## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-26) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (17-25)

MONDAY, MAY 23, 2022 — T-MOBILE PARK — 6:40 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Lost two of three at Los Angeles (AL) to start the road trip and are now 1-7-1 over the last nine series...have lost three of the last four games and six of the last seven...are 9-20 (.310) over the last 29 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 17-26 (.395) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...are nine games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under .500 (75-87)...have spent 18 of the last 19 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 18 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games, which is their largest deficit in the West since Sept. 9, 2019 when they were also 10½ back.

**A'S IN MAY:** The A's are 7-15 (.318) in the month of May, which is the second worst record in the American League to the Mariners (6-15, .286)...with one more loss, will clinch a losing record in May for the first time since 2017 (12-15)...are batting .197 (136-for-690) in May, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest slugging percentage (.281) and OPS (.548) in the majors and the second lowest on-base percentage (.267)...the lowest single-month marks in Oakland history (min. 10 games) are .210 for batting (April, 1979; May, 2012), .267 for on-base percentage (July, 2015), .298 for slugging (April, 1968) and .572 for OPS (April, 1968)...rank last in the majors in home runs (7), tied for last in extra base hits (40) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (59).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .194 (176-for-909) with 74 runs scored (2.6 runs per game) over the last 29 games dating back to April 22...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.205), on-base percentage (.272), slugging percentage (.313) and OPS (.586)...have the third fewest runs scored (140), are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (93) and have the fifth most strikeouts (372)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7)...have scored one run or fewer 16 times, which is four more than any other team...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit three home runs in the last eight games...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 39 games and 42 of 43 this year...have 25 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (21)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied with the Yankees for the most in the majors...each of the A's last seven home runs dating back to May 3 have put the team ahead and Oakland has 15 go-ahead home runs for the season, which is tied for seventh most in the majors.

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed 11 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (10 er in 25.0 ip, 3.60 ERA) after allowing 14 runs in the final game of the last homestand against Minnesota...are tied for third in the American League in shutouts (4) but have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.239), the fifth highest OPS (.691) and the fifth most walks (131).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 0-6 with a 4.77 ERA (29 er in 54.2 ip) over the last 11 games and the streak of 11 consecutive games without a win from the starter is the longest single-season streak by the A's since a 17-game streak from June 3-22, 2016...are 3-12 with a 4.25 ERA (59 er in 125.0 ip) over the last 24 contests...are 11-20 with a 4.00 ERA for the season and are tied with the Mariners for the most losses in the American League...rank fourth in innings pitched (220.1).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs in the last four games (14 er in 17.2 ip, 7.13 ERA) after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 contests (1.65 ERA)...has the second lowest batting average (.200), on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.300) against first batters faced in the AL...has allowed 16-of-74 (21.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 74 inherited runners are tied for fourth most...has surrendered three home runs in the last two games after yielding just one over the previous 17 contests...has allowed 11 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...is tied for fifth in saves (11) and holds (28).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 25-for-31 (80.6%) in stolen base attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and are tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 12-for-20 (60.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL (Orioles, 11-for-20, 55.0%)...the 12 stolen bases allowed are third fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed seven errors in the last nine games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 30

errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 32)...however, the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...are tied for second in the AL in double plays turned (40)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (4).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-2 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (three games) tonight...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 11-12 (.478) on the road...return home following the game Wednesday for a seven-game homestand against Texas (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-15/.250)...have compiled a 3.37 ERA (74 er in 197.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.23 at home.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 3-7 (.300) in intradivision play and the 10 games are second fewest in the majors to the Mariners (9)...this series is the A's first with the Mariners and face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League and the record is second worst...13 of the A's 26 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for the most in the AL...have one walk-off win, which is tied for third fewest.

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the rookies have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons.

**A'S vs. MARINERS:** The A's face the Mariners for the first time this year after losing the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...lost each of the final 12 games last year, which is one short of the Oakland record for longest losing streak against one team...11 of the 15 losses last year were by two runs or fewer...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost each of the last six games in Seattle, which is one short of the A's longest losing streak in this ballpark (7, May 3-Oct. 1, 2009)...have lost six straight and 10 of the last 12 in Oakland...have now lost seven of the last nine season series and are 66-96 (.407) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-320 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 171-173 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-109 at T-Mobile Park.

**Zach Jackson** is tied for sixth among American League relievers in strikeouts (25)...**Dany Jiménez** leads American League rookies and ranks fifth among all AL pitchers in saves (8)...ranks sixth among AL relievers in ERA (0.55)...is one of three AL closers without a blown save...**A.J. Puk** has a career-high and A's season-high 14.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks fourth among AL relievers in ERA (0.52).

**THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY**

In **1901** Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in **1983** it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings...in **2009** Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44<sup>th</sup> player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Logue (2-2, 2.04 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on Friday for his third stint with the A's this year...was optioned to Las Vegas on Wednesday and returned for Daulton Jefferies, who went on the 15-day injured list...is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the season...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15...picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled May 6 and went 1-2 with a 2.20 ERA in three starts during his second stint.

**FIRST APPEARANCE:** Made his Major League debut on April 19 in Oakland against Baltimore and earned the win with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 2-1 victory...became the 17th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his ML debut, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...relieved Irvin to start the sixth inning with Oakland trailing 1-0...struck out the first batter he faced (Ramon Urias) and retired the side in order in the sixth...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Castellani with one out and runners on first and second in the seventh.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 2-1 A's loss at Minnesota on May 6...surrendered a lead off home run to Miranda in the second and a leadoff home run to Buxton in the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work and he was relieved by Puk to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

**SECOND START:** He combined with Moll and Grimm on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win at Detroit on May 11...tossed seven of the innings, allowed five of the hits and did not walk a batter...allowed two base runners as far as second base.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Minnesota a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Polanco in the third and the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Buxton in the fifth and was relieved by Acevedo one out in the fifth and runners on first and second.

**WITH LAS VEGAS:** Was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts, all at home...walked eight batters in 16.0 innings for a .400 on-base percentage...surrendered five home runs and had a .621 opponents slugging percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .286 (4-for-14) against left-handed hitters and .327 (17-for-52) against right-handers...surrendered all nine of his extra base hits (three doubles, one triple, five home runs) and issued six of his eight walks to righties...had a 1.118 OPS against righties, .661 against lefties...all five of his home runs allowed were solo shots...logged 2.2 innings and 48 pitches in his first start and 4.0 innings and 64 pitches in his second start before joining the A's bullpen on April 15...then tossed 4.0 innings and 75 pitches in his third start and 5.1 innings and 87 pitches in his fourth start before joining the A's rotation on May 6.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP James Kaprielian (0-2, 4.50 ERA):** Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...allowed four runs in 2.0 innings in his first start but has yielded just five runs in 16.0 innings over his last three (2.81 ERA)...has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his four starts and opponents are 13-for-66 (.197)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-2 A's win last Tuesday against Minnesota in Oakland (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 6.35 ERA (17.0 ip, 16 h, 12 r, 12 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, including two starts, against Seattle...was 1-0 with a 5.87 ERA (15.1 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in four games, including two starts, last year...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas.

**2021 RECAP:** Began the season at Double-A New Hampshire and was 3-1 with a 4.54 ERA in seven starts when he was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 12...went 9-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with the Bisons and combined for a 12-4 record and a 3.67 ERA in 25 appearances overall...struck out 144 batters in 125.0 innings, an average of 10.37 per nine innings...walked just 27 (1.94 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.33...his strikeouts were a career-high and he matched his best in wins...hit a career-high 10 batters...tied for third among all minor leaguers in wins and tied for ninth in innings pitched...led the Blue Jays farm system in wins, strikeouts, games started (24) and innings pitched...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the season.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .239 opponents batting average, which broke down to .225 (27-for-120) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (85-for-349) against right-handers...yielded 14 of his 15 home runs to righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs with the bases empty...opponents hit .313 with runners in scoring position...had a 213 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .240 the second time and .313 after that...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .180 batting average...had a .130 opponents batting average with two strikeouts but allowed eight home runs.

**THIS AND THAT:** Combined for a 1.84 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.86 ERA from the third inning on...was 0-2 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts on four days rest or less, 10-2 with a 3.70 ERA in 19 games on five days rest or more...his teams were 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 25 appearances.

**2021 DAY-BY-DAY:** Struck out a career-high 12 batters in 6.0 innings in the first game of a May 29 doubleheader at Somerset...it was his second career game of 10 or more strikeouts (Aug. 13, 2018 for Dunedin vs. Jupiter)...went 3-0 with a 2.96 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts in May...struck out 39 batters in 27.1 innings and walked just three...was charged with his first loss of the season in his sixth start on June 4 against Binghamton...issued a season-high four walks and yielded three runs in 4.1 innings in an 11-4 loss...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings on June 11 at Portland but had a no decision...also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...it would be his final Double-A start as he was moved up to Buffalo the next day...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first start with the Bisons on June 18 at Rochester...allowed just one hit and did not walk a batter while striking out eight in a 5-0 win...earned Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week honors for his effort...then went 2-2 with a 4.99 ERA over his next seven games from June 25 to Aug. 1...threw a season-high 97 pitches in 5.0 innings on July 22 against Syracuse...made his one relief appearance on July 28 at Worcester and picked up the win after logging 4.0 scoreless and hitless innings (1 bb, 8 so)...won three consecutive starts from Aug. 7-20... had a 1.65 ERA during the streak, which included 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 13 against Rochester...yielded a season-high tying six runs and hit a career-high three batters in an 8-5 loss to Worcester on Aug. 26...then went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA over his final six starts...struck out 37 and walked just four in 30.1 innings.

**CAREER:** Was the ninth round selection of the Blue Jays in 2017 and went 32-16 with a 3.43 ERA in 84 games, including 73 starts, in four seasons in the Toronto farm system...was traded to the A's on March 16, 2022 with Gunnar Hoglund, Kevin Smith and Kirby Snead in exchange for Matt Chapman...tied for third among all minor league pitchers with 12 wins in 2021...was named a MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the 2018 and 2021 seasons...was named to the Eastern League Midseason All-Star team in 2019.

- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (19) and ranks seventh among relievers in innings pitched (20.2).
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 12 of his 19 appearances.
- Opponents are batting .154 (6-for-39) in May after hitting .316 (12-for-38) in April.
- Has not allowed a run in three career appearances against the Mariners, all last year (4.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).

**Last Year:** Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has allowed just 1-of-8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the 10th lowest percentage in the American League.
- Has not allowed a run in six appearances on one day of rest or fewer (6.2 ip).
- Has not faced the Mariners since April 11, 2018 while pitching for Kansas City (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

**Last Year:** Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Has not allowed an earned run over his last seven games (7.2 ip) and opponents are 3-for-25 (.120) with four walks and 11 strikeouts over that span.
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (19)...ranks sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (25) but is tied for the third most walks (12).
- Has allowed just 1-of-8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the 10th lowest percentage in the American League.
- Has not allowed an earned run in eight appearances on two days rest or more (8.2 ip).
