OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-34) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (25-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to four games last night, which is their second longest losing streak this year (9, April 29-May 8)...have lost seven of the last nine games and 14 of the last 19...are a season-low 14 games under .500 at 20-34 (.370)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League ahead of the Royals (16-34, .320) and it marks the first time the A's have been 14 games under .500 since Sept. 20, 2017 when they were 69-83...have not been 15 games under since they were 68-83 on Sept. 19, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 54 games (16-38 in 1994, 18-36 in 1979)...are 2-9-1 over the previous 12 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 30 of the last 31 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 28 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 15 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out of first place.

THE ONE-THIRD MARK: The A's played their 54th game of the season yesterday, which is the one-third mark of the season...are on pace to go 60-102, which would be the second 100-loss season in Oakland history...the Oakland single-season record for losses is 108 in 1979...are batting .211 with a .278 on-base percentage, .326 slugging percentage and .605 OPS...all four marks are currently the lowest in Oakland history (.225 batting average in 2020, .302 on-base percentage in 1979, .343 slugging percentage in 1968, .647 OPS in 1968)...are on pace to score 543 runs, which would be second fewest in a full season in Oakland history (532 in 1978), and hit 102 home runs, which would be third fewest (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...individually, the A's are on pace to challenge some of the lowest team-leading totals by a player in a full season in Oakland history...Elvis Andrus and Tony Kemp lead the A's with 39 hits (pace: 117...low is 136 by Dave Revering in 1979)...Seth Brown, Sean Murphy and Chad Pinder top the club with five home runs (pace: 15...low is 16 by Kevin Kouzmanoff in 2010)...Brown has 23 RBI (pace: 69...low is 70 by Mitchell Page in 1978)...Kemp and Murphy lead the club with 17 walks (pace: 51...low is 51 by Marcus Semien in 2016)...Frankie Montas leads the A's with 71 strikeouts and is on pace for 213, which would surpass his total of 207 last year for second most in Oakland history (Blue, 301 in 1971).

OFFENSE: The A's are 20-for-123 (.163) with eight runs scored over the last four games after hitting .261 with 50 runs scored over the previous 12 contests...are now hitting .211 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.278) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.326) and OPS (.605)...rank second in fewest home runs (34), tied for third in fewest runs (181) and tied for fourth in fewest extra base hits (127)...have homered once in the last five games...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 50 games and 53 of 54 this year.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.52 ERA (103 er in 168.0 ip) over the last 19 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.17 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.318) and slugging percentage (.396) and the fifth highest OPS (.714)...have issued the fourth most walks (173) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (412).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 5.46 ERA (19 er in 31.1 ip) over the last six games and 1-11 with a 5.10 ERA (62 er in 109.1 ip) over the last 21 contests...are 12-25 with a 4.28 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...have the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (280.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-3 with no saves, three blown saves and an 8.23 ERA (25 er in 27.1 ip) in eight games on the homestand...has a 6.59 ERA (41 er in 56.0 ip) over the last 15 games and a 4.03 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...has allowed 7-of-12 inherited runners to score over the last two games but just 25-of-104 (24.0%) for the season, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 104 inherited runners are tied for second most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.200), the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.315) and fifth lowest on-base percentage (.300)...has surrendered just 14 home runs, which is tied for third fewest...has converted 13-of-21 (61.9%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's have 11 stolen bases in the last 10 games and are 36-for-42 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 19-for-29 (65.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 10 caught stealings are tied for third most and the 18 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 34 errors, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (52).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 7-21 (.250) at home compared to 13-13 (.500) on the road...the home record is the worst in the majors and is tied with the 1956 Kansas City A's for second worst in Oakland history after 28 games...the 1920 Philadelphia A's were 6-21-1 (.222)...have a 4.70 ERA (132 er in 253.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the second highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .202 (180-for-889) with 76 runs and 12 home runs in 28 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the second fewest home runs and the fourth fewest runs...are 1-7 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-1)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand and have lost 18 of the last 21 home games...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1)...leave following the game tomorrow for a nine-game road trip to Atlanta (two games), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games)...beginning with that trip, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 games on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League and the winning percentage is second lowest...are 13-16 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 16 losses and 29 games are second most in the AL...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 43 players, which is tied for third most in the American League...the total includes 19 rookies, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...only the 2008 (21) and 2017 (20) clubs used more rookies...12 of the rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 10-21 (.323) record, which was second worst in the American League to the Royals (9-20, .310) and fifth worst in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since the A's went 9-21 in May of 1997...A's pitchers set an Oakland record for strikeouts in May with 234...tied for fourth in the AL in strikeouts in May but had the third highest ERA (4.47)...the A's slugged .316 with a .598 OPS, both of which were the lowest May marks in Oakland history...it was the first time they finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581) and it was the A's lowest May OPS since 1917 (.544)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (Texas, .562; Cleveland, .577)...had a .281 on-base percentage, which was second lowest in Oakland history in May, and a .214 batting average, which was third lowest...stole 22 bases, which was the most by the A's in May since 2012 (22)...ranked last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS last month, tied for the fewest home runs (15), had the third lowest on-base percentage and the third fewest runs scored (94)...had the third most steals.

A'S vs. RED SOX: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night after splitting the season series last year, 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...are 14-13 against the Red Sox dating back to 2017 but are 16-23 dating back to 2015...are 250-304 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-126 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1085 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and is tied for fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...**A.J. Puk** ranks 10th among AL relievers with a 1.29 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...in **2007** Mark Ellis hits for the cycle in the A's 5-4, 11-inning win over Boston...he completes the cycle with a single in the 10th inning and Eric Chavez wins the game with a walk-off home run in the 11th.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (5-1, 2.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his career-high 11th start of the season, surpassing his previous best of 10 from his rookie campaign of 2017...has a career-high five wins, which is tied for sixth in the American League...had just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons...also has a career-high 41 strikeouts and his 54.1 innings pitched are 4.1 innings shy of his high of 58.2 in 2017...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts, including no runs four times, and ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.15)...also ranks fifth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.50), sixth in fewest pitches per inning (14.6) and 10th in opponents batting average (.208).

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss in his last start last Monday against Houston to snap his season-opening and career-high five-game winning streak...went 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned nine starts...became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011.

DON'T WALK: Did not walk a batter in his last start and has issued just 12 free passes in 54.1 innings, an average of 1.99 per nine innings...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 10 starts, including four starts with no walks and three others with just one...has walked 22 in 92.2 innings over the last two years (2.14 per nine innings) and 50 in 192.1 career innings (2.34 per nine innings).

DON'T HOMER: Allowed two home runs in his last start after yielding just one home run over his first nine starts (47.2 innings)...now has three home runs in 54.1 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...yielded eight home runs in 38.1 innings last year and entered the season with 18 home runs in 138.0 career innings (1.17 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .184 (18-for-98) batting average...left-handers are hitting .232 (23-for-99) against him with eight of his 12 walks...opponents are 6-for-36 (.167) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has a .181 (15-for-83) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .253 (21-for-83) the second time and .161 (5-for-31) after that...has allowed a .144 opponents batting average with two strikes...the number five hitter in the order is 2-for-22 (.091) against him.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts on the road and 1-1 with a 3.57 ERA (9 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and ranks second in ERA...has not allowed a home run in 31.2 innings on the road.

BY INNING: Has allowed four runs in the first innings for a 3.60 ERA (10.0 ip)...has yielded five runs in innings two through four for a 1.50 ERA (30.0 ip) and four in the fifth for a 4.00 ERA (9.0 ip)...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (5.1 ip)

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...allowed a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings on May 3 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 10-7, 10-inning loss...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...logged a season-high 6.2 innings for the second consecutive start in the day game on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win...allowed a season-high tying six hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 20...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25...however, walked a career-high five batters.

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in a 5-1 decision against Houston on Monday in Oakland...allowed a season-high four runs in a season-high tying 6.2 innings...blanked the Astros on a hit and a hit batter over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...the streak ended on a one out solo home run by Alvarez in the

fourth...allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Maldonado RBI single and an Altuve two-run home run...Valdez tossed a complete game two-hitter for the Astros.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)...had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

RHP Frankie Montas (2-5, 3.20 ERA): Is 0-4 despite a 3.04 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the four-game losing streak is a career high...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run three times...he has allowed no runs twice during the streak, one run once and two runs three times...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Houston on Tuesday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2 ip, 16 h, 9 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts, against the Red Sox...is 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA in three starts against American League East teams this year compared to 0-5 with a 4.17 ERA in eight starts against everyone else...now has a five-game winning streak against the AL East dating back to May 3, 2021 and has a 1.87 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over that seven-start stretch.

- Has allowed earned runs in his last three outings after eight previous appearances of not allowing an earned run.
- Became the first pitcher in Oakland history to face 4 batter and walk them all Saturday night.
- Is tied for 10th in the majors in games (23)...is tied for seventh among AL relievers in strikeouts (29) and is tied for the most walks (17).
- Is holding opposing hitters to a .143 batting average with two strikes (6-for-42).
- Owns a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in away games compared to a 5.06 ERA (6 er in 10.2 ip) in home contests.
- Earned his first career win on May 17 against Minnesota.
- Has never faced the Red Sox.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

56 RHP DANY JIMENEZ (2-3, 3.92)

- Has allowed runs in three consecutive outings for the first time this season and blew his first save of the season on Saturday.
- Recorded his 10th save of the season Wednesday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012).
- Has converted 10 of his 11 save opportunities for the first 10 saves of his career...leads American League rookies and ranks tied for fourth among all AL pitchers in saves.
- Allowed three runs in 0.2 innings for the loss Friday night...prior to that outing, had not allowed a run in eight of his previous 10 games (10.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 0.96 ERA) and opponents were 2-for-30 (.067) over that span.
- Has allowed a .200 (10-for-50) average against right-handed hitters compared to .179 (5-for-28) against left-handers.
