OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-24) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (24-17)

SATURDAY, MAY 21, 2022 — ANGEL STADIUM — 6:07 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Minnesota to close out the last homestand and are now 1-6-1 over the last eight series...have lost five of the last eight games after winning four of the previous five contests...are 9-18 (.333) over the last 27 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are seven games under .500 at 17-24 (.415), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent 16 of the last 17 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 16 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by 8½ games...had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped a week ago yesterday by Los Angeles (AL).

OFFENSE: The A's had 12 hits on Wednesday after collecting 11 hits on Tuesday and reached double figures in hits in back-to-back games for the first time this year...however, are batting .200 (125-for-626) with 55 runs scored in 20 games in May (2.8 runs per game)...the lowest batting average in a month of 10 or more games in Oakland history is .210 (April, 1979; May, 2012)...have a .206 batting average for the season, which is the lowest in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.274) and OPS (.592), the second lowest slugging percentage (.318) and the third fewest runs scored (136)...have scored one run or fewer 15 times, which is three more than any other team in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (352), the third most grounded into double plays (30) and the third fewest extra base hits (90)...are tied for the second most sacrifice hits (7).

THE LONG BALL: The A's homered twice last night for their first multiple home run game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep...had homered just four times in the previous 16 games...snapped a streak in which they hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 26 games, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...have 25 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (20)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's allowed season highs in runs (14) and walks (10) and matched the high in hits (14) on Wednesday against Minnesota...it was the first time the A's issued 10 walks in a game since Aug. 29, 2018 at Houston (10) and the first time they allowed at least 10 hits and 10 walks since June 30, 2016 against San Francisco (14 hits, 11 walks)...had compiled a 2.80 ERA, .226 opponents average and averaged 2.66 walks per nine innings over the previous 15 contests...overall, are tied for third in the American League in shutouts (4) and rank third in fewest home runs allowed (34)...have the sixth highest opponents batting average (.237) and the fifth most walks (125).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 5.36 ERA (25 er in 42.0 ip) over the last eight games and 3-11 with a 4.37 ERA (57 er in 117.1 ip) over the last 22 contests...are 11-19 with a 4.06 ERA for the season...are second to the Mariners for the most losses in the American League...have the third most innings pitched (212.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed eight runs Wednesday after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 games (8 er in 43.2 ip, 1.65 ERA)...has allowed just one home run over the last 17 games and eight for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the American League (.278) and on-base percentage (.287) and the third lowest batting average (.198)...have allowed 15-of-70 (21.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 70 inherited runners are tied for fourth most...are tied for fourth in holds (28).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 25-for-31 (80.6%) in stolen base attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 11-for-19 (57.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second lowest success rate in the majors (Orioles, 11-for-20, 55.0%)...the 11 stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 10)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last seven games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 28 errors for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for second most in the American League (Orioles, 30)...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays turned (38) but are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's began a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-0 + two games) and Seattle (three games) yesterday...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 11-10 (.524) on the road...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the tied for the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-15/.250)...have compiled a 3.27 ERA (66 er in 181.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.23 at home...have the second lowest road ERA in the American League and the third highest home ERA.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...this series with the Angels is just the A's third against a divisional foe this year...are 3-5 in intradivision play and the eight games are the fewest in the majors (Mariners, 9)...face the Mariners for the first time with a three-game series beginning Monday and face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...the losses are tied with the Orioles and Red Sox for the most in the American League and the record is tied for second worst (Rangers, 7-7/.286)...12 of the A's 24 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for second most in the AL...had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game last Saturday against the Angels.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels, 42; Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 12 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have seven players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

SCORING CHANGES: Official scorers have made two scoring changes in recent A's games...in the fifth inning of the May 15 game against Los Angeles (AL), Ohtani is now credited with a base hit instead of reaching base on a Kemp error...in the day game on May 14 against the Angels, Romine is now credited with a sacrifice bunt in the eighth inning.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 2-3 against the Angels after losing three of four in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and their most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most...are 36-17 (.679) against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 473-393 against the Angels...that includes 248-187 in Oakland and 225-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 522-470 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

A.J. Puk has a career-high and A's season-high 14.1 inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14...opponents are 9-for-51 (.176) with two walks during the streak...has not allowed a run in 12 of 13 appearances overall. **Jed Lowrie** is batting .270 (129-for-478) with 26 doubles and 13 home runs in 132 career games against the Angels, including hitting .278 (63-for-227) in 61 games at Angel Stadium...**Luis Barrera** is hitting 10-for-27 (.370) with two doubles and one home run in 11 games with the A's this season...is 6-for-12 (.500) in six career games against the Angels.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1974 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in 1997 Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-4, 3.67 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) and .202 (23-for-114) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run once.

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 12 batters in his last start on Sunday against Los Angeles (AL), which was the second highest single-game total of his career (13, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle)...it was his eighth career 10-strikeout game, which is tied for fourth most in Oakland history...now has 53 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for sixth in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in games started (8), ranks fourth in innings pitched (49.0), seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.263), sixth in batting average (.207), 14th in OPS (.615) and 11th strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.08)...is averaging the most pitches per game (95.6) ahead of the Mariners Gilbert (95.4)...is tied for third in losses (4).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 (19-for-95) batting average against left-handed hitters and .202 (17-for-84) against right-handers...however, has surrendered five of his six home runs and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...opponents are hitting .152 (5-for-33) with runners in scoring position...four of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has allowed a .191 (13-for-68) average the first time through the order, .270 (17-for-63) the second time and .125 (6-for-48) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...opponents are 11-for-101 (.109) with two strikes, including 1-for-18 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .158 career average in that situation.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed eight of his 21 runs in the third inning for a 9.00 ERA (8 er in 8.0 ip)...has a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.88 ERA (8 er in 25.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-2 with a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) and .155 (18-for-116) opponents batting average in five starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 7.15 ERA (9 er in 11.1 ip) and .286 (12-for-42) opponents average in two starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-11 with a 2.68 ERA (59 er in 198.1 ip) in 33 starts on four days rest, 17-12 with a 4.14 ERA (106 er in 230.2 ip) in 41 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.87 ERA (10 er in 31.1 ip) and .164 (18-for-110) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and .261 (18-for-69) opponents batting average in three starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has 497.0 innings pitched in his career and needs 3.0 more for 500...the A's have been shut out in three of his eight starts and he has received one run of support or fewer five times...has 17 runs of support overall (49.0 ip, 3.12 RSA)...is 2-0 with a 3.63 ERA (7 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts at night compared to 0-4 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day...now has a career record of 21-12 at night and 12-15 during the day

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, al-

lowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...allowed a season-high seven hits and threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a season-high 12 batters for his eighth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...allowed a two-run home run to Ohtani in the first but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...blacked the Angels on one hit and an intentional walk over his final five innings...was relieved by Jackson to start the seventh with the A's trailing 2-1.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-2 with a 2.36 ERA (68.2 ip, 52 h, 22 r, 18 er, 25 bb, 77 so, 5 hr) in 14 career appearances, including 11 starts...is 2-2 with a 3.12 ERA (14 er in 40.1 ip) in nine games in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (4 er in 28.1 ip) in five appearances in Anaheim...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year (see last start above)...went 2-1 with a 0.68 ERA (26.2 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 2 er, 9 bb, 32 so, 0 hr) in four starts last year.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts...the strikeouts were second best in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...they were second best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74, also last year...his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (.263, .646, .230, .282)...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028)...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (2-1, 2.93 ERA): Is scheduled to be reinstated from the 15-day injured list tomorrow to make his sixth start of the season...was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis and made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto...was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...allowed one run or fewer in each of his last three starts before going on the IL (2 er in 16.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) and is now 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5 er in 22.1 ip) over his last four starts after taking the loss in his first start...had a no decision in his last start with the A's, a 3-1 loss to Cleveland on April 30 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a 2.90 ERA (31.0 ip, 34 h, 13 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in five career starts against Los Angeles (AL) all last year...picked up the win in his only start against an AL West team on April 24 against Texas after going 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition last year.
