OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-35) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (26-27)

SUNDAY, JUNE 5, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to five games yesterday, which is the A's second longest losing streak this year (9, April 29-May 8)...have lost eight of the last 10 games and 15 of the last 20...are a season-low 15 games under .500 at 20-35 (.364)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League ahead of the Royals (17-34, .333) and it marks the first time the A's have been 15 games under .500 since Sept. 19, 2017 when they were 68-83...have not been 16 games under since they were 67-83 on Sept. 18, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 55 games (16-39 in 1994, 18-37 in 1979)...have lost the first two games of this series and are now 2-10-1 over the last 13 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 31 of the last 32 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 29 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 15 games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out of first place.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-8 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-2)...with a loss today, would match the second worst record on a homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...went 2-5 on the last homestand and have lost 19 of the last 22 home games...are 7-22 (.241) at home compared to 13-13 (.500) on the road...the home record is the worst in the majors and second worst in Oakland history after 29 games...the 1920 Philadelphia A's started the year 6-22-1 (.214) at home (lost home game 30 in 1920)...have a 4.81 ERA (140 er in 262.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the highest home ERA in the American League and third highest in the majors...are hitting .200 (184-for-919) with 76 runs and 12 home runs in 28 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 29 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the second fewest home runs and the fourth fewest runs...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1)...leave following the game today for a nine-game road trip to Atlanta (two games), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games)...beginning Tuesday, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 games on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the seventh time yesterday, which matches the Tigers and Twins for the most in the majors...it also matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors...are batting .157 (24-for-15) with eight runs scored over the last five games after hitting .261 with 50 runs scored over the previous 12 contests...are now batting .210 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.277) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.324) and OPS (.601)...rank second in fewest runs (181) and fewest home runs (34) and fourth in fewest extra base hits (129)...have homered once in the last six games...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 51 games and 54 of 55 this year.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.64 ERA (111 er in 177.0 ip) over the last 20 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.24 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.248), fourth highest on-base percentage (.320) and slugging percentage (.398) and fifth highest OPS (.718)...have issued the fourth most walks (177) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (420).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 5.86 ERA (23 er in 35.1 ip) over the last seven games and 1-12 with a 5.24 ERA (66 er in 113.1 ip) over the last 22 contests...are 12-26 with a 4.34 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...have the third highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (284.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-3 with no saves, three blown saves and an 8.07 ERA (29 er in 32.1 ip) in nine games on the homestand...has a 6.64 ERA (45 er in 61.0 ip) over the last 16 games and a 4.11 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...has allowed 7-of-16 (43.8%) inherited runners to score over the last three games but just 25-of-108 (23.1%) for the season, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 108 inherited runners are second most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.201) and third lowest slugging percentage (.320)...has surrendered just 14 home runs, which is tied for third fewest...has converted 13-of-21 (61.9%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 12-for-12 in stolen base attempts over the last 11 games and 37-for-43 (86.0%) for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's oppo-

nents are 19-for-29 (65.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest success rate in the AL...the 10 caught stealings are tied for fourth most and the 19 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 35 errors, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (53).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League and the winning percentage is second lowest...are 13-16 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 29 games are second most in the AL and the 16 losses are tied for second...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 43 players, which is tied for third most in the American League...Oakland employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 19 rookies, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...only the 2008 (21) and 2017 (20) clubs used more rookies...12 of the rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost six of their last seven games in which the opponent starts a left-hander...are 7-10 (.412) for the season compared to 13-25 (.342) when the opponents starts a right-hander...the A's are 16-4 (.800) when scoring first and 4-31 (.114) when the opponent scores first...have the third best record in the American League when scoring first and the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...are 4-13 in the first game of a series, 8-8 in the final game...are averaging 3 hours and 4 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the AL and the majors.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 10-21 (.323) record, which was second worst in the American League and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...A's pitchers set an Oakland record for strikeouts in May (234)...tied for fourth in the AL in strikeouts in May but had the third highest ERA (4.47)...slugged .316 with a .598 OPS, both of which were the lowest May marks in Oakland history...it was the first time they finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581) and it was the A's lowest May OPS since 1917 (.544)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (TEX, .562; CLE, .577)...had a .281 on-base percentage, which was second lowest in Oakland history in May, and a .214 batting average, which was third lowest...ranked last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS in May, tied for the fewest home runs (15), had the third lowest on-base percentage and the third fewest runs scored (94)...had the third most steals (22).

A'S vs. RED SOX: The A's have lost the first two games of 2022 and have not been swept by the Red Sox in Oakland in a series of three or more games since Sept. 6-8, 2004...split the season series last year, 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...are 14-14 against the Red Sox dating back to 2017 but are 16-24 dating back to 2015...are 250-305 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-127 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1086 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and is tied for fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...**A.J. Puk** ranks ninth among AL relievers with a 1.23 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2004** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-5, 3.20 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 despite a 3.04 ERA (16 er in 47.1 ip) and .211 (36-for-171) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the four-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 3, two times, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run three times...he has allowed no runs twice during the streak, one run once and two runs three times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in games started (11), tied for third in innings pitched (64.2), ranks fifth in strikeouts (71) and 10th in on-base percentage (.257) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.73).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 11 batters on May 26 against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with 11...has 71 strikeouts this year, which ranks fifth in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 3-for-38 (.079) with runners in scoring position over his last 10 starts and are batting .140 (6-for-43) with RISP for the season, which is seventh lowest in the American League...has yielded five home runs in 122 at bats against left-handed hitters, two in 114 against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 15 walks to lefties...five of the seven home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has allowed a .189 (17-for-90) average the first time through the order, .259 (21-for-81) the second time and .169 (11-for-65) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...the opponents two hitter in the order is 2-for-29 (.069) against him...opponents are batting .122 with two strikes...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .158 career average in that situation.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (2 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts against American League East teams this year compared to 0-5 with a 4.17 ERA (21 er in 45.1 ip) in eight starts against everyone else...now has a five-game winning streak against the AL East dating back to May 3, 2021 and has a 1.87 ERA (9 er in 43.1 ip) and .190 (30-for-158) opponents batting average over that seven-start stretch...his last loss was on April 27, 2021 at Tampa Bay...is now 6-3 with a 2.43 ERA (20 er in 74.0 ip) in 16 career appearances against the AL East.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed eight of his 24 runs in the third inning for a 7.20 ERA (8 er in 10.0 ip) and .263 (10-for-38) opponents batting average...has a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip) and .192 (15-for-78) opponents average over innings 1-2 and a 2.73 ERA (10 er in 33.0 ip) and .194 (24-for-124) opponents average from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-3 with a 1.74 ERA (9 er in 46.2 ip) and .180 (30-for-167) opponents batting average in seven starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13.0 ip) and .271 (13-for-48) opponents average in three starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-12 with a 2.67 ERA (61 er in 205.1 ip) in 34 starts on four days rest, 17-12 with a 4.11 ERA (106 er in 232.1 ip) in 42 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 2.58 ERA (13 er in 45.1 ip) and .186 (30-for-161) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) and .253 (19-for-75) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been shut out in three of his 11 starts and he has received one run of support or fewer eight times...has 19 runs of support overall (64.2 ip, 2.64 RSA)...is 2-1 with a 2.73 ERA (10 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 0-4 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day...now has a career record of 21-13 at night and 12-15 during the day...the A's have lost in all four of his no decisions and are 2-9 (.182) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when

he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...then went 0-3 despite a 2.31 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in May...allowed a season-high seven hits and threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)...struck out 11 in 7.0 innings on May 26 against Texas, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Houston last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a season-high tying seven hits in 7.0 innings...faced the minimum over the first four innings as the only base runner (McCormick single) was erased on a double play...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to McCormick in the fifth...was relieved after surrendering a leadoff home run to McCormick in the eighth.

MONTAS vs. BOSTON: Is 0-1 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2 ip, 16 h, 9 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts...is 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA (2 er in 9.1 ip) in three games in Oakland and 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (1 er in 4.1 ip) in one start in Boston...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 3-2 A's loss in Oakland on July 2...retired nine of 11 batters over the first three innings...then walked Bogaerts to start the fourth and Devers followed with a RBI double...also allowed a RBI single to Verdugo in the fifth...was relieved by Wendelken with the bases loaded and two outs in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-0...Wendelken got the final out and Oakland scored once in the seventh and once in the ninth to get him off the hook.

- Had a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip), .146 (7-for-48) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 13 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for first in MLB in games pitched (25) and is ninth among AL relievers in innings pitched (24.2).
- Opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 15 of his 25 appearances.
- Faced the Red Sox for the first time in his career Friday night.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has allowed earned runs in his last three outings after eight previous appearances of not allowing an earned run.
- Became the first pitcher in Oakland history to face 4 batters and walk them all last Saturday night.
- Is tied for 14th in the majors in games (23)...is tied for seventh among AL relievers in strikeouts (29) and is tied for the most walks (17).
- Is holding opposing hitters to a .143 batting average with two strikes (6-for-42).
- Owns a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in away games compared to a 5.06 ERA (6 er in 10.2 ip) in home contests.
- Earned his first career win on May 17 against Minnesota.
- Has never faced the Red Sox.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
