OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-22) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (20-15)

MONDAY, MAY 16, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost three of four to Los Angeles (AL) to open the homestand after winning four of five at Detroit to close out the last road trip...are 7-16 (.304) over the last 23 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 15-22 (.405) overall, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 11th time in the last 12 days...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 11 days in fifth...trail first place Houston and Los Angeles by a season-high nine games, which matches their largest deficit in the West from last year (end of season)...have not been more than nine games out of first place in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped Friday...had their season-high nine-game losing streak come to an end a week ago today at Detroit.

OFFENSE: The A's had three sacrifice hits yesterday, which was just their second game with three sacrifice bunts over the last 21 years (also Aug. 3, 2013 vs. Texas)...have seven sacrifice hits for the season, which is tied for the most in the American League...scored one run yesterday for the second consecutive game and 14th time this year, which is four more than any other team in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is also the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...have scored 122 runs for the season, which is fifth fewest in the AL...are batting .183 (130-for-709) with 56 runs over the last 23 games (2.4 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...are batting .200 for the season, which is the lowest in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (.204)...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.270), slugging percentage (.309) and OPS (.579)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (322), the third most grounded into double plays (28) and the fifth fewest extra base hits (78).

PITCHING: A's pitchers struck out a season-high 15 batters yesterday but are averaging 7.82 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have compiled a 2.83 ERA (33 er in 105.0 ip) over the last 11 games...are tied for third in the AL in shutouts (4) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs allowed (31)...have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.235).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the last 13 games and are 3-7 with a 3.05 ERA (26 er in 76.2 ip) over that span...are 11-17 with a 3.89 ERA for the season...have the most losses in the American League but are tied for the third most wins...rank second in innings pitched (194.2).

THE BULLPEN: A's relievers have compiled a 1.78 ERA (7 er in 35.1 ip) over the last 12 games and now have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have not allowed a home run over the last 13 games (37.1 ip), which are the most consecutive games without a home run from the A's bullpen in a single-season since July 24-Aug. 7, 2013 when they also had a 13-game streak...the last longer such streak was a 17-game streak from June 30-July 22, 2013...have surrendered just seven home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to the Yankees (7)...have the second lowest batting average (.196) and slugging percentage (.286) against first batters faced in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.283)...have allowed 15-of-63 (23.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 63 inherited runners are fourth most in the AL...are tied for second in the AL in holds (26).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just three times in the last 13 games...have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 23 games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 25-June 29, 2011 when they had a 32-game streak...have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep...have 22 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League and the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have eight stolen bases in the last seven games and are 24-for-29 (82.8%) for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and are tied for second in steals...A's opponents are 8-for-16 (50.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...the eight stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 27

errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for the most in the majors...however, the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...rank second in double plays turned (36)...have the third fewest outfield assists (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (three games) and are now 5-12 (.308) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...snapped their-seven-game home losing streak in the day game on Saturday...the streak matched the ninth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Friday...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road...are hitting .189 (99-for-524) with 42 runs and seven home runs in 17 games at home compared to .209 (137-for-654) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, are tied for the second fewest home runs and have the third fewest runs scored.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game Saturday...improved to 3-7 (.300) in one-run games with the win, but that is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are tied for the most one-run losses...11 of the A's 22 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 5-7 in this stretch that began May 6 and runs through Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that included a stretch of seven games in five days from last Tuesday through Saturday...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16, including seven games in five days several times during that span...this three-game series against Minnesota marks the only games over a 20-game stretch from May 13-June 1 in which the A's will not play an American League West opponent...are 2-5 against divisional foes and the A's six intradivision games are the fewest in the majors

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels and Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's are 0-3 after being swept in a three-game series at Minnesota, May 6-8...all three losses were by one run and the A's were out-scored 7-4...won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Minnesota...have won each of the previous three season series and seven of the previous nine...are 36-20 (.643) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 314-309 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 139-178 in Minnesota...are 22-23 at Target Field...are 371-378 all-time against the Twins and have a 1018-1014 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1018 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez allowed his first earned run of the season yesterday and now has a 0.66 ERA, which ranks seventh among American League relievers...leads AL rookies and is tied for sixth among all AL pitchers in saves (6)...**A.J. Puk** has a career-high 12.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks fifth among AL relievers in ERA (0.59).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1939** the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in **1975** Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in **1986** Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in **1990** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Logue (2-1, 1.35 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and third start of the season and his career...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15...picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled May 6 and is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts since his return.

FIRST APPEARANCE: Made his Major League debut on April 19 in Oakland against Baltimore and earned the win with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 2-1 victory...became the 17th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his ML debut, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...relieved Irvin to start the sixth inning with Oakland trailing 1-0...struck out the first batter he faced (Ramon Urias) and retired the side in order in the sixth...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Castellani with one out and runners on first and second in the seventh.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 2-1 A's loss at Minnesota on May 6...surrendered a lead off home run to Miranda in the second and a leadoff home run to Buxton in the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work and he was relieved by Puk to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

LAST START: He combined with Moll and Grimm on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win at Detroit last Wednesday...tossed seven of the innings, allowed five of the hits and did not walk a batter...allowed two base runners as far as second base.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts, all at home...walked eight batters in 16.0 innings for a .400 on-base percentage...surrendered five home runs and had a .621 opponents slugging percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .286 (4-for-14) against left-handed hitters and .327 (17-for-52) against right-handers...surrendered all nine of his extra base hits (three doubles, one triple, five home runs) and issued six of his eight walks to righties...had a 1.118 OPS against righties, .661 against lefties...all five of his home runs allowed were solo shots...logged 2.2 innings and 48 pitches in his first start and 4.0 innings and 64 pitches in his second start before joining the A's bullpen on April 15...then tossed 4.0 innings and 75 pitches in his third start and 5.1 innings and 87 pitches in his fourth start before joining the A's rotation on May 6.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A New Hampshire and was 3-1 with a 4.54 ERA in seven starts when he was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 12...went 9-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with the Bisons and combined for a 12-4 record and a 3.67 ERA in 25 appearances overall...struck out 144 batters in 125.0 innings, an average of 10.37 per nine innings...walked just 27 (1.94 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.33...his strikeouts were a career-high and he matched his best in wins...hit a career-high 10 batters...tied for third among all minor leaguers in wins and tied for ninth in innings pitched...led the Blue Jays farm system in wins, strikeouts, games started (24) and innings pitched...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .239 opponents batting average, which broke down to .225 (27-for-120) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (85-for-349) against right-handers...yielded 14 of his 15 home runs to righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs with the bases empty...opponents hit .313 with runners in scoring position...had a 213 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .240 the second time and .313 after that...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .180 batting average...had a .130 opponents batting average with two strikeouts but allowed eight home runs.

THIS AND THAT: Combined for a 1.84 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.86 ERA from the third inning on...was 0-2 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts on four days rest or less, 10-2 with a 3.70 ERA in 19 games on five days rest or more...his teams were 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 25 appearances.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Struck out a career-high 12 batters in 6.0 innings in the first game of a May 29 doubleheader at Somerset...it was his second career game of 10 or more strikeouts (Aug. 13, 2018 for Dunedin vs. Jupiter)...went 3-0 with a 2.96 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts in May...struck out 39 batters in 27.1 innings and walked just three...was charged with his first loss of the season in his sixth start on June 4 against Binghamton...issued a season-high four walks and yielded three runs in 4.1 innings in an 11-4 loss...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings on June 11 at Portland but had a no decision...also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...it would be his final Double-A start as he was moved up to Buffalo the next day...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first start with the Bisons on June 18 at Rochester...allowed just one hit and did not walk a batter while striking out eight in a 5-0 win...earned Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week honors for his effort...then went 2-2 with a 4.99 ERA over his next seven games from June 25 to Aug. 1...threw a season-high 97 pitches in 5.0 innings on July 22 against Syracuse...made his one relief appearance on July 28 at Worcester and picked up the win after logging 4.0 scoreless and hitless innings (1 bb, 8 so)...won three consecutive starts from Aug. 7-20... had a 1.65 ERA during the streak, which included 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 13 against Rochester...yielded a season-high tying six runs and hit a career-high three batters in an 8-5 loss to Worcester on Aug. 26...then went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA over his final six starts...struck out 37 and walked just four in 30.1 innings.

CAREER: Was the ninth round selection of the Blue Jays in 2017 and went 32-16 with a 3.43 ERA in 84 games, including 73 starts, in four seasons in the Toronto farm system...was traded to the A's on March 16, 2022 with Gunnar Hoglund, Kevin Smith and Kirby Sneed in exchange for Matt Chapman...tied for third among all minor league pitchers with 12 wins in 2021...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the 2018 and 2021 seasons...was named to the Eastern League Midseason All-Star team in 2019.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (0-2, 4.97 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...allowed four runs in 2.0 innings in his first start but has yielded just three runs in 10.2 innings over his last two (2.53 ERA)...has allowed three hits in each of his three starts and opponents are 9-for-46 (.196)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win last Thursday at Detroit (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Twins, a start in the A's 1-0 loss at Minnesota earlier this month on May 7 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas...went 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, last year with Oakland.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has not allowed an earned run in his five appearances in May (6.0 ip, 4 h, r, 3 bb, 2 so) after posting a 9.64 ERA in six games in April.
- First batters faced are 1-for-9 with a sacrifice fly and he has stranded seven of eight of his inherited runners.
- Has a 1.80 ERA (1 er in 5.0 ip) and .235 (4-for-17) opponents batting average in six games on the road, a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) and .320 (8-for-25) opponents average in five games at home.
- Is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (4 er, 9.1 ip) in four career outings against Minnesota, including one start...faced them once this season, throwing 1.0 scoreless inning.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (17) and is tied for sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (21).
- Has not allowed an earned run in five appearances on two days rest or more (7.1 ip).
- Owns a 2.25 ERA (2 er in 8.0 ip) in away games compared to a 4.50 ERA (4 er in 8.0 ip) in home contests.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
