starts with Syracuse...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.179) and slugging percentage (.278) in the Triple-A East from Aug. 8 through the end of the season, the third lowest ERA and the fourth lowest OPS (.568)...allowed just one run in four starts in August and was 3-0 with a 0.38 ERA and .139 opponents batting average...struck out 34 batters in 24.0 innings...went 1-1 with a 4.71 ERA over his final four starts beginning Sept. 10.

CAREER: Has pitched in the Pittsburgh, San Francisco and New York (NL) farm systems and is 24-20 with four saves and a 4.05 ERA in 99 games, including 56 starts, in five seasons in the minors...has 395 strikeouts in 380.1 innings (9.34 strikeouts per nine innings)...has walked just 115 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.43...was originally a 20th round pick of Pittsburgh in 2016 but was released by the Pirates following the 2018 season...nearly retired from the game before signing with Windy City of the independent Frontier League in 2019...signed a minor league contract with San Francisco on May 30, 2019, was selected by New York (NL) in the 2019 minor league Rule 5 draft and was named the Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year in 2021.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (0-1, 9.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season...made his second career Opening Day start last Friday at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss (5.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 20 so, 3 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Tampa Bay...was 1-1 with a 3.97 ERA (11.1 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year...was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA in two starts this spring...went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08) and tied for fifth in wins.

- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday...is one of five non-roster invitees to make the A's Opening Day roster.
- Begins his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team (Rangers, 2012-13; Cubs, 2013-17; Royals, 2018; Mariners, 2018; Brewers, 2020; A's, 2022)...pitched in 306 games from 2012-18 but last night was just his fifth big league appearance since then.
- Is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014, 16-18, 20, 22).
- Posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Has not allowed a run in five career appearances against Tampa Bay (6.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
