OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-11) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (9-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost the first two games of this series and have not won or lost more than two consecutive games this year...have now lost five of the last seven games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are 10-11 overall and are in fourth place in the American League West for the second consecutive day...trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 3½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, two days in fourth and one day tied for fourth...have split their lone two-game series, lost two of three in their three three-game series and won three of four in their two four-game series.

A'S IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 16-11 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one earned run or fewer in three of the last five games and two earned runs or fewer in eight of the last 12 contests (36 er in 106.0 ip, 3.06 ERA)...have surrendered seven home runs over the last seven games after yielding no home runs over the previous five contests...now have a .381 opponents slugging percentage, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the fifth fewest strikeouts (170).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have gone back-to-back games without a decision for the first time this year...are 2-3 with a 4.34 ERA (18 er in 37.1 ip) and .203 (27-for-133) opponents batting average over the last seven games...are 8-8 with a 3.81 ERA for the season...the wins are tied with the Angels, Astros and Mariners for the most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...have 106.1 innings pitched, which is fourth most in the AL.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has been charged with the loss in each of the last two games but has just three for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...has converted 7-of-10 (70.0%) save opportunities...are tied for third in the AL in saves and tied for fifth in save percentage...has allowed 8-of-39 (20.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the majors ahead of the Rays (20.7%)...ranks second in the AL in opponents batting average (.167) and on-base percentage (.267) against first batters faced and fourth in slugging (.273)...is tied for the league lead in holds (21)...has allowed no earned runs in eight of the last 12 games, but three runs or more in the other four contests over that stretch.

OFFENSE: Over the last 11 games, the A's have been held to two runs or fewer eight times and five hits or fewer five times...are batting .201 (70-for-348) with 28 runs scored and six home runs over the last 11 games after hitting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs over the first 10 contests...have a .212 batting average overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second most strikeouts (197) and third lowest on-base percentage (.277)...have 18 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL...however, seven of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...are hitting .123 (8-for-65) with runners in scoring position over the last 10 games after batting .365 with RISP over the first 11 contests...A's designated hitters are batting .123 (9-for-73), which is the lowest mark in the majors behind the Guardians (.148).

ON THE BASES: The A's have four stolen bases in the last four games and are 12-for-13 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cardinals, 95.7%)...are tied for fifth in the AL in stolen bases...A's opponents are 3-for-9 (33.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors ahead of the Yankees (4-for-8, 50.0%)...the three stolen bases allowed are the fewest in the majors (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's turned four double plays yesterday, which were their most in a game since May 24, 2018 when they had five...now have 23 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 29)...have committed at least one error in nine of the last 10 games (10 errors total) and have 17 errors for the season, which is third most in the AL.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 0-2 against American League Central teams...had a 23-10 (.697) record against the AL Central last year, which was

the best record in the majors...are 74-27 (.733) against the Central over the last five years and are 88-31 (.739) dating back to June 23, 2017.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players, which is tied with the Tigers and Rays for the most in the American League...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Cleveland (0-2) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the first homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 6-6 on the road...are batting .205 (58-for-283) with 25 runs and five home runs in nine games at home compared to .217 (88-for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road...have a 2.89 ERA (26 er in 81.0 ip) and five home runs in nine games at home, a 4.08 ERA (47 er in 103.2 ip) with 15 home runs in 12 games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost 3-1 yesterday and seven of their 11 losses this year have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the American League...have four one-run losses, which is tied for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 6)...are 2-5 in the first game of a series, 5-1 in the final game of a series...are 4-2 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-9 (.400) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the AL and the majors.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL, including two on the Covid-19 IL (D. Jackson, Trivino) and five others (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A'S vs. GUARDIANS: The A's have lost the first two games of 2022...have not been swept by Cleveland since July 29-31, 2016 and have not been swept in Oakland since April 10-12, 2000...won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season, which is the first time Oakland has won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...went 4-2 last year, including 1-2 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...are 17-10 against Cleveland over the last five seasons...have an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-246 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-110 in Oakland and 136-136 in Cleveland...including 51-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 922-1039 against Cleveland.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .353 (110-for-312) career hitter against Cleveland, which is sixth best by any player against Cleveland with a minimum of 300 plate appearances...**Dany Jiménez** has not allowed an earned run over his first nine games (9.0 ip)...is tied for fourth in the American League in saves (4)...has four of the five saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)...**Sam Moll** has not allowed a run over his first eight games (6.0 ip)...**Sean Murphy** is tied for fourth in the AL in extra base hits (12), tied for sixth in doubles (7) and tied for seventh in RBI (14)...**Sheldon Neuse** is 15-for-41 (.366) with eight RBI over his last 11 games and is now batting .328 for the season, which is tied for sixth in the AL.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991** Rickey Henderson becomes baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992** Rickey Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356th hit as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-0, — ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list today and is scheduled to make his first start of the season...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third...made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas...had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so).

KAPRIELIAN vs. CLEVELAND: Is scheduled to make his first career appearance and start.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts...logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

DAY BY DAY: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record only to have the

bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...it was the shortest start of his career...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his first three starts following his return...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strike out a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but picked up the win on Aug. 20 against San Francisco...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings on Aug. 26 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss...that began a four-start stretch where he went 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA and .324 opponents batting average...allowed a career-high tying eight hits in a season-low tying 3.2 innings in a 4-3 loss to Texas on Sept. 12 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits in a 3-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 18...that would be his final start of the season as it brought his season innings pitched total, including Las Vegas, to 116.0...had just 101.0 innings as a professional entering the season...pitched in relief in each of his final three appearances and allowed at least two runs in all three appearances (7.88 ERA)...tossed 2.0 innings in his first relief appearance on Sept. 23 vs. Seattle, which was his shortest outing of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-3, 3.26 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and the sixth of his career...has lost each of his last three starts after winning his first start and his three losses are tied for the most in the American League...however, has received just two runs of support in his four starts (19.1 ip, 0.93 RSA)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss at San Francisco on Tuesday (4.0 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Rays in his career...went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA in four appearances, including three starts, this spring...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24-for-65 (.369)...spent most of the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis.

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his last nine games...allowed multiple runs for the blown save in the two exceptions on April 16 at Toronto and April 29 vs. Cleveland.
- Is tied for fifth in the American League in games (10).
- Friday night was his first career appearance against Cleveland.
- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...compiled a 5.79 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in four appearances this spring, including one start.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

46 RHP JUSTIN GRIMM

- Has pitched in six games...has retired the first batter faced in each of his appearances and has stranded all five of his inherited runners.
- Prior to Friday night, had faced Cleveland four times in his career, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings with two hits, zero walks, and one strikeout.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON

- Earned his first career save April 19 against Baltimore, recording the final out in the bottom of the ninth...is one of two rookies in the American League with a save along with teammate Dany Jiménez.
- Is tied for fifth in the AL in games pitched (10).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and is making his Major League debut...is 16-8 with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors...has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring and compiled a 1.35 ERA in six appearances...struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

56 RHP DANY JIMENEZ

- Has converted four of his five save opportunities for the first four saves of his career...is tied for fourth in the AL in saves...has four of the five saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other).
- Opponents are 2-for-11 (.182) with runners in scoring position.
- Made his Major League debut in 2020 when he pitched in two games for the Giants.
