OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-31) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (31-18)

TUESDAY, MAY 31, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games, seven of the last 10 and 11 of the last 16 to fall a season-high tying 11 games under .500 for the second time this year (19-30 on May 28)...have not been more than 11 games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 under (75-87)...are 20-31 (.392), which is the third worst record in the American League...lost three of four to Texas to start the homestand and are 2-8-1 over the previous 11 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 26 of the last 27 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 24 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 12 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since June 16, 2019 when they were also 12 back...have not been more than 12 games back since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out of first place.

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 10-20 (.333) in the month of May entering the final game today...this marks the 13th time in Oakland history the A's have lost 20 or more games in a month, the first time since August of 2008 (10-20)...with a loss today, the A's would tie for the third most losses in a month in Oakland history...have not lost more than 20 games in a month since going 9-21 in May of 1997...the A's .333 winning percentage this month is currently fifth worst in Oakland history in May...a win would make it sixth worst and a loss would keep it at fifth...are tied with the Mariners for the third worst record in the majors this month (Marlins, 7-19/.269; Royals, 9-19/.321)...today is the A's 31st game in May, which are the A's most games in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...A's pitchers have 225 strikeouts this month, which is seven short of the Oakland record for May (232 last year)...the A's are slugging .315 with a .595 OPS this month, both of which are currently the lowest May marks in Oakland history (.326 slugging in 1978, .622 OPS in 1968)...have not finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (Texas, .562; Cleveland, .577)...have a .279 on-base percentage, which is second lowest in Oakland history in May (.277 in 2018), and a .213 batting average, which is third lowest (.210 in 2012, .211 in 2018)...have 21 stolen bases, which is the most by the A's in May since 2012 (22)...rank last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS this month, have the second lowest on-base percentage, second fewest home runs (15) and third fewest runs scored (93)...have the third most steals.

PLAYER NOTES: Parker Markel and Domingo Tapia both made their 2022 debuts yesterday, becoming the 42nd and 43rd players to appear in a game for the A's this year...the 43 players are tied with the Twins for second most in the American League to the Angels (44)...Oakland employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...Markel became the 19th rookie, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...only the 2008 club (21) and 2017 (20) have used more rookies...Markel is the 12th rookie pitcher, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

OFFENSE: After collecting a season-high 14 hits on Sunday, the A's were held to a season-low tying two hits yesterday...are batting .250 (112-for-448) with 51 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last 13 games (3.9 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...for the season, the A's rank last in the majors in batting (.213), on-base percentage (.278) and OPS (.606) and second to last in slugging percentage (.328)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (174) and the seventh most strikeouts (439).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered 10 times in the last eight games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 33 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for fourth most in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 47 games and 50 of 51 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's have eight stolen bases in the last seven games and are 33-for-39 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 18-for-27 (66.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest success rate in the AL...the 18 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.62 ERA (88 er in 141.0 ip) over the last 16 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.12 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.244), slugging percentage (.396)

and OPS (.710)...have issued the fourth most walks (158)...have allowed eight home runs in the last three games and 51 for the season, which is fifth most.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-9 with a 5.42 ERA (55 er in 91.1 ip) over the last 19 games and are 12-23 with a 4.33 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and the ERA is third highest...have the third most innings pitched (262.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) over the last 12 games...has allowed 18-of-89 (20.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 89 inherited runners are sixth most...has the lowest batting average (.194) and slugging percentage (.297) against first batters faced in the American League and the third lowest on-base percentage (.292)...has surrendered just 14 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...is 13-for-20 (65.0%) in save opportunities...is tied for fourth in holds (34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games and now have 33 for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-1) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 15 of the last 18 home games...are 7-18 (.280) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Cubs (7-17, .292)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.500) on the road...have a 4.66 ERA (117 er in 226.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the highest home ERA in the American League and fourth highest in the majors...are hitting .204 (162-for-793) with 69 runs and 11 home runs in 25 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the second fewest runs and the second fewest home runs.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-8 (.333) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League, the winning percentage is second lowest and the 12 games are tied for fifth fewest...are 13-14 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 27 games are tied for second most in the AL and the losses are tied for third most...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that began on May 13 and concludes tomorrow in which they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 6-12 (.333) in intradivision play, which is the worst record in the AL.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A'S vs. ASTROS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 yesterday...lost the season series last year for the sixth time in the last seven years as they went 8-11 against Houston...were 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...are now 52-73 (.416) against Houston over the last eight years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 83-86 all-time, including 46-42 in Oakland and 37-44 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus had two hits Monday and now has 1,899 hits in his career...based on his current pace this year, he would finish the season with 1,975 career hits...**Dany Jiménez** is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...**A.J. Puk** ranks ninth among AL relievers with a 1.37 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-4, 3.28 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 despite a 3.12 ERA (14 er in 40.1 ip) and .200 (29-for-145) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run twice...he has allowed no runs twice during the streak, one run once and two runs twice.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in games started (10), ranks fifth in opponents batting average (.200) and strikeouts (66), tied for fifth in innings pitched (57.2), sixth in on-base percentage (.256) and 10th in OPS (.584) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.40).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 11 batters in his last start on Thursday against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with 11...has 66 strikeouts this year, which ranks fifth in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 2-for-34 (.059) with runners in scoring position over his last nine starts and are batting .128 (5-for-39) with RISP for the season, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has allowed a .212 (24-for-113) batting average against left-handed hitters and .186 (18-for-97) against right-handers...however, has surrendered five of his six home runs and issued 10 of his 15 walks to lefties for a .639 OPS (.519 OPS vs. righties)...four of the six home runs he has yielded have been solo shots...has allowed a .198 (16-for-81) average the first time through the order, .250 (18-for-72) the second time and .140 (8-for-57) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...the opponents two hitter in the order is 2-for-26 (.077) against him...opponents are batting .109 (13-for-119) with two strikes and are 1-for-23 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .157 career average in that situation.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed eight of his 22 runs in the third inning for an 8.00 ERA (8 er in 9.0 ip)...has a 2.29 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 1.59 ERA (7 er in 39.2 ip) and .163 (23-for-141) opponents batting average in six starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13.0 ip) and .271 (13-for-48) opponents average in three starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-11 with a 2.68 ERA (59 er in 198.1 ip) in 33 starts on four days rest, 17-12 with a 4.11 ERA (106 er in 232.1 ip) in 42 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.58 ERA (11 er in 38.1 ip) and .170 (23-for-135) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) and .253 (19-for-75) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been shut out in three of his 10 starts and he has received one run of support or fewer seven times...has 18 runs of support overall (57.2 ip, 2.81 RSA)...is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) in five starts at night compared to 0-4 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day...now has a career record of 21-12 at night and 12-15 during the day...the A's have lost in all four of his no decisions and are 2-8 (.200) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May

4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...is currently 0-2 with a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) and .206 (21-for-102) opponents batting average in five starts in May...allowed a season-high seven hits and threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss to Texas on Thursday in Oakland...tossed seven innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark for his career...struck out 11, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...allowed his only run in the third inning when he walked Ibanez with the bases loaded...retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced after the walk and was relieved by Acevedo to start the eighth inning with the scored tied 1-1.

MONTAS vs. HOUSTON: Is 7-4 with a 3.48 ERA (64.2 ip, 63 h, 28 r, 25 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 8 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 11 starts, during the regular season...also has a loss in one postseason start (5 er in 3.2 ip)...is 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA (12 er in 28.0 ip) in six games at Minute Maid Park and 4-2 with a 3.19 ERA (13 er in 36.2 ip) in seven games in the Coliseum...went 3-1 with a 1.82 ERA (24.2 ip, 20 h, 6 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 29 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year...the first win came in a 7-3 A's victory at Houston on April 10...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...then took the loss in an 8-1 decision in Oakland on May 19...allowed a home run to Altuve to start the game and Correa added a RBI single later in the inning...then blanked the Astros on four hits and a walk over his final four innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Houston on July 8...struck out 10 batters in 6.2 innings...shut out the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing a RBI double to McCormick in the seventh...his third win came in a 14-2 A's victory in Oakland on Sept. 24...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Altuve reached third on a Chapman error and scored on a Gurriel sacrifice fly...then surrendered a leadoff home run to Altuve in the third but that would be the last run he would allow in seven innings of work.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (2-2, 3.15 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-1 with a 3.65 ERA in two starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...has walked nine batters in 40.0 innings over his first seven starts, an average of 2.02 per nine innings...has struck out four batters in each of his last five starts, which matches the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...has exactly four strikeouts in six of his seven starts this year and has 26 strikeouts in 40.0 innings, an average of 5.85 per nine innings...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-5 A's loss to Texas on Friday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 so)...is 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA (20.2 ip, 25 h, 17 r, 17 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 6 hr) in four career starts against Houston, all last year.

- Has a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip), .146 (7-for-48) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 13 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for first in MLB in games pitched (23) and is 13th among MLB relievers in innings pitched (23.2).
- Opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 14 of his 23 appearances.
- Has faced the Astros thrice in his career, allowing one run over 3.0 innings with four walks and three strikeouts.
