## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-28) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (20-23)

FRIDAY, MAY 27, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost four of the last six games and eight of the last 12... are 11-22 (.333) over the last 33 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 19-28 (.413) overall, which is the fifth worst record in the American League... won two of three at Seattle to start the week and are 2-7-1 over the previous 10 series...are tied for fourth in the AL West and have spent 22 of the last 23 days with at least a share of last placet...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 11 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Aug. 10, 2019 when they were also 11 back...have not been 12 back since June 16, 2019.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to one run last night, which marks the 17th time this year they have scored one run or fewer...that is the most in the majors... have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...are batting .260 (81-for-312) with 35 runs scored and eight home runs over the last nine games (3.9 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.211), on-base percentage (.276) and OPS (.603) and second to last in slugging percentage (.327)...have the third fewest runs scored (158) and the fifth most strikeouts (408)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have homered seven times in the last four games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 30 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for the most in the majors...17 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is the seventh most go-ahead home runs in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 43 games and 46 of 47 this year.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have stolen a base in three consecutive games for the fourth time this year (six steals total during current streak)...are 31-for-37 (83.8%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and are tied with the Rangers for the second most steals (Rays, 34)...A's opponents are 13-for-22 (59.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors (Astros, 12-for-21, 57.1%)...the 13 stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest (Astros, 12)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers had 15 strikeouts last night for the second time in the last 11 games...have compiled a 5.06 ERA (59 er in 105.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in most walks (148) and fifth in highest opponents batting average (.238).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have not allowed an earned run in the last two games...however, are 1-7 with a 5.02 ERA (40 er in 71.2 ip) over the last 14 games...are 12-21 with a 4.12 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League...have the fourth most innings pitched (242.1).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has converted each of its four save opportunities over the last 14 games and has a 4-2 record over that span...has converted 13-of-18 (72.2%) save chances for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has the fifth most saves and is tied for third in holds (33)...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.201), the third lowest on-base percentage (.288) and is tied for the third lowest slugging percentage (.313)...has allowed 17-of-80 (21.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 80 inherited runners are fourth most...has surrendered just 12 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 30 errors, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 33)...however, the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest...rank second in double plays (45)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (4).

**A'S IN MAY:** The A's have clinched a losing record in the month of May for the first time since 2017 (12-15) as they are 9-17 (.346) with five games remaining...the 17 losses are the A's most in any month since going 10-17 in September of 2016...are scheduled to play 31 games this month, which would be the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31... have the third worst record in the American League this month and the fifth

highest ERA (4.09)...are batting .210 (175-for-832), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the lowest single month batting average in Oakland history (min. 10 games) is .210 in April of 1979 and May of 2012...also have the lowest slugging percentage (.311) and OPS (.587) in the majors and the second lowest on-base percentage (.275)...have the second fewest home runs (12) and the fourth fewest runs scored (77)...have 19 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to the Rangers (20) and the most by an A's team in May since they had 22 in 2012.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-1), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 12 of the last 14 home games...are 6-15 (.286) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Nationals (7-17, .292)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.458) on the road...have a 4.17 ERA (88 er in 190.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .199 (131-for-657) with 53 runs and eight home runs in 21 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the AL, the fewest runs and are tied for the fewest home runs.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 5-9 (.357) in intradivision play...the record is second worst in the AL and the 14 games are third fewest...have played each AL West foe except the Astros, who they will face for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Five of the A's last seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 12-14 (.462) in those games for the season...the 26 games are second most in the American League (Orioles, 28) and the 14 losses are tied for second most (Orioles, 15)...are 3-8 (.273) in one-run games...the losses are tied with the Orioles for the most in the AL and the record is second worst to the Rangers (2-6, .250)...have one walk-off win, which is tied for the fewest in the AL.

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the rookies have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons.

**A'S vs. RANGERS:** The A's are 1-3 against the Rangers this year...lost the first game of this series last night after losing two of three in Oakland from April 22-24 to open the season series...will not travel to Arlington until July 11... won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas... it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 55-35 (.611) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 31-13 (.705) in Oakland...are 396-388 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 209-183 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 493-470 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Dany Jiménez** recorded his 10th save of the season Wednesday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers in saves (8)...ranks fourth among AL relievers in ERA (0.49)...is one of three AL closers without a blown save...**A.J. Puk** had his career-high and A's season-high 15.0-inning scoreless streak snapped Wednesday...now has a 0.95 ERA, which ranks fifth among AL relievers.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-2, 2.94 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list last Sunday and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked nine batters in 33.2 innings over his first six starts, an average of 2.41 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year...his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts last year and has now done so in 37 of his 41 career starts...has walked just 65 batters in 257.1 career innings (2.27 per nine innings).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and all five of his home runs in three starts on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts against American League West teams...last year, he went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors last year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed four runs in the first inning for a 6.00 ERA (6.0 ip)...has a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over innngs two through five and a 9.82 ERA (4 er in 3.2 ip) from the sixth inning on...has struck out 22 batters in 33.2 innings, an average of 5.88 strikeouts per nine innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...has made five of his six starts this year in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors.

**2022 HIGHLIGHTS:** Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs and had season highs in runs (4) and strikeouts (4)...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...combined with Jackson, Sneed and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...was reinstated on May 22.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...allowed a season-high eight hits and walked a season-high tying two batters...surrendered a home run to Ohtani to lead off the first, allowed a RBI single to Trout in the second and a RBI single to Marsh in the fifth...was relieved by Grimm to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-0.

**IRVIN vs. TEXAS:** Is 3-2 with a 3.44 ERA (34.0 ip, 29 h, 16 r, 13 er, 7 bb, 27 so, 1 hr) in six career starts...is 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA (9 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts in Arlington...combined with Jackson, Sneed and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in his only start this year, a 2-0 A's win on April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...did not allow a base runner past first base...retired the side in

**2021 RECAP:** Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .323 career opponents average with RISP...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**LHP Zach Logue (2-3, 4.43 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 20 for his third stint with the A's this year and started and lost on Monday at Seattle in a 7-6 decision (4.2 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 3 hr)...allowed seven runs in 4.2 innings against the Mariners after yielding just four runs in 17.2 innings over his first four appearances...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15...picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled May 6 and went 1-2 with a 2.20 ERA in three starts during his second stint before he was optioned to Las Vegas on May 18...has never faced the Rangers in his career...was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts with Las Vegas...was acquired from Toronto prior to the season in the Matt Chapman trade.

- Has a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip), .156 (7-for-45) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 12 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (22) and is tied for 11th among MLB relievers in innings pitched (22.2).
- Opponents are 4-for-22 (.182) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 14 of his 22 appearances.
- Has faced the Rangers five times in his career, logging a 5.79 ERA (3 er, 4.2 ip) with five strikeouts, two walks, and two home runs allowed.

**Last Year:** Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has a 0.87 ERA (10.1 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 5 so) in eight games in May after posting a 9.64 ERA in six games in April.
- Has allowed just 1-of-8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in six appearances on one day of rest or fewer (6.2 ip).
- Has not faced the Rangers since Sept. 22, 2018 with the Mariners...has faced them four times in his career, throwing 4.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit and one walk with one strikeout.

**Last Year:** Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in games pitched (21)...ranks tied for sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (27) and is tied for the third most walks (13).
