OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-27) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (19-23)

THURSDAY, MAY 26, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for just the second time in the last 34 games (won three straight from May 10-12)...won two of three at Seattle for just their second series win over the last 10 series (have seven losses and a tie over that stretch)...have lost seven of the last 11 games and are 11-21 (.344) over the last 30 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 19-27 (.413) overall, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...moved into sole possession of fourth place in the AL West with the win yesterday after spending 21 consecutive days in last or tied for last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games for the fourth consecutive day, which is their largest deficit in the West since Sept. 9, 2019 when they were also 10½ back.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .270 (76-for-281) with 34 runs scored and eight home runs over the last eight games (4.3 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.212) and on-base percentage (.277) and second to last in slugging percentage (.329) and OPS (.606)...have the fifth fewest runs scored (157) and the fifth most strikeouts (402)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7)...have scored one run or fewer 16 times, which is the most in the majors, and have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs yesterday after connecting for two on Tuesday and have back-to-back multi-homer games for the first time this year...have homered seven times in the last three games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 30 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for the most in the majors...17 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is the seventh most go-ahead home runs in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 42 games and 45 of 46 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high tying three bases yesterday and have five stolen bases in the last two games...are 30-for-36 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 13-for-22 (59.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors (Astros, 12-for-21, 57.1%)...the 13 stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest (Astros, 12)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.25 ERA (56 er in 96.0 ip) over the last 11 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...now have a 3.87 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.240) and have issued the fourth most walks (146).

STARTING PITCHING: Paul Blackburn picked up the win yesterday for the first win by an A's starting pitcher since May 11 (Logue)...that snapped a 13-game streak without a win from a starter, which was the A's longest such streak since a 17-game streak from June 3-22, 2016...starters are now 1-7 with a 5.57 ERA (40 er in 64.2 ip) over the last 13 games and are 12-21 with a 4.25 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League...have the fifth most innings pitched (235.1)

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted each of its four save opportunities over the last 13 games and has a 4-1 record over that span...has converted 13-of-18 (72.2%) save chances for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has the fifth most saves and ranks third in holds (33)...has the lowest batting average (.199) and slugging percentage (.291) against first batters faced in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.287)...has allowed 16-of-79 (20.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 79 inherited runners are fourth most...has surrendered just 11 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last seven games but have 29 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 33)...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest...rank second in double plays (45)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (4).

A'S IN MAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in the month of May for the first time since 2017 (12-15) as they are 9-16 (.360) with six games remain-

ing...the 16 losses are the A's most in any month since going 11-16 in August of 2017...have the fourth worst record in the American League this month and the fourth highest ERA (4.13)...are batting .212 (170-for-80), which is second lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.315) and second lowest on-base percentage (.277) and OPS (.591)...have the fewest home runs (12) and the third fewest runs scored (76) but are tied for the second most stolen bases (18).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand against Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games) tonight...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 6-17/.261)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.458) on the road...have a 4.23 ERA (85 er in 181.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .201 (126-for-626) with 52 runs and eight home runs in 20 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the AL, the fewest runs and are tied for the fewest home runs.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 5-8 (.385) in intradivision play and the 13 games are third fewest in the AL...have played each AL West foe except the Astros, who they will face for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

CLOSE CALLS: Five of the A's six games on the last road trip were decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 12-14 (.462) in those games for the second...the 26 games are second most in the American League (Orioles, 28) and the 14 losses are tied for second most (Orioles, 15)...are 3-8 (.273) in one-run games...the losses are tied with the Orioles for the most in the AL and the record is second worst to the Rangers (2-6, .250)...have one walk-off win, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the rookies have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lost two of three in Oakland from April 22-24 to open the season series...will not travel to Arlington until July 11...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas...it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 55-34 (.618) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 31-12 (.721) in Oakland...are 396-387 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 209-182 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 493-469 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez recorded his 10th save of the season yesterday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers in saves (8)...ranks fourth among AL relievers in ERA (0.49)...is one of three AL closers without a blown save...**A.J. Puk** had his career-high and A's season-high 15.0-inning scoreless streak snapped yesterday...now has a 0.95 ERA, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-4, 3.55 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 3.51 ERA (13 er in 33.1 ip) and .208 (25-for-120) opponents batting average over his last six starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run once.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in games started (9), ranks seventh in opponents batting average (.205) and on-base percentage (.260), tied for seventh in strikeouts (55), tied for ninth in innings pitched (50.2) and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.23)...is tied for fourth in losses (4).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL), which was the second highest single-game total of his career (13, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle)...it was his eighth career 10-strikeout game, which is tied for fourth most in Oakland history...now has 55 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for seventh in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .212 (21-for-99) batting average against left-handed hitters and .198 (17-for-86) against right-handers...however, has surrendered five of his six home runs and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties for a .662 OPS (.541 OPS vs. righties)...opponents are hitting .152 (5-for-33) with runners in scoring position...four of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has allowed a .189 (14-for-74) average the first time through the order, .270 (17-for-63) the second time and .146 (7-for-48) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...the opponents two hitter in the order is 2-for-23 (.087) against him...opponents are 13-for-105 (.124) with two strikes, including 1-for-18 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .160 career average in that situation.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed eight of his 21 runs in the third inning for a 9.00 ERA (8 er in 8.0 ip)...has a 2.04 ERA (4 er in 17.2 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.88 ERA (8 er in 25.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) and .164 (19-for-116) opponents batting average in five starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13.0 ip) and .271 (13-for-48) opponents average in three starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-11 with a 2.68 ERA (59 er in 198.1 ip) in 33 starts on four days rest, 17-12 with a 4.11 ERA (106 er in 232.1 ip) in 42 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.87 ERA (10 er in 31.1 ip) and .173 (19-for-110) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) and .253 (19-for-75) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has 498.2 innings pitched in his career and needs 1.1 more for 500...the A's have been shut out in three of his nine starts and he has received one run of support or fewer six times...has 17 runs of support overall (50.2 ip, 3.02 RSA)...is 2-0 with a 3.32 ERA (7 er in 19.0 ip) in four starts at night compared to 0-4 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day...now has a career record of 21-12 at night and 12-15 during the day...the A's have lost in all three of his no decisions and are 2-7 (.222) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to

Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...allowed a season-high seven hits and threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...it was his eighth career game of 10 or more strikeouts.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...left the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)...allowed a lead off single to Ohtani but then retired each of the final five batters that he faced.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts...the strikeouts were second best in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...they were was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74, also last year...his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028)...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (2-2, 2.94 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list last Sunday and started and lost in the A's 4-1 decision at Los Angeles (AL) that day (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto...walked nine batters in 33.2 innings over his first six starts, an average of 2.41 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...is 3-2 with a 3.44 ERA (34.0 ip, 29 h, 16 r, 13 er, 7 bb, 27 so, 1 hr) in six career starts against Texas...including a win in his only start this year on April 24 in Oakland (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...left with the lead in both of his losses and his one no decision but the pen blew the save each time.

- Has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip), .143 (6-for-42) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 11 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for third in the the Majors in games pitched (21) and is tied for 11th among MLB relievers in innings pitched (21.2).
- Opponents are 4-for-22 (.182) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 13 of his 20 appearances.
- Has faced the Rangers four times in his career, logging a 7.36 ERA (3 er, 3.2 ip) with three strikeouts, two walks, and two home runs allowed.
