OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-30) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (30-18)

MONDAY, MAY 30, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak with a walk-off win yesterday but have lost six of the last nine games and 10 of the last 15...are 20-30 (.400) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 10 games under .500, which is one short of the season high of 11 (19-30 on May 28)...lost three of four to Texas to start the homestand and are now 2-8-1 over the last 11 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 25 of the last 26 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 11 games for the fourth consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Aug. 10, 2019 when they were also 11 back...have not been 12 back since June 16, 2019.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's trailed 4-0 yesterday entering the bottom of the fifth but came back to win 6-5 for their biggest come-from-behind win of the season...it was their sixth comeback win of the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...trailed 4-3 after seven innings for their first win when trailing after seven innings...won the game on a Jed Lowrie walk-off single for their second walk-off win of the season, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...are now 4-8 (.333) in one-run games...the eight losses are tied for the most in the AL and the record is second worst (Rangers, 2-7/.222)...are 13-14 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 27 games are tied for second most in the AL and the losses are tied for third most.

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 10-19 (.345) in the month of the May, which marks the first time they have lost 19 games in a month since going 8-19 in September of 2015...have lost 20 or more games in a month 12 times in Oakland history, most recently in August of 2008 (10-20)...the record is 24 in June of 1979...are scheduled to play 31 games this month, which would be the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...have the third worst record in the American League in May (Mariners and Royals, 9-18/.333) and the third highest ERA (4.50)...are batting .217 (204-for-941), which is the second lowest mark in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.621), the second lowest OPS (.604) and third lowest on-base percentage (.283)...have the fewest home runs (15) and the second fewest runs (92)...have 21 stolen bases, which is second most to the Rangers (24) and the most by an A's team in May since they had 22 in 2012.

OFFENSE: The A's collected a season-high 14 hits yesterday and are now batting .261 (110-for-421) with 50 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last 12 games (4.2 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...left 16 runners on base, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's stranded at least 16 in a nine-inning game...fell one short of the record of 17 (Sept. 18, 1982 at Chicago)...for the season, the A's rank last in the majors in batting (.215) and on-base percentage (.280) and second to last in slugging percentage (.331) and OPS (.612)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (173) and the fifth most strikeouts (432).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered 10 times in the last seven games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 33 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for third most in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 46 games and 49 of 50 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's had their season-high streak of five consecutive games with a stolen base end yesterday...have eight steals in the last six games and are 33-for-39 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 17-for-26 (65.4%) in stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest success rate in the AL...the 17 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.66 ERA (83 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 15 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.11 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the AL...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.245), slugging percentage (.394) and OPS (.709) and the fifth highest on-base percentage (.315)...have issued the fifth most walks (156).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-8 with a 5.42 ERA (51 er in 84.2 ip) over the last 17 contests...are 12-22 with a 4.30 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League...have the third highest ERA.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled 6.45 ERA (32 er in 44.2 ip) over the last 11 games...has allowed 18-of-88 (20.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 88 inherited runners are tied for fifth most in the majors...has the second lowest batting average (.196) and slugging percentage (.301) against first batters faced in the American League and the third lowest on-base percentage (.291)...has surrendered just 13 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...is 13-for-20 (65.0%) in save opportunities...is tied for fourth in holds (34)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 32 errors, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 14 of the last 17 home games...are 7-17 (.292) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Cubs (7-15, .318)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.500) on the road...have a 4.65 ERA (112 er in 217.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .209 (160-for-766) with 68 runs and 11 home runs in 24 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the majors, the second fewest runs and the second fewest home runs.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that began on May 13 and concludes Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 6-11 (.353) in intradivision play, which is the second worst record in the AL...have played each AL West foe except the Astros, who they will face for the first time today.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 41 players, which is fifth most in the American League...have two players on the roster who have yet to appear in a game (Markel and Tapia)...Oakland employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...the A's have used 18 rookies and Markel would become the 19th...are currently tied for the sixth most rookies in a season in Oakland history and Markel would move that into a tie for third most...the two highest rookie totals in a season in Oakland history are 21 in 2008 and 20 in 2017...Markel would be the 12th rookie pitcher, which would tie the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

MEMORIAL DAY: The A's have a 28-22 record on Memorial Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 20-12 at home compared to 8-10 on the road...have lost three of the last four games on Memorial Day, including a 6-5 loss at Seattle last year...are facing the Astros for the first time on Memorial Day.

A'S vs. ASTROS: The A's lost the season series last year for the sixth time in the last seven years as they went 8-11 against Houston...were 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...are now 52-72 (.419) against Houston over the previous seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 83-85 all-time, including 46-41 in Oakland and 37-44 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus had two hits yesterday and now has 1,899 hits in his career...based on his current pace this year, he would finish the season with 1,977 career hits...**Dany Jiménez** is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...**Chad Pinder** had a pinch hit RBI single in the eighth inning yesterday for his 21st career pinch RBI...that ties the Oakland career record for pinch RBI set by Matt Stairs...**A.J. Puk** ranks fifth among AL relievers with a 0.95 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (5-0, 1.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed nine runs over his first nine starts and has a 1.70 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...over the last 15 years, the only A's pitcher with an ERA under 2.00 and at least 40 innings pitched at the end of May is Sonny Gray in 2015 (1.82)...has not allowed a run in four of his nine starts and has yielded three runs or fewer in all nine starts...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

5-0: Has won each of his first five decisions for a career-high five-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...that is tied for the second longest winning streak in the American League this year (Verlander, 6)...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011...the five wins are tied for third most in the AL and are a career high...had just three wins in 30 career appearances entering the season.

DON'T WALK: Walked a career-high five batters in his last start after issuing just seven free passes in 42.1 innings over his first eight starts...has walked two batters or fewer in eight of his nine starts, including three starts with no walks and three others with just one...has issued just 22 free passes in 86.0 innings over the last two years (2.30 per nine innings) and is averaging 2.42 walks per nine innings in his career (50 bb in 185.2 ip).

DON'T HOMER: Has allowed just one home run over his first nine starts (47.2 ip) and his average of 0.19 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...yielded eight home runs in 38.1 innings last year and entered the season with 18 home runs in 138.0 career innings (1.17 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 5-for-32 (.156) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has a .187 (14-for-75) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .253 (19-for-75) the second time and .143 (3-for-21) the third time...has allowed a .146 opponents batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six of his nine runs over the first two innings of the game (6 er in 18.0 ip, 3.00 ERA)...has a 0.91 ERA (3 er in 29.2 ip) from the third inning on...is 4-0 with a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts on the road, 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts at home...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 8-1 (.889) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings on May 3 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 10-7, 10-inning loss...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 9.0 innings...logged a season-high 6.2 innings for the second consecutive start in the day game on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win...allowed a season-high tying six hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 20.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 victory at Seattle last Wednesday...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit, a Crawford RBI single in the second inning...however, walked a career-high five batters but only two base runners advanced to scoring position...was relieved by Trivino with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's leading 3-0.

BLACKBURN vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (13.1 ip, 26 h, 21 r, 20 er, 5 bb, 3 so, 5 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with a 12.79 ERA (9 er in 6.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 14.14 ERA (11 er in 7.0 ip) in two games in Houston...was 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (7.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 3 hr) in two starts last year...the no decision came in the A's 4-3 win in Oakland on Sept. 26...retired 14 of the first 15 batters he faced, allowing just a one-out walk to Bregman in the first...had a 1-0 lead when Castro singled with two outs in the fifth for the Astros first hit...Castro scored on a Siri RBI single and Blackburn was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth with the score tied 1-1...then took the loss in a 10-4 decision at Houston on Oct. 2...the A's scored twice in the top of the first but he allowed a three-run home run to Alvarez in the bottom of the first, a Castro solo home run in a two-run second inning and a leadoff home run to Gurriel in the third.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)...had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS
RHP Frankie Montas (2-4, 3.28 ERA): Is 0-3 despite a 3.12 ERA (14 er in 40.1 ip) and .200 (29-for-145) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run twice...he has allowed no runs twice during the streak, one run once and two runs twice...has 18 runs of support overall (57.2 ip, 2.81 RSA)...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to Texas last Thursday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 11 so)...it was his ninth career game with 10 or more strikeouts, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...is 7-4 with a 3.48 ERA (64.2 ip, 63 h, 25 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 8 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 11 starts, against Houston during the regular season...went 3-1 with a 1.82 ERA (24.2 ip, 20 h, 6 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 29 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year.

- Is tied for first in MLB in games pitched (23) and is 12th among MLB relievers in innings pitched (23.2).

- Has allowed earned runs in consecutive outings after 8 previous appearances of not allowing an earned run.
- Is tied for fifth in the majors in games (22)...is tied for fifth among AL relievers in strikeouts (29) and is tied for the third most walks (13).
- Is holding opposing hitters to a .143 batting average with two strikes (6-for-42).
- Owns a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in away games compared to a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) in home contests.
- Earned his first career win on May 17 against Minnesota.
- Has allowed just two earned runs to AL West opponents this season (8.1 ip, 7 h, 2 er, 11 so).

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
