## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-21) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (23-13)

SUNDAY, MAY 15, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split two games yesterday and have now won five of the last eight games since their season-high nine-game losing streak...are 7-15 (.318) over the last 22 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 15-21 (.417) overall and are in a tie for fourth place in the American League West after spending 10 consecutive days alone in last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...trail first place Houston and Los Angeles by eight games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 8½ (May 10 and 13)...had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped Friday night...won four of five at Detroit to start the week, which was the A's first series win since taking three of four from Baltimore, Apr 18-21...had gone 0-4-1 over the previous five series.

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game yesterday when Luis Barrera hit a three-run home run with the A's trailing 3-1...improved to 3-7 (.300) in one-run games with the win, but that is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses...11 of the A's 21 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox and Tigers, 12).

**THE LONG BALL:** Barrera hit the A's 22nd home run of the season yesterday, which is fourth fewest in the American League and the majors...however, the home run was a three-run shot and the A's now have nine home runs with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...have homered three times in the last 12 games...have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 22 games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 25-June 29, 2011 when they had a 32-game streak...have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep.

**OFFENSE:** The A's grounded into three double plays in the first game yesterday and four in the night game and the seven GDPs match the most in Oakland history in back-to-back games (14th time, last: Aug. 18-19, 2017)...now have 28 GDPs for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...the A's are batting .184 (125-for-680) with 55 runs over the last 22 games (2.5 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...are batting .201 for the season, which is the lowest in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (.204)...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.269) and OPS (.580) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.312)...have struck out 318 times, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Angels (322)...have the fifth fewest extra base hits in both the American League and the majors (77)...have been held to one run or fewer 12 times and have been shut out six times, which is the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.72 ERA (29 er in 96.0 ip) over the last 10 games and have two shutouts over that span...have four shutouts for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...are tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (30)...have the fifth fewest strikeouts (269).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last 12 games and are 3-6 with a 3.06 ERA (24 er in 70.2 ip) over that span...are 11-16 with a 3.92 ERA for the season...are tied for the most losses in the American League but rank third in wins...have the second most innings pitched (188.1) to the Angels (190.1).

**THE BULLPEN:** A's relievers have compiled a 1.39 ERA (5 er in 32.1 ip) over the last 11 games and now have a 3.06 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have not allowed a home run over the last 12 games (34.1 ip), which matches the most consecutive games without a home run from the A's bullpen over the last nine years (Aug. 17-29, 2020)...the last longer streak was a 13-game streak from July 24-Aug. 7, 2013...have surrendered just seven home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to the Yankees (7)...have the lowest batting average (.187) and slugging percentage (.280) against first batters faced in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.279)...have allowed 15-of-61 (24.6%) inherited runners to score and the 61 inherited runners are tied for third most in the AL...are tied for second in the AL in holds (26).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have six stolen bases in the last six games but have been caught stealing three times over that stretch...are 22-for-27 (81.5) in stolen bases attempts for the season...rank third in the American League in stolen base percentage and tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 8-for-15 (53.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in

the majors...the eight stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Yankees, 5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their season-high six-game errorless streak snapped in the day game yesterday...have made just four errors over the last 13 games after committing 16 over the previous 14 contests...have 25 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...have turned 36 doubles plays, which is second most.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's snapped their seven-game home losing streak with a win in the day game yesterday...the streak matched the ninth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...are 1-2 on this seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Minnesota (three games) and are now 5-11 (.313) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Red Sox, 4-9/.308)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road...are hitting .190 (94-for-495) with 41 runs and seven home runs in 16 games at home compared to .209 (137-for-654) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, are tied for the second fewest home runs and have the third fewest runs scored.

**15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS:** The A's are 5-6 in this stretch that began May 6 and runs through next Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that included a stretch of seven games in five days from Tuesday through yesterday...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16, including seven games in five days several times during that span.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This four-game series with the Angels is just the A's second against an American League West opponent this year...lost two of three to Texas (April 22-24) and the A's six intradivision games are the fewest in the majors...this series begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 of their next 20 games against the AL West, with two series against the Angels and one against each of the other teams.

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels and Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers.

**SCORING CHANGE:** Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the A's game at Minnesota a week ago today...in the seventh inning, Elvis Andrus reached base on what was originally scored as an error on Polanco...that has been changed to a hit.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have lost two of the first three games of 2022...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and there most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most...compiled a 2.01 ERA, which was the A's lowest against the Angels since 1971 (1.97)...outscored the Angels 86-46...have won 12 of the last 15 games and are 35-16 (.686) against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 472-392 against the Angels...that includes 248-186 in Oakland and 224-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 521-469 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Dany Jiménez** has not allowed an earned run in his first 13 appearances and his 13.0 innings pitched are the most among American League relievers with no earned runs...leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in saves (6).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1958** Ned Garver tosses a seven-hit shutout and Vic Power hits a three-run home run to account for all the offense in a 3-0 Kansas City win over Chicago...in **1985** the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3...Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each...in **2016** Danny Valencia hits three home runs, including the game-winning two-run shot in the ninth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-3, 3.77 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his American League leading eighth start of the season...the A's have been shut out in three of his seven starts and he has received 16 runs of support overall (43.0 ip, 3.35 RSA)...is in his seventh season in the majors and is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (43.0), seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.265), eighth in batting average (.205), tied for ninth in strikeouts (41) and 10th in OPS (.598)...is averaging the most pitches per game (94.9) ahead of the Mariners Gilbert (94.6)...is tied for fifth in losses (3).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .179 (5-for-28) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...four of the five home runs he has allowed have come with the bases empty...four of the five homers have been hit by left-handed hitters...opponents are hitting .169 (10-for-59) the first time through the order, .291 (16-for-55) the second time and .143 (6-for-42) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...opponents are 9-for-83 (.108) with two strikes, including 1-for-14 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .159 career average in that situation.

**THE THIRD INNING:** Has allowed eight of his 19 runs in the third inning for a 10.29 ERA (8 er in 7.0 ip)...has a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 3.28 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) and .161 (14-for-87) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and .261 (18-for-69) opponents batting average in three starts on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.35 ERA (4 er in 26.2 ip) and .151 (14-for-93) opponents batting average in four starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 7.15 ERA (9 er in 11.1 ip) and .286 (12-for-42) opponents average in two starts on five days rest

**2022 HIGHLIGHTS:** Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the doubleheader last Tuesday...it was his second consecutive start in which the A's were shutout, his third this year...allowed a season-high seven hits and threw a season-high 105 pitches...blanked the Tigers on three hits over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 13.0 innings...then allowed two runs in the fifth, highlighted by a Hill sacrifice fly, and a solo home run to Schoop in the sixth...was relieved by Snead with one out in the seventh and a runner on first and he allowed the inherited runner to score.

**MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 4-1 with a 2.30 ERA (62.2 ip, 48 h, 20 r, 16 er, 24 bb, 65 so, 4 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 10 starts...is 2-1 with a 3.15 ERA (12 er in 34.1 ip) in eight games in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (4 er in 28.1 ip) in five appearances in Anaheim...went 2-1 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 2 er, 9 bb, 32 so, 0 hr) in four starts last year...the loss came in a 4-0 decision on May 29 in Oakland...blanked the Angels on two hits

over the first four innings but then allowed four runs in the fourth inning, all unearned...the A's were shutout on three hits by Cobb, Watson and Iglesias...then picked up the win in a 6-4 victory in Oakland on June 15...allowed a RBI single to Upton in the third inning and a RBI single to Fletcher in the fifth...was relieved by Luzardo to start the eighth with the A's leading 5-2...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) on July 29...tossed 7.0 innings, allowed all three of the hits and struck out 10...allowed just three base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Anaheim on Sept. 19...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit but issued four walks...the lone hit was a two-out double by Marsh in the third and he was the only baserunner to get as far as second base...was relieved by Diekmann to start the eighth with the A's leading 2-0 and Romo allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (5.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400)...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.
