OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-29) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (21-23)

SATURDAY, MAY 28, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, five of the last seven and nine of the last 13 games...are 11-23 (.324) over the last 34 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 19-29 (.396) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...it marks the second time the A's have been 10 games under .500 this year (17-27 on May 23), which are the first times the A's have been 10 games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under (75-87)...won two of three at Seattle to start the week and are 2-7-1 over the previous 10 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 23 of the last 24 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 21 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 11 games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Aug. 10, 2019 when they were also 11 back...have not been 12 back since June 16, 2019.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .251 (86-for-343) with 40 runs scored and 10 home runs over the last 10 games (4.0 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.210), on-base percentage (.275) and OPS (.603) and second to last in slugging percentage (.328)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (163) and the fifth most strikeouts (417)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7)...have been held to one run or fewer 17 times, which is the most in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered nine times in the last five games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 32 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors...17 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is the eighth most go-ahead home runs in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 44 games and 47 of 48 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in a season-high four consecutive games (seven stolen bases total)...are 32-for-38 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 15-for-24 (62.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 15 stolen bases allowed are tied for third fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.29 ERA (67 er in 114.0 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in most walks (149) and fifth in highest opponents batting average (.241).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-0 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) over the last three games but are 1-7 with a 4.96 ERA (43 er in 78.0 ip) over the last 15 contests...are 12-21 with a 4.13 ERA for the season and the losses are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League...have the fourth most innings pitched (248.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled 6.48 ERA (24 er in 33.1 ip) over the last nine games...has allowed 18-of-83 (21.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...the 83 inherited runners are fourth most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.204) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.293) and slugging percentage (.313)...has surrendered just 12 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...is 13-for-19 (68.4%) in save opportunities and is tied for fifth in saves...ranks third in holds (34)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 30 errors, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 35)...however, the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest...rank second in double plays (47).

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 9-18 (.333) in the month of May, which is their first losing record in May since 2017 (12-15)...the 18 losses are the A's most in any month since going 10-18 in August of 2016...are scheduled to play 31 games this month, which would be the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...have the third worst record in the American League in May and the fifth highest ERA (4.24)...are batting .209 (180-for-863), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the lowest single month batting average in Oakland history (min. 10 games) is .210 in April of 1979 and May of 2012...also have the lowest slugging percentage (.314) and OPS (.588) in the majors and the second lowest on-base percentage (.274)...have the second fewest home runs (14) and the fourth fewest runs scored (82)...have 20

stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to the Rangers (22) and the most by an A's team in May since they had 22 in 2012.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-2), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 13 of the last 15 home games...are 6-16 (.273) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Nationals (7-17, .292)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.458) on the road...have a 4.34 ERA (96 er in 199.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the fifth highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .198 (136-for-688) with 58 runs and 10 home runs in 22 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the fewest runs and the second fewest home runs.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that began on May 13 and runs through Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 5-10 (.333) in intradivision play, which is the second worst record in the AL...have played each AL West foe except the Astros, who they will face for the first time with a three-game set beginning Monday.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last eight games have been decided by three runs or fewer...are 3-8 (.273) in one-run games...are tied with the Orioles for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record to the Rangers (2-6, .250)...are 12-14 (.462) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 26 games are second most in the AL and the losses are tied for second most (Orioles, 13-15)...have one walk-off win, which is tied for the fewest in the AL.

PLAYER NOTES: Austin Pruitt was selected from Las Vegas today and would become the 41st player to appear in a game for the A's this year...the A's current total of 40 players is tied for fifth most in the American League...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...11 of the rookies have been pitchers, which is one short of the Oakland record (12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.

AUSMUS TO MANAGE: Bench coach Brad Ausmus will manage today as Mark Kotsay attends his daughter's graduation...Ausmus has five years of Major League managerial experience with the Tigers (2014-17) and Angels (2019).

SCORING CHANGE: The official scorer has made a scoring change in Thursday night's game...in the top of the second, Heim reached base on what was originally scored as an Andrus error...that has been changed to a base hit, which makes the run off Montas that inning earned.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The A's are 1-4 against the Rangers this year...have lost the first two games of this series after losing two of three in Oakland from April 22-24 to open the season series...will not travel to Arlington until July 11...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas...it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 55-36 (.604) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 31-14 (.389) in Oakland...are 396-389 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 209-184 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 493-471 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez recorded his 10th save of the season Wednesday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers in saves...his 10 saves are the most among AL closers without a blown save...**A.J. Puk** had his career-high and A's season-high 15.0-inning scoreless streak snapped Wednesday...now has a 0.95 ERA, which ranks fourth among AL relievers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** George Hendrick hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off shot in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago...in **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Logue (2-3, 4.43 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 20 for his third stint with the A's this year and started and lost on Monday at Seattle...allowed seven runs in 4.2 innings against the Mariners after yielding just four runs in 17.2 innings over his first four appearances...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15...picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled May 6 and went 1-2 with a 2.20 ERA in three starts during his second stint before he was optioned to Las Vegas on May 18...returned two days later when Daulton Jefferies went on the 15-day injured list.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .188 (3-for-16) opponents batting average left-handed hitters compared to .268 (19-for-71) and all five of his home runs allowed against right-handers...opponents are 3-for-19 (.158) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number three hitter (0-for-10) or seven hitter (0-for-10)...is scheduled to make his first appearance in a day game after each of his first five outings came at night.

FIRST APPEARANCE: Made his Major League debut on April 19 in Oakland against Baltimore and earned the win with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 2-1 victory...became the 17th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his ML debut, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...relieved Irvin to start the sixth inning with Oakland trailing 1-0...struck out the first batter he faced (Ramon Urias) and retired the side in order in the sixth...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Castellani with one out and runners on first and second in the seventh.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 2-1 A's loss at Minnesota on May 6...surrendered a lead off home run to Miranda in the second and a leadoff home run to Buxton in the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work and he was relieved by Puk to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

SECOND START: He combined with Moll and Grimm on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win at Detroit on May 11...tossed seven of the innings, allowed five of the hits and did not walk a batter...allowed two base runners as far as second base.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Minnesota on May 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Polanco in the third and the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Buxton in the fifth and was relieved by Acevedo one out in the fifth and runners on first and second.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-6 loss at Seattle on Monday...allowed seven runs on six hits and four walks in 4.2 innings...yielded a three-run home run to Rodriguez in the third, a two-run home run to Raleigh in the fourth and a two-run home run to Suarez in the fifth.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts, all at home...walked eight batters in 16.0 innings for a .400 on-base percentage...surrendered five home runs and had a .621 opponents slugging percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .286 (4-for-14) against left-handed hitters and .327 (17-for-52) against right-handers...surrendered all nine of his extra base hits (three doubles, one triple, five home runs) and issued six of his eight walks to righties...had a 1.118 OPS against righties, .661 against lefties...all five of his home runs allowed were solo shots...logged 2.2 innings and 48 pitches in his first start and 4.0 innings and 64 pitches in his second start before joining the A's bullpen on April 15...then tossed 4.0 innings and 75 pitches in his third start and 5.1 innings and 87 pitches in his fourth start before joining the A's rotation on May 6.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A New Hampshire and was 3-1 with a 4.54 ERA in seven starts when he was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 12...went 9-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with the Bisons and combined for a 12-4 record and a 3.67 ERA in 25 appearances overall...struck out 144 batters in 125.0 innings, an average of 10.37 per nine innings...walked just 27 (1.94 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.33...his strikeouts were a career-high and he matched his best in wins...hit a career-high 10 batters...tied for third among all minor leaguers in wins and tied for ninth in innings pitched...led the Blue Jays farm system in wins, strikeouts, games started (24) and innings pitched...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .239 opponents batting average, which broke down to .225 (27-for-120) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (85-for-349) against right-handers...yielded 14 of his 15 home runs to righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs with the bases empty...opponents hit .313 with runners in scoring position...had a 213 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .240 the second time and .313 after that...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .180 batting average...had a .130 opponents batting average with two strikeouts but allowed eight home runs.

THIS AND THAT: Combined for a 1.84 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.86 ERA from the third inning on...was 0-2 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts on four days rest or less, 10-2 with a 3.70 ERA in 19 games on five days rest or more...his teams were 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 25 appearances.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Struck out a career-high 12 batters in 6.0 innings in the first game of a May 29 doubleheader at Somerset...it was his second career game of 10 or more strikeouts (Aug. 13, 2018 for Dunedin vs. Jupiter)...went 3-0 with a 2.96 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts in May...struck out 39 batters in 27.1 innings and walked just three...was charged with his first loss of the season in his sixth start on June 4 against Binghamton...issued a season-high four walks and yielded three runs in 4.1 innings in an 11-4 loss...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings on June 11 at Portland but had a no decision...also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...it would be his final Double-A start as he was moved up to Buffalo the next day...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first start with the Bisons on June 18 at Rochester...allowed just one hit and did not walk a batter while striking out eight in a 5-0 win...earned Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week honors for his effort...then went 2-2 with a 4.99 ERA over his next seven games from June 25 to Aug. 1...threw a season-high 97 pitches in 5.0 innings on July 22 against Syracuse...made his one relief appearance on July 28 at Worcester and picked up the win after logging 4.0 scoreless and hitless innings (1 bb, 8 so)...won three consecutive starts from Aug. 7-20... had a 1.65 ERA during the streak, which included 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 13 against Rochester...yielded a season-high tying six runs and hit a career-high three batters in an 8-5 loss to Worcester on Aug. 26...then went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA over his final six starts...struck out 37 and walked just four in 30.1 innings.

CAREER: Was the ninth round selection of the Blue Jays in 2017 and went 32-16 with a 3.43 ERA in 84 games, including 73 starts, in four seasons in the Toronto farm system...was traded to the A's on March 16, 2022 with Gunnar Hoglund, Kevin Smith and Kirby Sneed in exchange for Matt Chapman...tied for third among all minor league pitchers with 12 wins in 2021...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the 2018 and 2021 seasons...was named to the Eastern League Midseason All-Star team in 2019.

RHP James Kaprielian (0-2, 5.48 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his last start after yielding five runs in 16.0 innings over his previous three starts...has allowed four hits or fewer in four of his five starts...has a 0.90 ERA over the first two innings, a 9.00 ERA from the third inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win at Seattle last Tuesday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is scheduled to make the 27th start of his career tomorrow, his seventh against Texas...is 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA (32.0 ip, 34 h, 16 r, 16 er, 9 bb, 23 so, 5 hr) in six career starts, all last year...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas.

- Has a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip), .156 (7-for-45) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 12 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for second in MLB in games pitched (22) and tied for 12th among MLB relievers in innings pitched (22.2).

- Recorded his 10th save of the season Wednesday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012).
- Has converted each of his 10 save opportunities for the first 10 saves of his career...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers in saves.
- Ranks 21st among AL relievers in ERA (1.89), 12th in opponents OPS (.468) and seventh in slugging percentage (.211).
- Allowed three runs in 0.2 innings for the loss last night...prior to that outing, had not allowed a run in eight of his previous 10 games (10.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 0.96 ERA) and opponents were 2-for-30 (.067) over that span.
